Since last November all English radio has come from Halifax. There are widespread complaints since then that local news, announcements and weather no longer reach us.

As for television, would you like more viewing time, a change in programs, more French or more English, two separate channels? Or would you like the CBC to take over the running of the station here? Here is your chance to speak your mind. But please, as far as programs are concerned, mention alternatives for any shows you ask to have removed.

We would like to remind the residents of Labrador City that it is thanks to the Iron Ore Company of Canada that we have television at all. They have done their part in bringing it here, now it is up to the rest of us to get the viewing we desire by letting the CBC know our likes and dislikes.

So, lets get busy and do something about the situation. Check whichever boxes you wish, add your comments, sign your name, if there is not enough space, attach a note. Return these to the Carol News, Box 1813, we will see that they are forwarded to the CBC and they, in turn will know that our Town does care.

REPORT FROM THE PROVINCIAL CAPITAL

CONFEDERATION BUILDING, 21 JAN. '66

The Fourth Session of the Thirty-Third General Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador was opened by His Honour The Honourable Fabian O'Dea, Q.C. Lieutenant-Governor, at 3 pm Wednesday 12 January 1966. Only two items in the fourteen page SPEECH FROM THE THRONE will directly effect the District of Labrador West. (a) "My Ministers will lay before you legislation to create a new Department of Labrador Affairs. This Department will be charged with the duty of promoting and assisting in every appropriate way the speedy development of Labrador, both as to natural resources and public and social conveniences. My Ministers are determined to reverse the tendency so often felt on the Island of Newfoundland to regard the resources of Labrador as being primarily of advantage to the Island. They are anxious to impress upon all concerned the fact that the resources of Labrador must be made to mean very great advantage and benefit to the people who work and reside in Labrador. It would be the desire of my Ministers as soon as may be to make the Department of Labrador Affairs the responsibility of a Minister who would have few, if any, additional departmental duties." (b) "Legislation will be placed before you in connection with the erection of a Public Building at Wabush in Labrador."

On Thursday 20 January 1966 Mr. Charles S. Devine, M.H.A. (Independent-Labrador West) delivered a twenty one page address in reply to the SPEECH FROM THE THRONE. Here follow excerpts from this speech.

"Housing is at present our No. 1 problem in Labrador West" stated Mr. Devine. "We require a minimum of 150 units in both Labrador City and Wabush, this in addition to the 100 unit apartment building under construction at Labrador City." The Assembly's lone Independent Member said any housing that could be had through the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation would be too expensive for the average worker and that serviced company lots for trailers were but "stop-gap" measures. He noted that Ottawa will make available \$12 million for subsidized housing for Eskimos in the Northwest Territories this year and asked if some assistance might also be made available to Western Labrador which pays more taxes to the Federal Treasury than N.T. and the Yukon combined. Continuing his remarks he stated that unless good housing is made available, a shanty town may develop around the fringes of Labrador City-Wabush. He suggested that Sir Brian Dunfield, recognized as one of Canada's leading housing authorities, be appointed as a one man commission to look into housing problems in both towns.

Charles Devine (Independent-Labrador West) said during the Throne Speech Debate there was a lack of contact with the rest of the Province and in a blistering attack he placed much of the blame on the government-run Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. Young children have nothing to watch on television between 6 and 7 but an Indian head test pattern. He said that when Iron Ore Company received permission to establish a television station Wabush Mines were asked to assist but refused. At the same time the company presented the City of Seven Islands with a \$24,000 school bus, and are sponsoring full-length movies on a St. John's television station, which he added, are of little entertainment value to people residing on the shores of Wabush Lake. It would cost \$110,000.00 to install a second antenna for simultaneous English and French telecasting, which is the approximate value of 24 hours production from Scully Mine.

"The time has come for this company (Wabush Mines) to take stock of their responsibilities towards Labrador West and to integrate into the District."

"There is still the feeling that we are neglected taxpayers and there are still some Provincial services to which we should have better access." A trunk road from the Western boundary, to the Strait of Bell Isle, would be a good thing, but it would probably take 10 to 15 years to complete, he continued, but a few miles of local roads would do much to lessen the feeling of claustrophobia. Mr. Devine said it was his understanding that the Federal Government will pay all construction costs and 85% of maintenance costs of roads that join established resource development projects. "Surely the two Provincial Governments can get together and build a road from Labrador City-Wabush to Gagnonville, P.Q., which would, within two or three years end our curse of isolation".

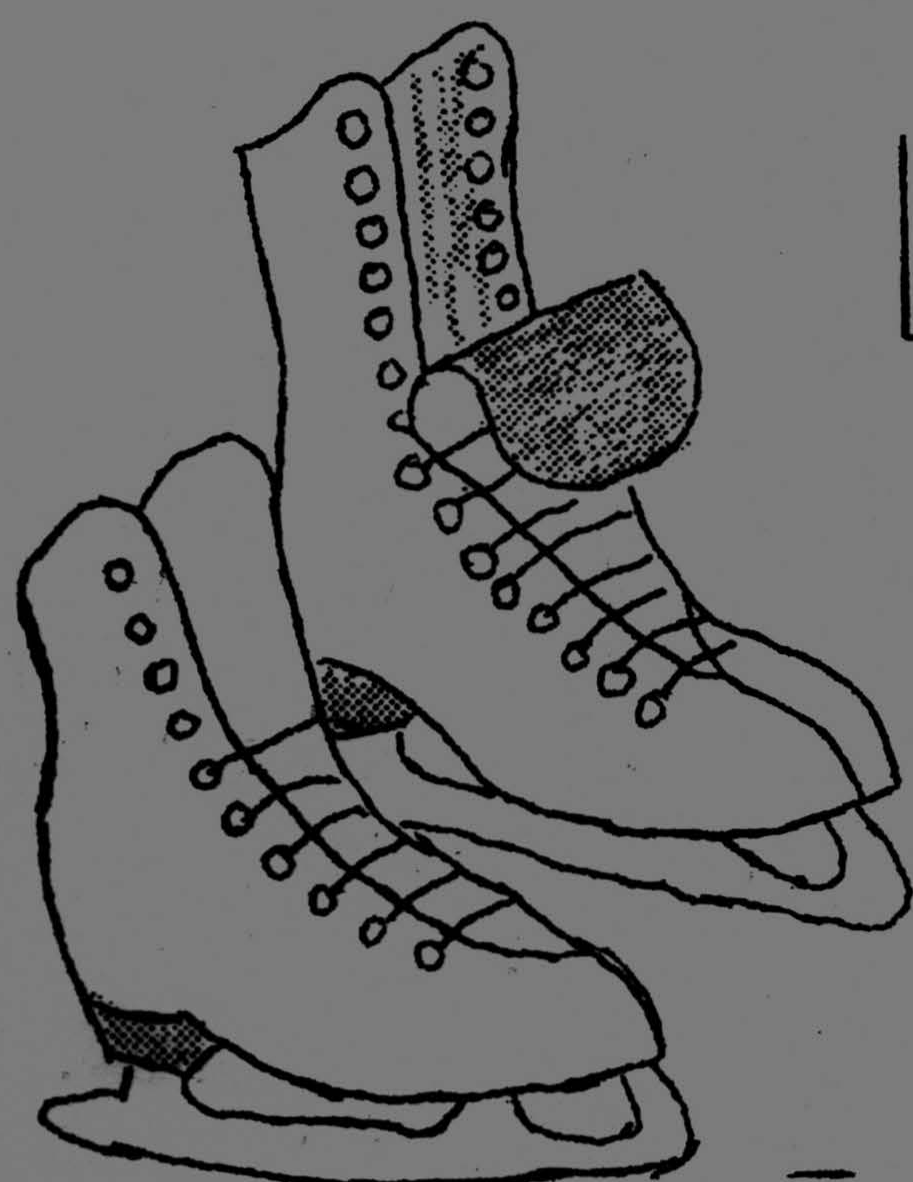
