ELECTIONS OVER

Labrador has proved to be solidly Liberal this time. First in the Provincial elections of 2 weeks ago, when Mr. Tom Burgess took the 'Labrador West' seat in the House of Assembly, and again on Monday of this week, when in the Federal By-election, Mr. A. Chatwood, of Wabush, won the seat for the geographically huge district of Grand Falls, White-Bay, Labrador. This seat in the Commons, became vacant, when Mr. Charles R. Granger, veteran member, quit his seat, to become Newfoundland's first minister of Labrador Affairs.

Congratulations are offered to these 2 men, who are now our "VOICE" in both the Provincial and Federal governments. I am sure, they are aware of the grave responsibility which has been entrusted to them.

Which brings up the question - Are we, as citizens and tax-payers, aware of OUR responsibilities? The type of government we enjoy in Canada, can only be Good Government, when the citizens do their part. First and foremost, it is our duty to Vote - this has been shown by the statistics, to be where a great weakness lies - DID YOU VOTE LAST WEEK? 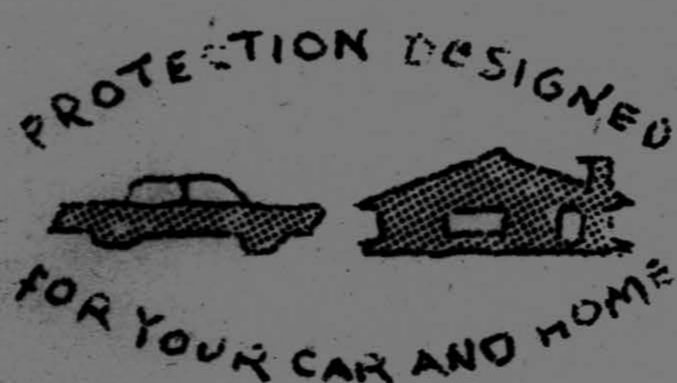

The road which links our town and Wabush will soon be ready for paving and the base course of asphalt is expected to be completed by the middle of October.

The final asphalt coating won't be laid until next spring. This will allow for correction of flaws in the initial coating.

The access road to Wabush Airport will also be paved in October. Meanwhile, paving of the air terminal is progressing favorably, and is expected to be completed next week.

CENTENNIAL PROJECT

We have all watched with pleasure the Labrador City Centennial Project, being constructed. Valued at \$31,500. it consists of a Park and Playgrounds area, situated in the centre of town. The swings, slides, horseshoe pitches and picnic tables are already in use, and by completion of the project next summer, there will be included a badminton court, children's wading pool and rest rooms. The cost of the project is being shared evenly by Labrador City and Provincial and Federal governments.

It has been reported that a study is now in progress in this town, concerning the feasibility of constructing an indoor swimming pool. Final plans will not be known for several months.

We would like to say congratulations, to those in charge of this very useful and lovely Centennial Project, in our ever-growing wonderful northern town.
