

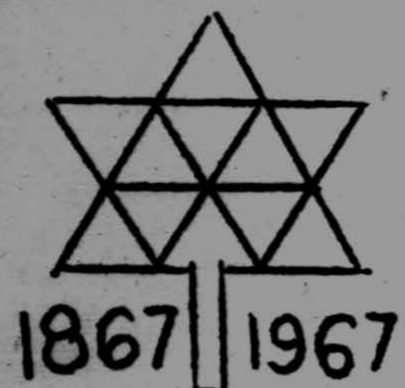

THE COLOURS WERE DONATED BY CITY MOTORS TO THE MEMORY OF THE LATE COMRADE ALLAN BURRY, AND ORIGINALLY WERE TO BE PRESENTED BY COMRADE JOHN ANDREWS, DISTRICT MANAGER OF CITY MOTORS BUT UNFORTUNATELY COMRADE ANDREWS WAS DELAYED IN MONTREAL AND COULD NOT GET BACK IN TIME FOR THE PRESENTATION.

THE LATE COMRADE BURRY, A GREAT LEGIONNAIRE WAS PAST PRESIDENT PROV. COMMAND. MR. BURRY FIRST CAME TO LABRADOR CITY AS A REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE DOMINION ALE COMPANY.
