EDITORIAL

Residents of the Labrador City area are in a particularly unenviable situation. Merchants of this area have little or no competition and consequently are in the driver's seat concerning customer relations. As a result, "customer service" is practically non-existent.

Customers must accept inflated, fluctuating prices because of isolation, but a singular lack of decent service does not have to exist.

Extension of service to customers is not dictated by economic factors but by decent human nature and a desire to provide able clerks and sales personnel who are motivated toward helping customers. The lack of business competition in this area does not mean that customer service can not be provided.

However, if Labrador City can be compared to other communities, then the arrival of competition is the only thing that will rectify the situation. The high cost of living in an area such as ours, is somewhat discouraging but the lack of "customer service" produces a deplorable situation.

This editorial is not meant to be an indictment of all businesses in this area: only ninety-eight per cent of them!

INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING PROVINCIAL ELECTION SEPT.8th.1966

The Returning Officer for the District of Labrador West for the Nfld. Provincial Election being held on Sept.8th 1966, Magistrate L.W.Wicks, has issued the following release to assist persons in voting and to clarify any confusion resulting from the fact that two elections are going on about the same time. Please note this release applies only to the PROVINCIAL GENERAL ELECTION OF SEPT.8th.1966 and has no connection with the Federal By - Election which takes place on Sept.19th 1966. Instructions regarding the latter will be published after the Provincial Election is over.

1. At the end of this release you will find a list of all the Polling Areas and Polling Booth Locations for Labrador City and Wabush. This list will tell each voter, to which Polling Area he belongs, and at which Polling Booth he may vote.

2. Qualifications for voting:

- (a) 19 years of age.
- (b) Newfoundlander, resident in the District of Labrador West as of July 17th, 1966, or
- (c) Canadian citizen or other British Subject, resident in this Province for the past 12 months, and in this district as of July 17th - 1966.
- (d) Hours of voting in this District 6.30 am. to 6.30 pm. - Sept. 8th, 1966.
- (e) There are no advance Polls.
- (f) If a voter's name does not appear on the voter's list, he may still vote, by taking an oath at the Polling Station in Form 35. (If he is other wise qualified)
- (g) How to vote: Mark an X opposite name of candidate for whom you want to vote. Make no other mark on your Ballot Paper, otherwise you spoil your ballot.
- (h) Names of Candidates and their Party in the order they will appear on the Ballot Paper:
 - (1) Thomas William Burgess - Liberal Party
 - (2) Charles S.Devine - Progressive Conservative Party.
 - (3) Albert McGrath - New Democratic Party.
