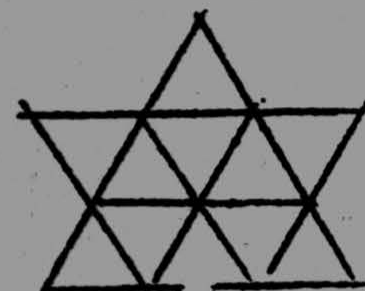

MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY EXTENSION SERVICE

The Memorial University of Newfoundland through its Extension Department in cooperation with the Labrador City - Wabush Branch of the Alumni Association are considering the possibility of giving full university credit courses in this area beginning in September, 1967. This course (or courses) will be given over VERB, an amplified telephone system whereby instruction can be given over long distances and in several centres simultaneously.

In view of the enormous cost of such a project and the administrative details involved, it is necessary to ascertain as possible the number of interested persons in this area. The fee for such a course would be approximately the same as that of a regular course taken at the university. Should the number of interested persons exceed the number we can accommodate then those who indicate interest at this time will be given preference.

NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR FOREST SERVICE FIRE REGULATIONS:

"NO PERSON SHALL LIGHT A FIRE OUTDOORS IN ANY PART OF THE PROVINCE OUTSIDE A CITY OR MUNICIPALITY BETWEEN THE HOURS OF MIDNIGHT ON THE 5th DAY OF JUNE AND MIDNIGHT ON THE LAST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1967 UNLESS THAT PERSON LIGHTS THE FIRE UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF A PERMIT ISSUED BY OR UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE MINISTER OF MINES, AGRICULTURE AND RESOURCES UNDER THE FOREST FIRES ACT."

"ALL PERSONS ARE REQUIRED BY THE FOREST TRAVEL ACT TO HAVE A PERMIT TO TRAVEL IN ANY 'RESTRICTED AREA' (ALL FOREST LAND WITHIN THE PROVINCE) AND MUST OBTAIN THIS PERMIT BEFORE ENTERING ANY RESTRICTED AREA."

"ALL PERSONS MUST HAVE A PERMIT TO CONVEY HUNTING AND / OR FISHING PARTIES ON AIRCRAFT AS SPECIFIED BY THE "WILDLIFE REGULATIONS".

THESE PERMITS ARE OBTAINABLE AT THE FOREST RANGER OFFICE

FOREST SERVICE REGULATION PENALTIES

1. FOR LIGHTING A FIRE CONTRARY TO THE FOREST FIRES ACT AND REGULATIONS --- IMPRISONMENT UP TO TWO YEARS.
2. FOR ENTERING A "RESTRICTED AREA" WITHOUT A TRAVEL PERMIT --- UP TO \$1,000.

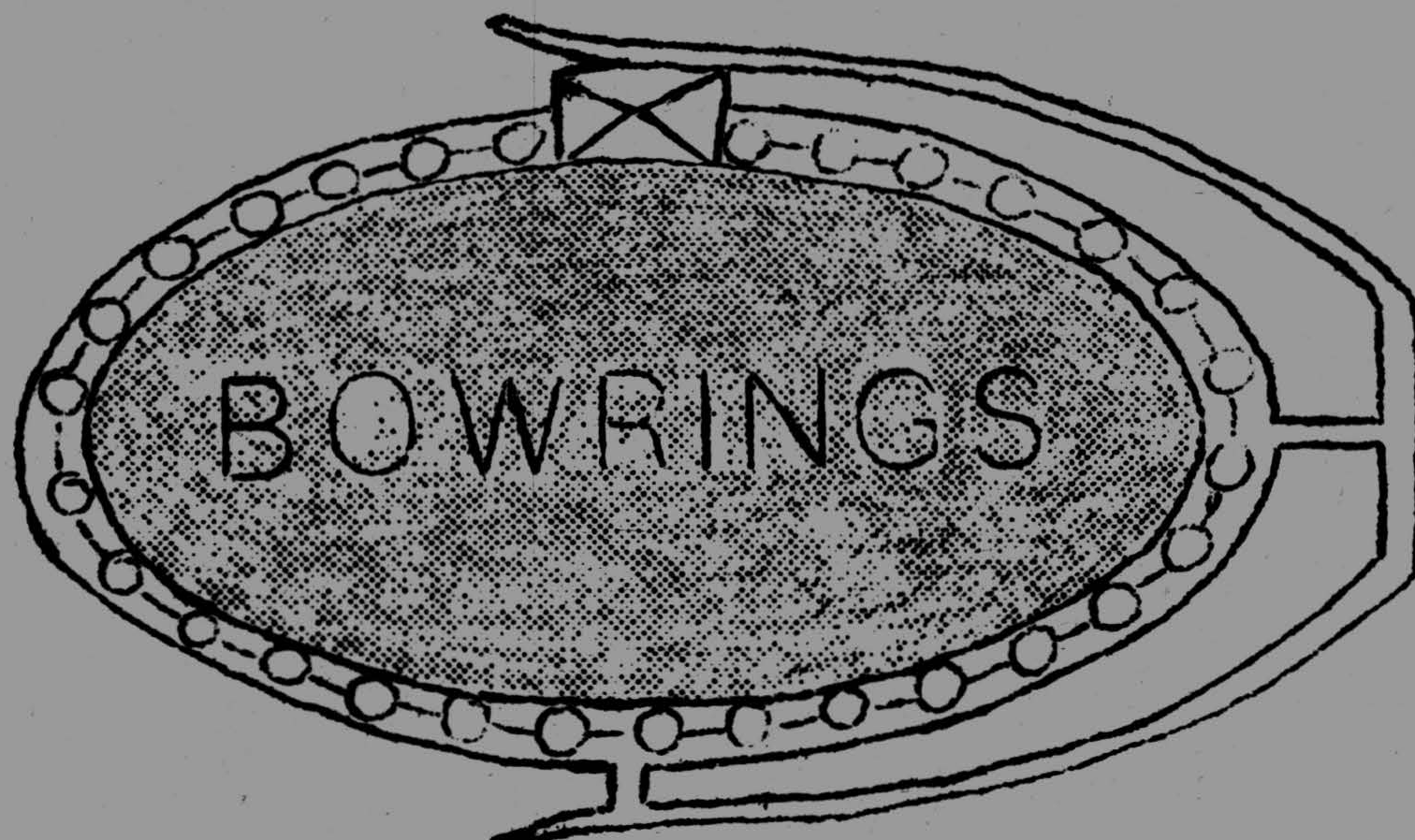
