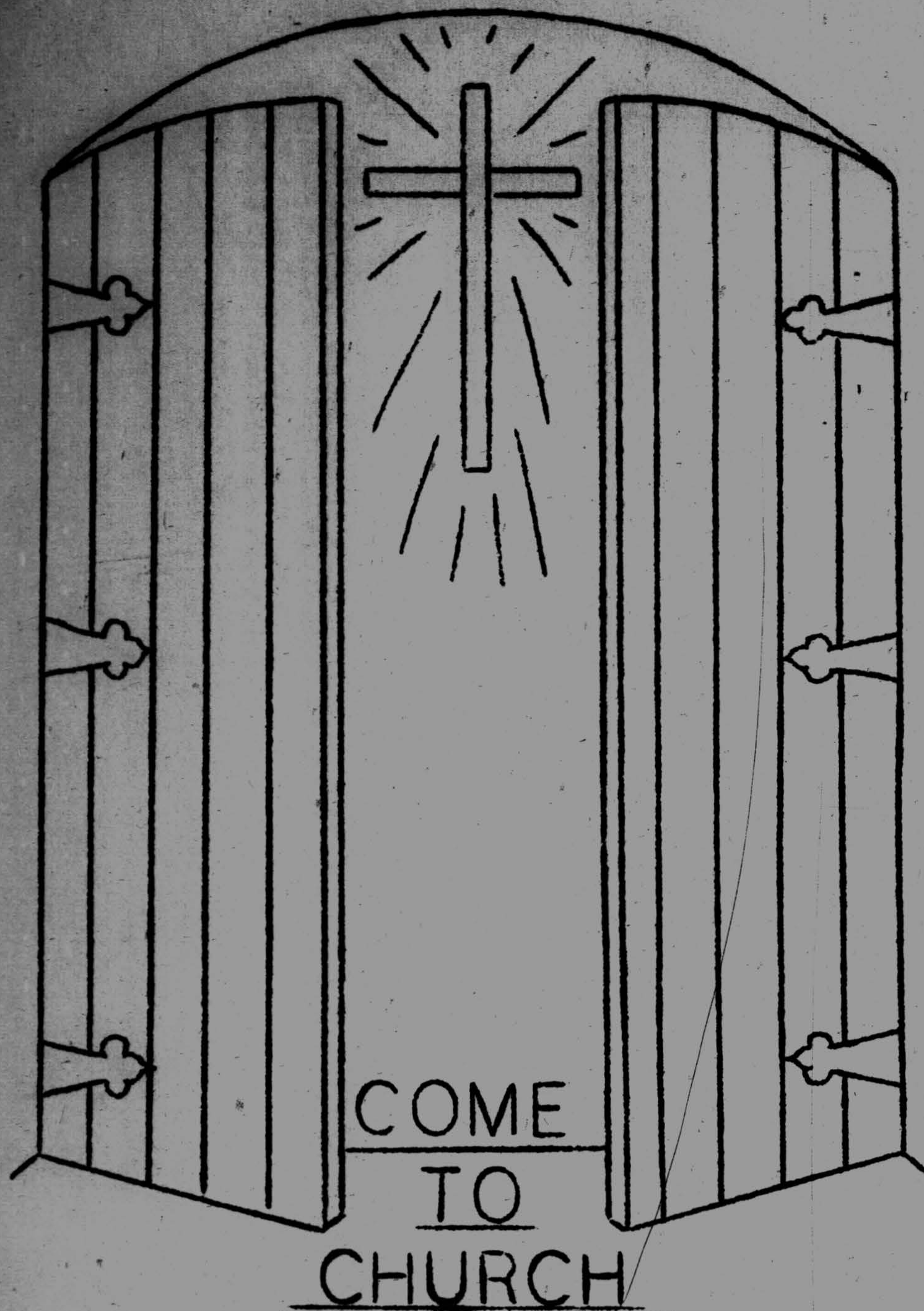

Another reminder to members. Due to our large membership guests are only permitted during weekdays and not over the weekend. That is about all for now, so we will see you on the ice.

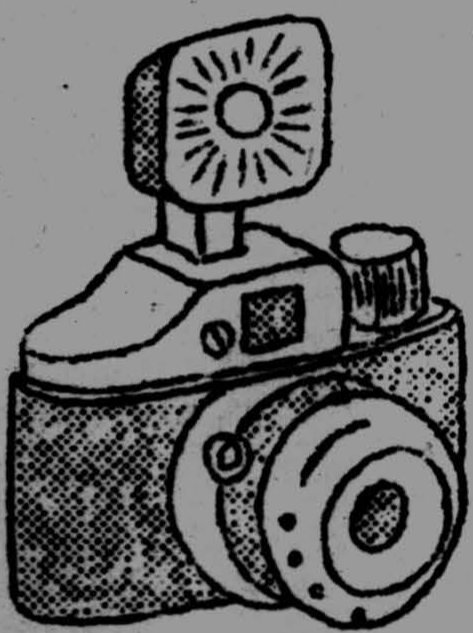

PRESS RELEASE

10. November 1967.

Sixteen Foreign Officers of the Department of State for External Affairs will visit Newfoundland and Labrador next week for a close look at this Province. The tour is being made with the cooperation of the Canadian Association for Adult Education. Mr. D. Snowden, Director of Extension Services for the Memorial University of Newfoundland, is a national director of C.A.A.E. and has responsibility for organizing the Newfoundland and Labrador visit.

As part of their introduction to the Province, the Foreign Service Officers will get a capsule course in Newfoundland history. Dean Leslie Harris of Memorial will speak on the early and pre-Confederation period; Telegram Associate Editor Harold Horwood will describe the advent of Confederation, and MHA Ed Roberts will review events since Confederation.

On Tuesday morning, the visitors will tour the Fisheries College, the University's Marine Science Research Laboratory and the Arts and Culture Centre. In the afternoon, the party will be greeted by Hon. Leslie R. Curtis, Q.C., Acting Premier and President of the Council. Next they will be briefed on Churchill Falls by Mr. Gordon Pushie of the Premier's Office; on Labrador City by Mr. C. Howse of the Iron Ore Co. of Canada and on coastal Labrador by Mr. A. Williamson of the University. Mr. Ken Harnum of the Department of Community and Social Development will talk about the resettlement programme and its impact upon Newfoundland and Labrador.

On Wednesday, the visiting Foreign Service Officers will tour Marystown to get a first-hand look at industrial development in a planned resettlement location.

Thursday, the group moves to Labrador City where a unique feature of the programme will send each of the visitors into a Labrador City home to get a first-hand look and opinion on life in the northern part of the Province. As guests of the Iron Ore Co. of Canada they will also tour the mining operations.

The Foreign Service Officers are appointed to Canadian Embassies and consulates all over the world once their training is complete. Some of the group visiting Newfoundland and Labrador have already had foreign service.

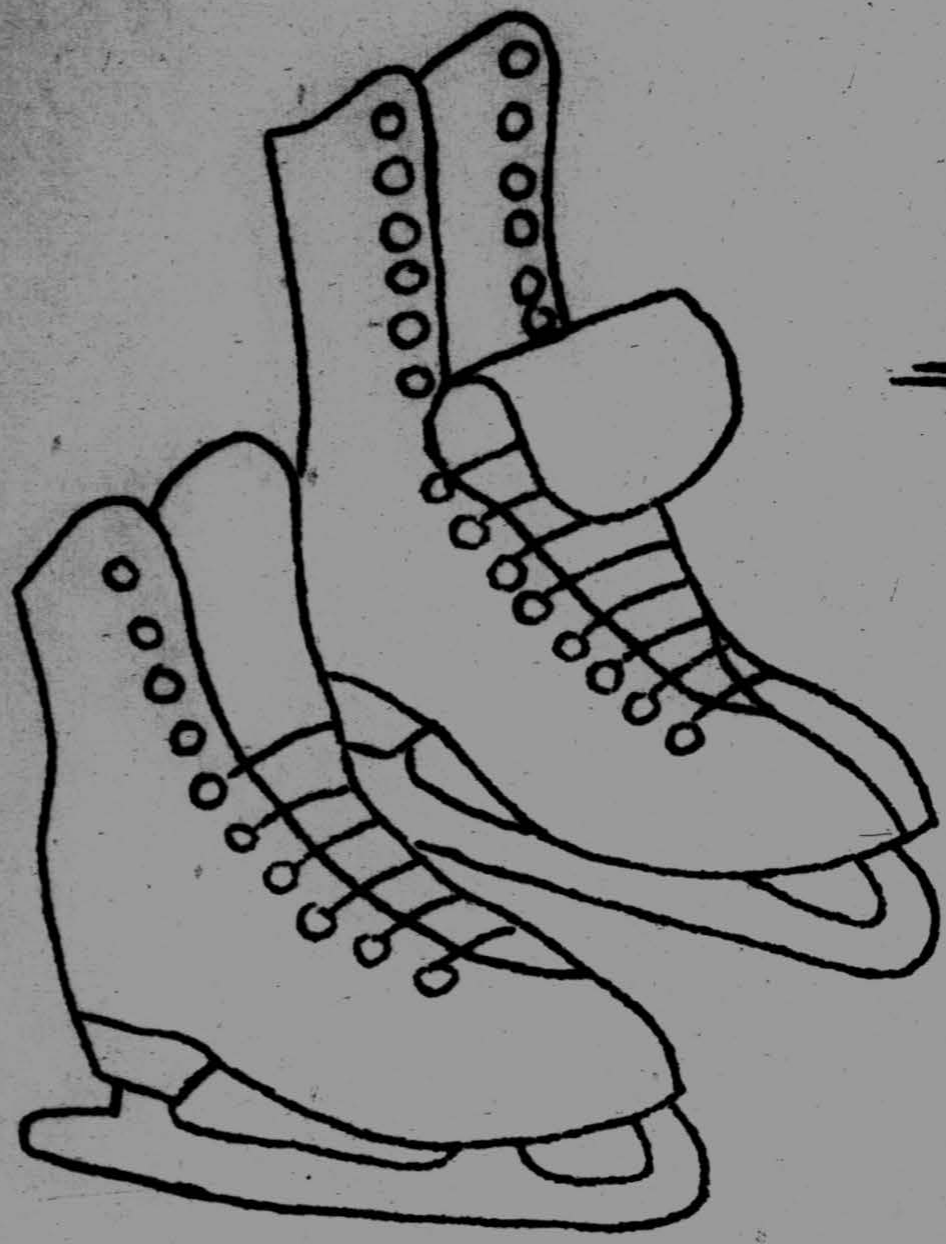

The first Hockey of the season will be held this coming Sunday night, November 19th at 8:30 pm; when the All-stars play an Inter-squad game. The proceeds of this game go towards Minor Hockey. Admission: will be 50¢ for adults and 25¢ for children (accompanied).

SPORTS BEAT BY DON

The fourth basic hockey skill for Minor Leaguers deals with shooting. You need to know how:-

- (a) To shoot forehand and backhand.
 - (b) To locate the ideal target areas in the net.
- Some good pointers on shooting are:

- (1) Grip the stick firmly with your lower hand near the centre of the shaft.
- (2) Draw the puck well behind the plane of your body, turning your right shoulder to the net.
- (3) Sweep the puck towards the net, snapping the wrists into the shot.
- (4) At the same time transfer your weight from the rear foot to the front foot.
- (5) Shoot low by stopping the follow-through of the stick. Shoot high by flicking the wrists and lifting the stick in it's follow-through.
- (6) Pick the net opening, look down, ready the puck, and shoot. Later as you gain control, you won't need to look down.

In making the backhand shot, bring the puck to the set position at the right side, turning the left shoulder to the net. Sweep the puck forward, driving hard off the right skate. As your wrists will tend naturally to lift the puck in this move, you may find this shot always goes high. Remedy this by decreasing both follow-through and wrist action.

There are certain ideal spots in the net at which to aim. Unless you know, and look for these, you find all your shots are directed at the goalkeeper's pads. Notice in what hand the goalie holds his stick. The bottom six inches of that side of the net is his weakest spot, since his catching hand covers the opposite side. For a left-hand goalkeeper, then, this would be his lower right hand corner. Other good spots are the high corners, just inside the posts, and right along the ice. Quickly select your opening and get your shot away fast.

Practice shooting, with a specific target in mind. Work to shorten the length of time it takes you to get the puck away.

You will notice that the slapshot hasn't been mentioned, it's advisable to develop your wrist-shot as the former is both difficult and very inaccurate. After mastering the wrist shot you may then try the slap-shot. Next week a look at CHECKING.
