Canvassers will call on each householder with pledge cards, indicating time and place of X-ray.

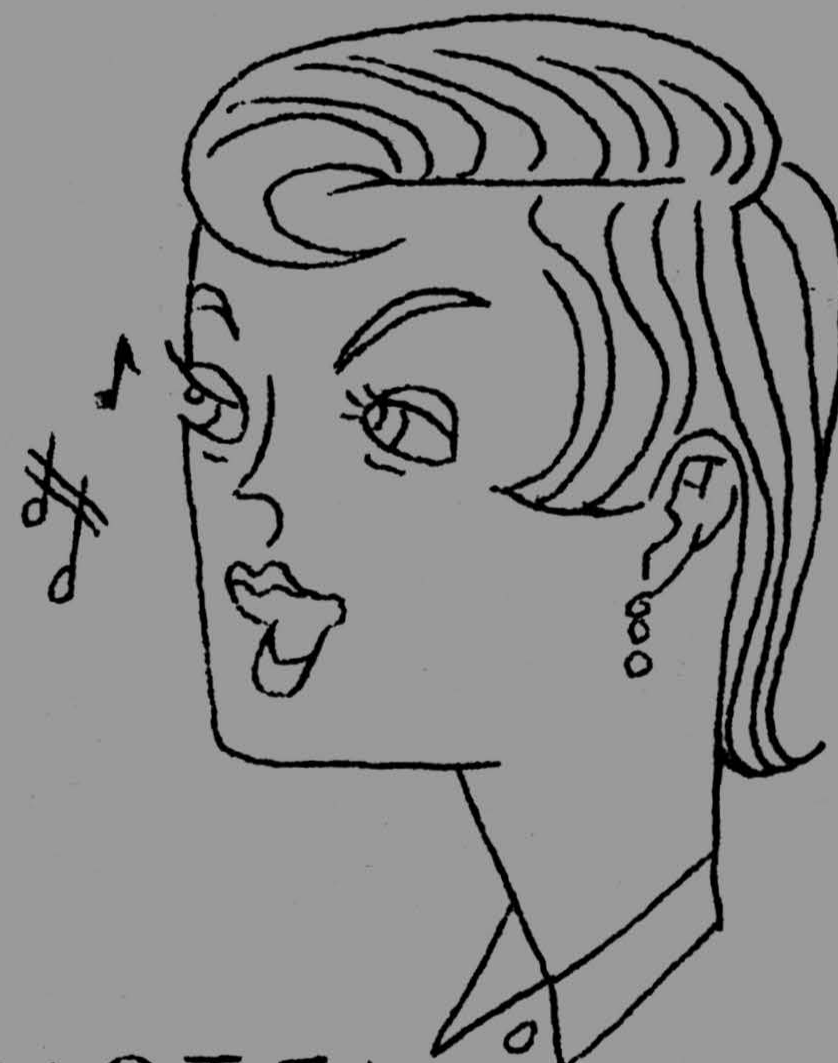

RELEASE - THE CANADIAN NATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND

Plans are now nearing completion for the Labrador City and Wabush CNIB Amblyopia Screening Survey to be conducted in October. Labrador City and Wabush will be a testing ground for a screening technique for the detection of Amblyopia. Amblyopia, or one-eyed or lazy eye blindness, is an eye problem in which the vision of the two eyes is unequal or the eye muscles are not balanced. The two eyes do not, therefore, work together and double vision results. The brain does not tolerate this double picture and suppresses the image impulses from the weaker eye. The CNIB warns that if the defect is not corrected before the child is seven, there is a permanent loss of vision in one eye. It is estimated that 10% to 15% of children have Amblyopia.

The Treatment for Amblyopia may involve patching the one eye to encourage the other eye to work again, eye exercises, corrective glasses, or if necessary, surgery.

The CNIB Superintendent for the Newfoundland and Labrador Division, Mr. J.E. Caruk, and the new Eye Service Supervisor, Miss Allison Sayers, will arrive in Labrador City and Wabush in the first week of October to commence the training of the volunteers and to put the final touches to the proposed programme. Already 12 nurses have volunteered to participate in the survey. Two screening areas will be set up - one in Labrador City and one in Wabush.

There are approximately 2,000 boys and girls of pre-school age in the two towns and about 1,000 of them are between 3½ and 7 years of age, which is the age group that is to be screened in the pilot project. A recently developed sight screener, which will be used in the survey, promises to become a great aid in the detection of Amblyopia. It will enable trained volunteers to mass screen accurately the pre-school population vulnerable to this eye condition.

In addition to volunteers who will assist with the screening, many other volunteers will be required for registering, recording, reviewing the "E" game with the children, transportation and possibly baby sitters for the younger children who cannot be left home alone. The project will be directed by Miss Allison Sayers who joined the CNIB Newfoundland and Labrador Division staff in July as Eye Service Supervisor. She will train the volunteers in the screening techniques to be used and will supervise the pilot project and assist the doctor to do the final diagnosis and treatment of all youngsters who will fail the screening test. The local medical doctors have agreed to follow-up on all treatment prescribed. The Labrador City and Wabush CNIB Amblyopia Screening Survey, with the co-operation of the Iron Ore Company of Canada and Wabush Mines and the help of volunteers will be held from the 9th to the 25th of October. The week of the 23rd of October those children discovered by the screening programme to have eye problems will be seen by an ophthalmologist (eye doctor) brought in, as part of the survey, from St. John's.

The CNIB Superintendent feels this is "an ideal situation and the final results should be very beneficial to the youngsters we pick up with the eye defect and to our future efforts in this field.

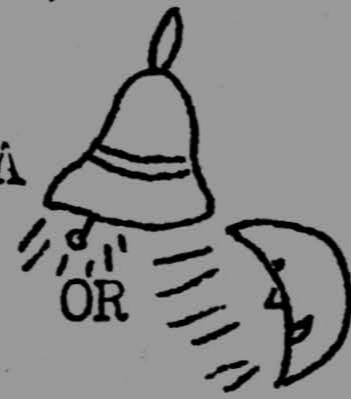

One Labrador City man was fined \$75.00 for driving his car at a speed which was greater than was reasonable under the existing conditions.

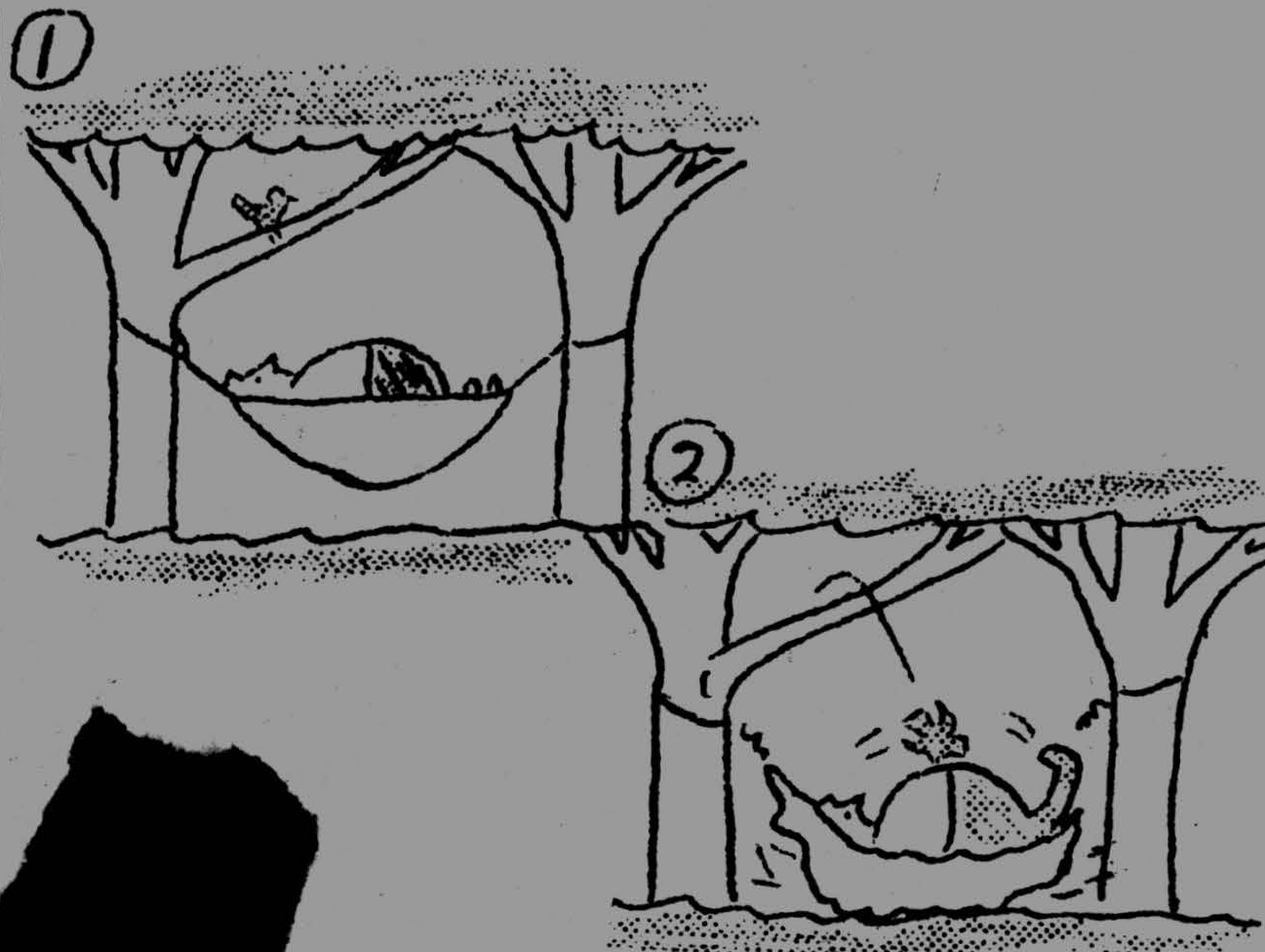
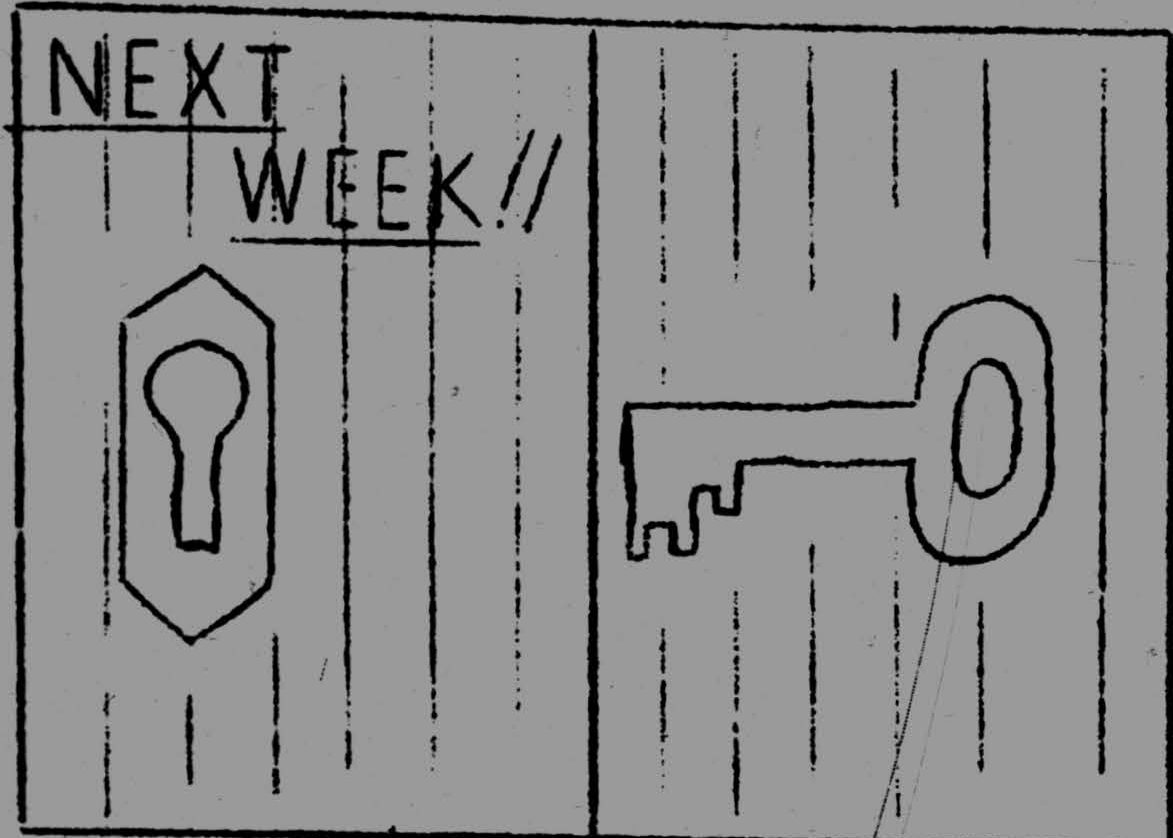
Two men and two women were convicted and fined for operating a motor vehicle without a driver's licence.

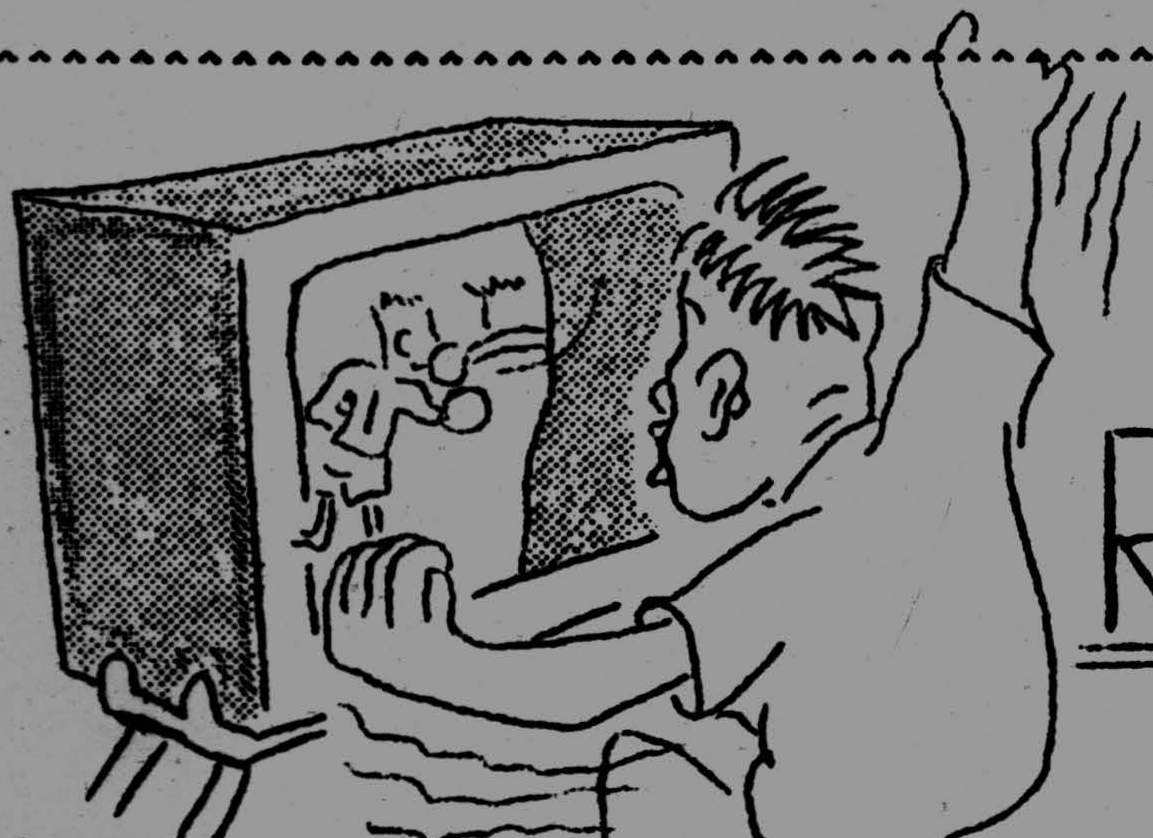

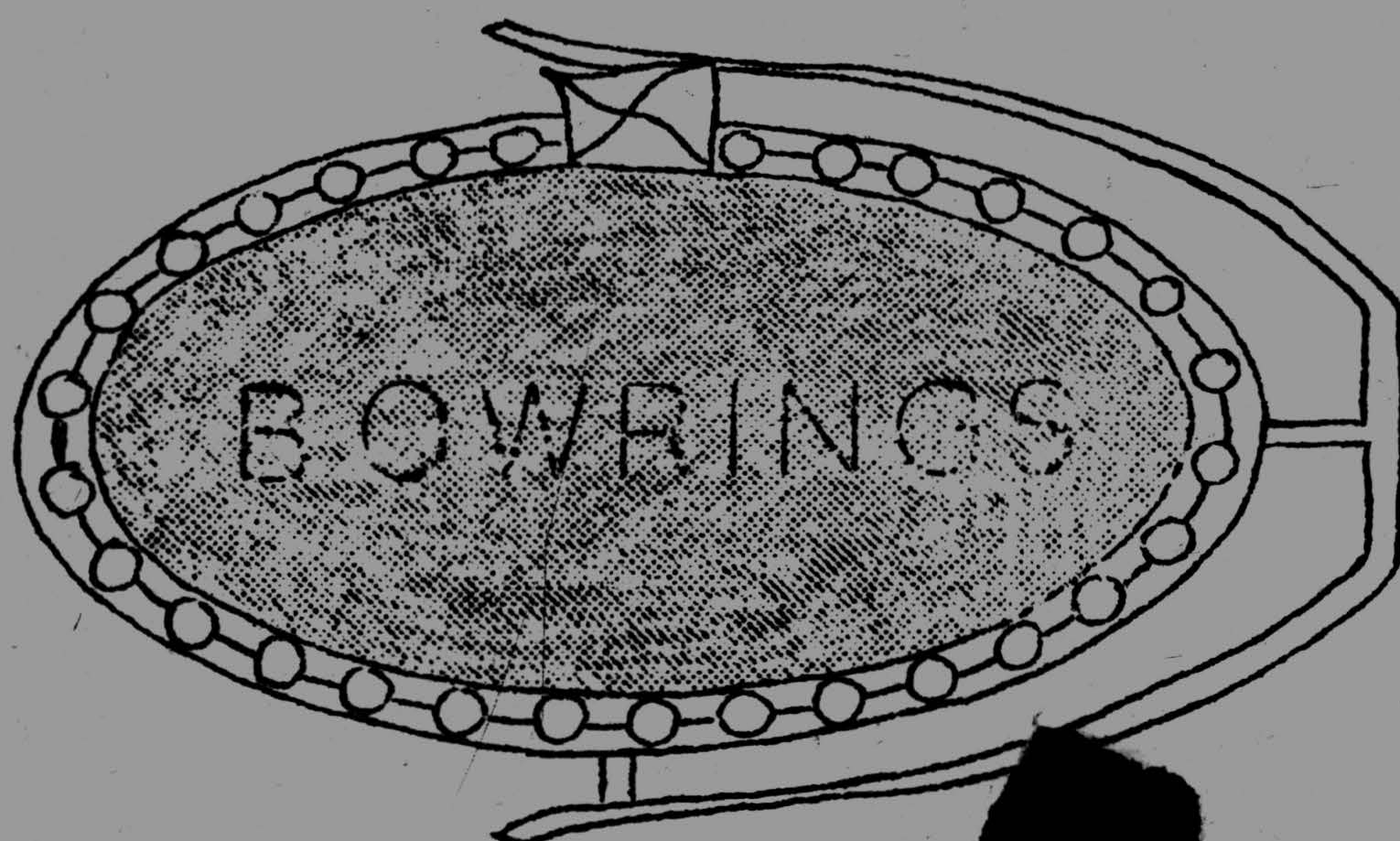
