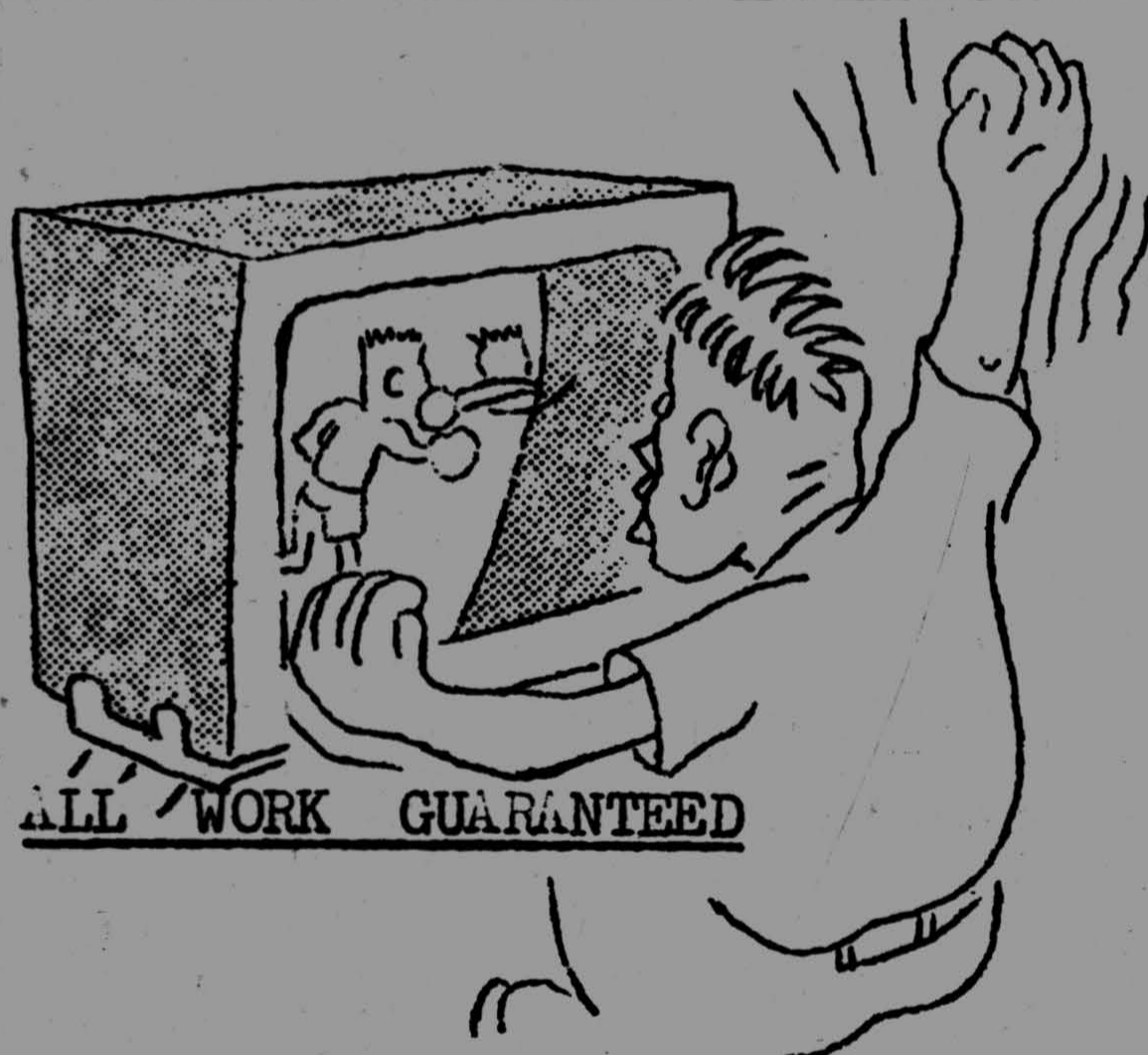
PRENATAL CLASSES

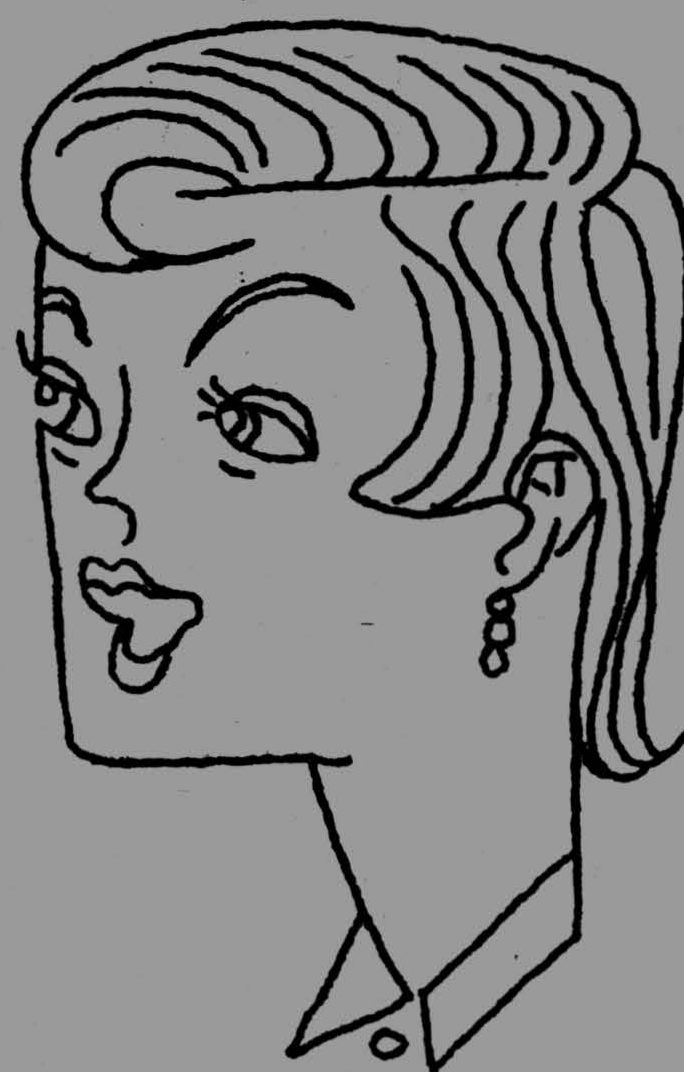

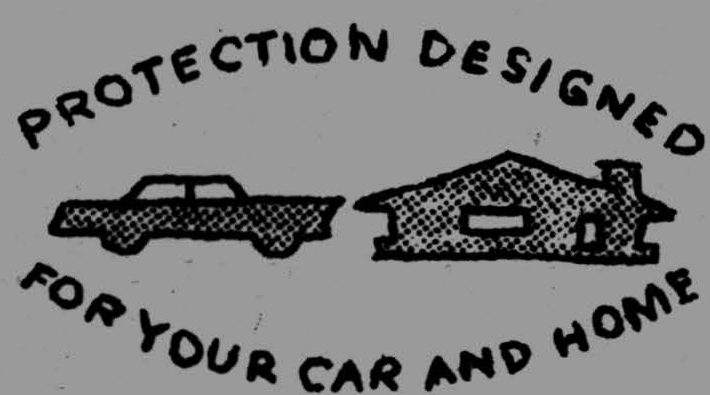
