Or is it too much trouble to look after your most treasured possessions?

Remember, your child's life is in your hands. Teach it the rules, and supervise it while young, and you'll have no regrets' later.

The summer school art classes run by the Recreation Department have been enjoyed by a small group of children. The groups have narrowed down to a group who are very interested in art generally.

In the morning from 10:30-12:00 there are about 25 of the same children every day.

They paint with water colours, mold with plasticene, colour with crayons and oil pastels, and are a good cleanup crew when they're finished every morning.

The afternoon two groups have pretty much merged into one of about 15-20 young people. The younger group have also gone on 2 or 3 sketching trips within 10 minutes of the Arena.

They have drawn, painted, worked with plasticene, carved a soft stone called Maple-Rok, worked with plaster molds and coloured with crayons and oil pastels.

The adult classes, held every Tuesday evening, are proving interesting. There is a group of 4 or 5 who are learning basic sketching, water colouring

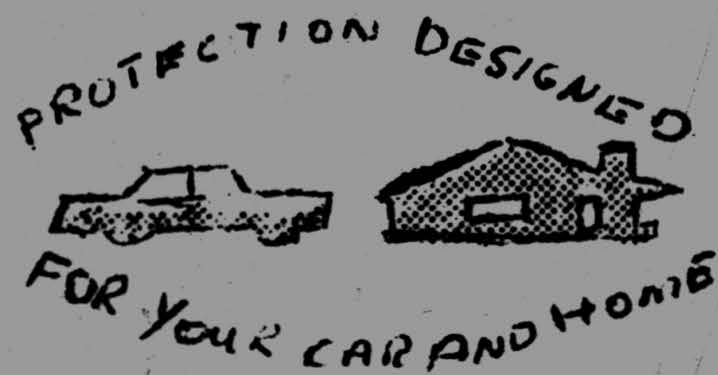

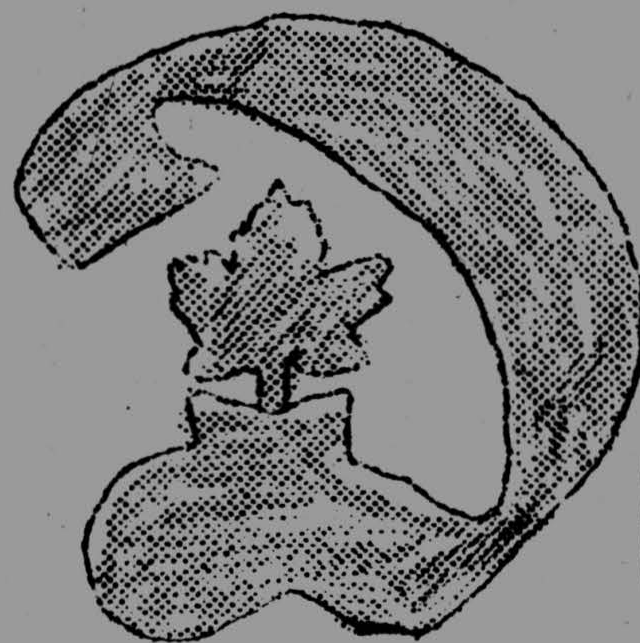

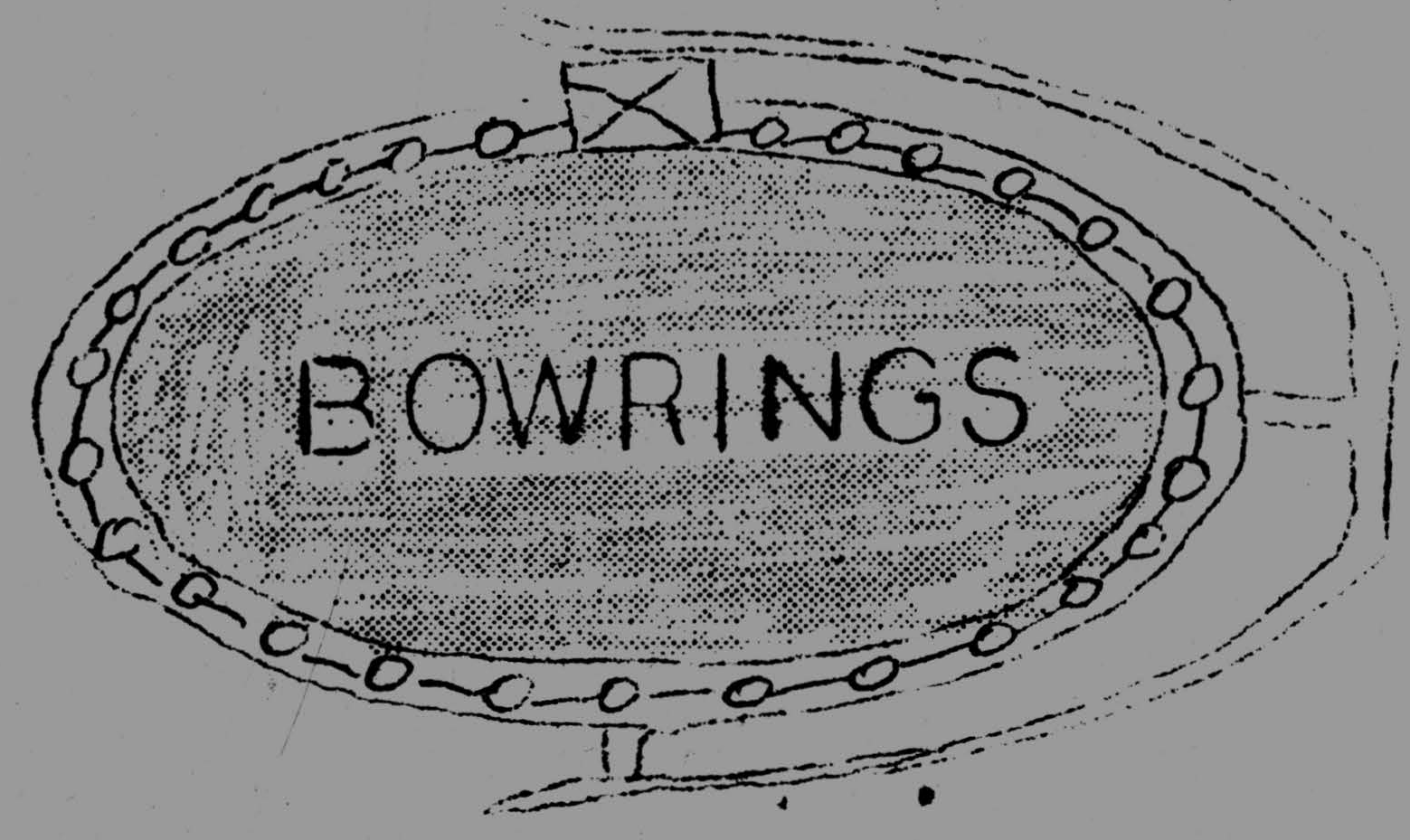
