Let Him into your life and heart this Easter as He waits outside and seeks admittance.

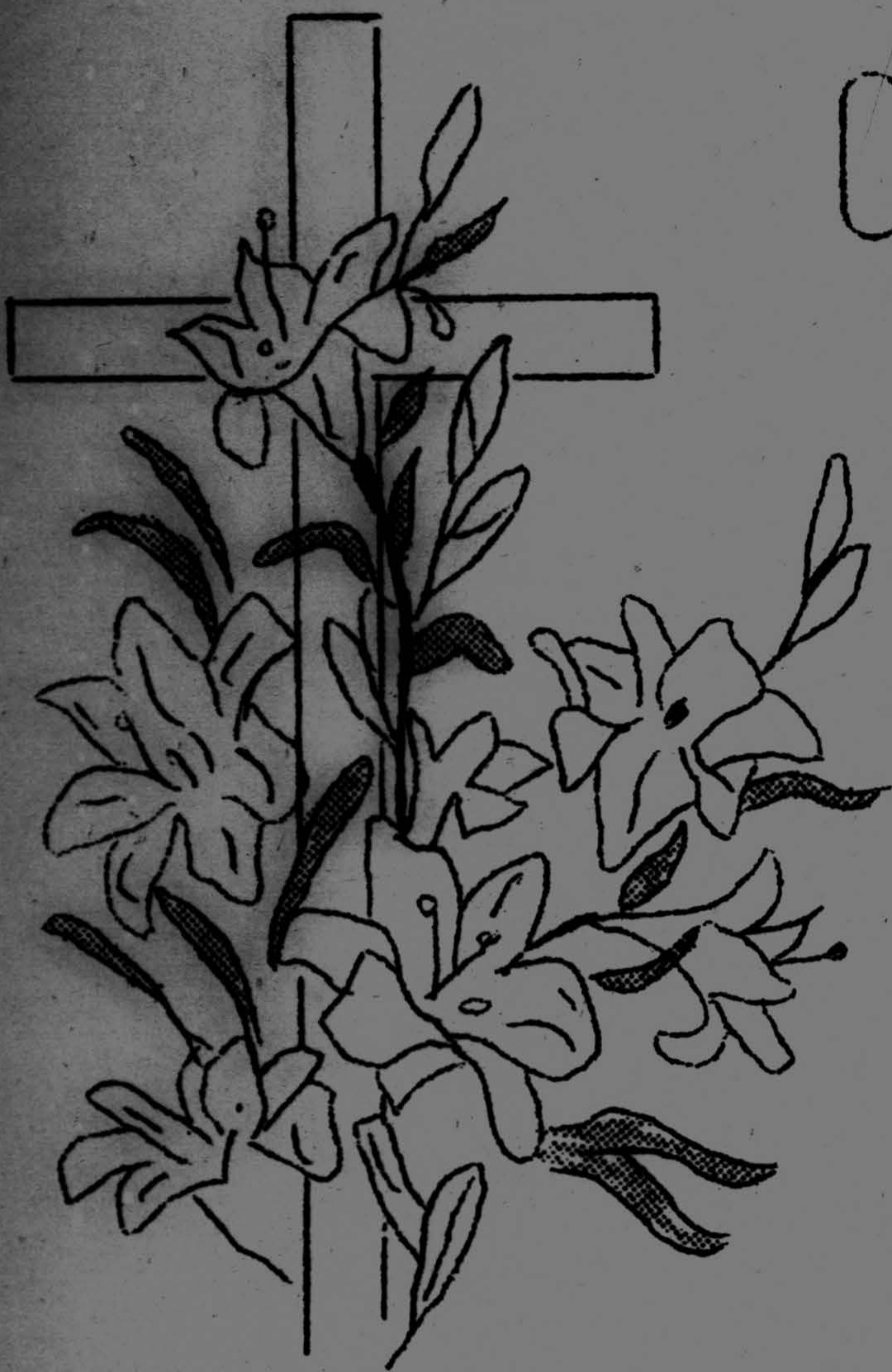

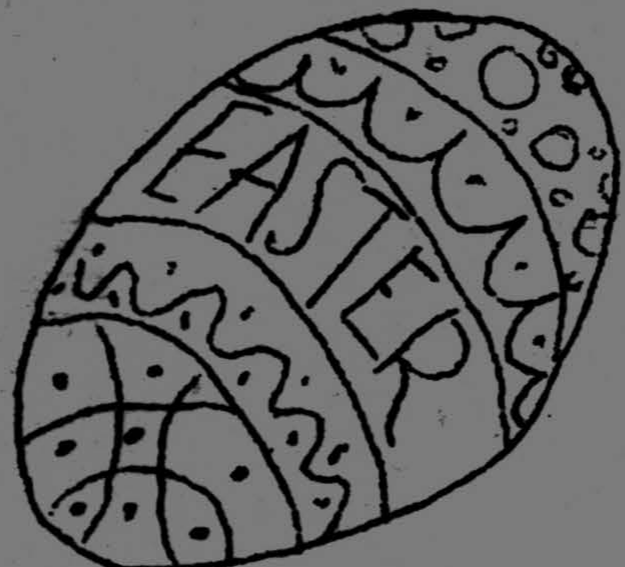

MEMORIAL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The Director of the Extension Department of Memorial University of Newfoundland, Mr. Donald Snowden, visited Labrador City and Wabush from March 30 to April 1. He was accompanied to this area by Mr. Harold Stamp, the Chairman of the Alumni Association at Memorial. During their visit, they called on both Mine Managers, the Union representatives, and the school principals in each town. They also attended a meeting of the Labrador City- Wabush Branch of the Alumni Association.

The reason for the visit was to finalize plans for an extensive survey to determine just what extension courses may be offered. The plan is to circulate a questionnaire to all adults in both towns, and if the demand is great enough, the Extension Department of Memorial will arrange for all courses with at least twenty applicants to begin in September of this year. Classes will be held in the schools in the area, but will not necessarily replace the present adult education program. Some of the courses that will be available are as follows:

It must be understood that these are only suggested courses and that people filling out the questionnaire may feel free to suggest any courses which they would like to see provided.

Credit courses may also be provided if there is a demand. There will be a tuition fee charged in all cases which will be the same rate as is charged in all other places in the province where courses are operated.

In addition to course work, the Extension Department is anxious to extend other services such as travelling Drama Workshops, assistance with the formation of Glee Clubs, travelling Art Exhibitions, and providing distinguished speakers in a great variety of fields.

You will be approached in the near future to fill in this questionnaire. Please co-operate to make sure that our survey is complete.
