RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP

CREAMY FISH PIE

1.1b cooked fish
1½ oz. margarine
1 oz. flour or corn starch
½ pint milk

Salt and pepper
1 tbsp. parsley
a squeeze of lemon
Creamed mashed potato.

Skin, and bone the fish and flake finely. Make a sauce in the usual way with 1 oz. fat, flour and milk. Add seasoning, parsley, lemon juice and the fish, put in a fireproof dish and cover with mashed potato. Dot with remaining fat; heat in a moderate oven (375° F., mark 5) for about 20 minutes or until potatoes are golden brown.

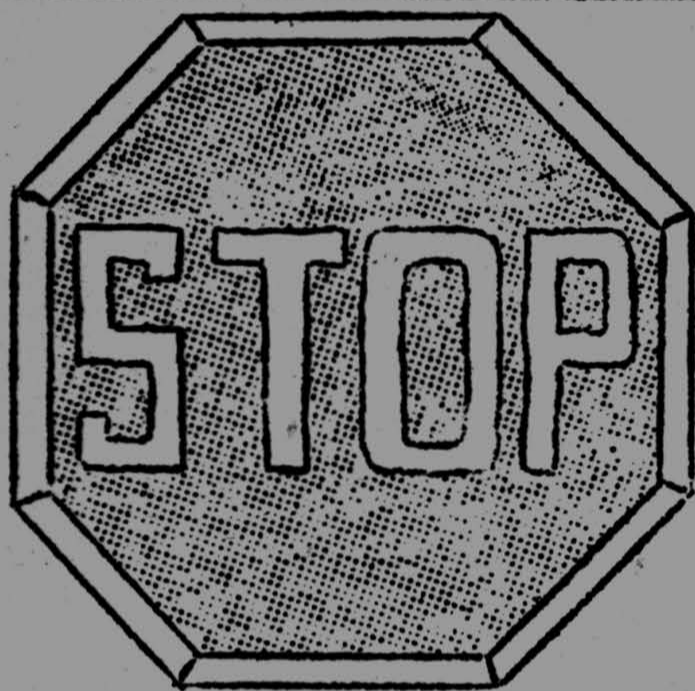

Our very best wishes to with Mrs. Betty Phillips, leaving soon for St. Johns in order to undergoe an operation.

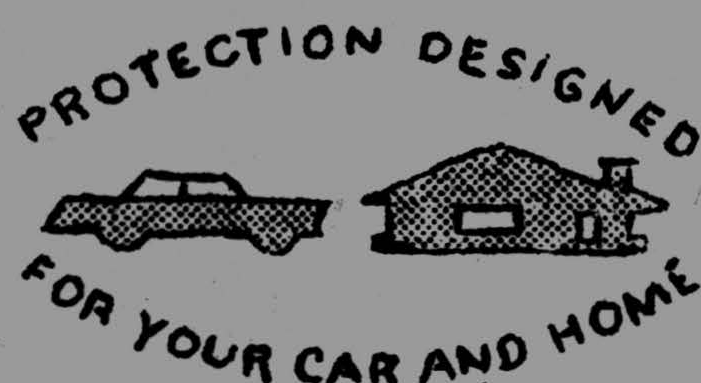

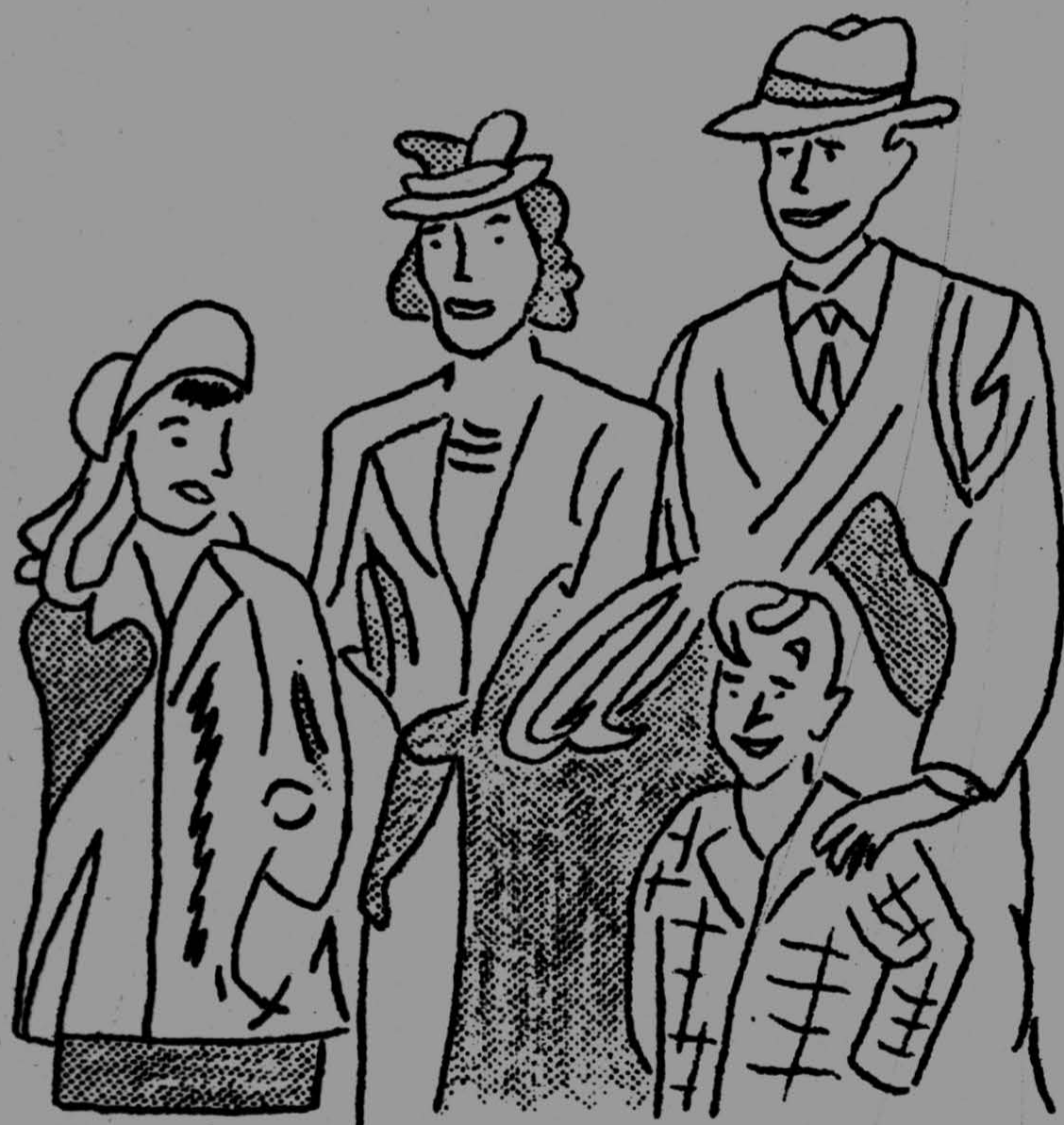

MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY EXTENSION SERVICE.

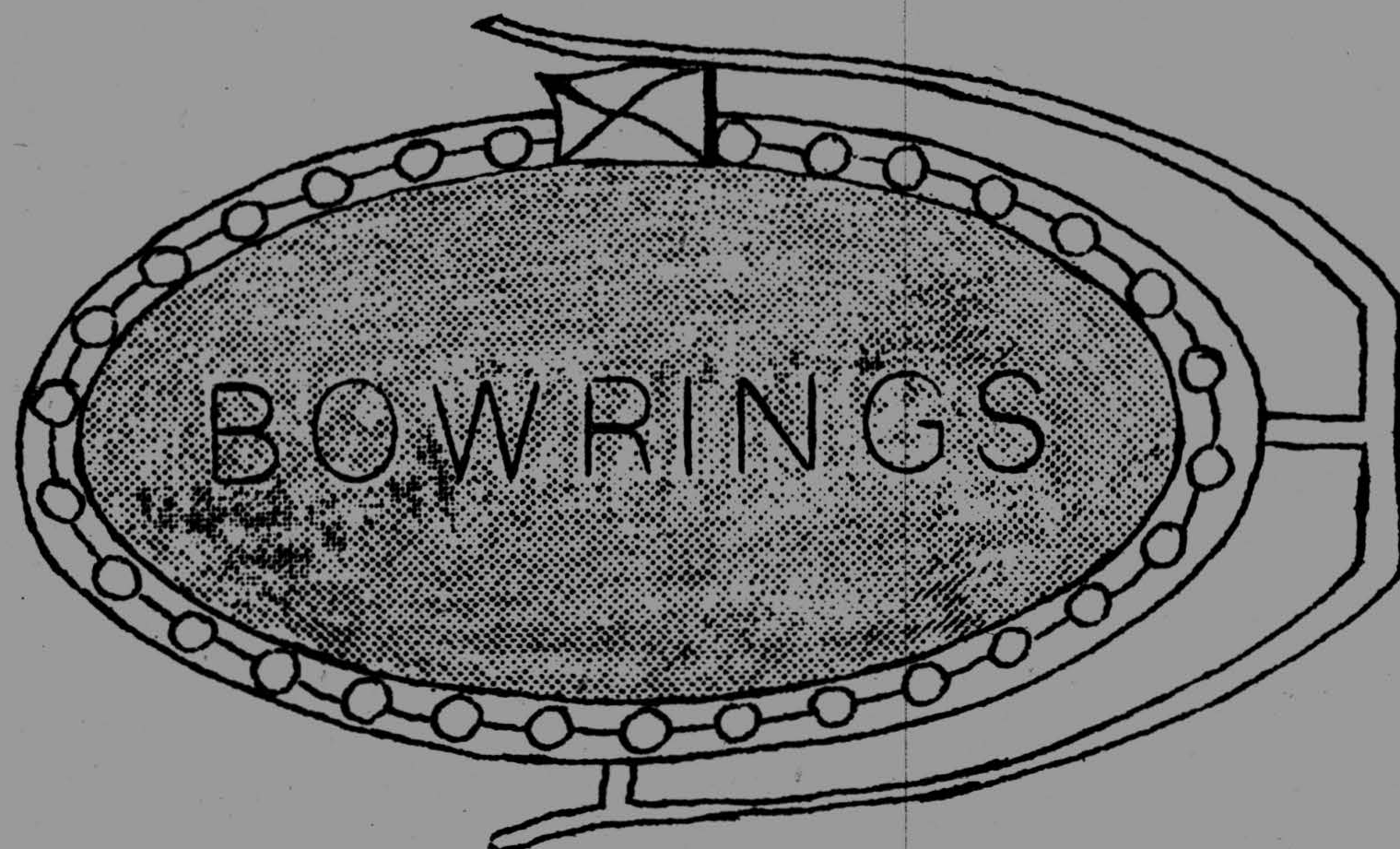
