TO THE EDITOR:

Since my recent comment on the Newfoundland Labrador - Quebec Boundary I have been asked, what I would consider a basis to commence discussions with the government of Quebec on the subject. Listed below is a nine point presentation:

- (1) Immediate start on construction of a Highway from Labrador City-Wabush to Gagonville, P.Q., and on to join with the Quebec road system to Montreal.
- (2) A comprehensive plan covering an inter-Labrador highway system connecting Labrador City-Wabush to Goose Bay-Happy Valley.
- (3) Removal of all Provincial Sales and Personal Income Taxes.
- (4) Reduction of the Gasoline Tax from 17 to 5 cents per gallon.
- (5) Reduce Air Fares from Labrador to Quebec points by 25%.
- (6) Establishment of Junior College-Trade Schools in both Western and Central Labrador
- (7) Start on construction, THIS YEAR, of the Hamilton Falls Power Development
- (8) An agreement whereby at least 50% of all Taxes & Royalties received through resource development be expended within LABRADOR.
- (9) Direct Radio & Television service from both the English & French Networks of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

All the above points would have to be ratified by the Quebec Legislature before a plebesite would be requested by the permanent residents of Labrador.

My concluding remarks are addressed to the Editor of the St. John's Evening Telegram:

If I am found guilty by the St. John's Establishment of giving "aid and comfort" (to the enemy); meaning, presumably, Mr. Johnson and the Government of the Province of Quebec: then it is my fondest wish that I be banished to the "wilds of Labrador" for the rest of my natural life.

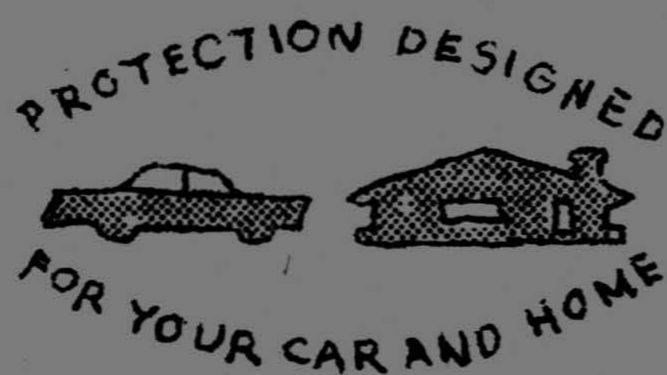

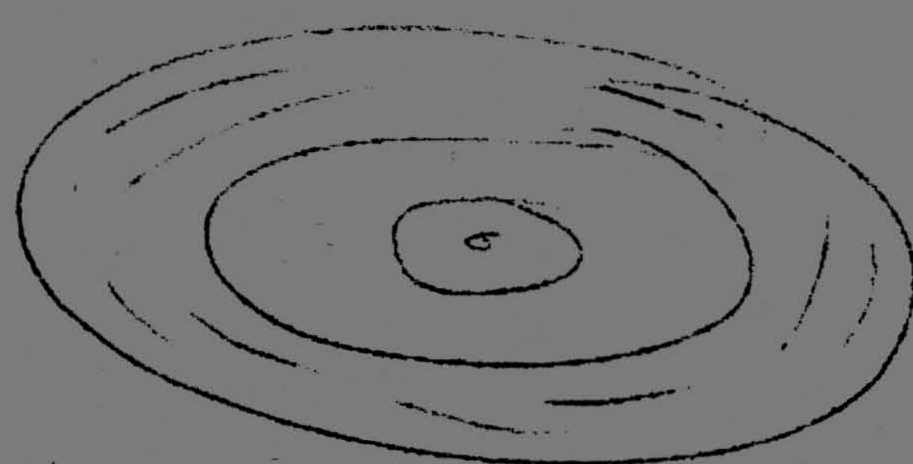
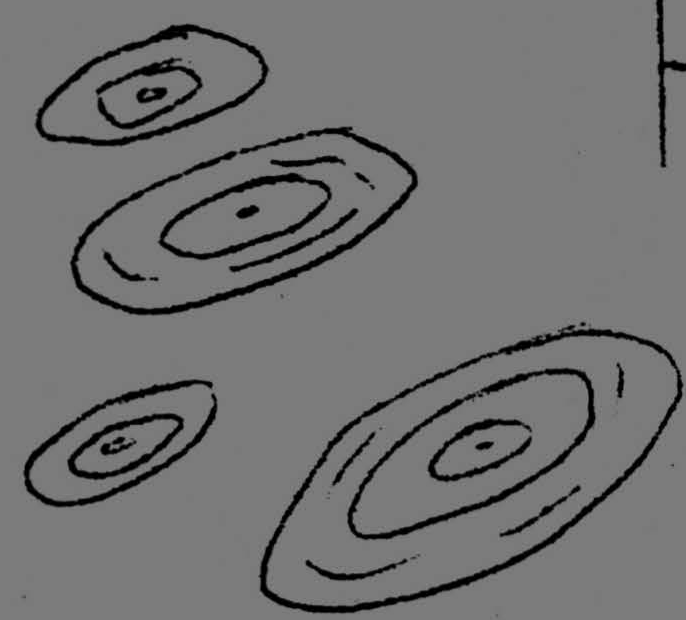
