## EDITORIAL

The Message of Christmas

To many people Christmas means little more than the giving of gifts and receiving of them, family reunions and jollification followed by a quick return to the daily round. Nearly a century after the Nativity, John, writing from a rich experience, expressed the significance of this unique event in the unforgettable words, "The Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us". (John 1:14)

It is fitting that we should pause and think of the significance of the event. He was born in to a world that 'knew not God', a world steeped in idolatry, that offered its sons and daughters as sacrifices to pacify the wrath of their idols, or to glorify them. Jesus born in a cattle stall, and cradled in a manger, raised amongst the poor as the son of a carpenter, was the revelation of the Eternal on earth, and, therefore the Light of the World.

He taught the world a doctrine it had lost - that the living God is "Our Father" and that, therefore, all men are brothers: that Christ's way is to "Love your Enemies" to "love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, mind and strength", and to "love thy neighbour as thyself".

He revealed by His death and resurrection that death is not the end, but that life if lived in harmony with God's laws, is an immortal condition, subject to the will and grace of God. Indeed, he preached a doctrine that gave hope of a more abundant life.

May His blessing of peace and grace attend you, and His Spirit watch over you as you seek to walk with the ONE who became flesh.

## THE STORY OF SILENT NIGHT

On Christmas Eve in 1818, Franz Gruber, church organist in the little town of Oberndorf, Bavaria, made a startling discovery. The organ would not play! Quickly he went to the vicar, Joseph Mohr, and told him his story. He asked Mohr to write a new Christmas song which could be easily sung without the use of the organ.

Later as Mohr sat reading Christmas stories from his Bible, the words, "Unto You is Born This Day in the City of David a Saviour" gripped his soul. As he sat meditating on them he wrote a poem about the wondrous story.

Early the next day, Gruber took the newly written words and composed a melody. Now the people were gathering at the Church, one man who could pick out tunes on a guitar was asked to accompany the new carol. The people immediately loved the song, and thus Joseph Mohr and Franz Gruber gave to the world one of the most beautiful and best loved of Christmas carols. Today "Silent night" is sung in nearly every language of the world.

Oh, that the real meaning of Christmas would grip us this season as, like Joseph Mohr, we consider these words: "unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11)

This Saviour is UNTO YOU. YOU who are burdened with cares, with sin, You who have gone astray, who need the forgiveness of sin. Christ Jesus came into this world to save you, He died on the cross for you.

To night will be a "silent night" and a "holy night" in your soul if you will trust in this loving and living Saviour.

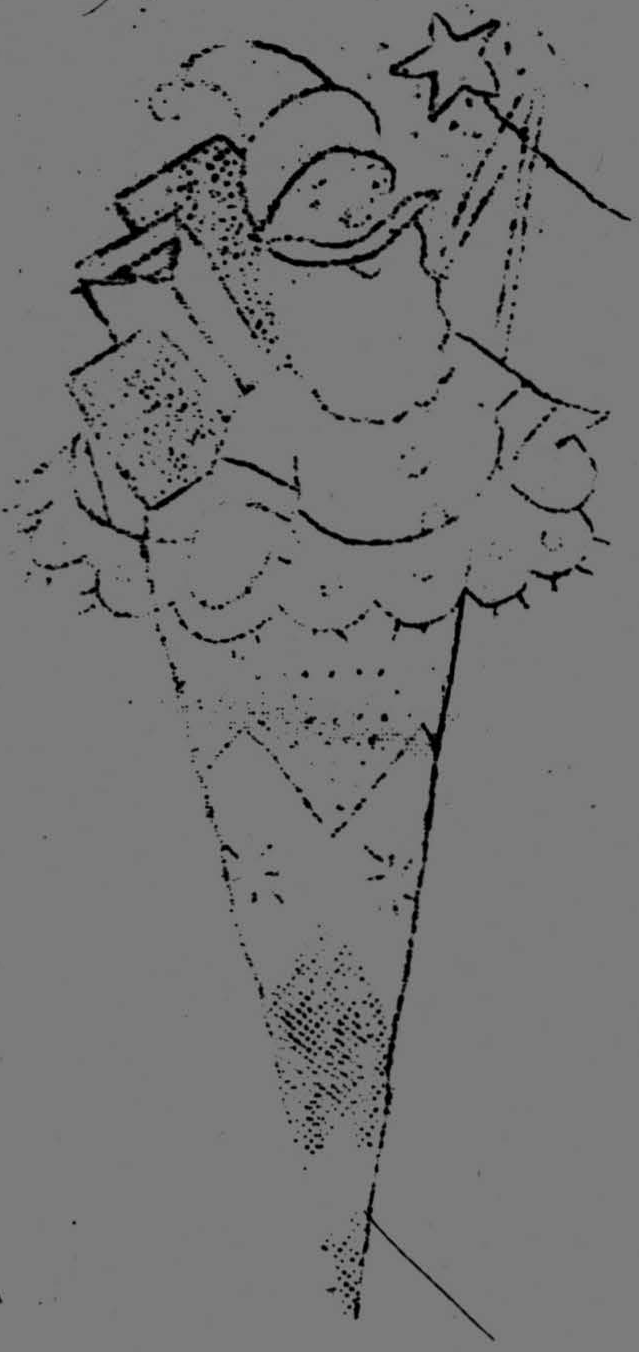

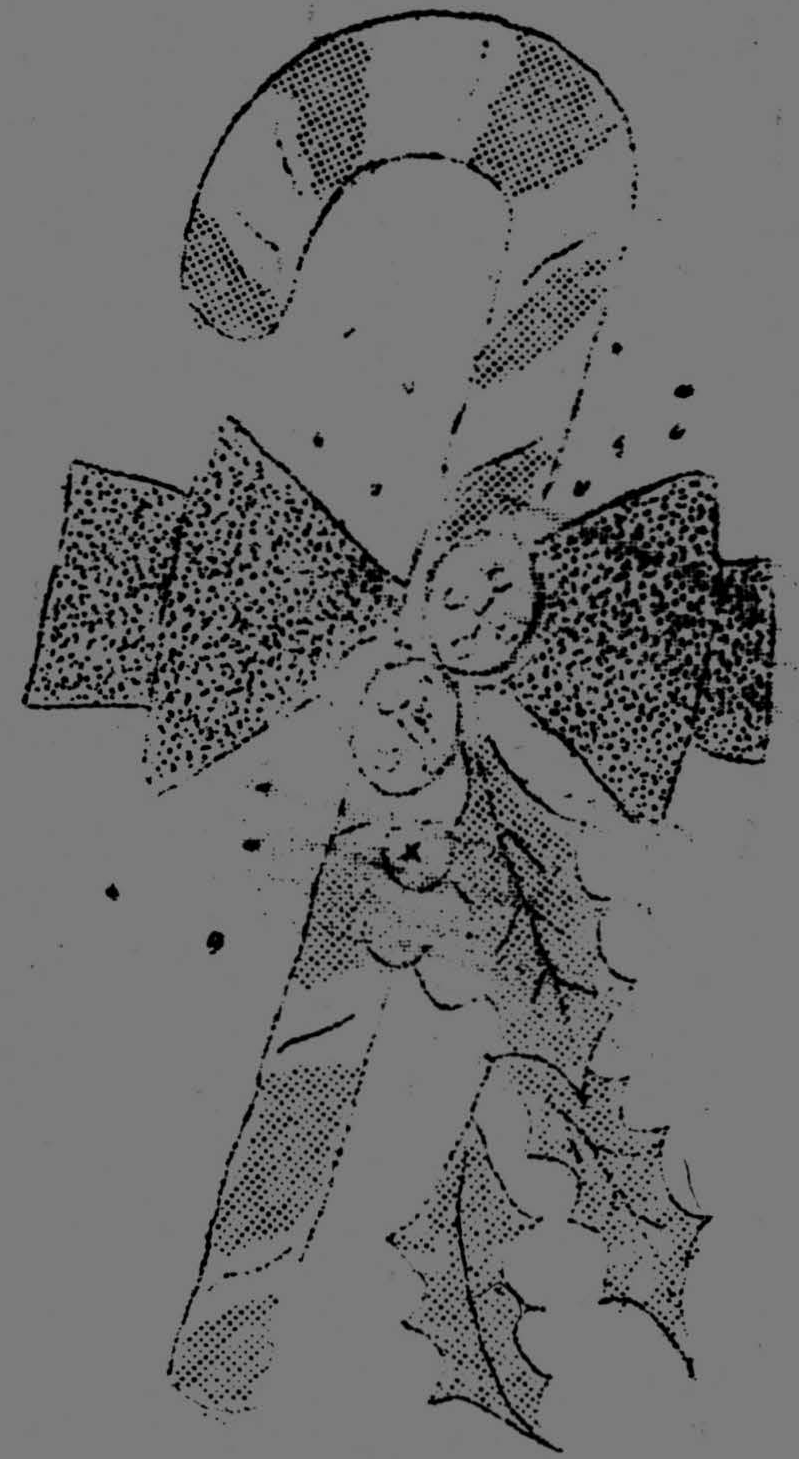

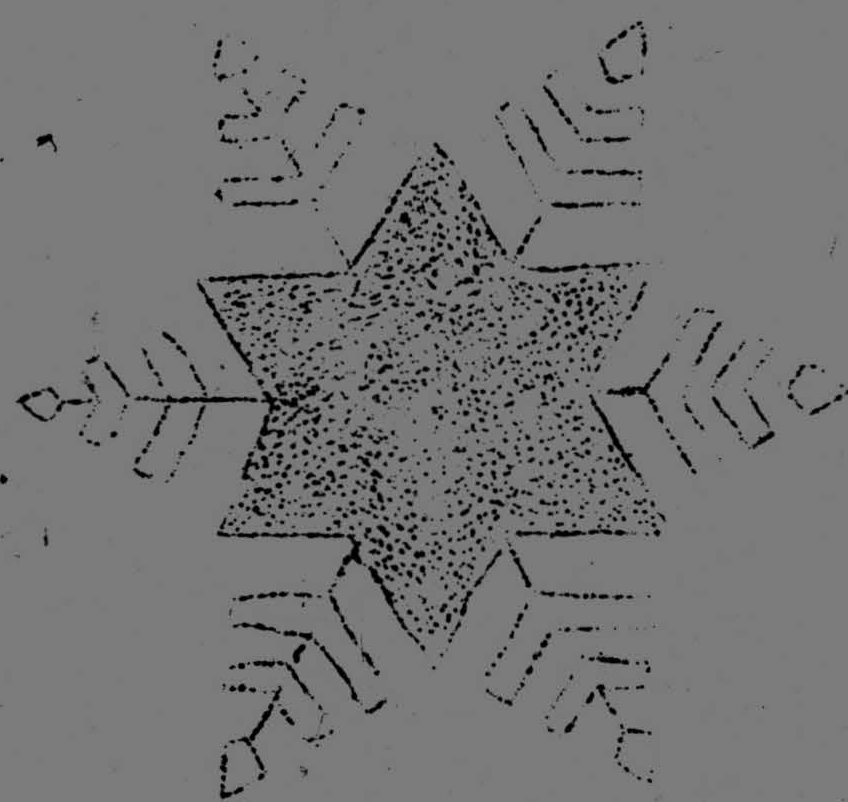

## C O U R T   N E W S

In court at Labrador City recently, Magistrate L.W. Wicks presiding, the following cases were heard.

On December 8th the Court was occupied for almost the entire day by juvenile matters. The offenses for which the boys were charged concerned mainly the improper use of air pistols, commonly called BB guns, by shooting windows and theft charges. All the boys in this instance were placed on suspended sentence, as it was their first offence, given a stern lecture and their air pistols forfeited. The Court takes a very serious view of such actions and will deal very severely with offenders.

There were, during the past week, a large number of traffic offences with the usual fines imposed where there were convictions.

A resident of Labrador City was charged and convicted of impaired driving. This having been his second conviction for this charge, he was sentenced to fourteen days imprisonment without the option of a fine and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a highway in Canada for eighteen months. Under the Canadian Criminal Code, persons convicted a second time for impaired driving cannot be given the option of a fine.

Another resident was charged with two counts of false pretenses. The matter will be completed at a later date.

There were a number of civil cases held involving the Town of Labrador City and delinquent tax payers. In all instances, judgment was given in favour of the Town and the persons ordered to pay the taxes forthwith.

Another resident was charged with theft of a counter stool from the Home Bakery Restuarant. He was convicted, placed on suspended sentence for one year and ordered to pay the restuarant compensation.

On December 13th in Court a resident of Wabush was charged with assault and evidence was given to show that the complainant in this matter was severely beaten. The defence, however, pleaded self-defence. The matter was not completed.

Another resident of Wabush was convicted of impaired driving, fined \$125.00 or fourteen days and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a highway in Canada for nine months. The same man was convicted of theft from a Wabush store and placed on suspended sentence for one year and ordered to file a bond of \$200.00 for one year to be of good behaviour.

Another resident of Wabush was charged with causing a disturbance in a Wabush restuarant by using obscene language. He was convicted of the offence. The Magistrate, in passing sentence, stated that this type of conduct would not be tolerated and that stiff penalties would be imposed for it. In this instance, the man was fined \$100.00 or thirty days imprisonment.

A resident of Labrador City was charged with hit and run. Further witnesses are to be called before this matter can be completed.

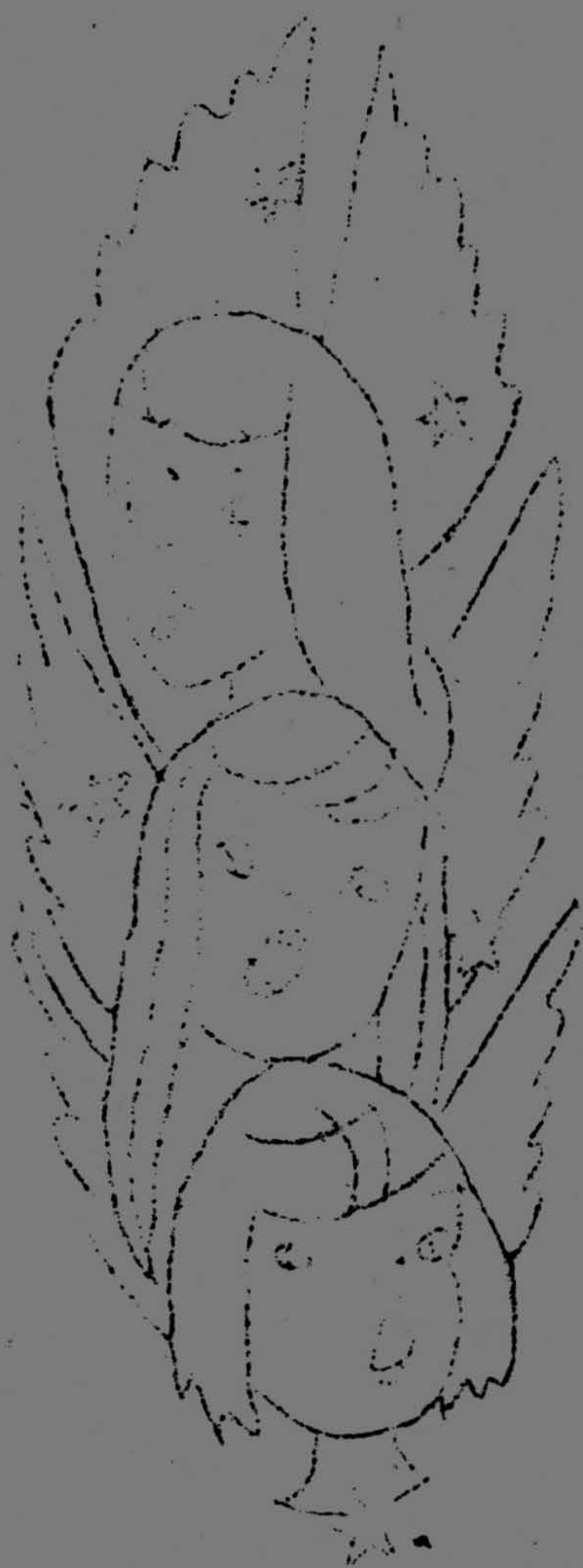
