## C A R O L N E W S

For the information of all residents of the Labrador City area, we are printing the full text of a statement made in the House of Assembly by the Premier of Newfoundland, The Honourable J. R. Smallwood, on Wednesday afternoon, January 26, 1966. The statement was as follows:-

### STATEMENT OF THE HONOURABLE J. R. SMALLWOOD:

"I am pleased to announce that the Iron Ore Company of Canada and its associated Company, the Carol Pellet Company, will expand pelletizing capacity at Labrador City to 10,000,000 tons per annum. The Iron Ore Company now has an annual capacity at Labrador City of 7,000,000 tons of high grade iron ore concentrate and the Carol Pellet Company has an annual capacity of 5.3 million tons of pellets. On the completion of the proposed expansion programme, the entire production at Labrador City will be pelletized and the mining, concentrating and pelletizing complex will be one of the 3 largest in the world.

The expansion will cost approximately \$58,000,000. and will be completed late in 1967. At that time the total investment of the Iron Ore Company of Canada, its subsidiaries and the Carol Pellet Company in mining, concentrating, pelletizing, railway, shipping, and townsite facilities will be in excess of \$558,000,000. More than \$255,000,000. of that amount will be spent in Labrador City. The Iron Ore Company is owned by a group of Canadian and American mining and steel companies and the Carol Pellet Company is owned by the ore consuming shareholders of the Iron Ore Company of Canada. The facilities of the Carol Pellet Company are operated by the Iron Ore Company.

A working force of 1,000 will be required for construction. On the completion of the project it is anticipated that the total payroll will be 1,600. Additional houses will be built this year for sale to employees under an arrangement with the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation. A skating and hockey arena and a Curling Club were added to the existing recreational facilities during the past year. The future recreation programme will include a covered Swimming Pool and a Community Auditorium. The Iron Ore Company and the CBC are now providing a television service to the area.

Since the Iron Ore Company began to produce in 1954, it has shipped a total of 122,000,000 tons of iron ore, concentrates and pellets. This is almost half of all the iron ore produced in Canada in that period. 64,000,000 tons of the total tonnage shipped came from Newfoundland-Labrador. The Iron Ore Company has now become one of the world's major sources of iron ore, shipping its production to steelmakers in Canada, the United States and Europe.

From the inception of operations in 1962, the Company has paid \$49,000,000 in wages and salaries in Labrador City and in the same period has paid to the Government of Newfoundland \$13,000,000 in royalties and taxes of various kinds."

COURT NEWS

Four residents of Wabush, charged with a breach of the Forest Fires Act, were arraigned in Court this past week. The charge against three of the individuals was dismissed and the fourth man was convicted and fined \$50.00 or one month in HMP. The Magistrate pointed out the seriousness of this matter and the necessity for every one to be cautious when in or near our wooded areas. This offence occurred last Summer.

A resident of Labrador City, an employee of Hussey Engineering Limited, was charged with Impaired Driving and was convicted and fined \$125.00 or 14 days imprisonment and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a highway in Canada for a period of nine months. The same man was also charged with driving a motor vehicle while his license was suspended. This case will be completed this week.

Another resident of Labrador City, charged with a breach of the Highway Traffic Act had the case against him dismissed.

One man charged with Impaired Driving had his case postponed and he was released on bail.

A resident of Wabush appeared in Court on eleven charges of false pretences. The evidence showed that the accused used worthless cheques at business houses in Wabush. Judgement will be given in this matter later.

A resident of Labrador City, charged under the Highway Traffic Act, with having improper brakes on his vehicle had the case against him dismissed.

During the week a number of minor traffic offences were heard and the usual fines imposed.
