Accidents are an unnecessary evil that seem to be present in our daily walks of life. Many are due to one's own carelessness, others are caused by someone else's thoughtlessness. As we go about our business through the townsite, we should always be on the alert for danger spots. Recently there have been several reports of just such places.

Number one on the list, is the Post Office door. For some time now, one of the double doors leading into the Post Office has been boarded in with a solid sheet of wood. As people approach the door ready to swing it open, often it comes flying out and many folks have been given a nasty bang. Small children are probably the most common victims but a goodly number of adults have had their share of bumps and bruises. To whom it may concern - PLEASE lets have the glass installed as soon as possible - and in the meantime, residents, approach the door slowly, with care and caution.

Number two, is a fire hydrant which protrudes from a section of the wall of the shopping centre - just around the corner from the entrance to the Bowling Alley. A report was given to the Carol News of a small boy who, running and playing as small boys do, without looking, ran right into this, getting a very nasty bump on the forehead.

Number three is the large ditch between the shopping centre and the school road. In our spring like thaw last week, this ditch was dangerously filled with water, the depth being concealed beneath the snow and slush. A large number of small children arrived both to and from school, soaking wet from the hips down. In all likelihood, it will be April or May before this problem arises again - perhaps a solution to this danger spot will be found before then.

Safety is of prime importance in our work, as all industrial and construction employees know - lets make it of equal importance in our town!

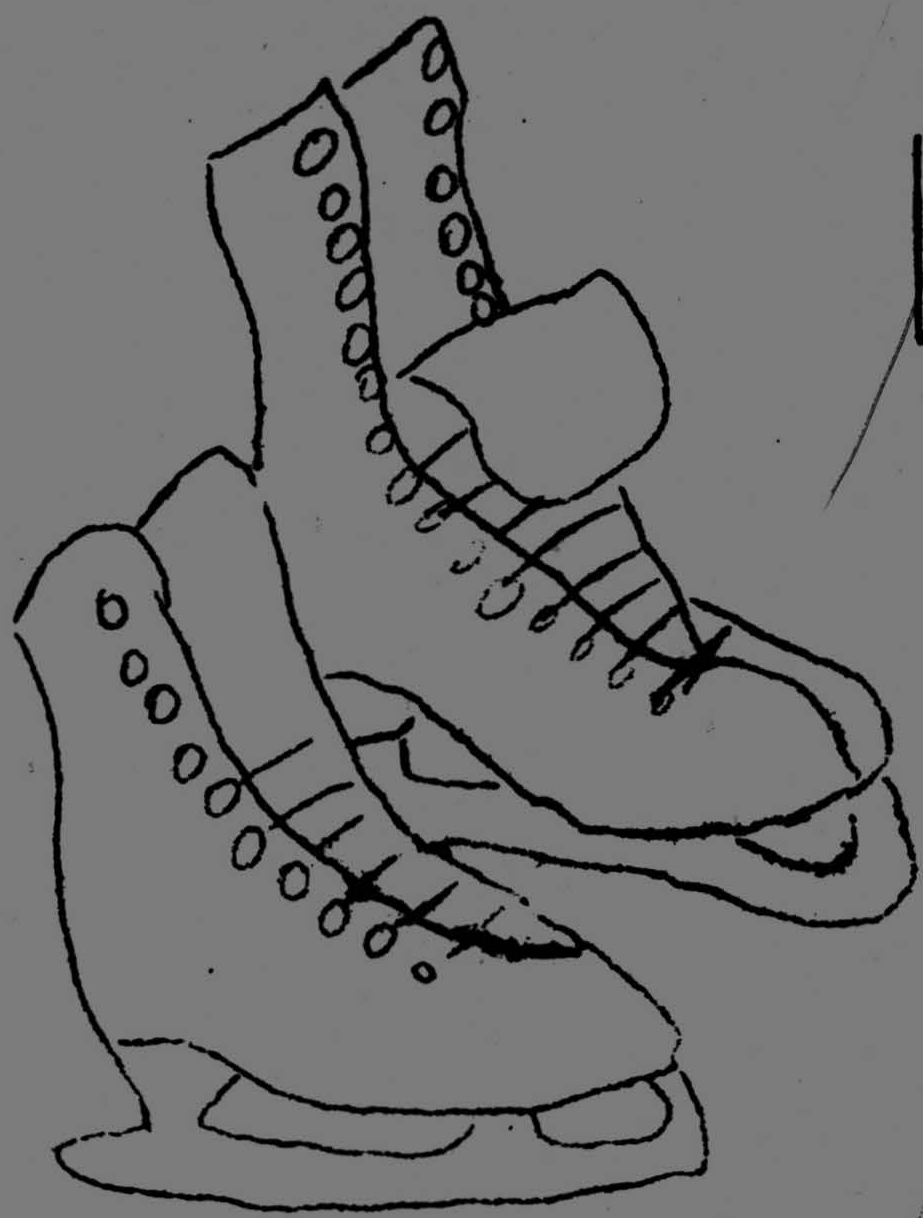
