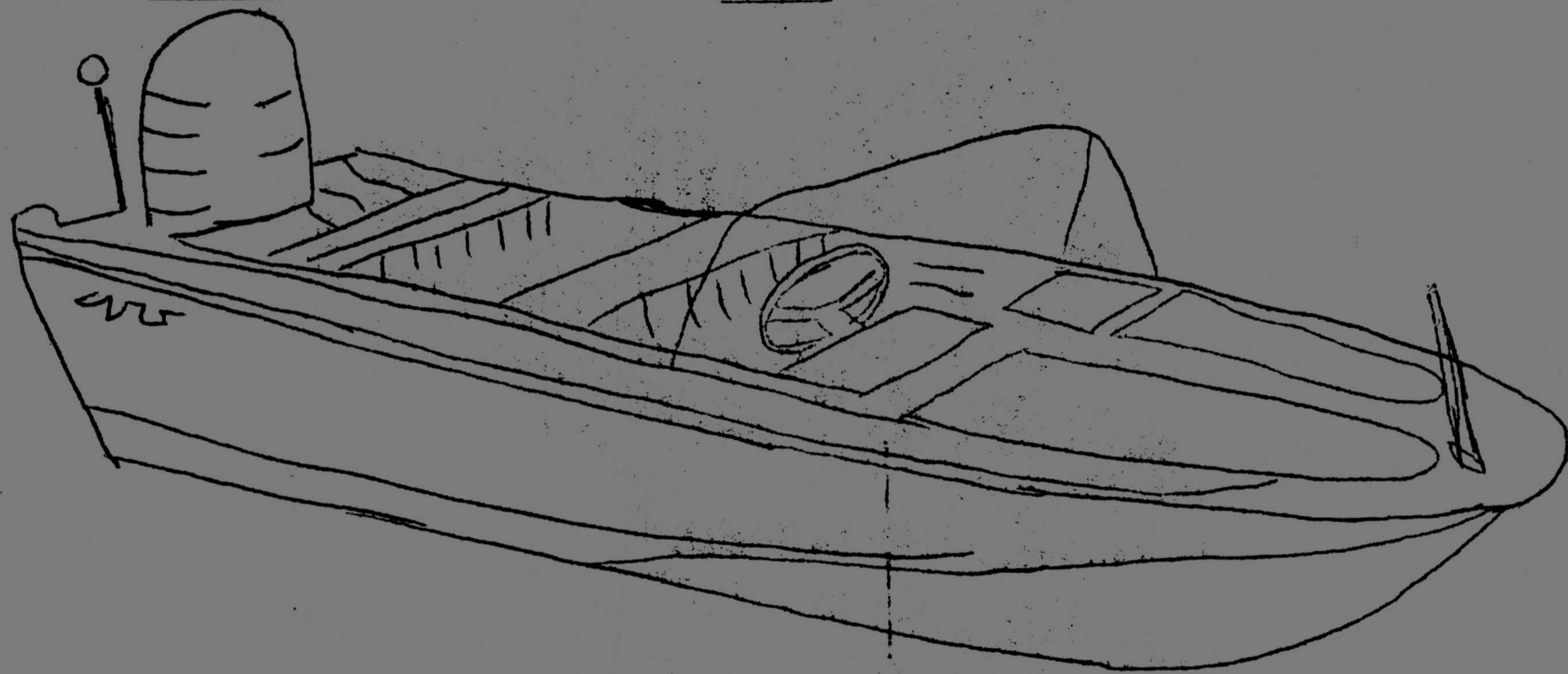

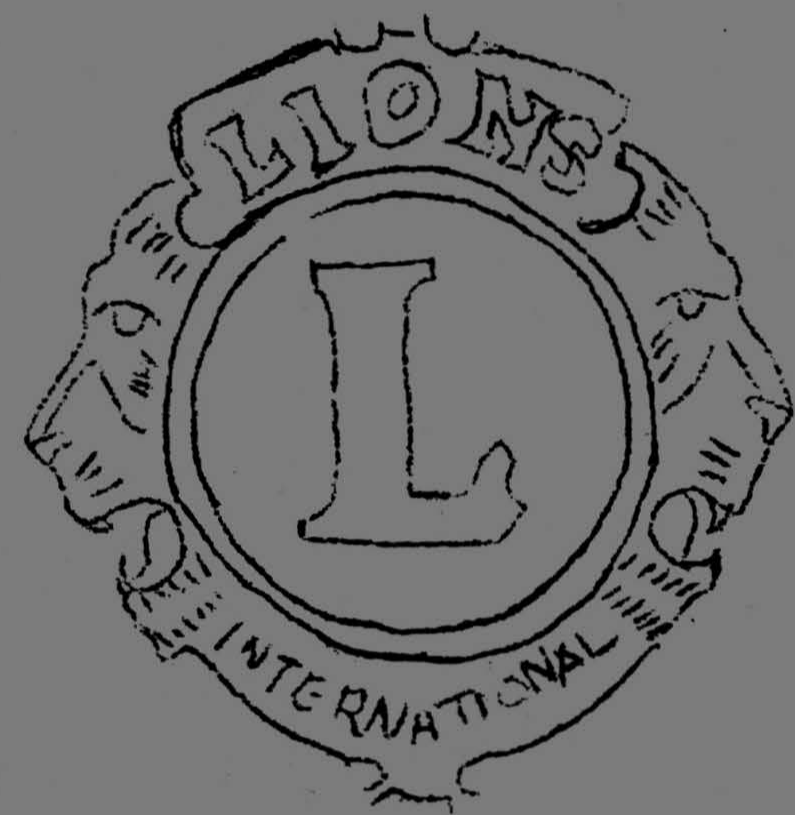

### R.C.M.P. MUSICAL RIDE and BAND 1967 CENTENNIAL TOUR

The Hon. J.R. Chalker, Minister in charge of Centennial Affairs for the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, has been advised by Commissioner Geo. B. McClellan that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police will be providing a self-sustained presentation of the Musical Ride and Band in Newfoundland, during Centennial Year. Performances will also be given in various centres across Canada beginning in June and ending in September with a ten day stand at EXPO 67

This special tour is sponsored solely by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and is one of their contributions to Canada's Centennial celebrations:

The programme will be approximately one hour and forty-five minutes in length, the format as follows:

- (a) A 40 minute concert presentation by the Band and fanfare trumpets - the repertoire will be military and concert band pieces and is expected to include one piece especially written for the Centennial year by an outstanding Canadian composer. This will lead to
- (b) A performance by the Musical Ride, accompanied by the Band. This will be 20 minutes in length and is a 32 mounted member display in full dress - this will be followed by
- (c) A presentation of a Retreat Ceremony, by the Band, including quick and slow marches on parade, a Drum Corps display, the Evening Hymn and Flag Lowering, leading to the conclusion
- (d) A "March Past" by the Ride and Band to the Regimental March of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. The Salute will be taken by an invited dignitary.

The following regulations have been made by the Board of Trustees of the Local Improvement District of Labrador City under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1966, and were approved by me on the 28th. day of April, A.D. 1966.

REGULATIONS

1. The Local Improvement District of Labrador City (Taxi) Regulations, 1961, are hereby further amended by repealing Regulation 23A and substituting therefore the following:-

23A The rates and fares to be charged by the owners and drivers of taxicabs for the transportation of any passenger or passengers on any trip, which commences and terminates within the District, shall be in accordance with the tariff of prices shown in Schedule A to these regulations annexed.

2. These Regulations shall come into effect on the 9th day of May, A.D., 1966, and may be cited as the Local Improvement District of Labrador City (Taxi) (No. 2 Amendment) Regulations, 1966.

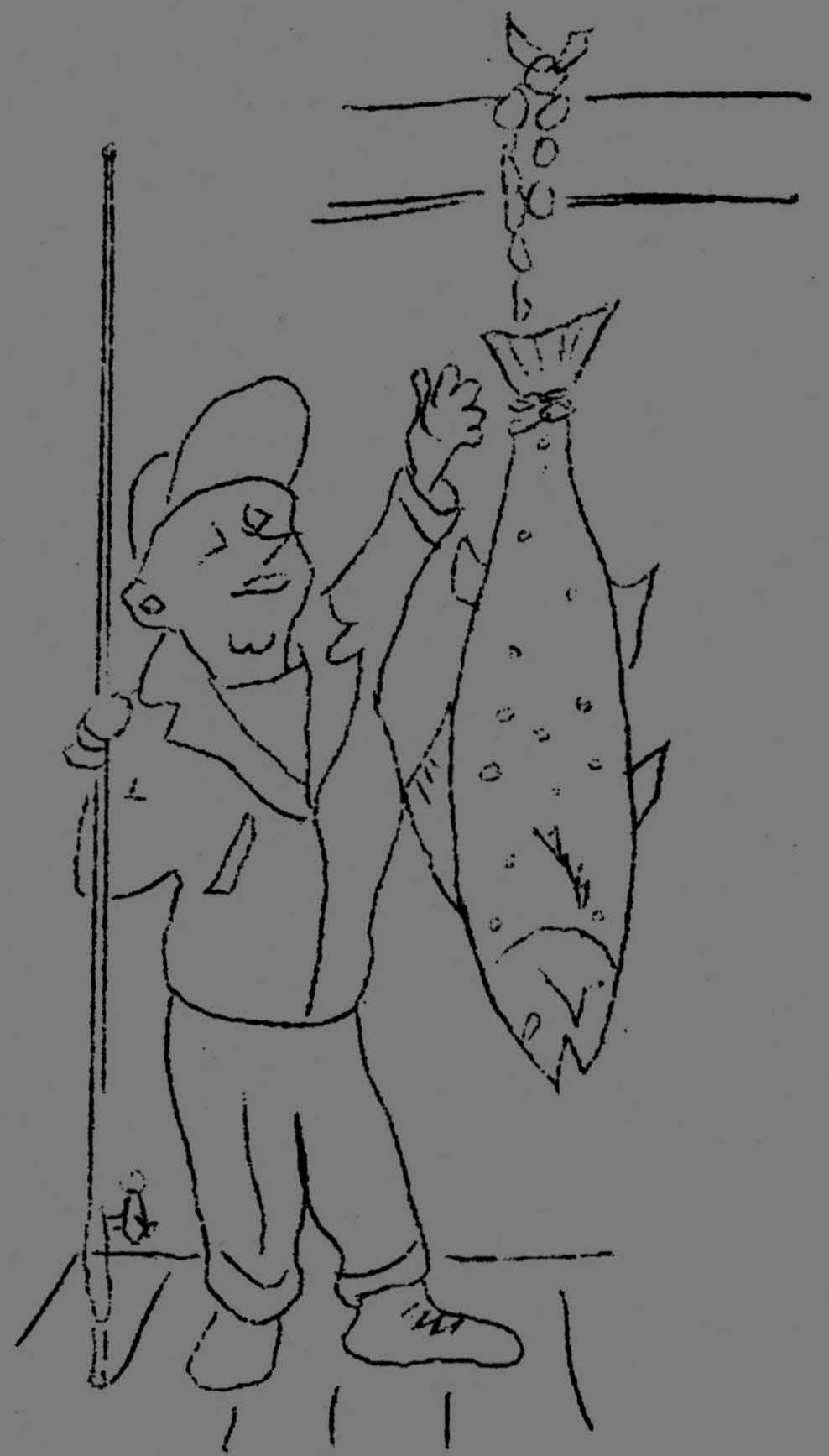
