OUR TOWN

Another milestone in the continual growth of our Town, was reached on Friday, March 11th. at 8 pm, when the Labrador City Arena was officially opened. Mr. L. Coombes, chairman of the Recreation Commission was the Master of Ceremonies and spoke words of welcome to the residents of the Town along with the special guests. Standing on centre ice, were the Board of Trustees, the Iron Ore Company officials, the men representing their companies who did the actual building of the Arena, also Mr. Charles Devine, Ind. Member of Parliament Labrador West, and the Hon. B. J. Abbott, Minister of Municipal Affairs & Supply.

Mr. Rose of the Architectural firm who designed the building spoke first and handed the keys over to Mr. McNicol representing the Building Contractors. He in turn passed the keys to the Hon. B. J. Abbott, that he may officially open the arena.

In Mr. Abbott's address, he mentioned that it was just 8 years ago that the Iron Ore Company began the detailed exploratory work in the Carol Lake Area. The project was developed and a town commenced to grow. In 1959 there were just a few prefabricated buildings and some trailers. But the men desired their families to be with them and the year 1961 saw it boasting 191 houses, plus trailers with a population of 1700 people. It was that year that it was set as a Government Local Improvement District, administered by an appointed Board of Trustees, which has all the qualifications of a town council. By 1965 the town had developed to 648 houses, 100 trailers and 85 apartments and a population of 5400 people. Today it is a modern town in every respect with many stores, schools, churches, hospital town hall and library.

Community affairs are very important in the life of a town, and with this thought the Board of Trustees with the co-operation of the Iron Ore Co. built the Arena as well as the Curling Club.

Mr. Abbott said he was honoured to have the privilege of opening the Arena and ended his talk by expressing his hope that there develop a spirit of sportsmanship within the walls that would be felt through out the province. He then handed the keys to Mr. E. P. Murphy, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and thus the Arena was officially opened.

In Mr. Murphy's response, he said that he was extremely happy to see the long awaited for Arena. His hope was that it was only the beginning of the recreational facilities for our community and he thanked the Provincial Government and the Iron Ore Co. of Canada for their encouragement and assistance in making the dream a reality.

Mr. M. Monaghan, then spoke a few words on behalf of the Iron Ore Co. He expressed his hope that the facilities would be used by all citizens. We have potential here, he said, as proven by our Bowling Teams, Basket-ball and Hockey Teams who have all represented us well.

At the conclusion of these ceremonies, there took place the introduction of the Carnival Princesses for this year, as well as Miss Kay Williams who was last years Queen. Sponsered by the Ashuanipi Social Club was Miss Rosemary Hatt. By the Carol Shopping Centre was Miss Marriette Chamberlain. By Bowring Brothers Ltd., was Miss Louise Ouellet and by the Labrador City Trapshooting Club, Miss Sarah Murray.

A hockey game between the Wabush High School and the Labrador City Collegiate followed, in which the Labrador City boys were the victors with a score of 9 - 4.

On Saturday afternoon, March 12th. at 4 pm the Carol Curling Club was also officially opened. Mr. Bill Campbell was the Master of Ceremonies and welcomed Mr. Edwards, resident commissioner of Labrador, Mr. Rowe, Deputy-minister of Municipal Affairs, Mr. Charles Devine, Ind. Labrador west, Mr. H. Farnham and Mr. M. Monaghan of the Iron Ore Co. and Mr. Rockwell, president of the Newfoundland Curling Association. He then introduced Mr. Bill Lindstrom, the Carol Curling Club President. Mr. Lindstrom on behalf of the executive and members of the club, thanked the Board of Trustees and the Iron Ore Co. for our new Curling facilities.

Mr. Monaghan replied and mentioned that the new club was great improvement over the old one, which started 4 years ago. He said the Iron Ore Co. was pleased that another unit had been added to our recreational complex. He welcomed the visiting Rinks and also congratulated Bishop Seaborn who was present, on his recently acquired new responsibilities as Primate Bishop of Newfoundland.

Mr. Rockwell, president of the Newfoundland Curling Association then spoke and stated it was a pleasure for him to be present for this opening and the Bonspiel. Coming from St. John's, he said the folks there hear of us in Labrador City and what we are doing, but one must see the area to really appreciate it. He was very impressed. In our new facilities, he said, the adults can now enjoy this Top Game, and also be able to teach it to our young people. He then presented Mr. Bill Lindstrom with a Newfoundland Curling Association Pin, and proceeded to go to the ice to officially throw the first rock.

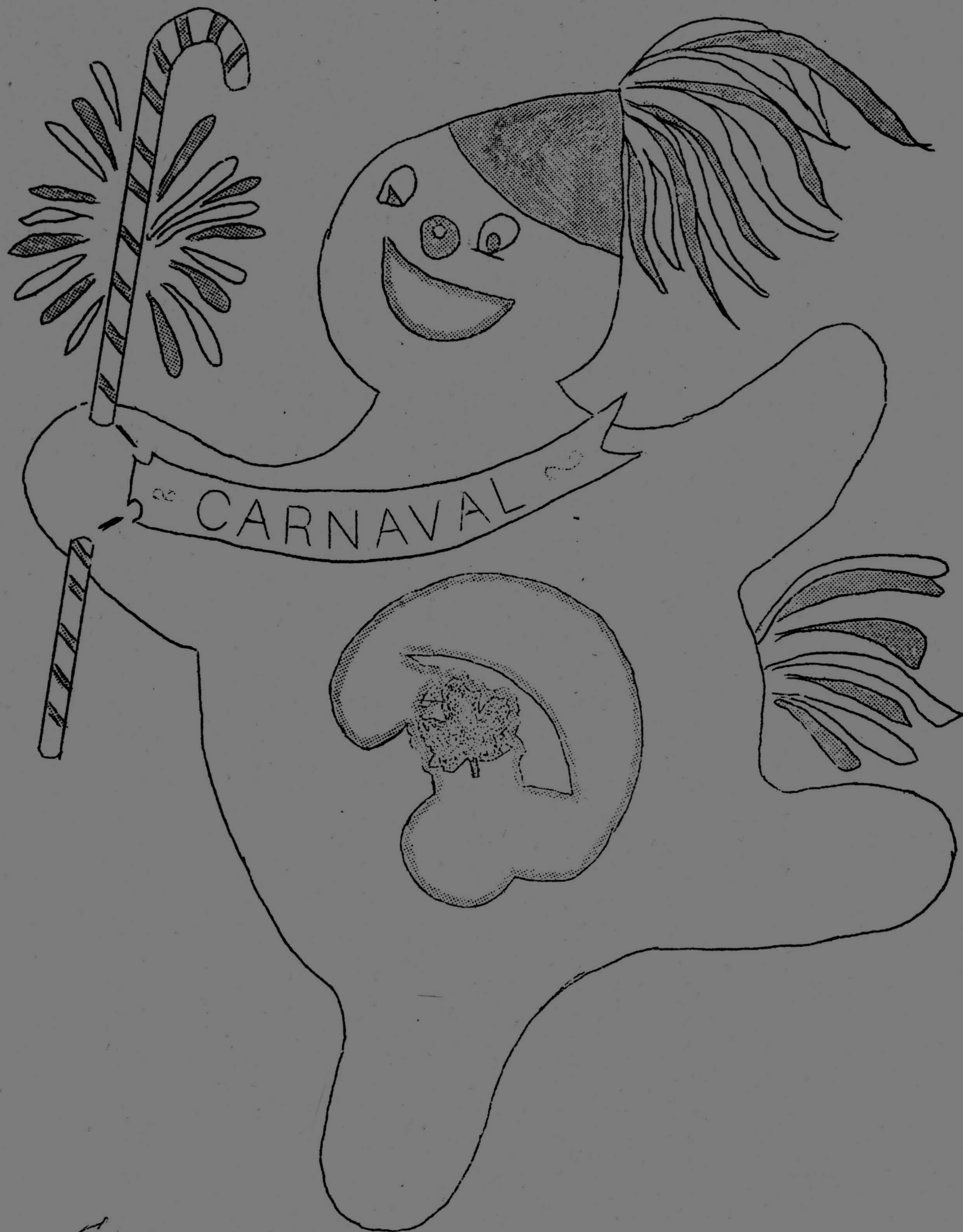


