## SHOULD RELIGION BE TAUGHT IN THE SCHOOLS?

The return of boys and girls to the schools of Labrador City this week raises a perennial question about religious instruction as a part of the educational curriculum. Religion is a part of the program of studies in all schools in Newfoundland, but not a compulsory one. Under the school system followed in Labrador City parents have the option each year of withdrawing their children from these classes after consultation with the school authorities or the clergyman of their denomination.

There are several different views about the place of religious instruction at the elementary and secondary school levels. A traditional one, supported by Roman Catholic educational authorities as well as by many Protestant groups, is that religious instruction not only constitutes a subject in its own right, but that it should also permeate the teaching that goes on in every other subject in the school as well. On the other hand, many people today feel that religious instruction is a matter for churches and Sunday Schools and that it should be kept out of the public schools.

I agree with a third view which considers it worthwhile to have religious instruction both in school and Sunday School. But there is a difference, I believe, in the point of view from which the subject is taught in these two places.

The basic purpose of religious instruction in the schools is to acquaint the child with religion as part of our culture in the same way as a knowledge of history, music, art and literature is also a part of his or her education. At the lower levels of education this involves a general knowledge of the Bible, the source book not only of the religious values of our civilization, but also of every other branch of culture as well. At the higher levels this basic knowledge is broadened to include a history of the Christian church, discussion of ethical and moral questions and a knowledge of other religions as well.

It is important to note, however, that this program of religious education is not intended and should not be used to teach Christian doctrine, or to bring a child to believe in God or to make a religious decision. That is a task that belongs to the parents, churches, Sunday Schools and other groups and individuals outside the school.

The ministers of Labrador City in conjunction with the school authorities have drawn up a program of religious education which we believe will bring boys and girls to the knowledge of the place of religion within our society. Every parent should avail their children of this opportunity of broadening and deepening their general education.

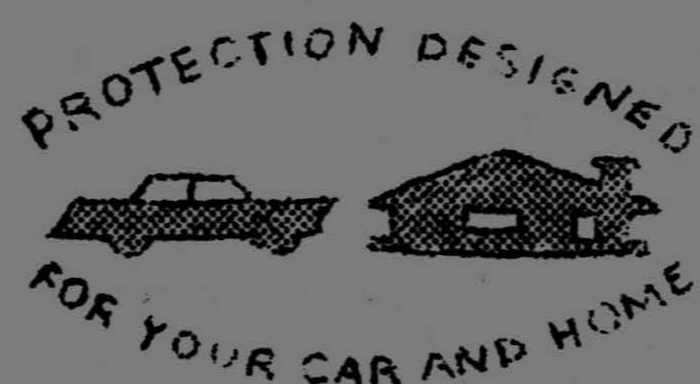

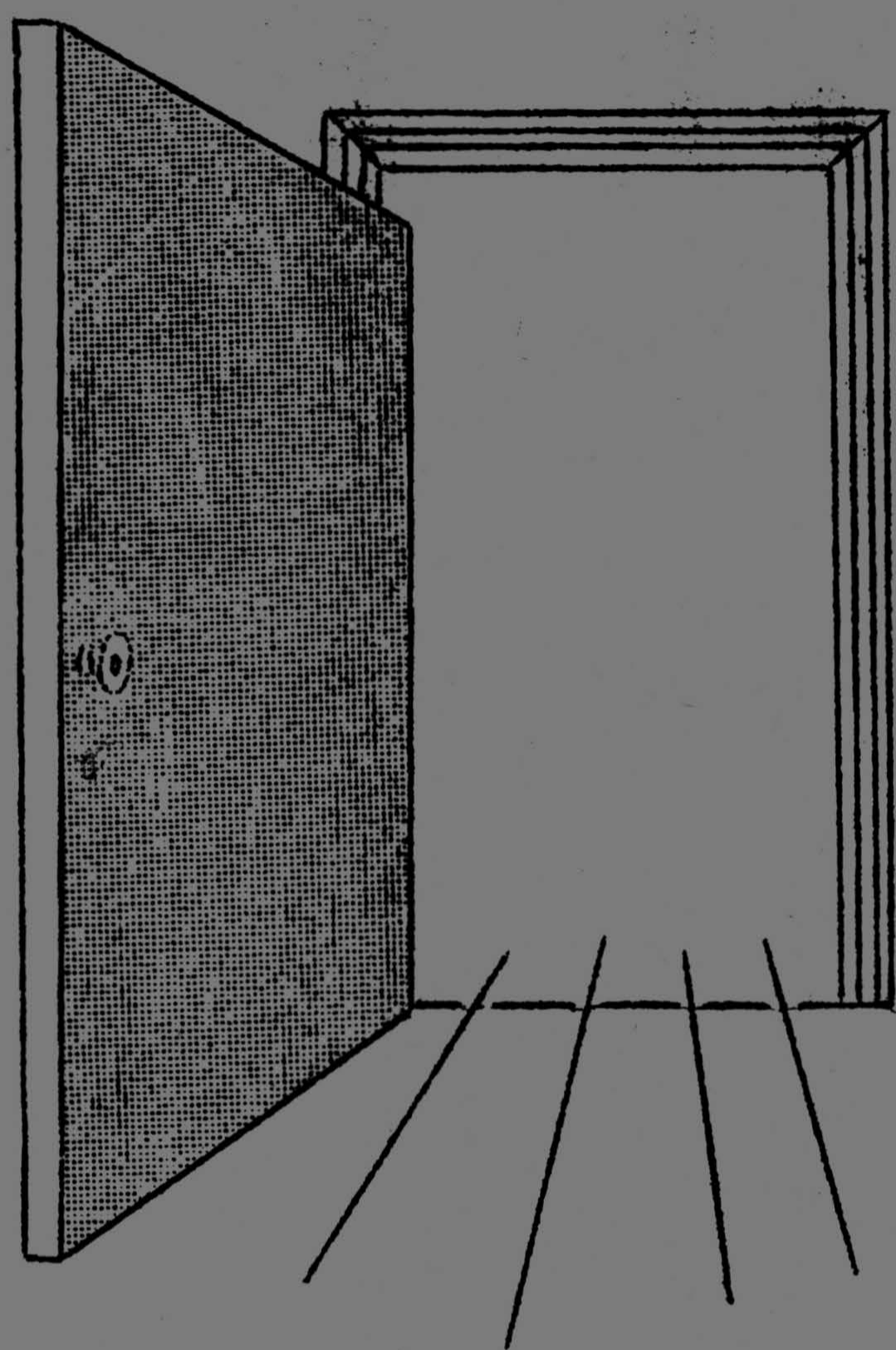

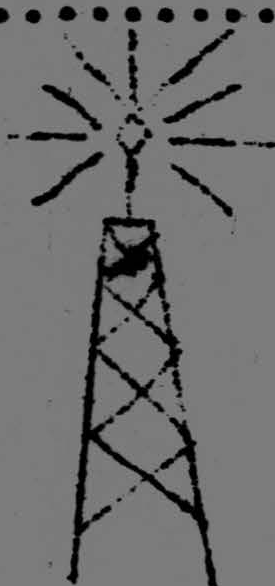
