"Help us to help each other, Lord
Each other's cross to bear;

And feel his brother's care."

When Charles Wesley penned these words, he captured the essence of Christian living; simply service to God through service to man.

Dr. Wilfred Grenfell, one of the great examples of devotion and service to his fellows in our own Labrador, has been quoted as saying,

"Whether we, our neighbor, or God is the judge,
absolutely the only value of our 'religious'
life is what it fits us for and what it enables
us to do."

He had proved that the inevitable expression of real Christianity must be in a life of service

It was this self-same conviction that inspired the slogan "with heart to God and hand to man" which portrays the emphasis and the approach the Salvation Army has in its endeavours related to its agencies for the social welfare of men and women. When William Booth, the Founder, was asked for his motto in life he summed it up simply, and in one word - "Others."

We may be living in a community and a society of affluence in which material need is not so great as in the past, yet let us remember there is still the need of "friendly aid". The hand of friendship, the word of encouragement and a quiet, genuine concern - these can, in very real ways meet needs which, although less obvious, may be of vital importance to our neighbor. May each of us learn to "feel our brother's care."

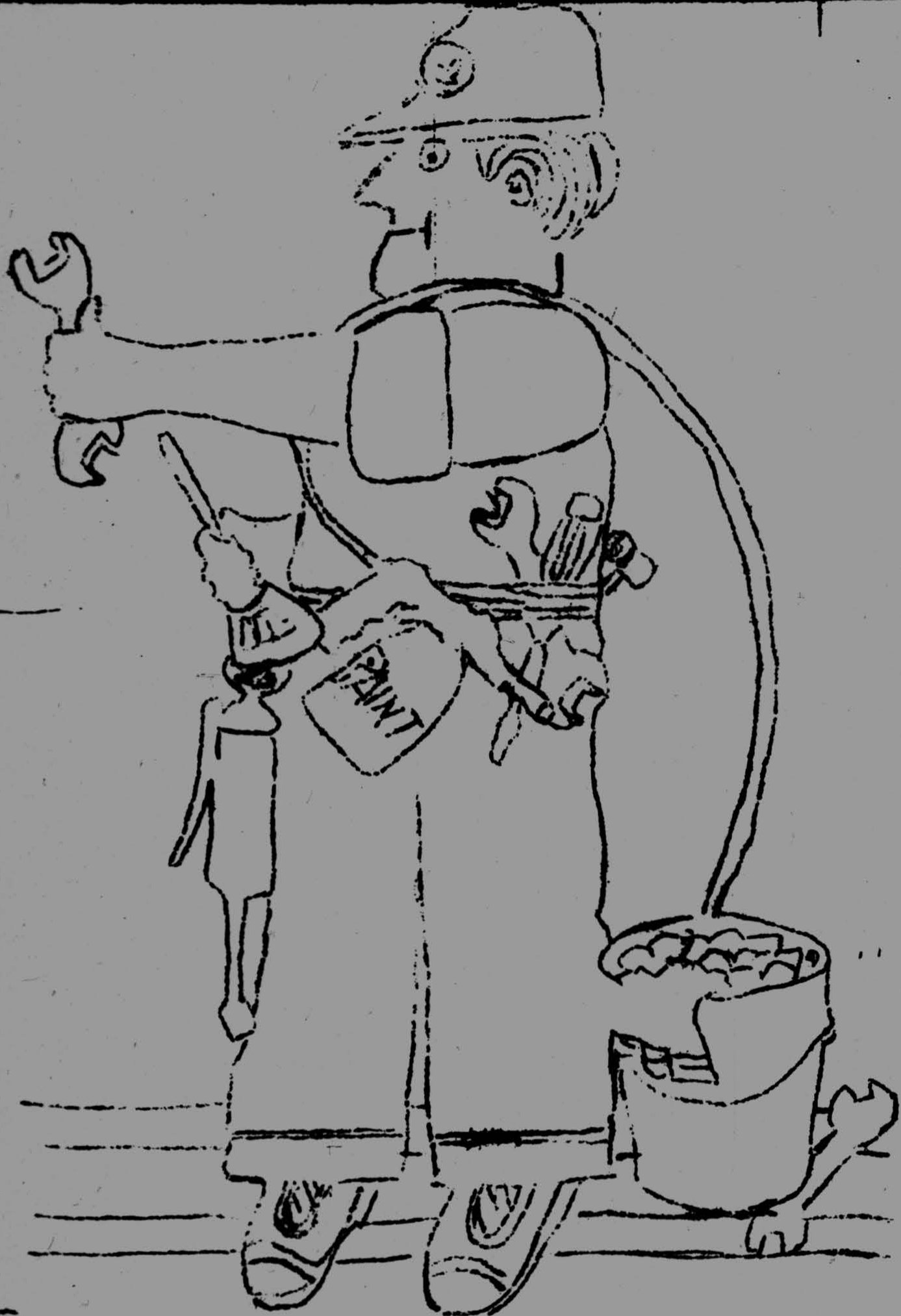
