R E P O R T

On Thursday September 28th, 1967 some forty members of the Newfoundland - Labrador Board of Trade visited Labrador City.

Perhaps the most welcome visitor in the Group was Mr. Keith Murrow, Provincial Manager of the C.B.C. who has just returned from a visit to Ottawa where he attended a series of meetings with his superiors. The radio and T.V. programming for this area was given top priority by Mr. Murrow and he assured Mr. Bill Hogan, chairman of the Citizens' Committee that within the near future radio broadcasts will be more centralized in their origin. Broadcasts will originate eventually in St. John's and other major centres in Newfoundland, presenting international, national, provincial and local programmes.

Mr. Murrow's interest in T.V. and his knowledge of the local situation were brought out at these meetings and he has been asked by his superiors to advise them of the programmes which can be produced in St. John's for showing in Labrador City. These programmes would be in the field of light entertainment, current affairs and news items. Mr. Murrow will be advocating this as much as he can, however this should not be left to one man alone.

The majority of the people, Mr. Hogan said, will complain to each other but never to the people concerned in Ottawa. These people, he said must be prepared to write down any complaints and send them to the C.B.C. The programming is very bad continued Hogan and the only people who can do anything about it are the residents in the area. If people took five minutes and a five cent stamp every week, over and over again, the situation would eventually be corrected.

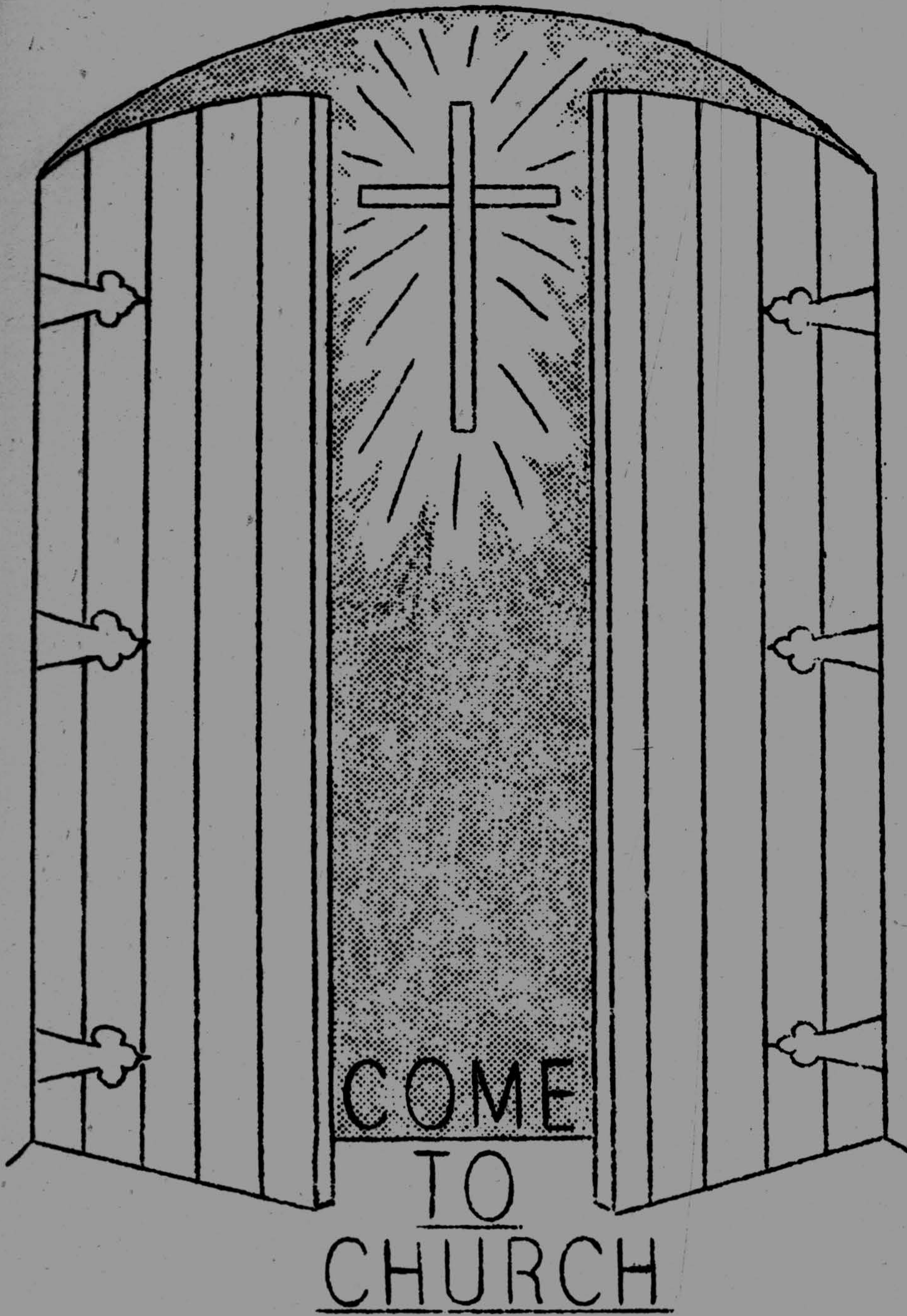

name-Guy's Hospital, one of the great centres of medicine in the whole world. He
gave more than a quarter of a million pounds to his hospital, and in doing so he gave
thousands a new chance of life.

So before we point our finger at the man next door, remember Thomas Guy, the
so-called miser, and think again.

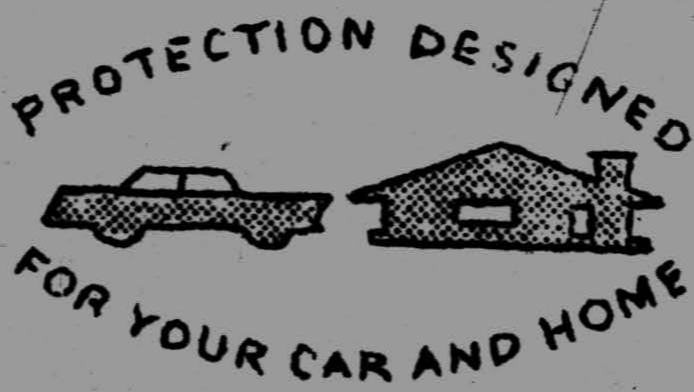

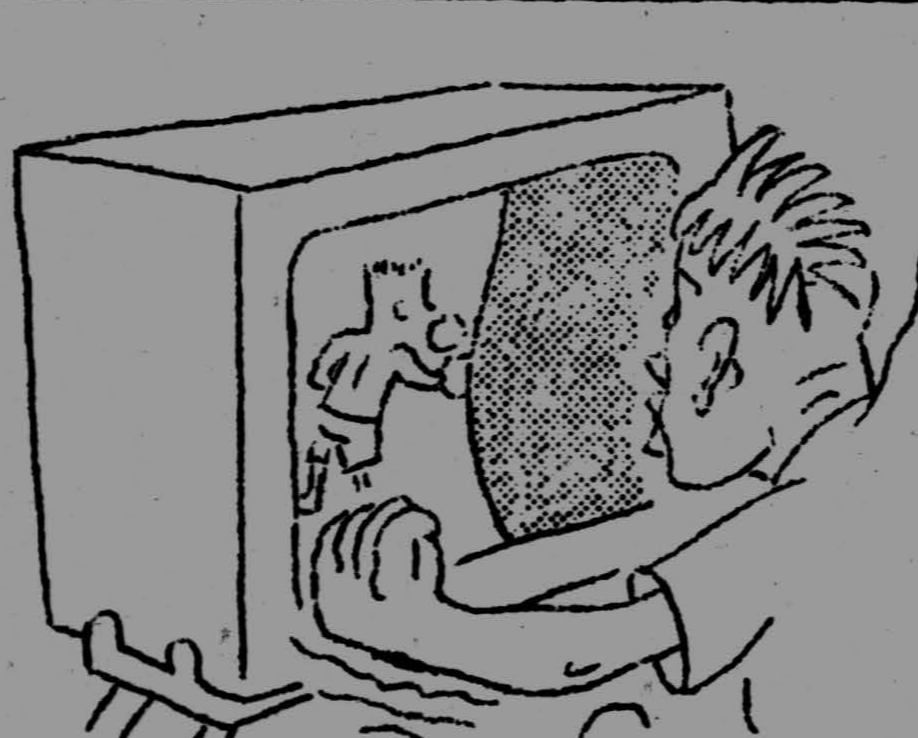

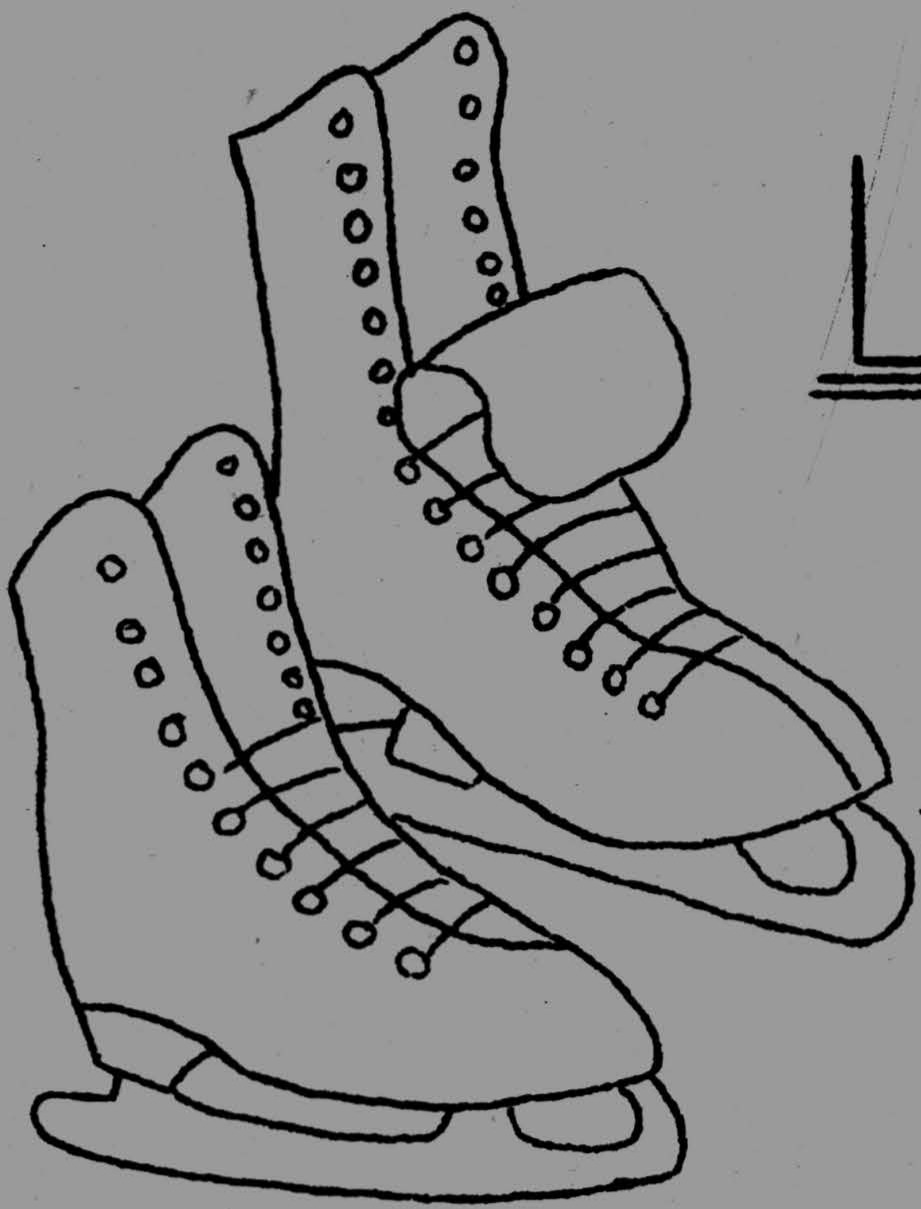

The organization of Minor Hockey in Labrador City and Wabush is flying high. Just this past week our association became affiliated with the C.A.H.A.; through the N.A.H.A. and Mr. Bill Todd was elected vice-president for Labrador.

To date over 250 boys in the area have registered for Minor Hockey. Wabush will have 5 teams and Labrador City 10 to 12 teams. The breakdown of the association in age groups is as follows:

MOSQUITO - 8 to 10 years as of May 31st.
PEE-WEE - 10 to 12 years " " " "
Bantam - 12 to 14 years " " " "
Midget - 14 to 16 years " " " "

Boys over 16 years and attending school will get the opportunity to play as they will be fitted in with the midget group where possible.

The Minor Hockey Association will be working in close liason with the schools, re grades of students etc; this means, a boy's grades must be up to par or else he will not be permitted to participate in the programme.

To date the Local Association consists of over 50 people including the executive, coaches, referees etc: They met the 2nd Thursday of every month to discuss problems and set policy. The general public and those interested in fostering Minor Hockey are invited to attend.

A large number of groups and firms have signified their intentions of sponsoring teams, but more are needed.

The executive informed me that 'if' there are any boys who haven't registered they may do so by contacting either Mr. Liniger or Mr. Furlong, physical education teachers at the schools.

Referees for minor hockey will come under Mr. Rollie Beliveau who has quite a few guys interested in doing the job. Instructions will also be given to players so that they may handle games out of their division.

Every boy participating will come under an insurance plan in case of injury etc; and in this regard the association has made it mandatory that each boy must have the necessary protective equipment, such as- HEAD GUARD, GLOVES, SHIN PADS, SKATE GUARDS, MOUTH GUARD etc. Sweaters and socks will be supplied by the association. It was passed by the Nfld: Minor Hockey Association, that FACE-MASKS for goalies are a necessity and must be worn (The L.A. will supply all goalie equipment).

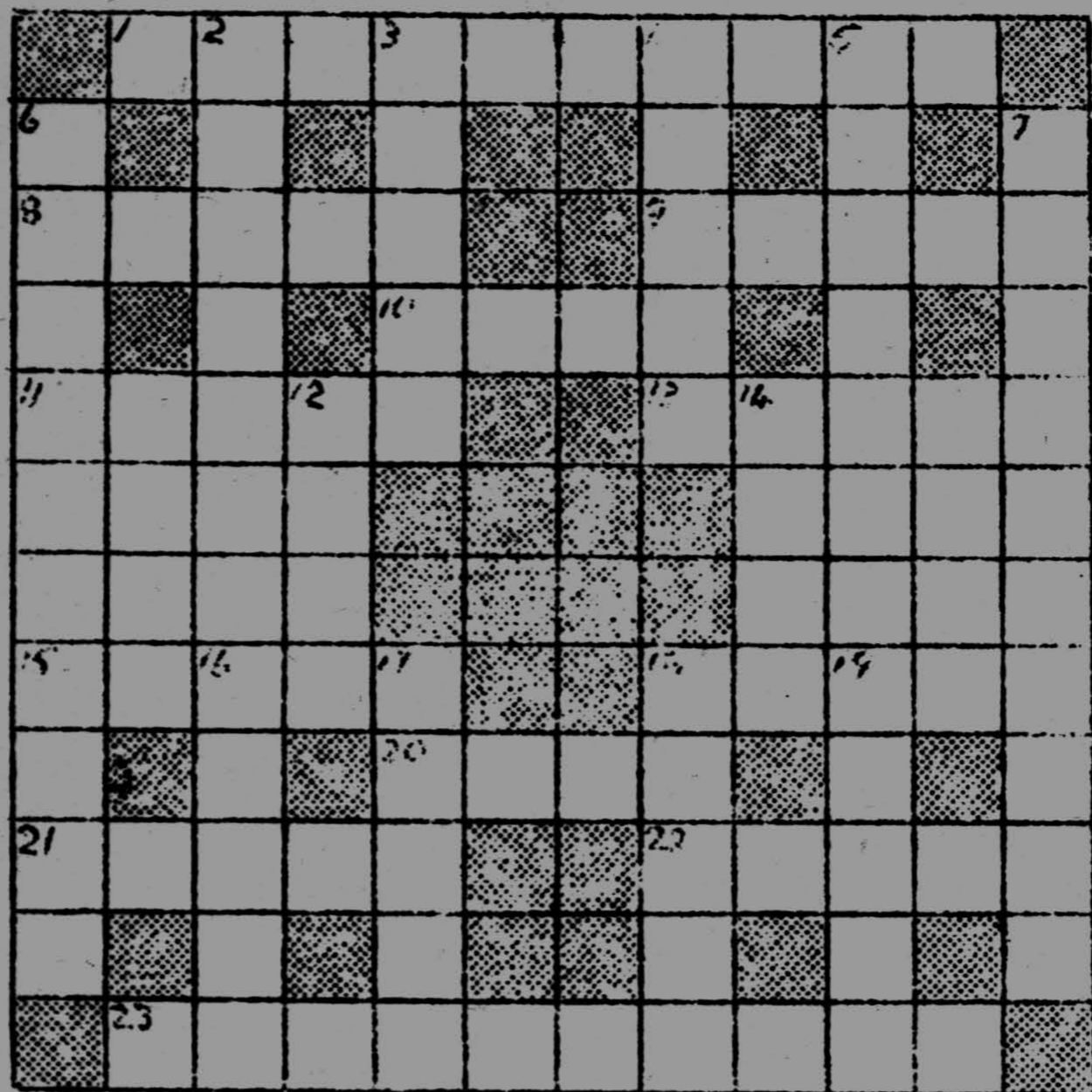

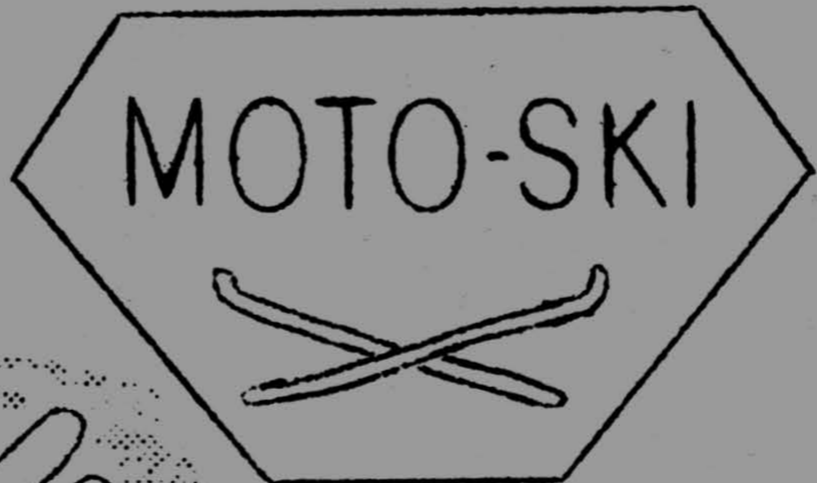
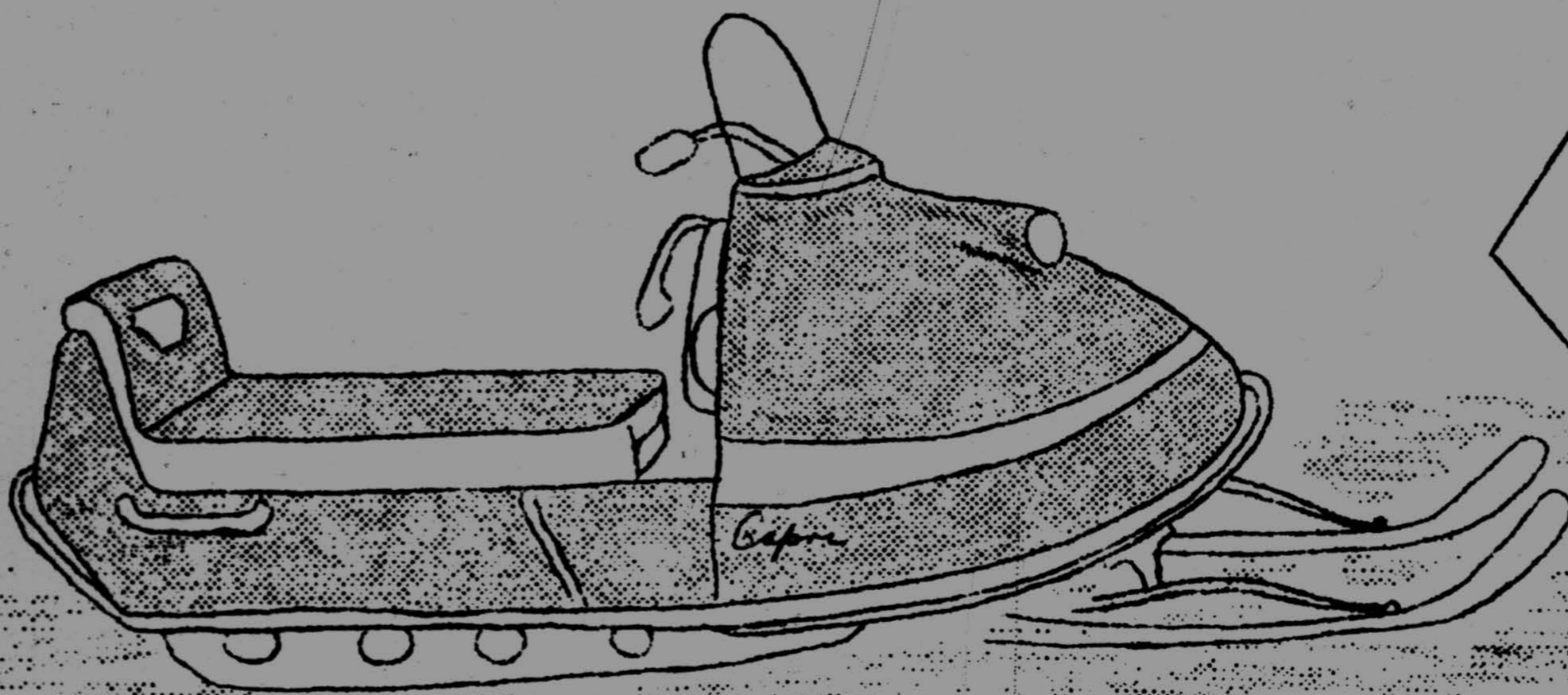
