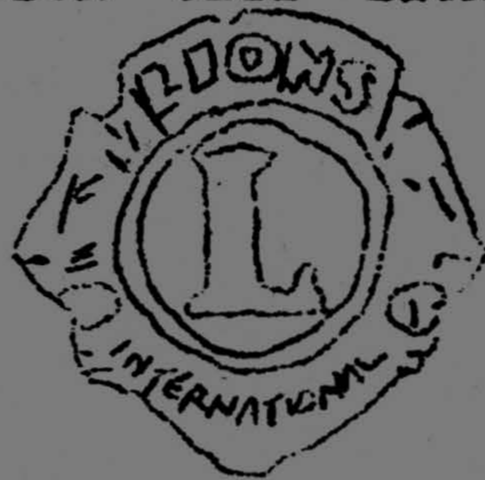

C O U R T N E W S

A man from Labrador City was convicted of impaired driving and fined \$100.00 and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a highway in Canada for 6 months.

A man from Labrador City was charged with attempted theft from Dominion Stores and was convicted and given a suspended sentence of 1 year, and was ordered to sign a Bond of \$100. to keep the peace and to report to a Probation Officer when required.

A young man from Wabush was convicted of having been in possession of liquor under the age of 21, and was fined \$25.00 or 14 days.

Two men from Labrador City were convicted of causing a disturbance in the Ashuanipi Club. One man was given a suspended sentence of 1 year and ordered to sign a Bond of \$100. to keep the Peace and be of good behavior. The other man was ordered to pay a fine of \$50. or 30 days.

A third man, charged with the same offence, was also charged with being drunk in a public place and was placed in custody of the police, over-night. He appeared before the Magistrate the next morning and was convicted of both charges and fined a total of \$110.00 or 1 month and 14 days imprisonment.

A man, previously committed to the Hospital for Mental and Nervous Diseases for 3 days, was this week sentenced to 3 months in prison for Indecent Assault.

Two men from Wabush were sentenced to 3 days imprisonment and fined \$100.00 or an additional 30 days for theft of a wallet containing \$130.00. They were ordered to pay \$65.00 each compensation.

Magistrate Wicks will be out of town this coming week, attending a Symposium on Alcohol Problems, sponsored by The Department of Health for the Province of New Brunswick. This will be held in St. John, N. B.

MAGISTRATE L. W. WICKS HAS ISSUED A **RELEASE** IN CONNECTION WITH THE ROYAL COMMISSION ON FOOD AND DRUG PRICES.

THE COMMISSION WILL VISIT THIS AREA IN EARLY DECEMBER. PUBLIC HEARINGS WILL BE HELD AS FOLLOWS:

WABUSH December 7th. 1966. 8 pm in the auditorium of J. R. Smallwood Collegiate
LABRADOR CITY Dec. 8th. 1966. 8 pm in the auditorium of C. E. McManus School.

It is hoped that every citizen who possibly can, will attend these public hearings, to give the Commission as much information as possible.

These particular hearings on December 7th. and 8th are intended to give the CONSUMER an opportunity to be heard. At the same time, however, organizations, firms and individuals who wish to submit written briefs should make every effort to have these briefs prepared and passed to the Commission during their forthcoming visit, if at all possible. The Commission will then return to this area at a later date to consider their written briefs and to meet with the groups who have presented same.

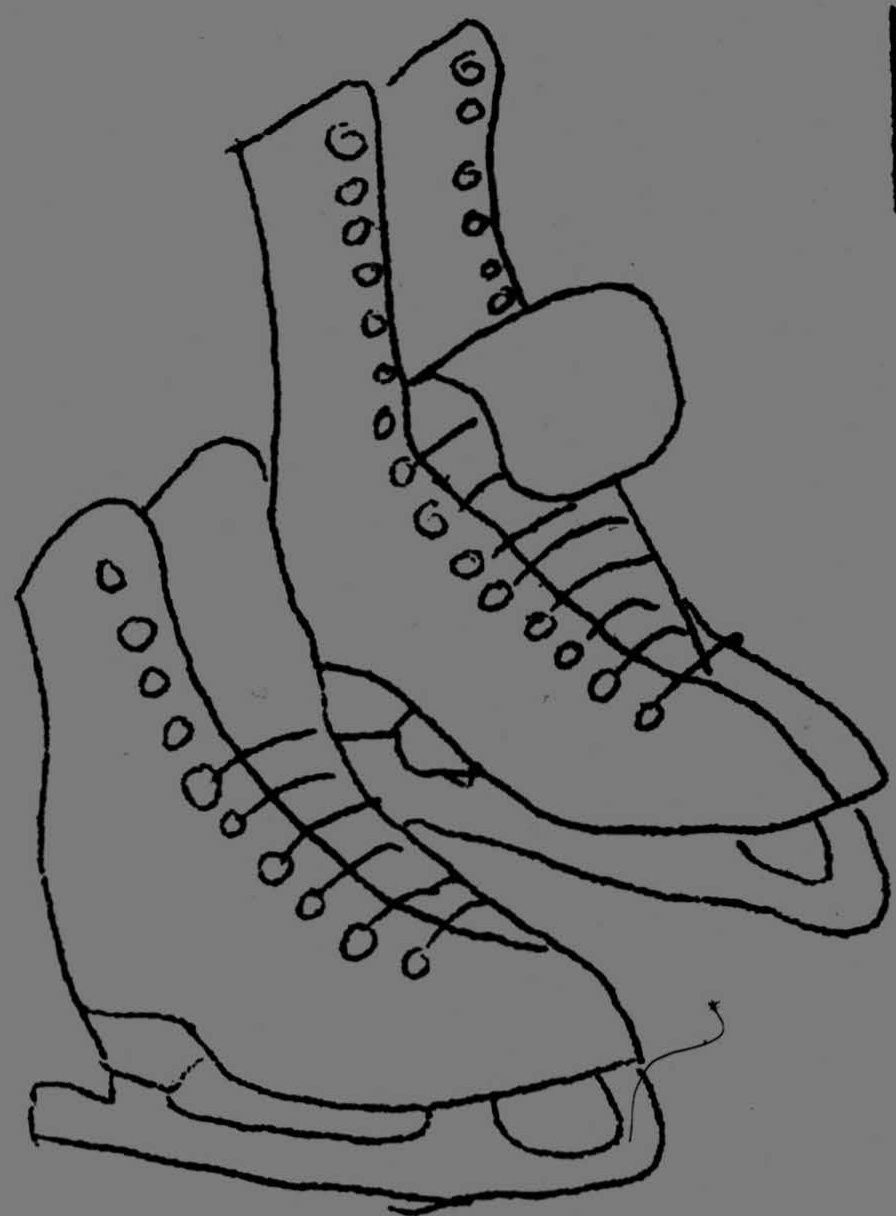
