## BLUE MIST DISASTER FUND

The Carol News and it's readers were saddened this past week to hear of the loss of the Grand Bank trawler BLUE MIST 11, and her 13 crewmembers. The trawler radioed February 18th. she was fighting a severe storm. She was never heard from again. Of the 13 men who were lost, 12 were married, leaving 32 children and 12 widows.

The CJON Radio and T.V. Stations have launched a campaign for funds for these dependents and the Bank of Nova Scotia in the Province of Newfoundland has agreed to accept the donations without charge.

In Court in Labrador City during the past week, with Magistrate L. W. Wicks presiding -

A man was charged with 2 breaches of the Alcoholic Liquor Act. One being drunk in a public place - the other, the possession of illegal liquor. He was convicted and fined \$20.00 or 14 days imprisonment on each charge.

A resident was charged with impaired driving and was convicted and fined \$100.00 or 14 days. He was prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a Highway in Canada for 6 months.

A Wabush Resident was charged with 11 breaches of false pretenses - that of writing worthless cheques. He was placed on suspended sentence for 2 years, on condition he abstain from alcohol and he sign a Bond of \$500.00, and pay back the amount received by the worthless cheques within 2 months and that he report to a Probation Officer when required.

Another resident of Wabush was charged with possession of stolen goods and fined \$100.00 or 2 months imprisonment.

A Labrador City resident was charged with Hit and Run. He was convicted and fined \$100.00 or 1 month. He was prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a Highway in Canada for 6 months.

A Wabush Resident was charged with impaired driving and fined \$75.00 or 14 days. He was prohibited from driving a motor vehicle on a Highway in Canada for 6 months.

Two residents of Wabush were charged under the Newfoundland and Labrador Dog Act - that of allowing their dogs to be at large. They were convicted and fined \$5.00 or 1 day each.

A considerable number of traffic offences were heard and disposed of with appropriate action.

RELEASE FROM THE MAGISTRATES OFFICE

ROYAL COMMISSION ON TRANSPORTATION & COMMUNICATIONS

Magistrate L. W. Wicks advises that he has received correspondence from the Chairman of the Royal Commission on Transportation, the Hon. P. J. Lewis.

When the Commission held its hearing at Labrador City, Magistrate Wicks stated that, in view of the short notice, many persons, firms or organizations may not have had ample opportunity to prepare briefs etc. He requested the Commission therefore, to permit the receipt of written letters and briefs at a later date, and that these be given the same consideration as if presented at the formal hearing.

In his letter to Magistrate Wicks, the Hon. Mr. Lewis regretted the fact, that more residents of Labrador City and Wabush did not have opportunity to be present at the hearing. He therefore assured the Magistrate that the Commission would give most serious consideration to any letter or briefs, long or short, that any person, firm or organization might submit to it, and these submissions would receive the same study as all others in the preparation of the Commission's final report to the Government of the Province.

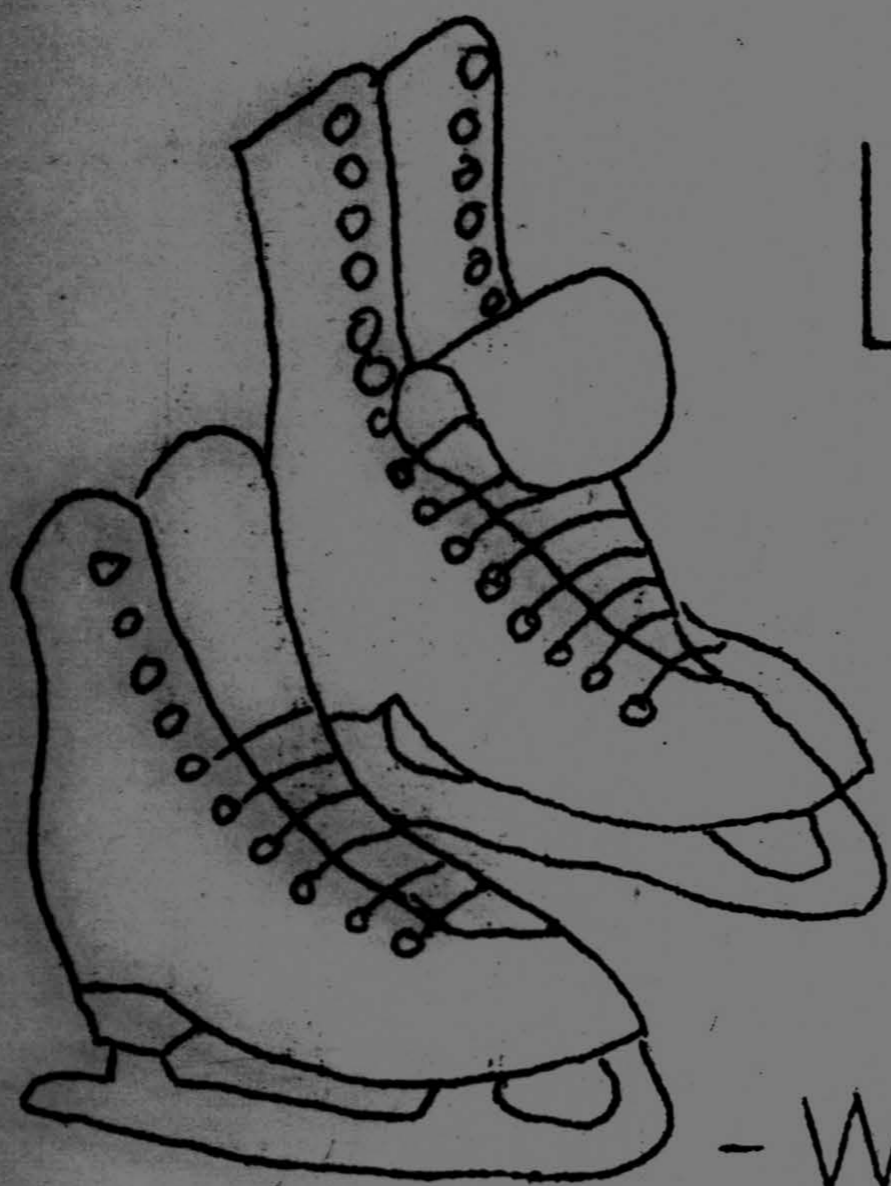
