OUR EDITORIAL THIS WEEK WAS KINDLY SUBMITTED BY CAPTAIN J. CAREW  
OF THE SALVATION ARMY.

Commissioner and Mrs. C.D. Wiseman, Territorial Commanders for the Salvation Army in Canada and Bermuda, will be in Labrador City on the week-end of December 2 and 3, 1967 for the official opening and dedication of The Salvation Army Citadel on Bartlett Drive. They will be supported by Colonel and Mrs. Wm. Ross, Provincial Commanders of the Salvation Army in Newfoundland and Labrador. Also on hand for the occasion will be Colonel Hanna Janes, who is well known to many people in this area, having spent a year as administrator to the Captain William Jackman Memorial Hospital, during its first year in operation.

The opening and dedication of the new citadel on Bartlett Drive marks another milestone in the history of the Salvation Army in Labrador City. Services were first commenced by Mr. Gerald Cooper on April 15, 1961 in an office building owned by the Bechtel Co: September 3, 1961 marked the official opening of services with Captain John Gerard assuming command of the corps. In December 1962, Commissioner W. Booth visited Labrador City and opened and dedicated the pre-fabricated steel building which has been used until now for Salvation Army activities.

The official opening of the new citadel will take place on Saturday December 2, 1967 at 3 pm; and the solemn service of dedication will be held on Sunday December, 3 1967 beginning at 3 pm: Also on Sunday Commissioner and Mrs. Wiseman will be conducting the holiness meeting which begins at 10:30 am. and an Evangelistic meeting at 7:30 pm:

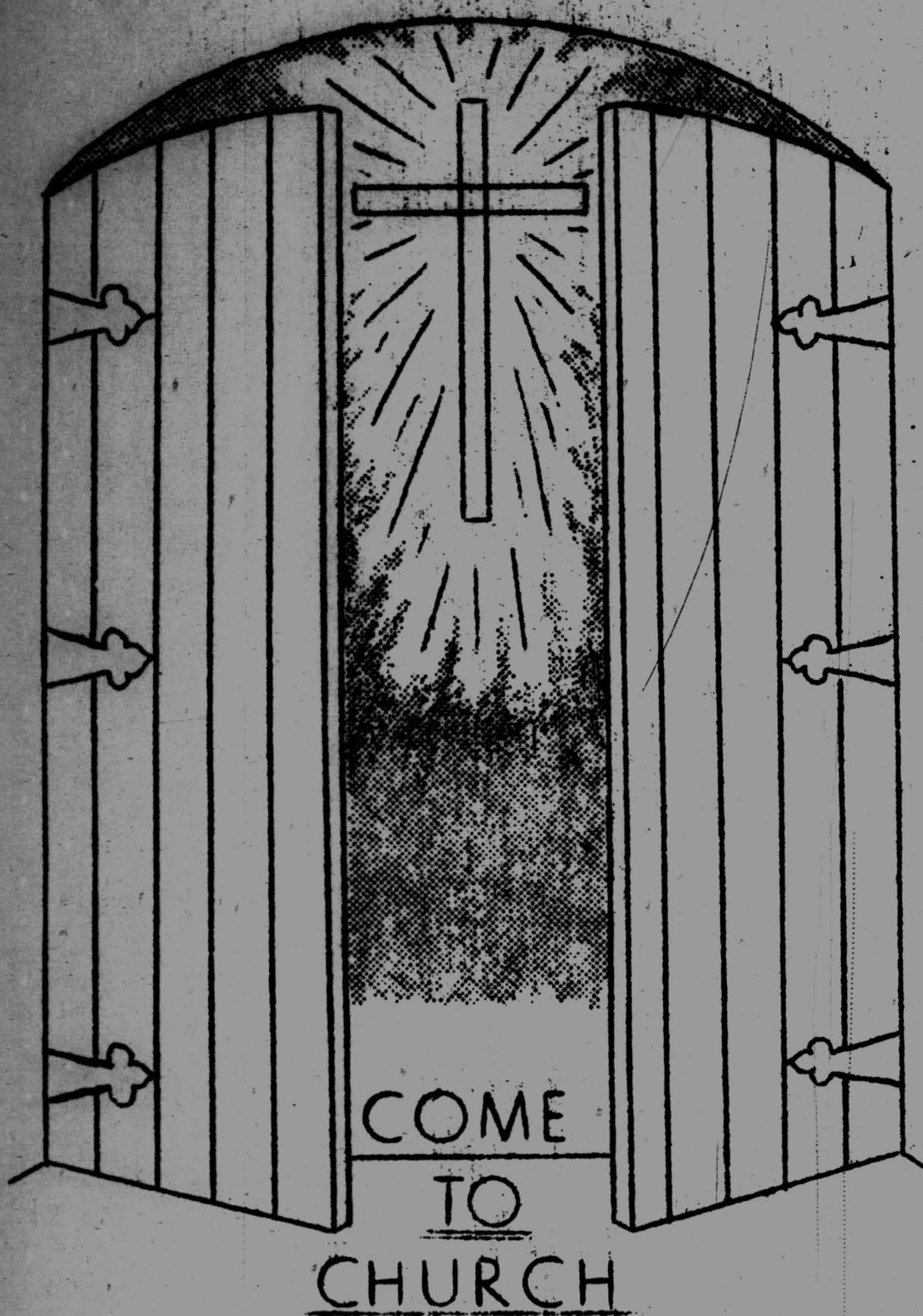
Commissioner and Mrs. C.D. Wiseman are well known to many of you, having served in Newfoundland for several years in charge of the Army's work, and as Chief Secretary for Canada and Bermuda, with headquarters in Toronto. An appointment as Territorial Commanders for East Africa preceded their assuming principalship of the International Training College for Salvation Army Officers in London, England, where they spent several years before being appointed back to Canada as Territorial Commanders for Canada and Bermuda. Commissioner Wiseman also served as Chaplain with the Canadian Armed Forces overseas during the second world war. The general public is cordially invited to attend any or all of the services to be held during the opening of the Salvation Army's new Citadel on Bartlett Drive.

## TIPS FOR MINOR LEAGUERS #5 - CHECKING

TO BE A GOOD CHECKER YOU NEED TO KNOW HOW:-

- (a) To poke check and hook check with your stick. (b) To body check
- (c) To cover a man without the puck.

HERE ARE SOME GOOD POINTERS ON CHECKING:-

- (1) To poke check, aim a quick thrust of your stick at the puck, releasing your lower hand as you do so.
- (2) To Hook check, snake your stick using one hand only, as far out as you can reach, bending low to place as much of your stick as possible flat on the ice. Stride forward with your right foot at the same time.
- (3) To bodycheck, the player readies himself with slightly bent knees, wide stance and body lean, watching the attacker closely. At the last moment, he shoves hard off the rear foot, driving his shoulder and hip into his opponents body. The stick blade is kept close to the ice throughout. As body checking requires good timing, it should only be used when this timing is mastered. A missed body check usually leaves the path to the goal open. Never use a body check in your own end unless you have a team-mate on hand to pick up the loose puck. You may take out one attacker on to find he has passed to a team-mate in a scoring position.

All players except the goalie must know how to cover a man, since this is essential in back checking. Here are some good tips on covering:-

- (1) Stay between your man and the puck: In your own end, stay between him and the goal.
- (2) Know where the puck is at all times when covering. (DON'S SPORTSBEAT CONT)

Miss Judy LaMarsh, Secretary of State will support any efforts to improve local radio and T.V.

Mr. Bill Hogan met briefly with Miss Lamarsh, Hon.Dr.F.Rowe, Provincial Minister of Education and Labrador Affairs, Hon.Dr. C.A.Frecker, Minister of Provincial Affairs, M.H.A. Tom Burgess and Andrew Chatwood, M.P. at various times during the weekend of November 11th - 14th. and received strong support for the work of his committee.

Dr. Rowe, recently appointed Minister of Labrador Affairs, stated that although he does not expect to be assigned to the office very long he will do all in his power to see that Labrador City and Wabush as well as Labrador in general, receive consideration from the Provincial Government. Dr. Rowe predicted that in the near future there will be a road across Labrador to the Island of Newfoundland via Goose Bay. He also pointed out that 50 miles of the road is now completed between Goose Bay and Churchill Falls. Dr. Rowe went on to say that there will be a public building( Provincial - Federal) built in the area and that special consideration will be given to housing a civic auditorium in that building if there is a need. Mr.Hogan pointed out to him that local Theatre groups, Community Concerts and other public service clubs are depending on local schools to provide space for these activities even though the schools have sufficient activities of their own and are in constant need of this space.

Dr. Rowe said that he would lead a delegation to meet with officials on the improvement of local Radio and T.V.

The Hon.Dr.Frecker advised Mr.Hogan that he personally would support any move to have cultural and sports exchanges with the rest of Newfoundland, saying that he thought there was a great need for such exchanges and that he will do all he can to encourage them. Mr. Hogan says that Dr.Frecker can be counted on as a strong and influential friend in any endeavours to improve living in our communities.

Mr.Tom Burgess M.H.A. very vigorously attacked the Programming of C.B.C.locally both on Radio and T.V. and stated that this area should be taken from the Northern services of the C.B.C.and placed under the Management of the Newfoundland Regional Office. Mr. Burgess asked for the support of all visiting officials in correcting this situation and received it. He also supported the Citizens' Committee's call for more public support by the writing of letters and to steadily complain about the service and in this way and this way only will matters improve.

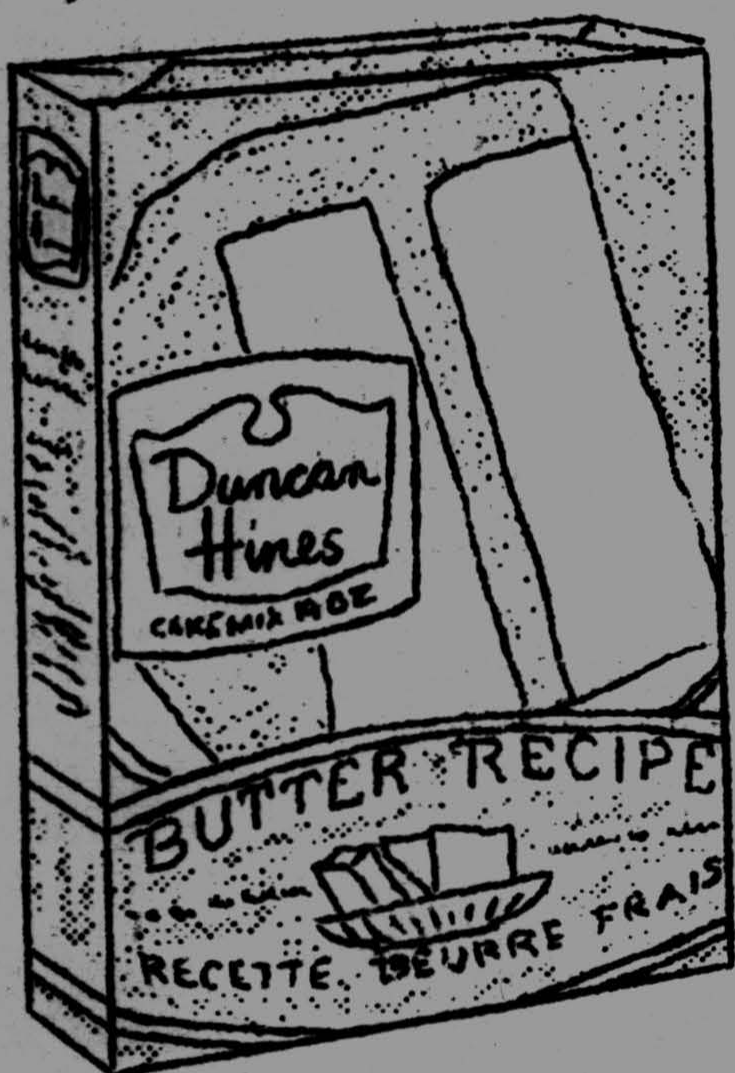

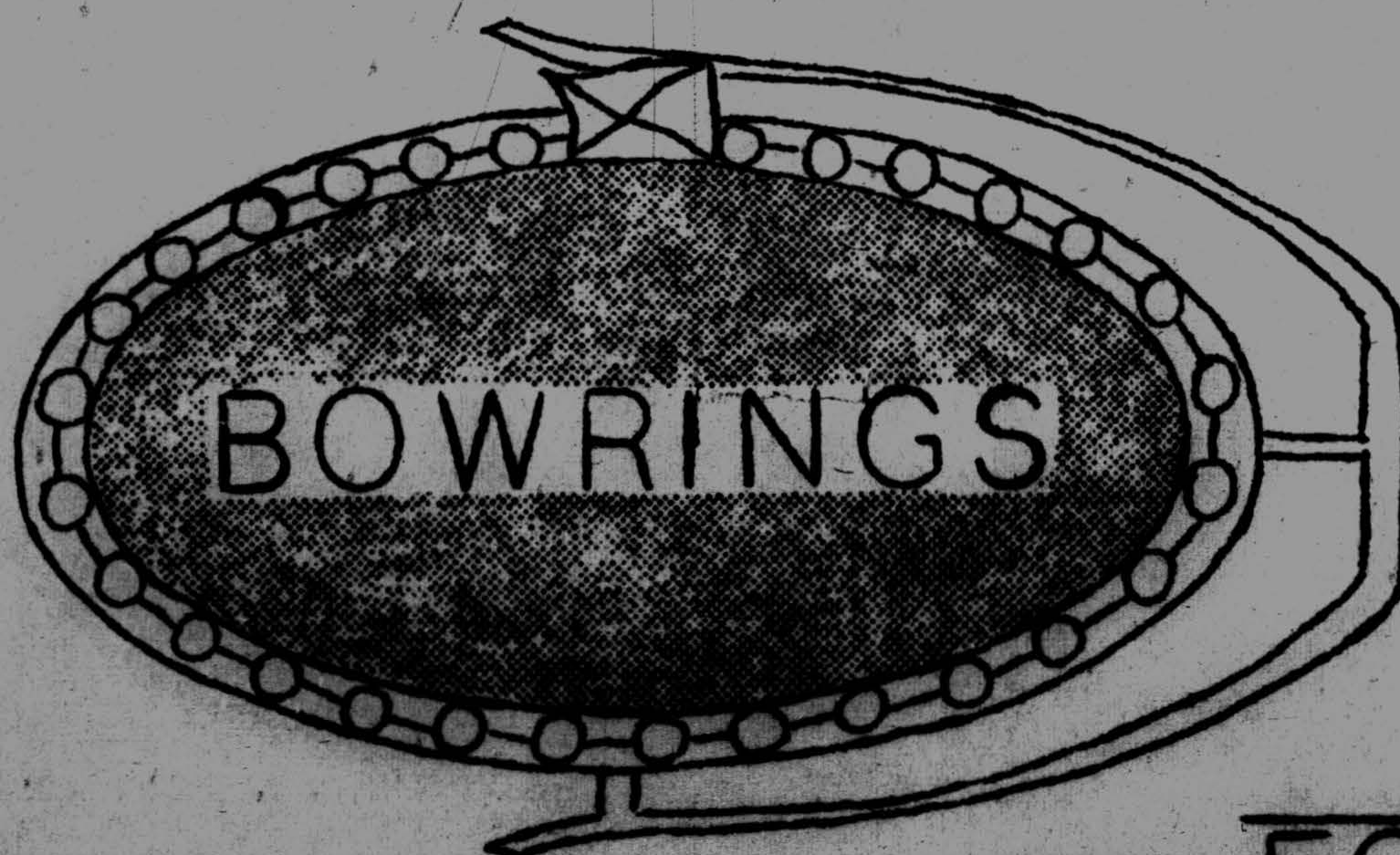
