Last week-end a tragedy occurred in Labrador City, in which a child died. Accidentally.

If this had happened to an employee of any of the various companies in the area, it would have been also tragic, but not as shocking as a child killed while PLAYING! The larger companies have vast and expensive safety programs and departments set up and operating to try to avoid accidents of any kind. They still have accidents, but one must take into consideration the variety of operations, machinery and the numbers of people involved.

Children can get great pleasure from a variety of small and simple things. But sometimes these simple things can be very hazardous. Like digging a cave in a sandpit, or sailing on a make shift raft in a hole full of water, Such was the case last week-end. The hole was left over from some construction work down near the old air strip. Full of water, with lovely rafts of plywood floating on it. All very tempting to a small adventurous boy.

Some people will probably say that children should be kept more closely at home. But they more than likely have no 6 or 7 year old boys. You cannot tie a boy of that age to a rope in the yard like a puppy. They go to school and are starting to learn that there is a big world around them to be explored. Unfortunately they are a little young to understand or realize all the dangers in that world. They are just starting to learn.

In both Labrador City and Wabush, we have marvelous community spirit. Any kind of an organization can get started, social, sports, entertainment - you name them, we have them. Why can we not have an organization or an off-shoot of one of the established ones, for reporting or even eliminating hazards to small children?

Just going for a drive one can notice some of these menacing spots, Many people go walking. If they could pick up the phone on their return home and report these hazards to some committee or body which could implement the elimination of these danger spots we could go a long way in stopping the repetition of these distressing accidents.

## COURT NEWS

The following items are some of the cases heard in Magistrate's Court over the past month.

A man was charged with 2 offences and convicted of stealing from Dominion Stores and Ayre's Ltd. and placed on suspended sentence for 2 years

Two men were convicted of causing a disturbance at the Sir Wilfred Grenfell Hotel Tavern and fined \$50. or 30 days each, and placed under a Bond of \$200. to keep the peace and be of good behaviour in every respect.

A young resident of Wabush was convicted of 2 offenses under the Alcoholic Liquor Act - drunk in a public place and being in a licenced establishment while under the age of 21. He was fined \$20.00 on the first charge and sentenced to 5 days imprisonment on the second. This being his 2nd. offence.

A man was charged with malicious damage to a room in the Camp Site and placed on suspended sentence for 1 year. The same chap was also convicted of being in a licenced establishment while under age.

A resident of Labrador City was charged with impaired driving and was convicted and fined \$100.00 or 14 days, and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a highway in Canada for a period of 6 months. He was represented by lawyer David Sparks.

Another young man was convicted of theft from Northern Drugs in Wabush and placed on suspended sentence, for 1 year.

A resident of Labrador City was charged with dangerous driving and had his case post-poned till a later date.

A large number of Traffic Offences involving local residents have been heard in Magistrates Court in the past 3 weeks and appropriate penalties imposed where convictions were registered.

A male resident of Schefferville was convicted of fraudulently obtaining board & lodging from Sir Wilfred Grenfell Hotel and was ordered to sign a Bond of \$500. and pay compensation of \$185.00 to the Hotel.

A Wabush resident was convicted of forgery, that of falsifying a termination slip and was Bonded in the amount of \$200. and sentence was suspended for 2 years. He was ordered to report to Probation officer as often as required.

Another Wabush resident was charged with malicious damage to property and of assaulting a police officer and was convicted of both offences

A young man was charged with 2 offences under Alcoholic Liquor Act. Being in an establishment under 21 years of age and removing liquor illegally from the establishment. Charges were dismissed.

A transient was convicted of 2 offences under the Al. Liquor Act, Under age and illegal removal of liquor. He was fined \$50. or 30 days.

Two residents of Labrador City were convicted of impaired driving on June 9. They were fined \$100. or 7 days and prohibited from driving for 6 months

A young man from Wabush was convicted of malicious damage in Sir Wilfred Grenfell Hotel Tavern. Evidence showed that this man upset 7 tables, smashed 3 chairs, and a number of glasses and ash-trays cutting 2 people. He remained in custody for sentence later. He was also convicted for being in a Tavern under 21 years of age and was convicted of the same offence a month ago.

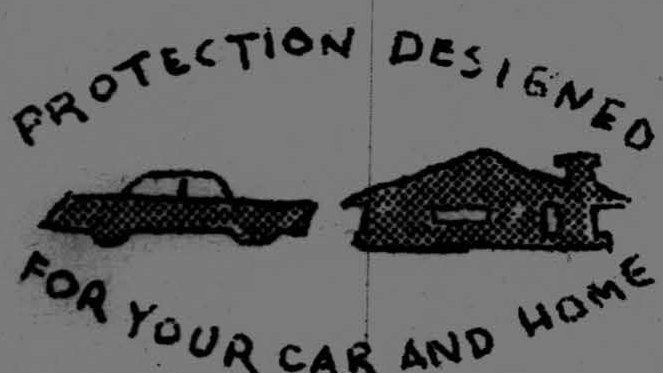
