Store in fridge or bake.



CBC'S TED WOOD- NAMED PROGRAMME DIRECTOR, RADIO CAE, GERMANY

The CBC Northern Service announces the appointment of T.J. (Ted) Wood, announcer-operator at the CBC Mackenzie radio-network centre, CFYK Yellowknife, as programme director of Radio CAE (Canadian Army - Europe) at Werl, West Germany, headquarters of 4 Canadian Infantry Brigade group. Mr. Wood, 27, whose hometown is Moncton, N.B., is being 'seconded' by the CBC to National Defence department. He replaces Barclay Macmillan, former manager of the CBC radio station in Inuvik, who becomes manager of Radio CAE. (The previous Radio CAE manager was Hans Konow, once manager of Northern Service radio station CFWH Whitehorse; Mr. Konow was recently appointed manager of Radio CFN, Lahr, West Germany, serving 1 Air Division personnel and their dependents.)

Mr. Wood, who is single, received his education in Moncton and Goose Bay, Labrador. He began his broadcasting career in 1961 as an announcer-operator with the Northern Service radio station CFGB Goose Bay. Previously he had worked as a clerk with the National Defence department in Moncton. In 1964 Mr. Wood was transferred to the CBC radio station in Grand Falls, Nfld., and in March of this year he was appointed to the staff of CFYK as announcer-operator. He reports at Radio CAE towards the end of this month after a short visit to his parents in Moncton.

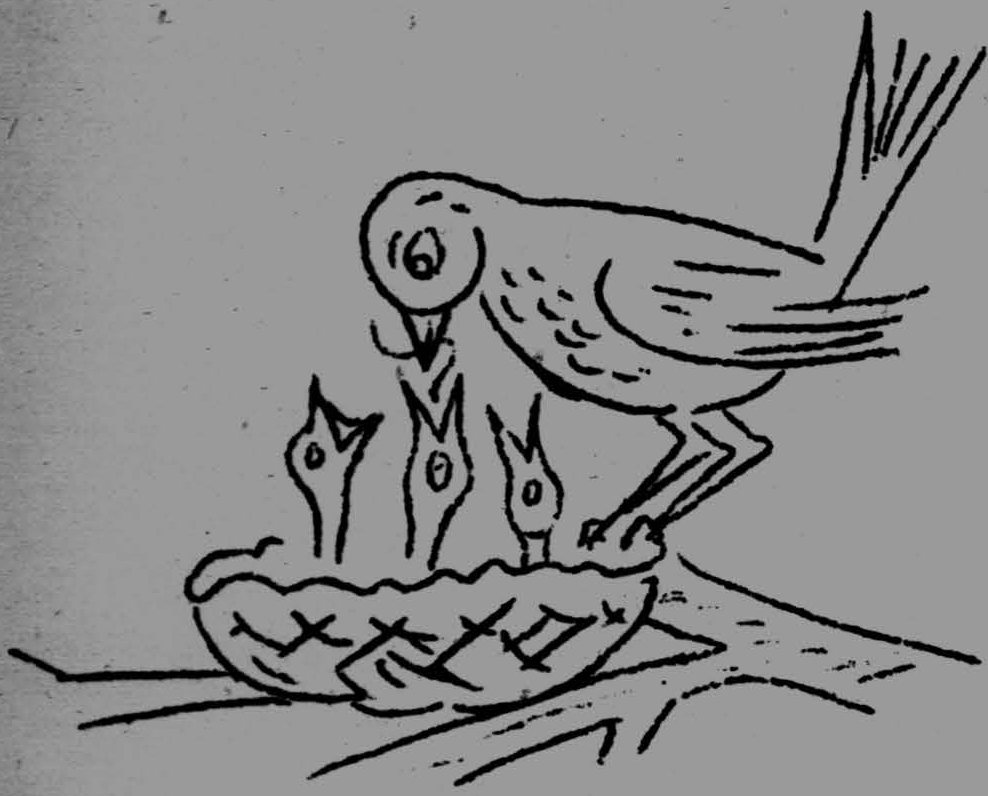

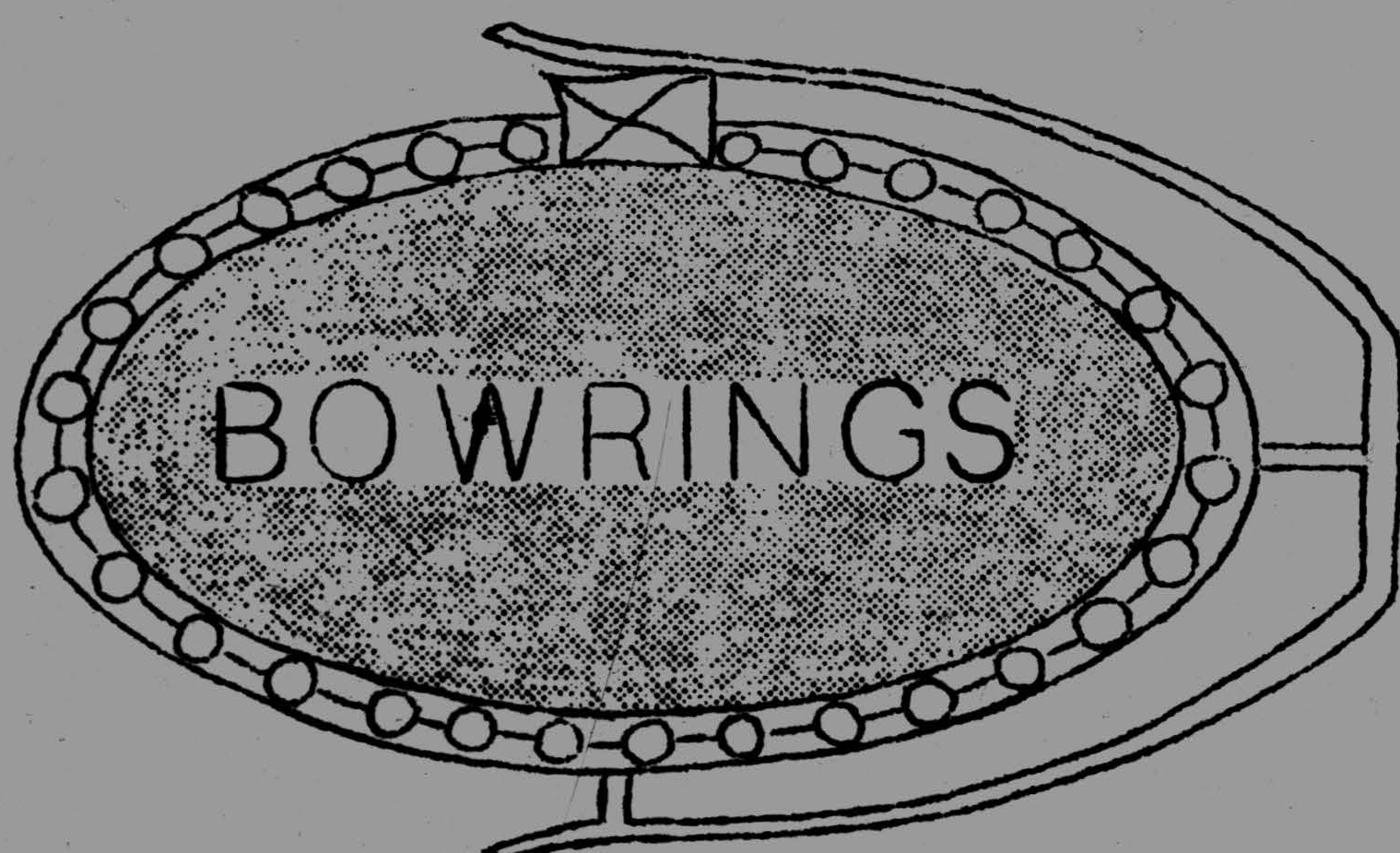
