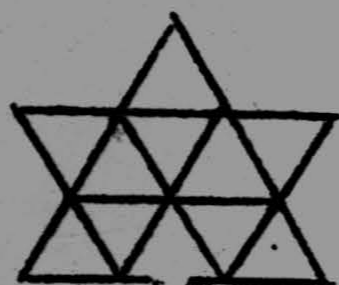

EDITORIAL

SUNDAY SCHOOL? - DO WE EVER ASK OURSELVES "WHO SHOULD I BE GRATEFUL TO, FOR GIVING TIME AND ENERGY, THAT MY CHILD MAY BENEFIT?"

COURT NEWS

A MAN FROM LABRADOR CITY WAS CHARGED WITH TAKING A CAR FROM THE CAR PARK OF THE ASHUANIPI SOCIAL CLUB CAR PARK, WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE OWNER. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WAS FINED \$100. OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT.

A RESIDENT OF LABRADOR CITY WAS CHARGED WITH BEING IN POSSESSION OF GOODS BELONGING TO THE IRON ORE COMPANY OF CANADA, TO A VALUE OF LESS THAN \$50. THE CASE WAS POSTPONED TO APRIL 17TH. WHEN THE DEFENDENT, WHO IS UNDER RECOGNIZANCE, WILL APPEAR AT THAT TIME.

THREE MEN FROM LABRADOR CITY WERE CHARGED WITH STEALING GAS BELONGING TO THE COMPANY OF KAIGHEN AND HUGHES, LABRADOR CITY. THEY WERE CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND GIVEN A SUSPENDED SENTENCE FOR TWO YEARS AND ORDERED TO SIGN A BOND FOR \$200 EACH TO KEEP THE PEACE AND BE OF GOOD BEHAVIOUR AND TO REPORT TO A WELFARE OFFICER WHEN REQUIRED TO DO SO.

A YOUNG MAN FROM LABRADOR CITY WAS CHARGED WITH ASSAULT BY HITTING A MEMBER OF THE STAFF OF THE ASHUANIPI SOCIAL CLUB ON THE PREMISES OF THE CLUB. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WAS FINED \$100. OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT.

A MAN FROM LABRADOR CITY WAS CHARGED WITH DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILST UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL. HE PLEADED GUILTY TO THE CHARGE AND WAS CONVICTED AND FINED \$100. OR 14 DAYS IMPRISONMENT, HIS DRIVER'S LICENCE WAS SUSPENDED FOR A PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS.

A YOUNG MAN FROM TWIN FALLS, NEWFOUNDLAND, WAS CHARGED WITH DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILST HE WAS PROHIBITED FROM HOLDING A DRIVERS LICENCE, HIS LICENCE HAD BEEN SUSPENDED BY THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES AFTER A CONVICTION OF DRIVING WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL HEARD IN THIS COURT LAST DECEMBER. HE WAS CONVICTED AND FINED \$150. OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT

TWO MEN FROM LABRADOR CITY WERE CHARGED WITH CAUSING A DISTURBANCE BY FIGHTING IN THE CAR PARK OF THE ASHUANIPI SOCIAL CLUB. THEY WERE CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE, AND WERE FINED A TOTAL OF \$50 DOLLARS EACH OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT. ONE OF THESE MEN WAS ADDITIONALLY CHARGED WITH ANOTHER MAN, OF UNLAWFULLY RESISTING A MEMBER OF THE R.C.M.P. WHILST IN THE EXECUTION OF THEIR DUTY. THEY WERE FINED \$100. EACH OR 60 DAYS IMPRISONMENT.

A MAN FROM WABUSH LAKE, WAS CONVICTED OF ASSAULTING HIS WIFE, BY GRABBING HER BY THE THROAT. HE WAS GIVEN A SUSPENDED SENTENCE OF ONE YEAR, WAS ORDERED TO SIGN A BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500. TO KEEP THE PEACE AND BE OF GOOD BEHAVIOUR IN EVERY RESPECT AND TO ABSTAIN FROM ALCOHOL.

TWO MEN FROM LABRADOR CITY WERE CHARGED WITH SPEEDING ON THE AIRPORT ROAD. THEY WERE CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WERE FINED \$50 EACH OR 4 WEEKS H.M.P.

A RESIDENT OF WABUSH LAKE WAS CONVICTED OF DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL. HE WAS FINED \$100. OR 14 DAYS HMP AND HIS DRIVERS LICENCE WAS SUSPENDED FOR A PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS.

THE USUAL AMOUNT OF TRAFFIC OFFENCES WERE HEARD IN COURT DURING THE END OF MARCH AND THE BEGINNING OF APRIL, AND DEALT WITH ACCORDINGLY. THE MAGISTRATE WAS IN GOOSE BAY HOLDING THE REGULAR MONTHLY COURT SESSIONS THERE, AT THE BEGINNING OF APRIL.

IF THIS WERE POSSIBLE, IT WOULD CERTAINLY HELP TO SOLVE YOUR BUILDING PROBLEM AND WOULD ALSO BE OF TREMENDOUS BENEFIT IN THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CENTRE."

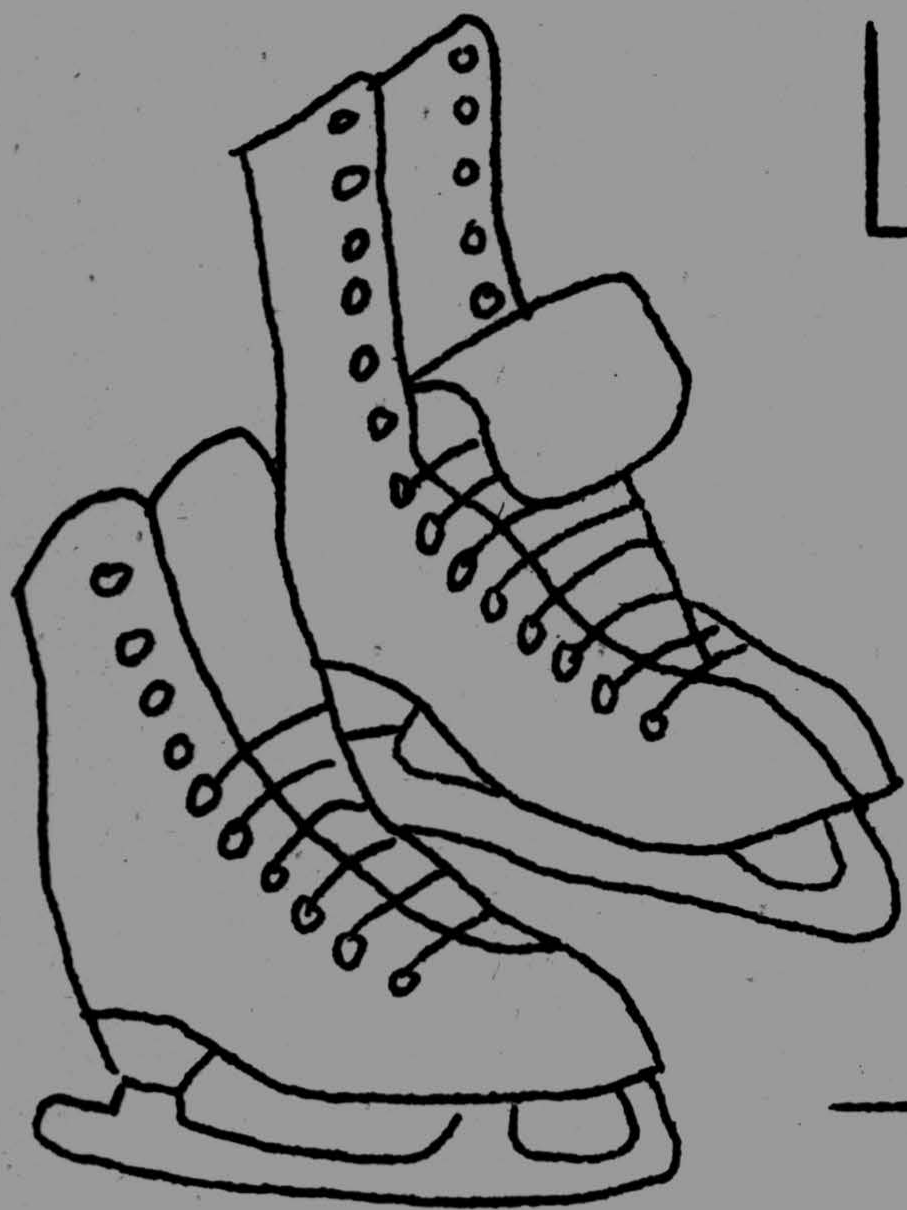
