OUR LOCAL SCOUT MASTER - MR. KEVIN GREENE.

The aim of the Boy Scouts of Canada is to develop good citizenship among boys by moulding their character, training them in habits of observation, obedience, self-reliance, loyalty and thoughtfulness for others. In teaching them useful Public Services and handicrafts useful to themselves. In promoting their physical, mental and spiritual development.

With these aims in mind the Group Committee and Scouters of the Carol Scout Group began the 1967 - 68 year of weekly activities on Friday night Sept. 8th.

The Carol Boy Scout Group was formed in November, 1961 and has been functioning with great success since then. In the beginning there were twelve cubs, seven scouts and three leaders. January of 1966 saw approximately one hundred and sixty boys in the movement.

This year with the influx of families to Labrador City, we expect to have over two hundred boys registered. Of course this depends on the availability of new leaders who, at present are very few. At this time there are twelve leaders all on a voluntary basis. At least six more leaders are needed to help the cubs and scouts of Carol Group, to become proficient in the aims outlined above.

Leader training is not a necessity, all that is required is a willingness to work with boys. A leader, each week, spends approximately five or six hours of his or her time, gaining the personal satisfaction of having helped make better citizens of tomorrow.

It would be greatly appreciated if more parents, especially the fathers, took an active interest in what their sons are doing on Friday nights. "DON'T SEND YOUR SON TO CUBS OR SCOUTS ---- BRING HIM!".

At a later date letters will be sent to parents explaining our hopes and expectations for the coming year.

We would now like to thank all those who helped make this past year's Cub and Scout camp at Sept. Iles, the success it was. First of all to the IRON ORE COMPANY OF CANADA and the QUEBEC NORTH SHORE AND LABRADOR RAILWAY, for their co-operation in transporting the boys from Labrador City to Sept Iles and return.

Also a special thankyou to MR. TCM MANUEL of Sept Iles, who made his car available and his many visits to camp, to assist in the numerous requirements necessary to a successful camp, which was set up and ready on the arrival of the cub packs from here by the Group Committee and Scouters of Sept Iles.

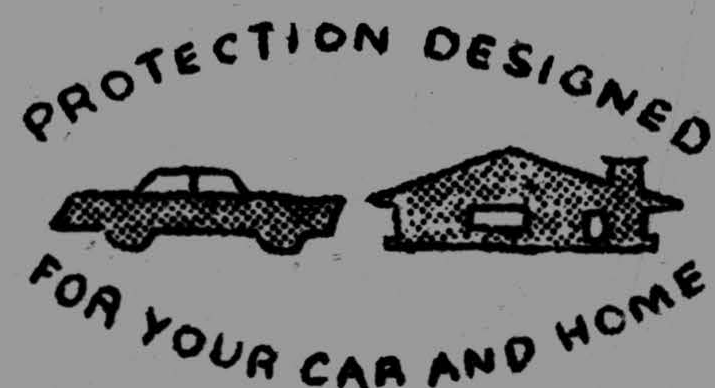

PRENATAL CLASSES

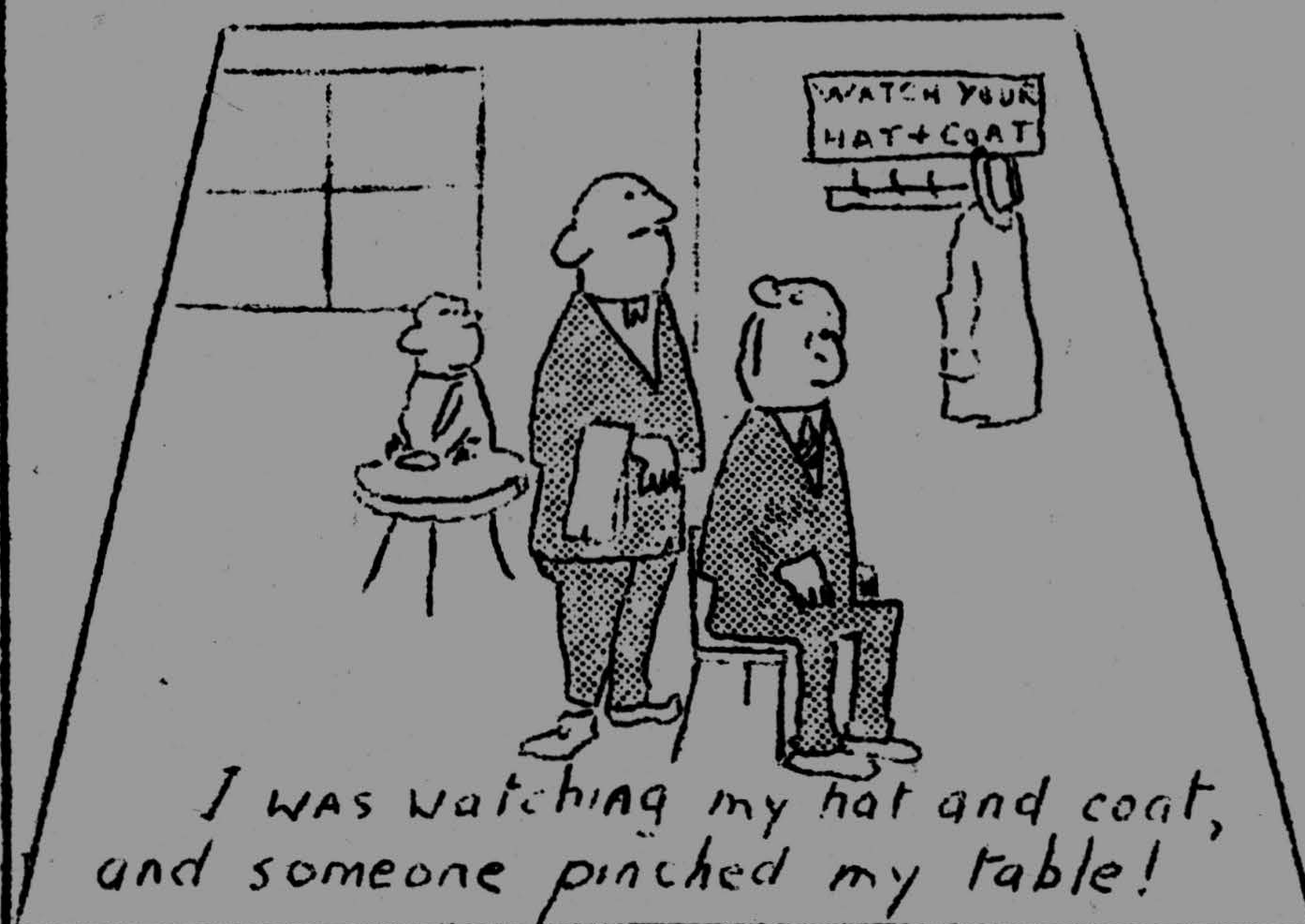
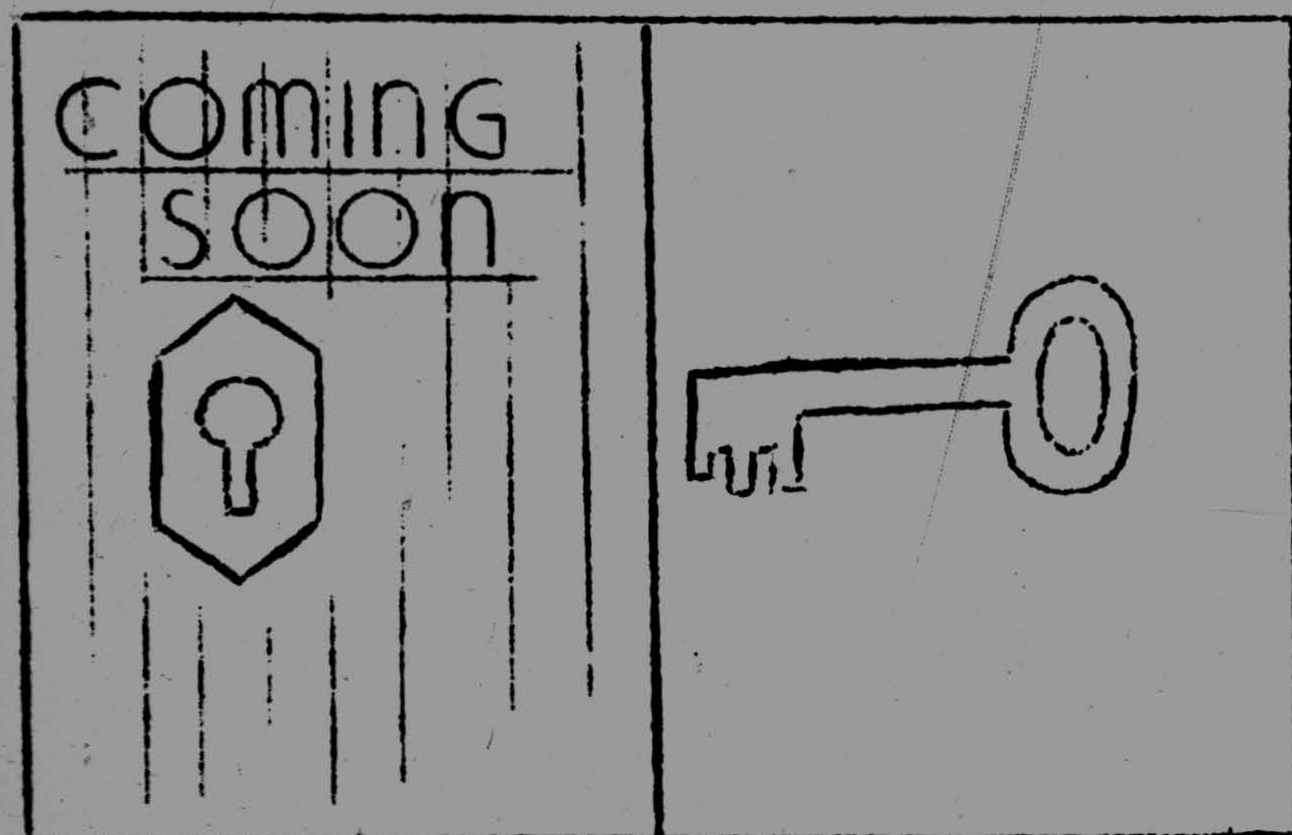
Classes for expectant mothers are held both at the hospital in Labrador City and in Wabush.

NEWFOUNDLAND PROVINCIAL EXAMINATION RESULTS

Labrador City Collegiate is very pleased to announce the following summary of results obtained by its students in Provincial Exams for the academic year 1966-67.

In the Grade Eleven English Section a total of twenty-nine students wrote the Newfoundland Provincial Exams. Twenty-six wrote the matriculation exams, five students received honour standing, fourteen received a matriculation standing and five met the pass certificate requirement. Three students wrote the certificate exams and all three were successful. The total percentage of passes for those taking the Grade Eleven Academic Course was ninety-three (93.1).

The Grade Eleven French Section had a total of four students write the Quebec Provincial Exams. Three students wrote the Scientific exams and all were successful. One pupil wrote the general exams and was also successful. This gave the French Section one hundred per cent passes.

The Grade Eleven Business Education Class wrote the Newfoundland Provincial Exams. Eight students wrote the exams and all were successful with one student attaining honours standing. This again represented one hundred per cent passes.

At the Grade Ten level, four students from the English Section wrote the Newfoundland Provincial Exams, three of these specifically for scholarship purposes. All four were successful in obtaining very satisfactory results. Scholarship announcements will be made before the end of September.

During the year the school operated night school classes and had forty-five students register for exams. In general, most of those who wrote the exams were successful. We take this opportunity to congratulate them and to encourage them and others to take advantage of this means of improving their educational standing.

To date, on the basis of the exam results, two scholarships have been awarded. Both scholarships are Iron Ore Co. of Canada Scholarships and were awarded to Antoin O'Neill and Sherida Workman. In the near future we will have information concerning other local and possibly provincial scholarships.

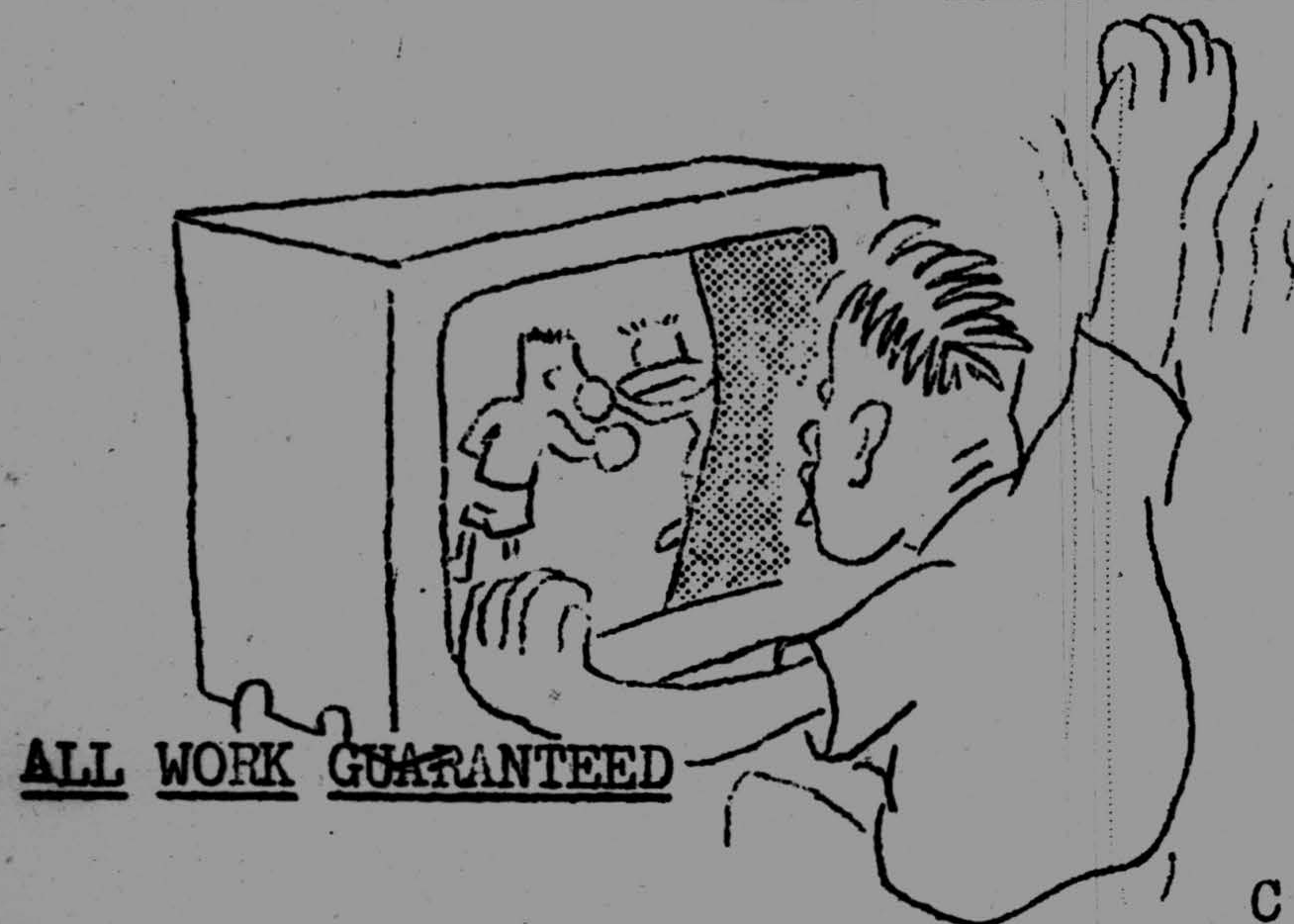

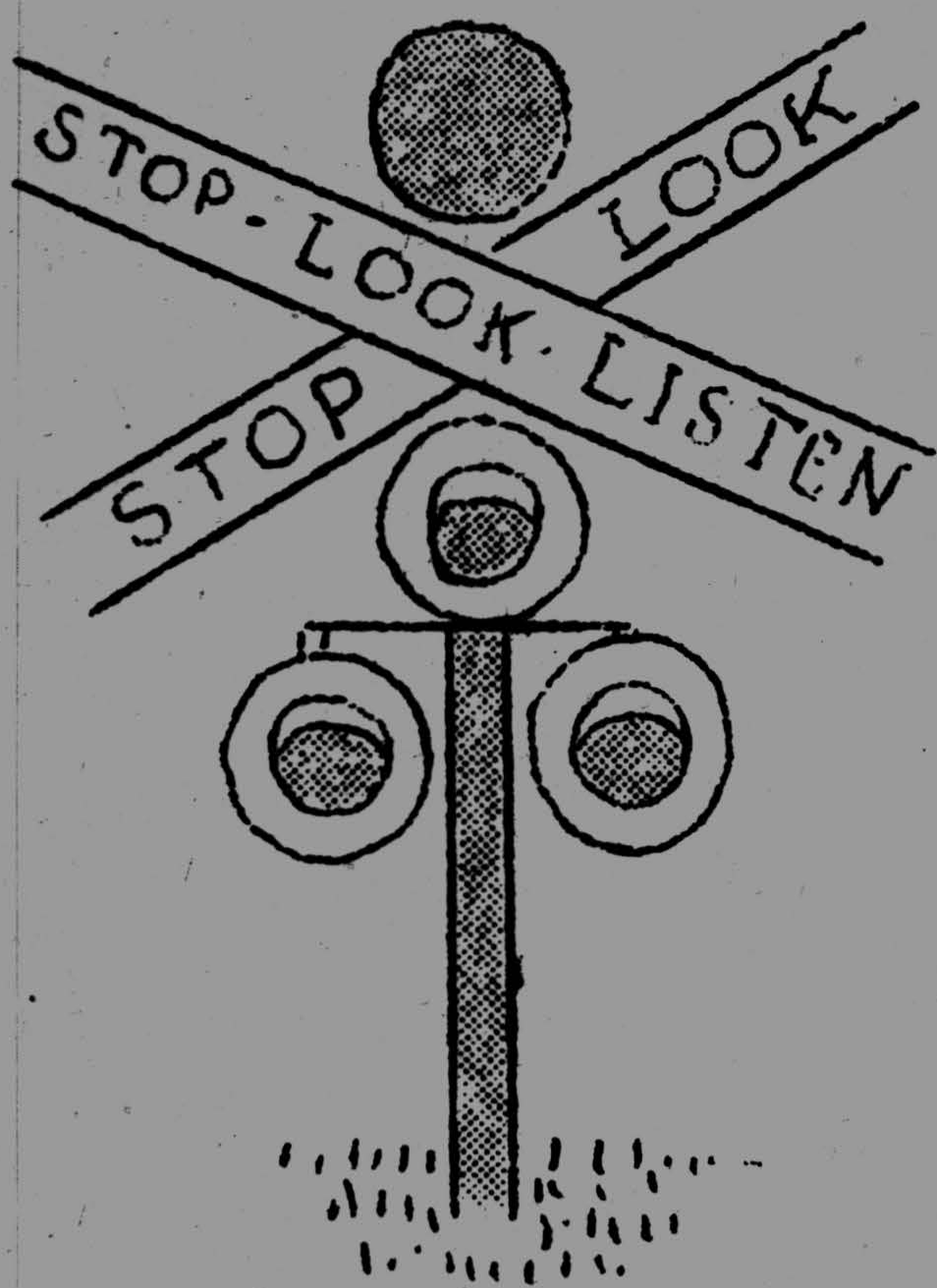

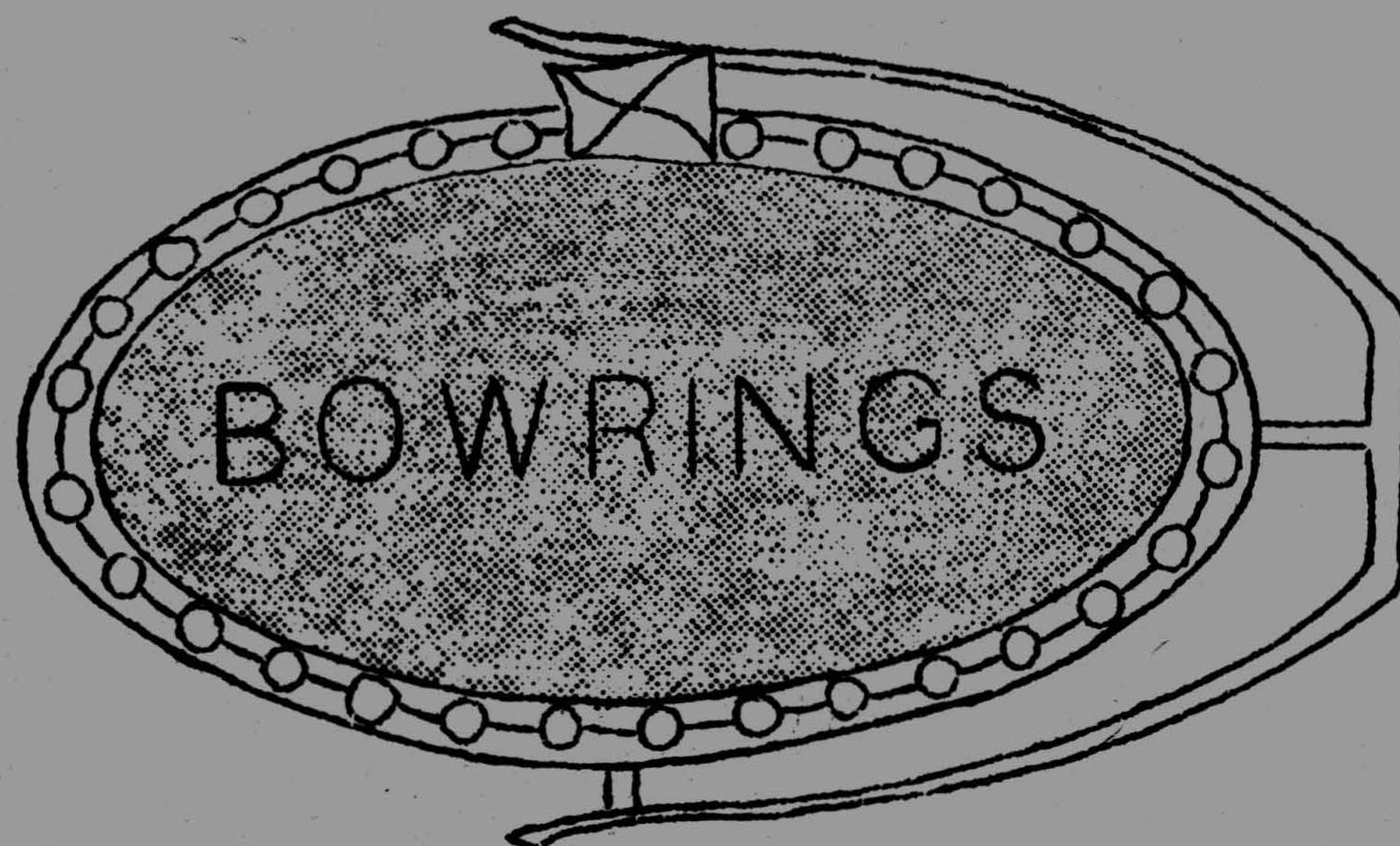
