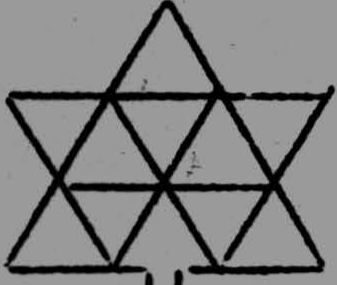

## EDITORIAL

THROUGHOUT THE WINTER'S ACTIVITIES, THE SINGULAR LACK OF INTEREST ON THE PART OF ADULTS CONCERNED, HAS BEEN NOTICABLE. IT IS A FAVOURITE EXPRESSION OF THE TEEN-AGERS TO SAY THAT THIS TOWN'S ENTERTAINMENT IS GEARED FOR ADULTS. A PRIME EXAMPLE OF THIS WAS THE HIGH SCHOOL BONSPIEL, HELD LAST WEEK-END. ### STUDENTS STAGE WALKOUT!

ON MONDAY, MAY 8TH. 153 UPPER SCHOOL STUDENTS WALKED FROM THEIR CLASSES IN LABRADOR CITY COLLEGIATE, IN PROTEST OF THE DISMISSAL OF A TEACHER, WHO THEY FELT SHOULD HAVE BEEN ALLOWED TO COMPLETE THE YEAR AND GIVE FINAL EXAMINATIONS NEXT MONTH. THROUGHOUT THE DAY THE STUDENTS MARCHED IN A QUIET, ORDERLY FASHION IN FRONT OF THE SCHOOL, SOME CARRYING PLACARDS.

ON TUESDAY, 111 STUDENTS WERE STILL ADSENT FROM THEIR CLASSES AND MEMBERS OF THE STUDENT COUNCIL AND SENIOR STUDENTS OF THE SCHOOL MET WITH MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL BOARD WHERE THE STUDENTS AIRD PAST GRIEVENCES WHICH CULMINATED IN THIS PROTEST. THE OBVIOUS RESULT OF THIS PROTEST, WAS THAT THE STUDENTS WERE GIVEN A CHOICE OF GOING BACK TO THEIR CLASS ROOMS OR IMMEDIATE EXPULSION

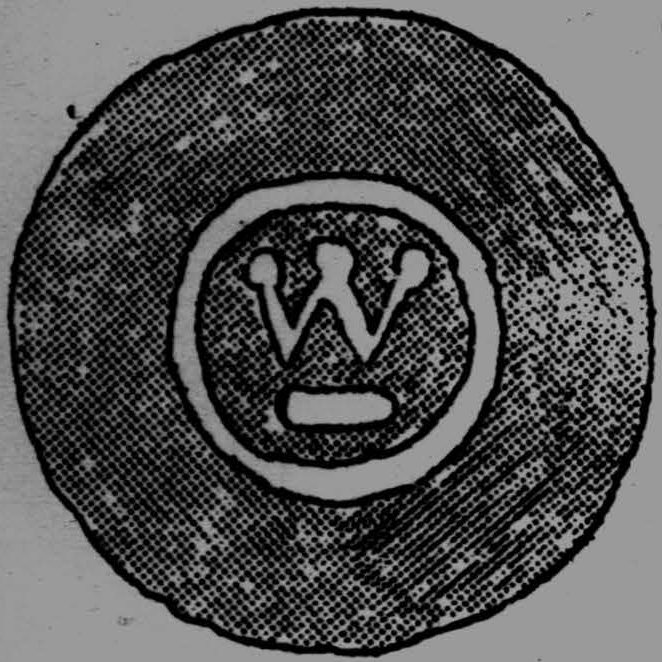

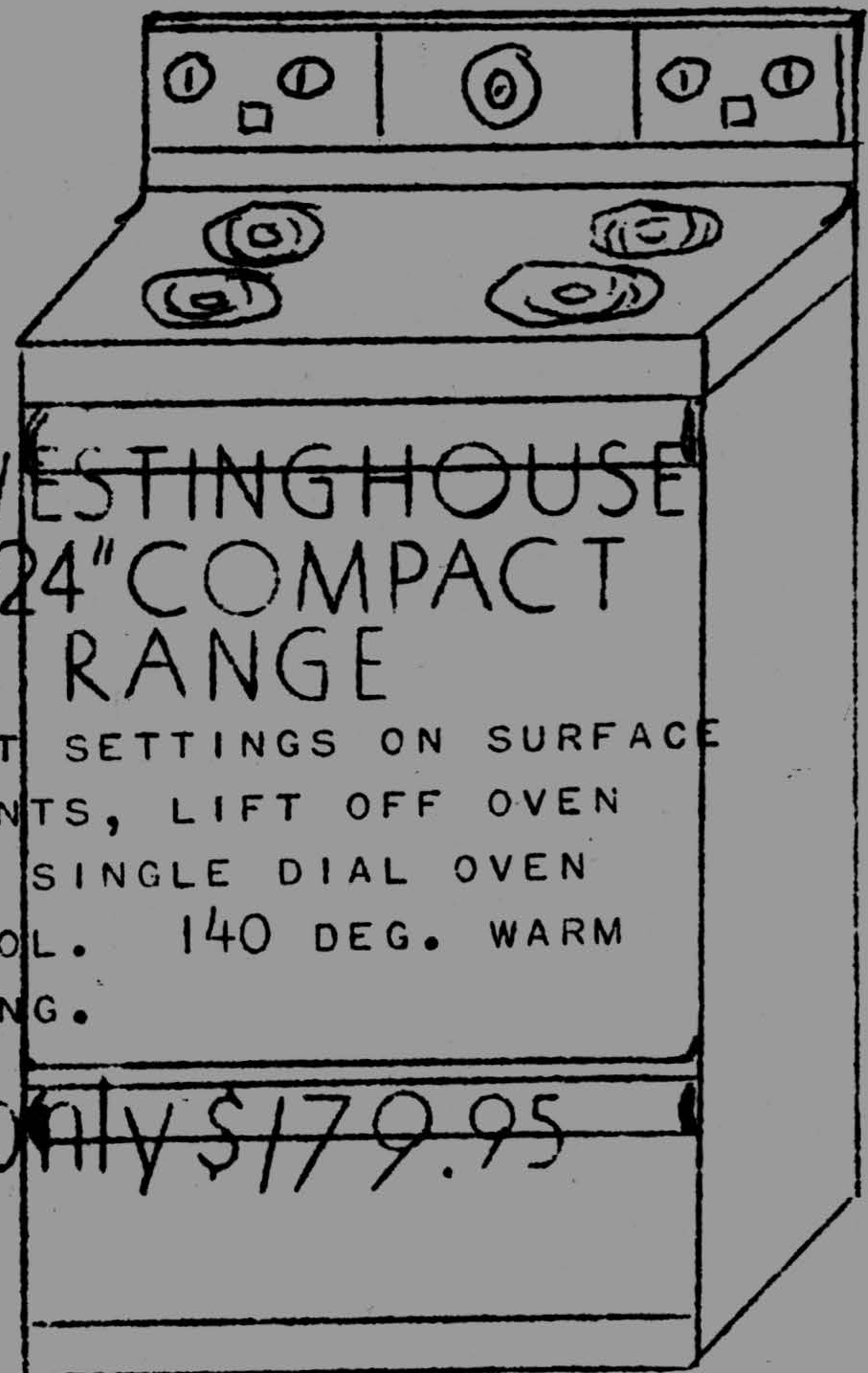

THIS, I THINK IS THE RESULT OF A NUMBER OF OUR FAITHFUL LEGIONNAIRS AND VETERANS, IT WOULD NOT BE FAIR HOWEVER, TO SINGLE OUT ANY ONE MEMBER, BUT IT IS NOTICEABLE WHEN THE SAME FACES CAN BE SEEN SO OFTEN IN THE LEGION AND IT SHOWS THE GENUINE INTEREST THAT EXISTS THROUGHOUT THE BRANCH, BUT DON'T THINK FOR A MOMENT THAT WE DO NOT HAVE ANY PROBLEMS, BUT THERE IS NOTHING THAT CANNOT BE IRONED OUT WITH A LITTLE UNDERSTANDING.
