It is very disconcerting to see youngsters weaving across the road, even the very little ones who still have training wheels on, are wobbling back and forth, in their effort to ride well, like their older counterparts. Surely it must be clear that this is hardly fair to the motorists. Usually the driver is left in a state of indcision as to what the child is going to do.

Good traffic sense taught in the very early years, will carry over to the future, when our youngsters will in turn be a motorist!

I wish first to thank the Publisher of the Carol News, Mrs. Marion Smith for the opportunity to make the following statement.

Since my return from the Provincial P. C. Leadership Convention, held at Gander, Nfld. last month, I have been asked by many of my friends and supporters to elaborate on certain statements circulating in Western Labrador.

On 19 Nov. 1962, I was elected by the voters of Labrador West as an opposition Member of the Newfoundland House of Assembly. During the past four sessions of the Legislature, I have, to the best of my ability, represented the people of this area as their representative in the peoples House.

I do not wish to, here, go into the record of the past four years, this will be presented to the voters within the near future. However one thing I state now: at all times since my election to the House of Assembly, I have tried to place the interests of the people of Labrador West, first and foremost.

Before joining the P. C. Party of Newfoundland and Labrador, assurances were given me by the new leader Dr. Murphy, that neither he nor the party, would in any way interfere with my expressions regarding the aspirations of the residents of this area. It would be, it will be, complete freedom of political thoughts and actions, and I believe the District of Labrador West will benefit by this decision.

No change in party loyalty was involved because I was not previously a party Member. The move was merely FROM OPPOSITION MEMBER TO MEMBER OF THE OPPOSITION.

I trust the above will clear any misunderstanding on the matter.

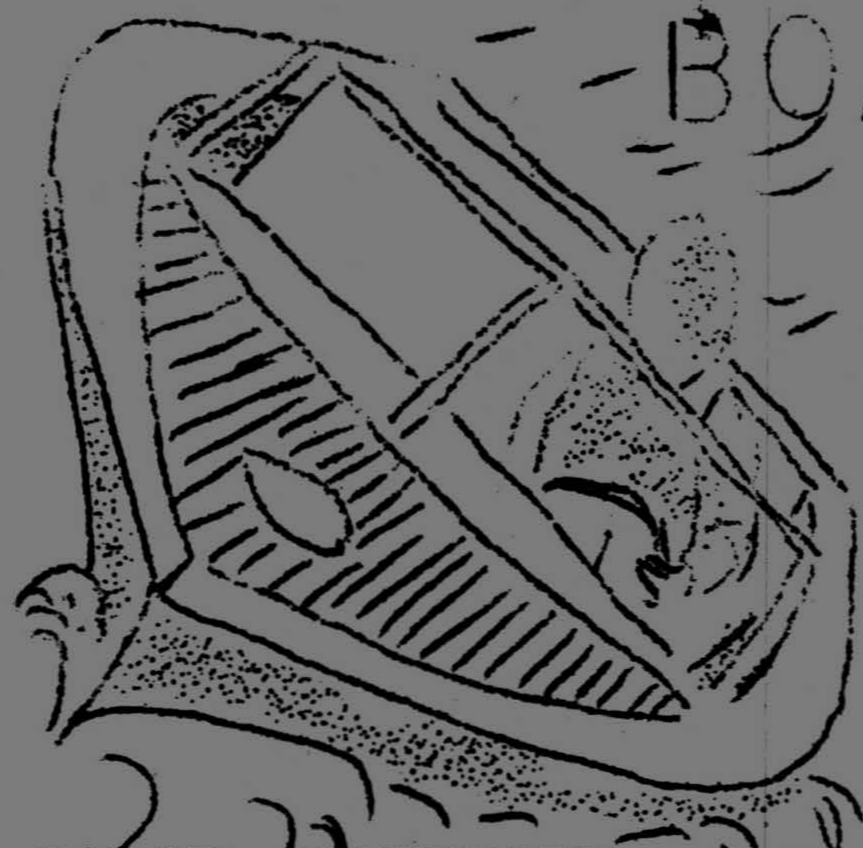

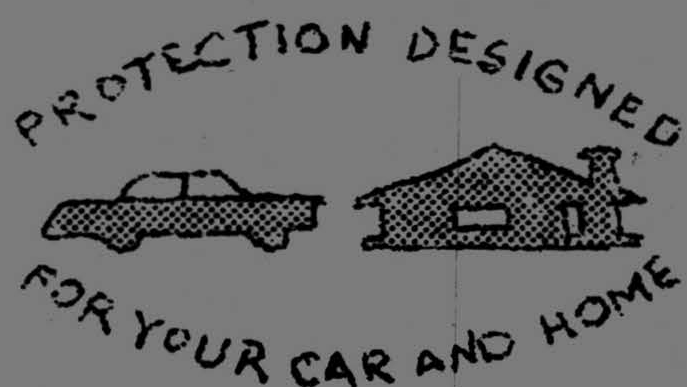
