This week I am very pleased to publish the second part of an extremely interesting editorial sent in to the Carol News by Mr. Elmer Harris, News Director, C.K.C.M. Radio, Grand Falls!

"We are separated now by a small sea, but if our great grand fathers had not made a mistake, we would be separated only by a land boundary".

This statement was made to me personally by the Premier of the Soviet Union on June 30th, 1967, and has given me a new respect for our northern frontiers. Premier Aleksei Kosygin was speaking, of course, of the sale of Alaska to the United States by Russia. This statement unfolded a new lesson concerning the wise use of our northland.

Citizens of Labrador City as well as other areas of Labrador, have had thrust upon them the responsibility of preserving this GREAT land. It must be preserved in such a way as to allow the maximum amount of return to the most people, both now and in the future.

A simple compromise or mistake now, even in the name of tolerance, could be the first step toward untold headaches.

In addition to the preservation of its physical heritage -- forests, fisheries, water and mineral -- there is a responsibility on your shoulders to retain the more intangible properties, which are, never the less, an important heritage. We must be open minded enough to retain the spirit, culture and historic rights to this land.

This can only be done, if every individual in this town is prepared to co-operate to the fullest extent with the municipal government, the Newfoundland government and the government of Canada. Their effort to help this land to reach its goal is only as strong as the desire of the citizens of Labrador City to co-operate.

Educational advancement, scientific discovery and technological strides have made it absolutely necessary for you to advance according to a well prepared schedule. The end result of a haphazard approach to your problems will be more costly and time consuming than the time taken to prepare a plan.

### SPRING VEGETABLE OMELETTE SERVED WITH POTATOES IN CREAM SAUCE

#### OMELETTE

Finely chop a few young carrots, spring onions, and 2 rashers streaky bacon.

Add a few peas or green beans.

Frizzle the bacon, toss the carrots in the fat, add a little sugar, pinch salt,

onions and teacup water. Simmer gently till carrots are tender. Add peas or beans.

continue reducing water until vegetables are done. Make omelette (3 eggs for 2 people) While still moist add veg.

#### POTATOES WITH CREAM SAUCE

Boil small whole or sliced potatoes until cooked, drain. Pour over about half pint white sauce, with parsley or chives.

# LEGION NEWS

## THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION LABRADOR CITY BRANCH N°47



I AM OF THE OPINION THAT THERE ARE A NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO ARE NOT FAMILIAR WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION. I WILL TRY AND GIVE YOU AN INSIGHT OF SOME OF THE DO'S AND DON'TS, FOR NOT KNOWING CAN BE EMBARRASSING BOTH TO THE PUBLIC AND LEGIONNAIRES ALIKE.

FIRST OF ALL YOU MAY ASK WHAT IS THE LEGION? THE LEGION IS AN ORGANIZATION WHERE EX-SERVICEMEN AND WOMEN CAN GO AND TALK OVER OLD TIMES AND RENEW THE COMRADESHIP THAT EXISTED DURING THEIR TERMS OF SERVICE EITHER DURING THE WAR OR IN PEACETIME. ALSO IT HAS AN OBLIGATION TO ITS MEMBERS AND THE COMMUNITY IN WHICH IT IS SITUATED. "WHAT MUST I DO TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE LEGION? YOU MUST HAVE SERVED AT LEAST TWO YEARS (PEACETIME) IN ANY OF HER MAJESTY'S FORCES, BE OF GOOD CHARACTER WITH AN HONOURABLE DISCHARGE.

I DO KNOW THAT A LOT OF PEOPLE AT DIFFERENT TIMES WOULD LIKE TO VISIT THE LEGION, MAY BE TO SIT AND ENJOY A QUIET BEER OR TO JOIN WITH FRIENDS WHO MAY BE THERE. SO LET ME TELL YOU RIGHT NOW THAT YOU WILL BE MADE VERY WELCOME - AS A MATTER OF FACT, EVERYONE IS WELCOME TO COME TO THE LEGION. OF COURSE THERE ARE RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT MUST BE ENFORCED, FOR INSTANCE IF YOU ARE NOT A MEMBER - YOU MUST BE SIGNED IN BY A MEMBER AND YOU MUST ARRIVE AND DEPART WITH THAT MEMBER WHO SIGNED YOU IN, FOR THAT PERSON WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR ACTIONS WHILE YOU ARE IN THE BUILDING.

EACH LEGIONNAIRE IS PERMITTED TO SIGN IN TWO GUESTS, THAT MEANS THAT TOM AND DICK ALONG WITH THEIR WIVES OR GIRL FRIENDS CAN BE SIGNED IN BY HARRY AND RECEIVE THE SAME BAR PRIVILEGES (ETC) THEN AGAIN THERE ARE OPEN NIGHTS AT WHICH TIMES IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO BE SIGNED IN, SUCH AS DANCE NIGHTS AND THIS IS AS GOOD A TIME AS ANY TO TELL YOU THAT EVERY MONDAY NIGHT AT 9:00 pm. THERE WILL BE A MOVIE SHOWING AT THE LEGION. THIS TOO IS AN OPEN NIGHT WHEN ANYONE 21 YEARS AND OVER WILL BE WELCOME. THE REASON WE MUST BE VERY CAREFUL ABOUT THE AGE GROUP IS OF COURSE OWING TO THE FACT THAT NO ONE UNDER 21 YEARS IS PERMITTED TO FREQUENT A PLACE WHERE DRINK IS BEING SERVED - THIS IS WHY, EVEN ON GAMES NIGHT MINORS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

THE LEGION ALSO HAS CLUB MEMBERS, THESE MEMBERS CONSIST OF MEN WHO ARE NOT EX-SERVICEMEN, BUT WHO ENJOY COMING TO THE LEGION AND DO NOT HAVE TO BE SIGNED IN. AGAIN THEY MUST ABIDE BY THE LEGION RULES. THEY ARE NOT PERMITTED TO SIGN IN GUESTS OR ATTEND REGULAR MEETINGS, BUT IN OTHER WAYS THEY HAVE FULL LEGION PRIVILEGES, AND I WOULD LIKE TO SAY, TO ADD, THAT WE HAVE SOME GOOD CLUB MEMBERS WHO REALLY TAKE AN INTEREST IN THE LEGION AND TREAT THEIR PRIVILEGES WITH THE GREATEST RESPECT.

PLEASE NOTE: IN CASE ANYONE READING THIS, DECIDE THEY WOULD LIKE TO BECOME A CLUB MEMBER - I AM SORRY BUT WE ARE ONLY ALLOWED A LIMITED NUMBER AND WE HAVE OUR FULL QUOTA AND ALSO HAVE A LONG WAITING LIST.

THERE ARE OF COURSE, OTHER DO'S AND DON'TS - AND DON'T THINK FOR A MINUTE THAT ALL OF THIS IS THOUGHT UP BY US OR THIS BRANCH. MOST OF THESE RULES ARE GENERAL BY-LAWS, LAID DOWN BY THE DOMINION COMMAND, AND MUST BE CARRIED OUT BY ALL THE DIFFERENT BRANCHES.

Don't wear your sunglasses for night driving warns the Canadian National Institute for the Blind. They cut down glare, but they also cut down your ability to see road signs and traffic lights clearly.

-----

When wielding an open umbrella, says the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, please keep your eye on the points! Don't you be the cause of an eye injury.

-----

Never look directly at the sun even while wearing sun glasses advises The Canadian National Institute for the Blind. Infra-red rays can penetrate those dark lenses and damage the retina of the eye.

-----

If fertilizer, plant spray or insecticide gets into your eyes, flood them with water immediately for approximately 15 minutes. Hold your face under the tap or pour cool water from a bottle. Do not use an eye cup. Chemical burns should be examined by a doctor as soon as possible says The Canadian National Institute for the Blind.

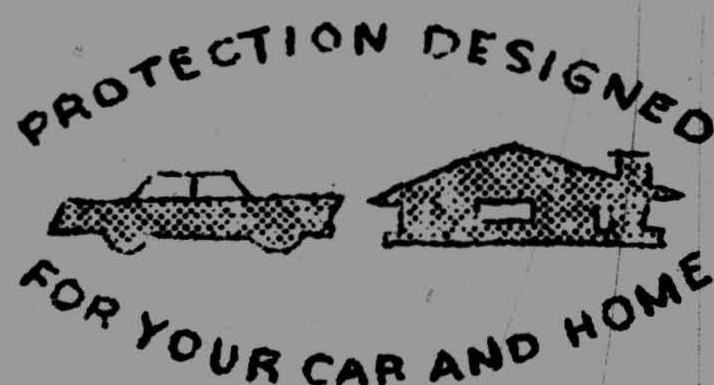

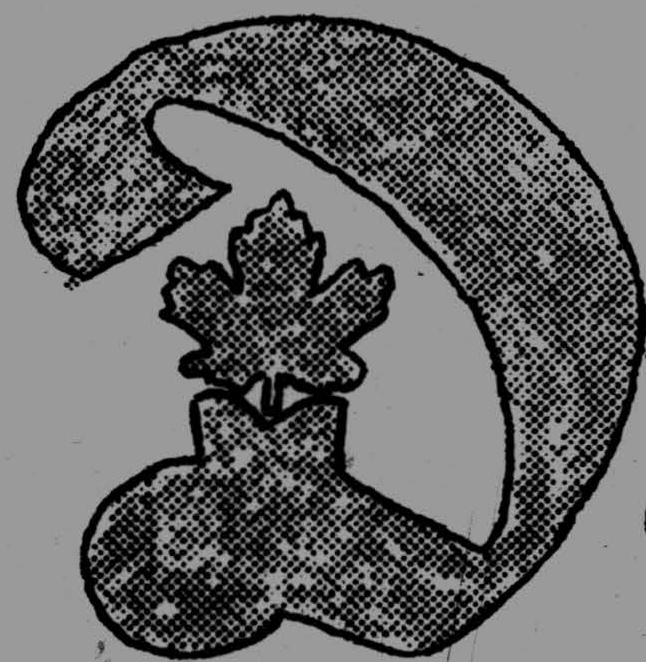

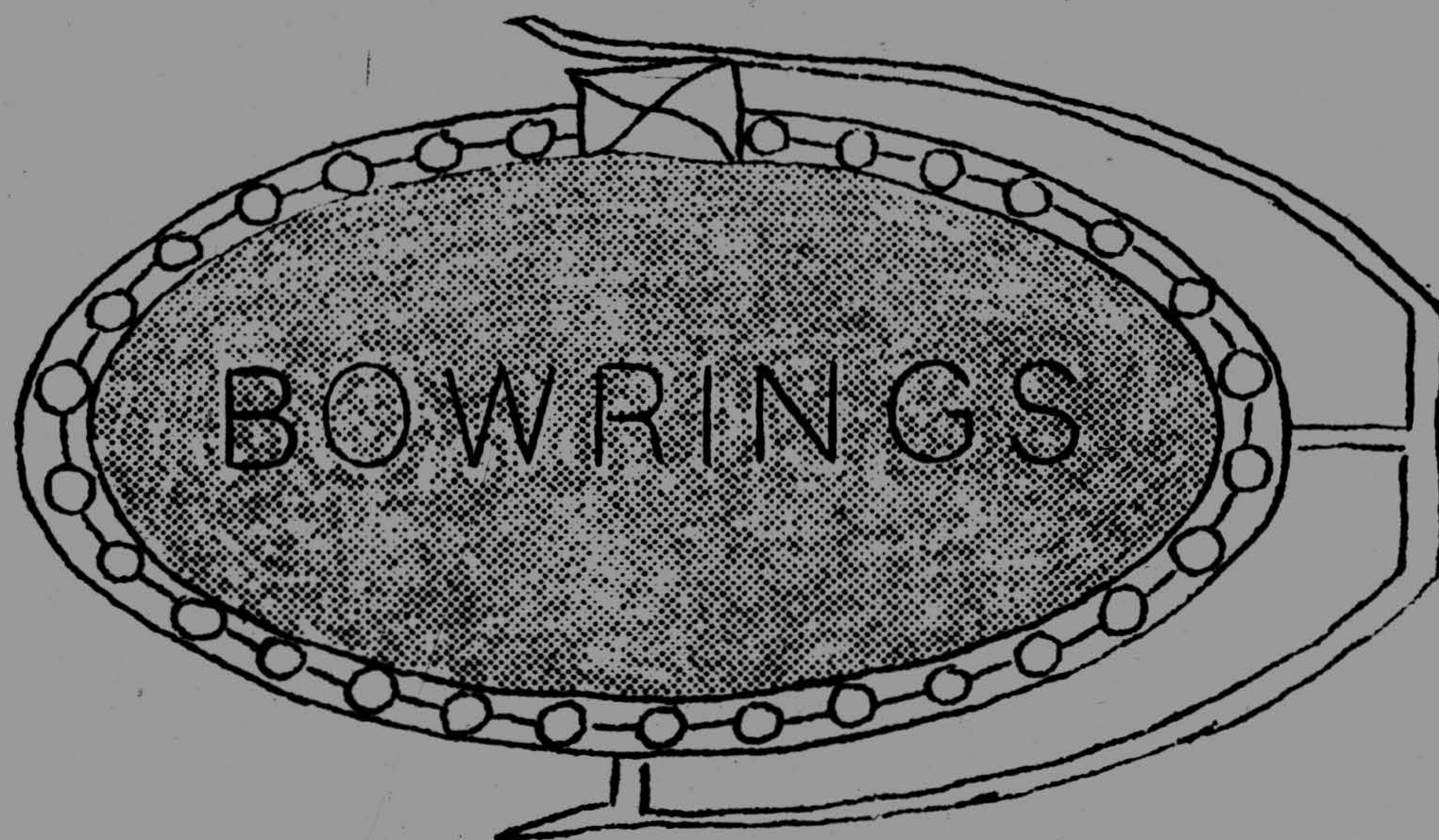
