ISOLATION WITHOUT TEARS

Labrador City is an isolated mining community in Newfoundland, linked to the outside world only by air and rail. No roads. The Carol Ladies Community Club was pioneered, along with the town, only six years ago, but thanks to its hardworking members, Labrador City has grown steadily in stature and facilities. The Club collected the first books for a library donated a set of Encyclopaedia Britannica and a set of reference books, and a set of reference books, and handed over to the regional board a well set up library. The club also gives financial and social support to the local associations of Girl Guides and Brownies, sponsors a Community Concerts Association series of three concerts a year, has equipped a children's playground that boasts a two-month summer school, and each year donates a \$300. scholarship to the top grade twelve student at Labrador City Collegiate. Funds are raised at a dinner-and-dance, raffles, fashion shows. Each Christmas, small gifts are collected from members and donated to a hospital - last year gifts went to the Sunshine Rehabilitation Centre in St. John's.

The above paragraph is copied from the September issue of the Chatelaine Magazine. We residents of Labrador City should be proud of our local Ladies Club for winning second prize in the Magazine's Ninth Annual Club Award Contest. The prize consisted of a framed certificate and fifty dollars, 'for broadening the environment of an isolated mining community'

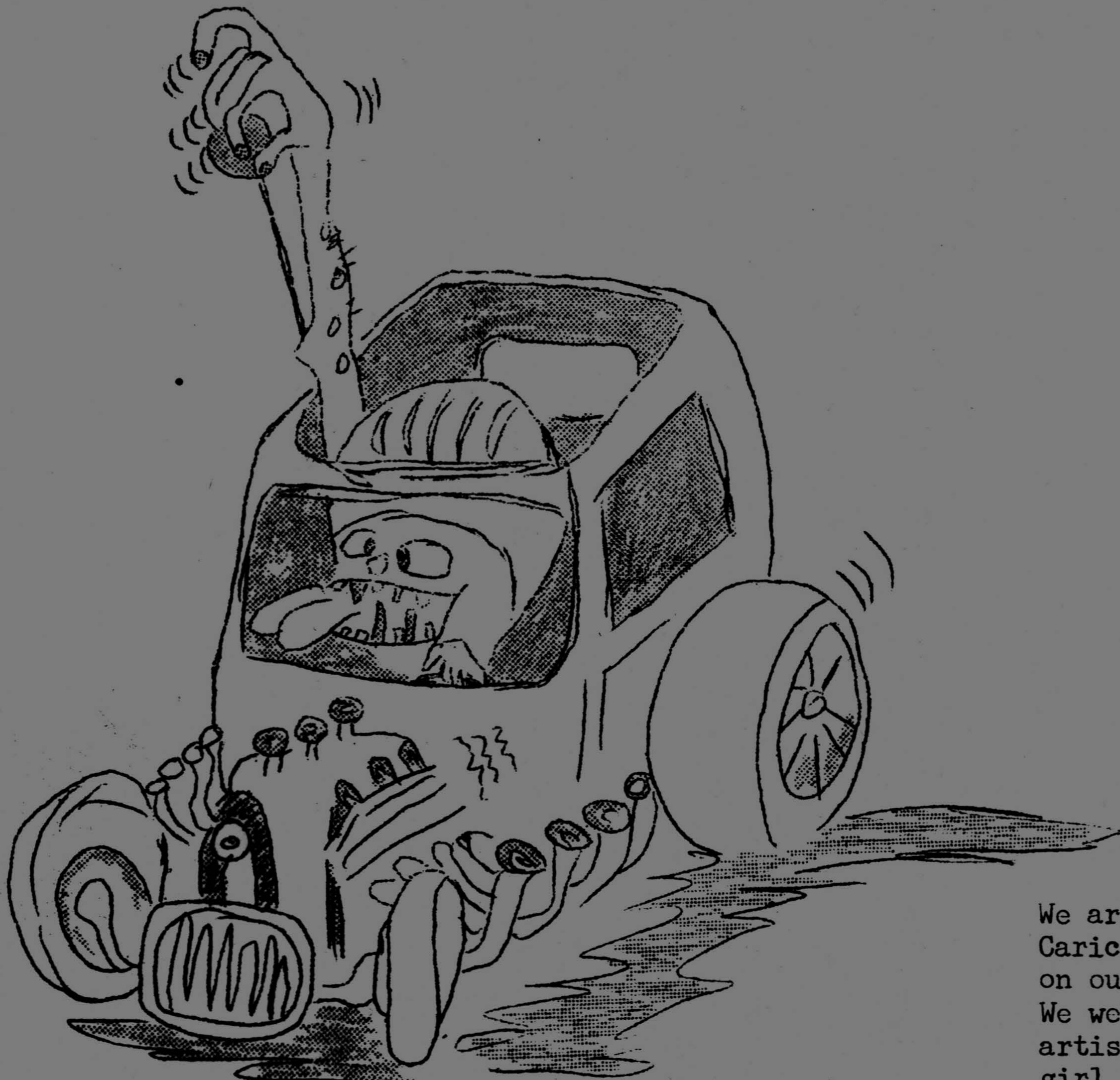

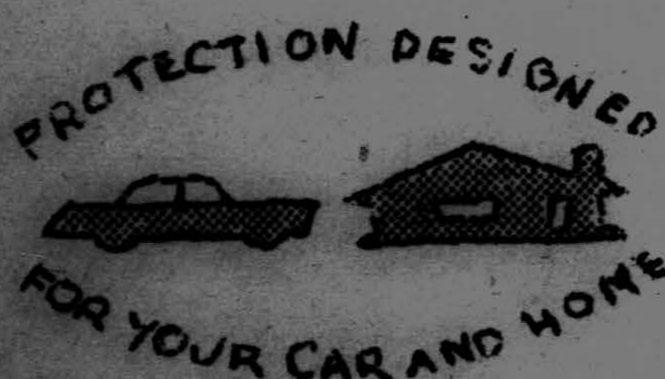

Memorial University of Newfoundland

Extension Service

Evening Courses

As a result of a survey conducted by the Labrador City-Wabush branch of the Memorial University Alumni Association the following courses and cultural activities will be offered in this area beginning October 10:

1. Conversational French

This course, employing the audio-visual method, is designed for people who want to speak the French language. French grammar will not be taught directly and the course is intended for beginners but may also be helpful to people who want to improve their pronunciation and vocabulary.

Two groups will meet as follows:

- a. Group I--Tuesday--7:00 P.M.-8:00 P.M. at Notre Dame Academy, Labrador City
- b. Group II--Thursday--7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at Labrador City Collegiate, Labrador City.

2. Learning to Speak and Write Good English

This is a course designed to upgrade a person's present standard in the speaking and writing of English and is intended for those already fluent in English but who feel increased efficiency in its use, orally and written, would be an asset to them in their present occupation.

The course will endeavour to cover various aspects of public speaking, as well as practice in the different forms of written communication, reports, letters, preparation of speeches, minutes and the like, and will be tailored as much as possible to the needs of the applicants.

Two groups will meet as follows:

- a. Group I--Tuesday--7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush
- b. Group II--Thursday--7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at Labrador City Collegiate, Labrador City.

3. Sewing

A course designed for ladies who would like to learn the fundamentals of clothing construction.

One group will meet on Tuesdays from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush.

4. Painting and Ceramics

One group only will meet twice a week as follows:

- a. Tuesday--7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M.
Painting:--This is a course in painting and drawing which will include practice and individual help in the use of pastels, oils, crayons and paints.
- b. Thursday--7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M.
Ceramics:--This course will permit the student to work freely in pottery and clay.

In both these classes there will be a minimum of lectures and emphasis will be given to helping the individual work at his own level. Movies and slides will be used from time to time to demonstrate a variety of techniques. Both classes will be held at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush.

5. Conversational English

This course is intended for people who desire to improve their spoken English. Emphasis will be on pronunciation and vocabulary building. Some written work and grammar will be introduced if the level of the class demands it.

One group only will meet on Thursdays from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. at Labrador City Collegiate, Labrador City.

6. Typing

This course will be offered at Wabush only. Classes will meet as follows:

Group I--Tuesday 7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush

Group II--Thursday 7:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush

7. Physical Fitness

This course is designed for adults, both male and female. It will include instruction in folk dancing, badminton and other games but will emphasize individual fitness by concentration on exercises of all types.

Groups will meet as follows:

- a. Group I--Ladies--Tuesday 7:00 P.M.-8:00 P.M. at Notre Dame Academy, Labrador City.
- b. Group II--Men--Tuesday 8:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at Notre Dame Academy, Labrador City.
- c. Group III--Ladies--Thursday 7:00 P.M.-8:00 P.M. at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush.
- d. Group IV--Men--Thursday 8:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. at J. R. Smallwood Collegiate, Wabush.

All of these courses will run for twenty weeks--ten classes before and ten classes after the Christmas recess. The fee for each course is twenty dollars (\$20.00) or one dollar per lesson. In each case qualified teachers have been hired by the Extension Service of the University.

Glee Club

The University hopes to start an Extension Glee Club in the area. This will be under the direction of Mrs. Peter Young and will meet each Monday evening from 8:00 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. The meeting place will be decided at a later date but will be such as is most convenient for those participating.

Drama

As a follow-up to last spring's Drama Workshop it is hoped that a little theatre group will be formed. The tentative plan is to have two public performances with the possibility of entering the second attempt in the Provincial Drama Festival in the Spring.
