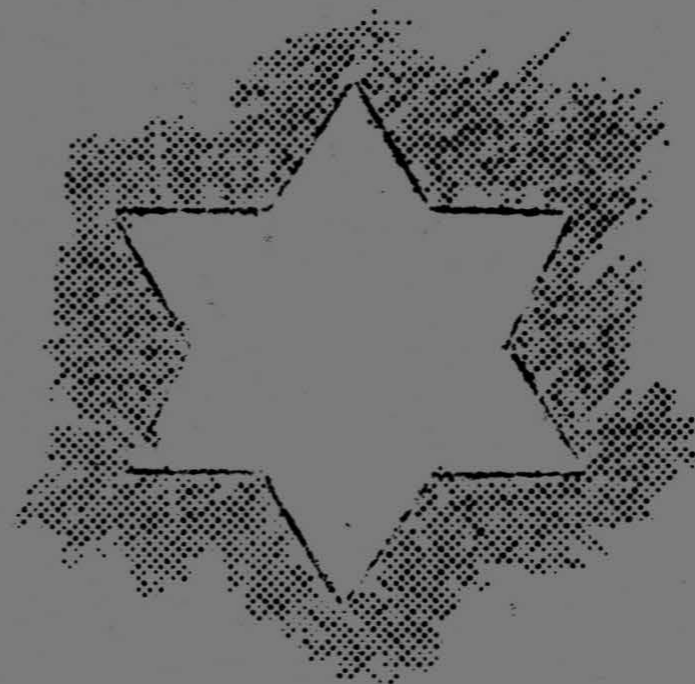

You remember Jacob, the man who cheated his brother out of his birthright. Perhaps you remember also how he fled from his brother's anger and went to live with his uncle in a distant land. But do you remember Rachel, the beautiful young woman that he met there? How there is a story .....

Rachel was uncle Laban's daughter, and she was beautiful. The first time I saw her she was leading a flock of sheep across the fields towards me. Her headdress had fallen to her shoulders and her hair was tossed in the wind. Her face and cloak were dusty from her labours, but her eyes were black and sparkling like the midnight sky. I felt alive just to see her.

For my beloved Rachel I served my uncle seven years, and they seemed to me but a few days because of the love I had for her. Rachel was mine, but I longed for my own land so many miles away. And so it was that I took my Rachel home with me.

We crossed the desert with our camel-train - not an easy journey at the best of times - until we saw at last the hills of Gilead. Do you remember the scent of home? The air is different and the breeze has a taste of its own. My beautiful Rachel was with child. For her it had been a long journey from Paddan to the homeland. But we crossed the Jabboc, then the Jordan: we were almost home.

I loved my Rachel, the wife I married long ago. When I came from Paddan, Rachel to my sorrow died in the land of Canaan on the way...and I buried her there on the way to Ephrath by the town of Bethlehem, and raised a pillar on her grave. Bethlehem is a place of sorrow now.

You remember the prophet Jeremiah. He knew Bethlehem well, It was a town of proud people - descendants of Benjamin, the son for whom the beautiful Rachel died. As he stood beside the town, Jeremiah could almost hear the mother's dying cry for her new-born son. And he trembled, for he knew that soon she would be crying for her children's children. He could almost see the trampling soldiers of Babylon, and the long line of captives being led northward past her grave. He could hear the Mother of Israel still weeping for her children: lamentation and bitter weeping. Rachel is weeping for her children; she refuses to be comforted for her children, because they are no more. All this in the sad town of Bethlehem.

You remember Herod, how he took and killed all the children of Bethlehem because he feared for his throne. It is as though in Bethlehem all the sadness of mankind's predicament had found expression. All the cruelty, disappointment and loss is there in that town. At least it was so. Things have changed now. Those who "would not be comforted" now can find there the Consolation of Israel - and of the world.

That is why I can wish you a merry Christmas

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, 1966

Notice is hereby given that, under authority of The Hours of Work Act, His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to proclaim the following days for observance as holidays during the calendar year 1966 pursuant to the provisions of the said Act:

<u>Days</u>	<u>Dates of Observance</u>
(a) New Year's Day	Saturday, January 1st.
(b) St. Patrick's Day	Monday, March 14th.
(c) Good Friday	Friday, April 8th.
(d) St. George's Day	Monday, April 25th.
(e) Commonwealth (Empire) Day	Monday, May 23rd.
(f) Discovery Day	Monday, June 27th.
(g) Memorial Day	Monday, July 4th.
(h) Orangemen's Day	Monday, July 11th.
(i) Labour Day	Monday, September 5th.
(j) Armistice Day	Friday, November 11th.
(k) Christmas Day	Monday, December 26th.
(l) Boxing Day	Tuesday, December 27th.

These holidays are required, by law, to be observed by chartered banks and by all businesses to which the relevant provisions of the Hours of Work Act apply. They will also be observed by the Provincial Government Service.

In the weeks in which Commonwealth (Empire) Day, Discovery Day, Memorial Day, Orangemen's Day and Labour Day are required to be observed as holidays pursuant to the foregoing, employees in shops to which The Hours of Work Act applies shall be given another full day off in addition to these days and in addition to Sunday but shops will not be required to close on any day in the week other than these days and Sunday.

### FATAL ACCIDENT

A tragic accident occurred last Saturday on the Airport road. Returning from the Airport Gaston Lapage, native of White Brook, New Brunswick, 35 years old and the father of two children was struck and killed by another car. Mr. Lapage, dressed in dark clothes was in the centre of the road picking up a chain which had fallen from his car's wheel, Mrs. Lapage was at the controls of the car, 100 yards from the scene. Robert Sirois, of Labrador City, driver of the other car was blinded by lights of oncoming car. The autopsy revealed death was due to a cerebral hemorrhage.

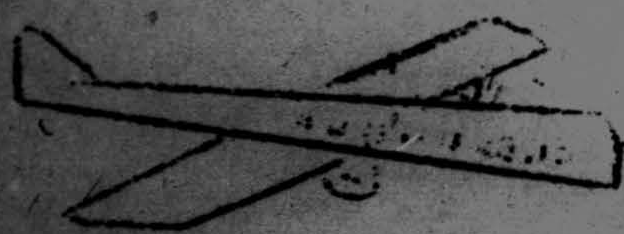

In Court at Labrador City recently, Magistrate L.W. Wicks presiding, the following cases were heard.

One resident of Labrador City was charged with imprudent driving and convicted. He was fined \$50.00 or four weeks imprisonment.

Another resident, charged with speeding and convicted, was fined \$25.00 or fourteen days.

Further witnesses in the hit and run charge reported last week resulted in the charge being dismissed.

Judgement was handed down on a charge of obstruction of an officer. The defendant was placed on suspended sentence and instructed to file a bond of \$500.00 to be of good behaviour in every respect.

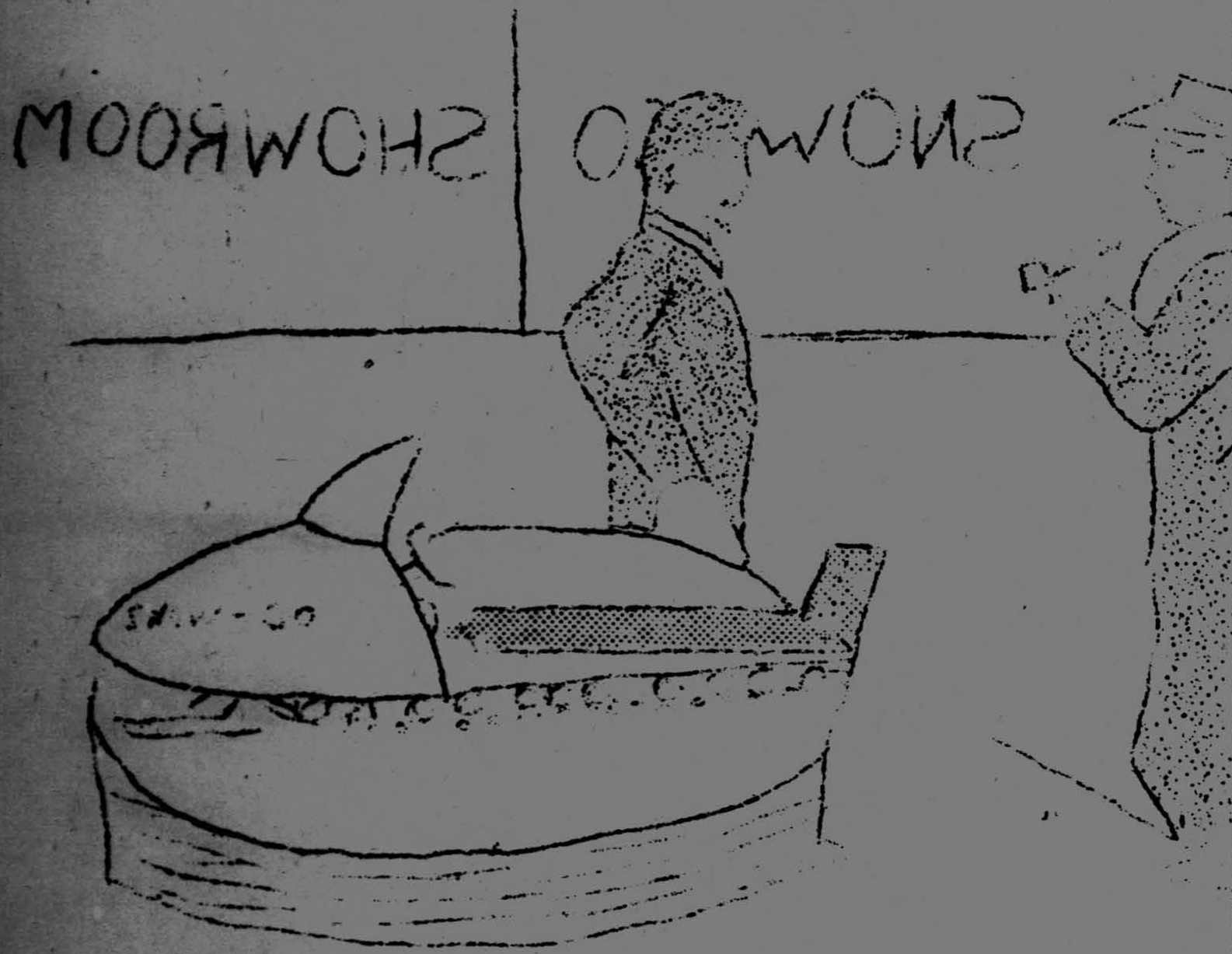

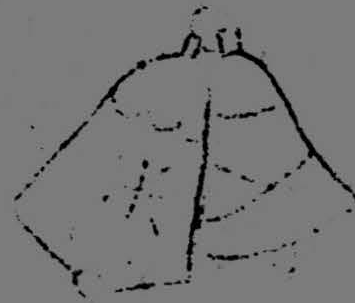
