

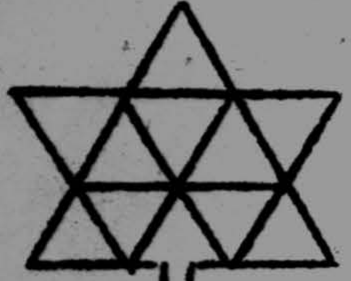

CENTENNIAL PROJECT

THE FOLLOWING PRESS RELEASE WAS NOTED THIS WEEK, AND THE CAROL NEWS, ON BEHALF OF THE IRON ORE COMPANY RESIDENTS OF OUR TOWN, WISHES TO EXPRESS GRATITUDE TO THE COMPANY FOR SUCH A WORTHWHILE AND TRULY GENEROUS CENTENNIAL PROJECT.

HUNDREDS OF SCHOOL CHILDREN FROM THE IRON ORE COMMUNITIES OF SCHEFFERVILLE, LABRADOR CITY AND SEPT-ILES WILL VISIT EXPO 67 THROUGH A CENTENNIAL PROJECT ANNOUNCED TODAY BY THE IRON ORE CO. OF CANADA. THE COMPANY AND IT'S ASSOCIATED COMPANIES WILL AIRLIFT CHILDREN OF EMPLOYEES, RANGING IN SCHOOL AGE FROM GRADE V THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL, TO MONTREAL FOR A TWO DAY VISIT TO THE WORLDS FAIR.

IT IS ESTIMATED THAT APPROXIMATELY TWO THOUSAND (2000) PEOPLE WILL BE INVOLVED IN THE BIG AIRLIFT, BUT NOT ALL OF THESE WILL BE SCHOOL CHILDREN, SINCE THE EXPO REGULATIONS REQUIRE THE PRESENCE OF ONE ADULT FOR EVERY TEN CHILDREN ON SUCH GROUP VISITS. THE VISITS WILL BE ARRANGED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE EXPO 67 RECENTLY ESTABLISHED SCHOOL GROUP CO-ORDINATOR OF THE VISITORS SERVICE.

THE CHILDREN FROM THE IRON ORE PRODUCING COMMUNITIES WILL VISIT EXPO 67 IN GROUPS OF ONE HUNDRED (100) BETWEEN THE PERIODS OF MAY 14 TO JUNE 16, AND SEPTEMBER 10 TO OCTOBER 20, 1967. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT TWENTY (20) FLIGHTS IN CHARTERED AIRCRAFT WILL BE REQUIRED TO MOVE THE CHILDREN WHO WILL BE HOUSED AT THE EL CONVENTO HOTEL WHICH HAS BEEN REFURBISHED TO ACCOMMODATE SUCH GROUPS. TWO FLIGHTS A WEEK ARE NOW SCHEDULED, THE FIRST TO ARRIVE ON A SUNDAY NIGHT, PERMITTING THE CHILDREN TO VISIT EXPO 67 ON MONDAYS AND TUESDAYS, AND THE SECOND TO ARRIVE WEDNESDAY EVENING TO ENABLE THE CHILDREN TO VISIT THE FAIR ON THURSDAYS AND FRIDAYS

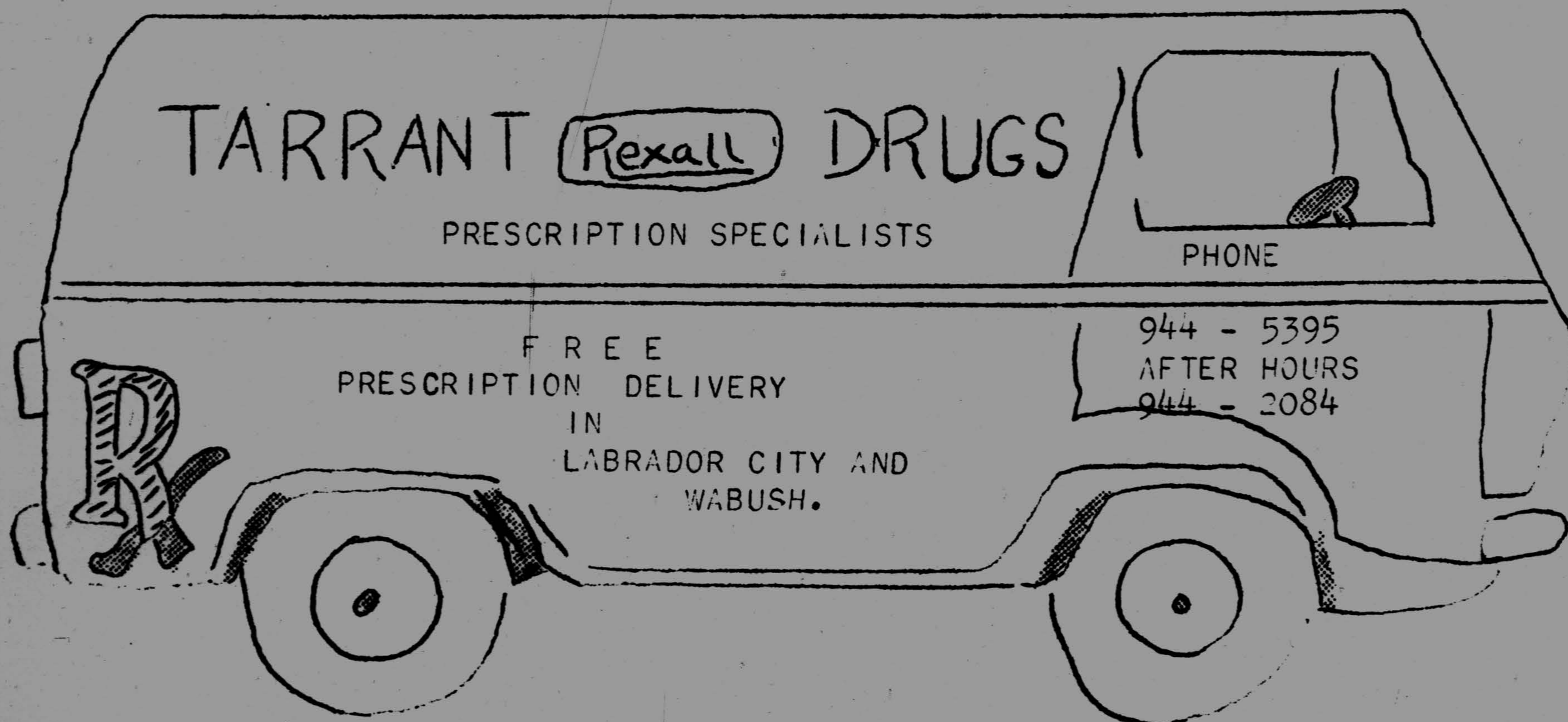

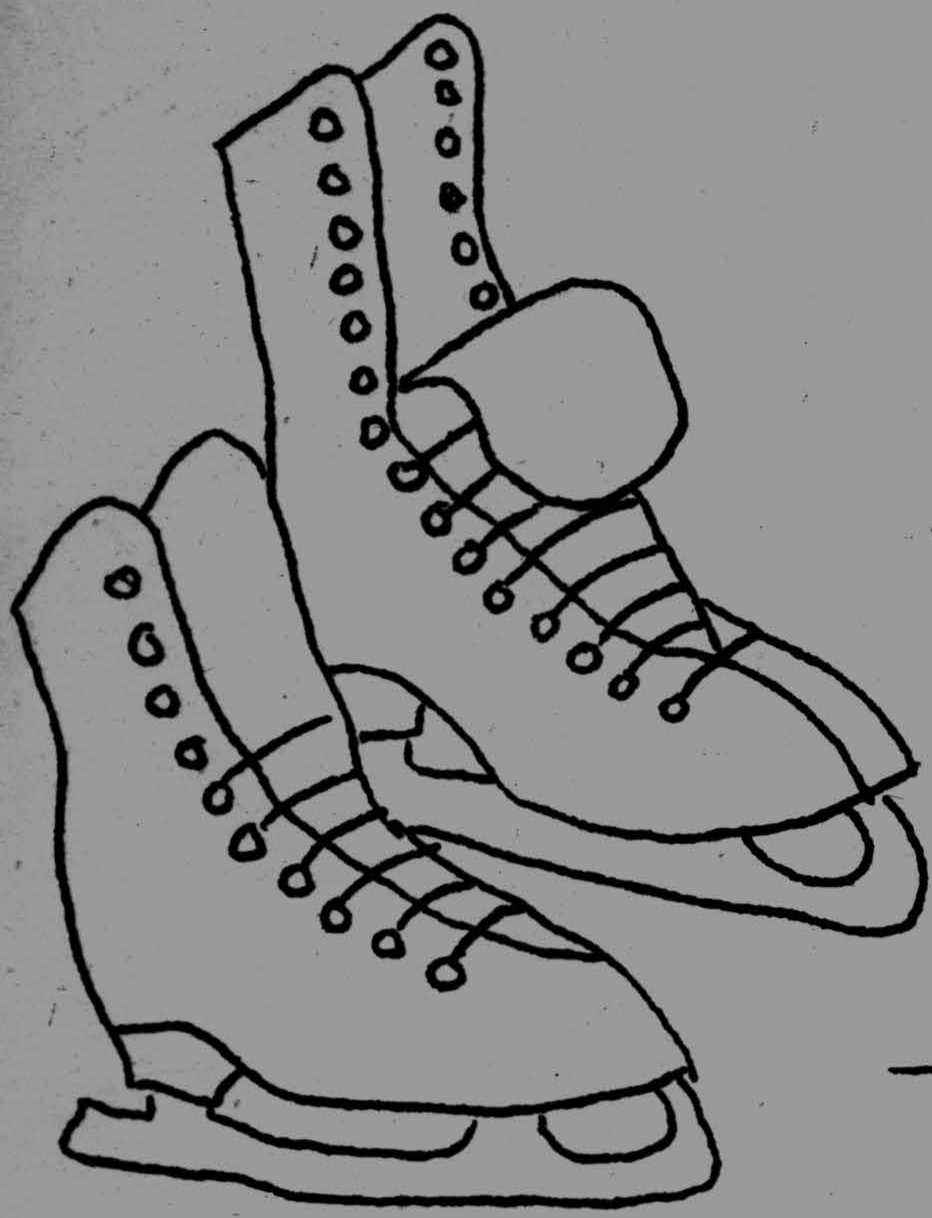
