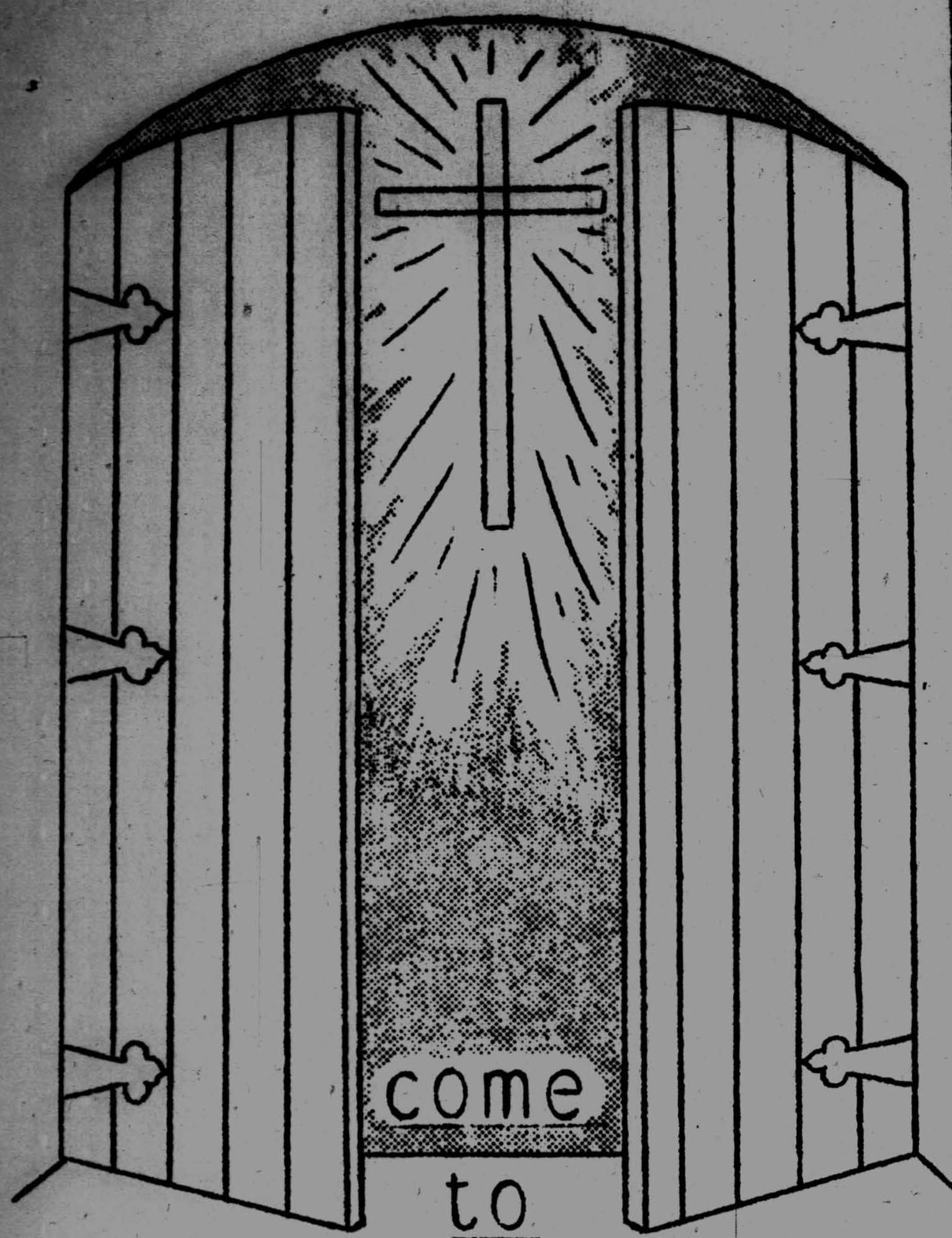

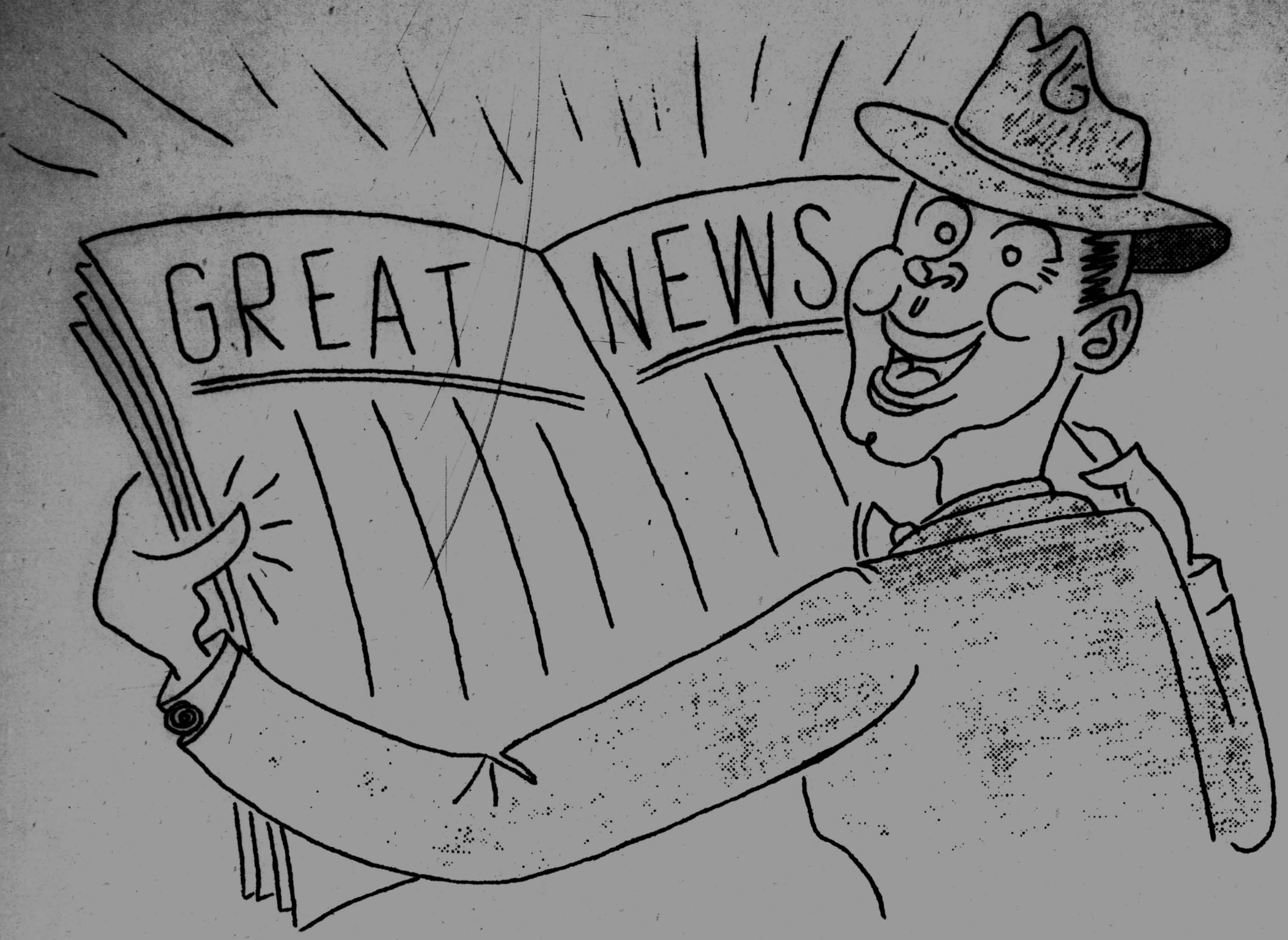

# SPORTS BEAM BY "DON"

This past week-end answered a lot of questions in the world of sport. It also forced yours truly to go a lot easier on predictions. St.Mary's won the Hockey Tournament here in town. Boston Bruins took over first place in the established N.H.L. Clay lost to Jefferies in the computerized boxing tournament and Hamilton walked off with the big four title.

The Cec-Bees are in the N.A.H.A. and upended the Corner Brook Royals 3 - 0 in their first game. The St.John's Caps. suffered their first loss a 5 - 4 decision to the Duchans Miners.

## QUITE A WEEK-END !

With absolutely no co-operation from the weatherman plus a couple of other set-backs. The hockey tournament was played and proved a tremendous success. St.Mary's were in a class by themselves while Labrador City, Gagnon and Scheffer-ville could beat each other on a given night. The big thing that I noticed with St.Mary's was their positional play, never a loose puck lying around, always a huskie ready to pick it up. A fine hockey club and a pleasure to watch. Our own boys put up a pretty good effort defeating Gagnon 5 - 3 while losing to the tournament winners 6 - 1. The week-end star for the Carol Lakers has to be Leon Coté, time and time again he stopped the opposition cold. My pick for a tournament star would be Bob Woods of St.Mary's, 9 goals in two games, scoring the first three goals for his team in each game.

## MINOR HOCKEY TIPS #6

PLAYING FORWARD: Here are some good pointers for forwards to follow when carrying the puck:-

- (1) Always pass ahead to an open teammate rather than stickhandle.
- (2) Carry the puck down centre when possible, rather than down one side.
- (3) Don't rush to the Goal Line three abreast. If you do that, two players will be out of a scoring position, and noone will be in a position to check back. Make it a rule that, if the puck is passed to one wing, the other wing slows down and trails in the centre.
- (4) Practice as a line, making plays at the defence. Aim to draw a check, then make the pass. When the wings are covered, shoot the puck deep into the attacking end, rather than risk interception. This gives the wings a chance to dig in and get to the puck first.
- (5) When you have the puck in scoring position, shoot quickly. Know which is the goalies weak side and look there first for an opening. The best shooting area is fifteen to twenty feet in front of the net. If you are waiting for a pass-out, don't be too close to the net. From fifteen feet out a defenceman is less likely to cover you closely.
- (6) When the puck goes into their own end the two backcheckers stay with their men all the way, fighting for possession. Should a defenceman get the puck, they circle back out for a pass. Meanwhile the third forward circles inside his own blueline to cover the attacking defencemen. When his team gets possession, this man then is in position to break into centre for a relayed pass.
- (7) Both on offence and defence, forwards should try to anticipate what will happen next. This is the basis of good positional play. A good start is made towards it, when the wingmen have learned to patrol their wing lanes.

That's 'thirty' for this week, and remember " IF YOU CAN'T TAKE PART IN SPORT, BE A GOOD ONE ANYWAY".

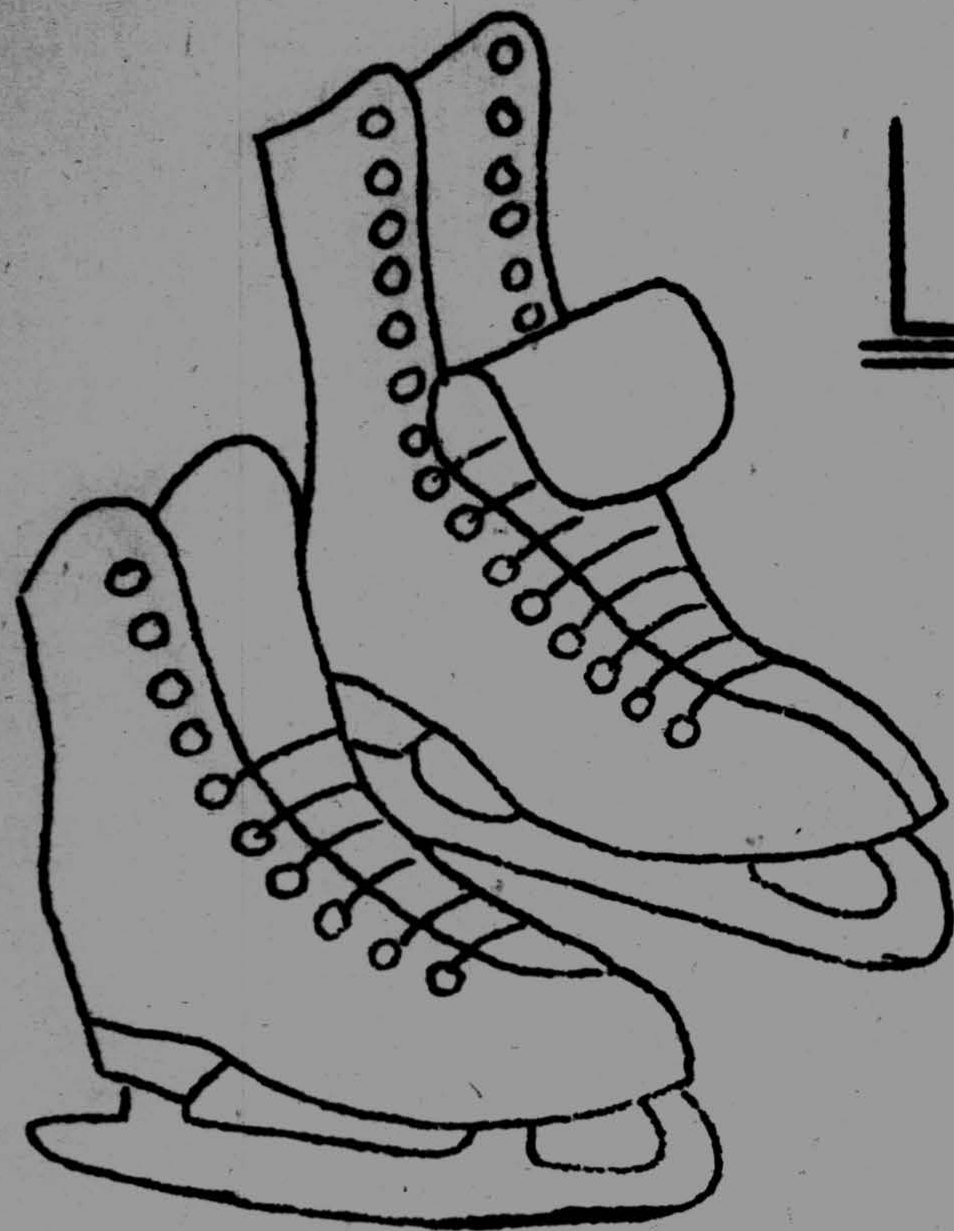

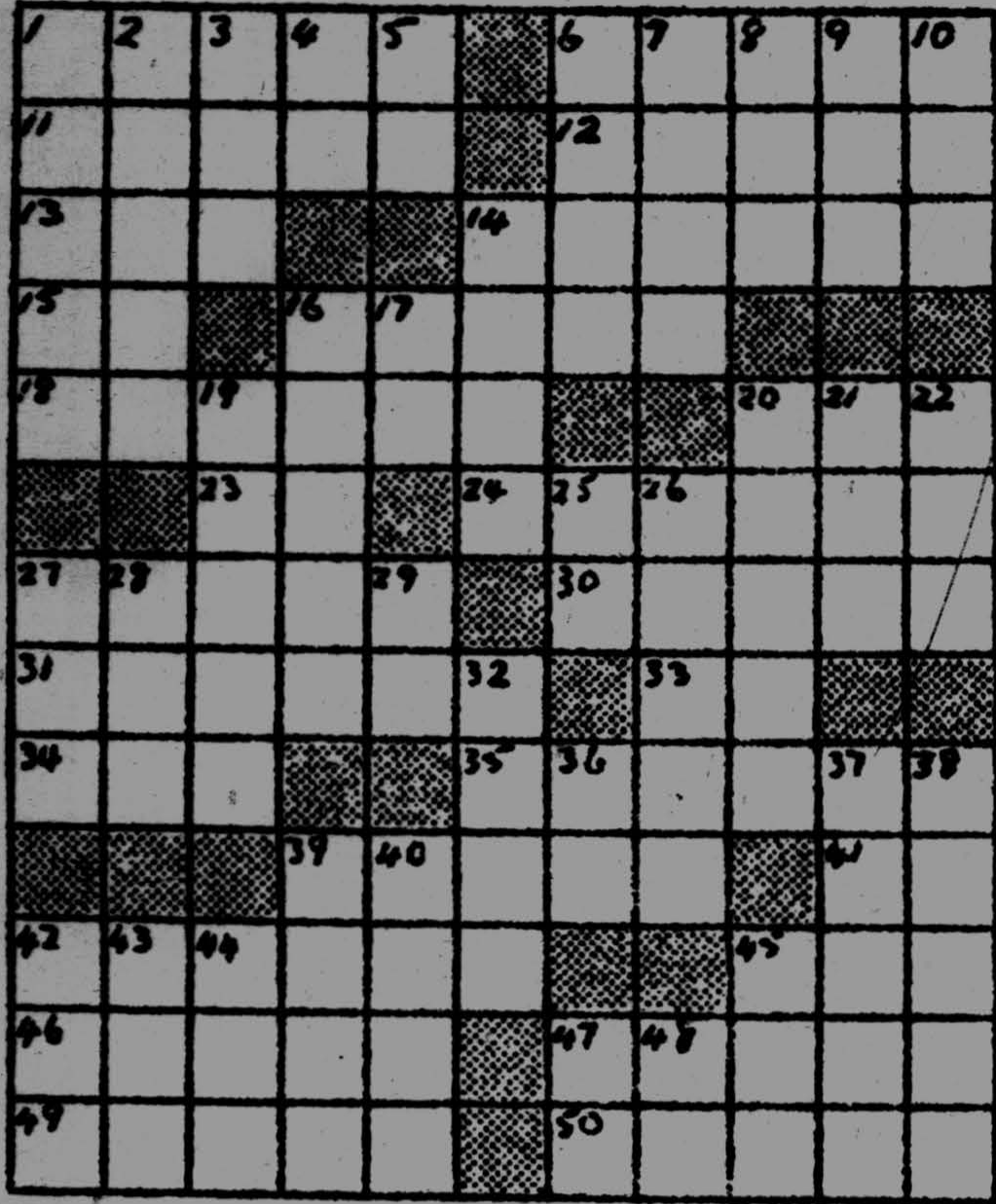
Patrons wishing to watch hockey and not skate on Friday nights will be charged 25¢. All other nights will be \$1.00 Adults and 25¢ children accompanied.

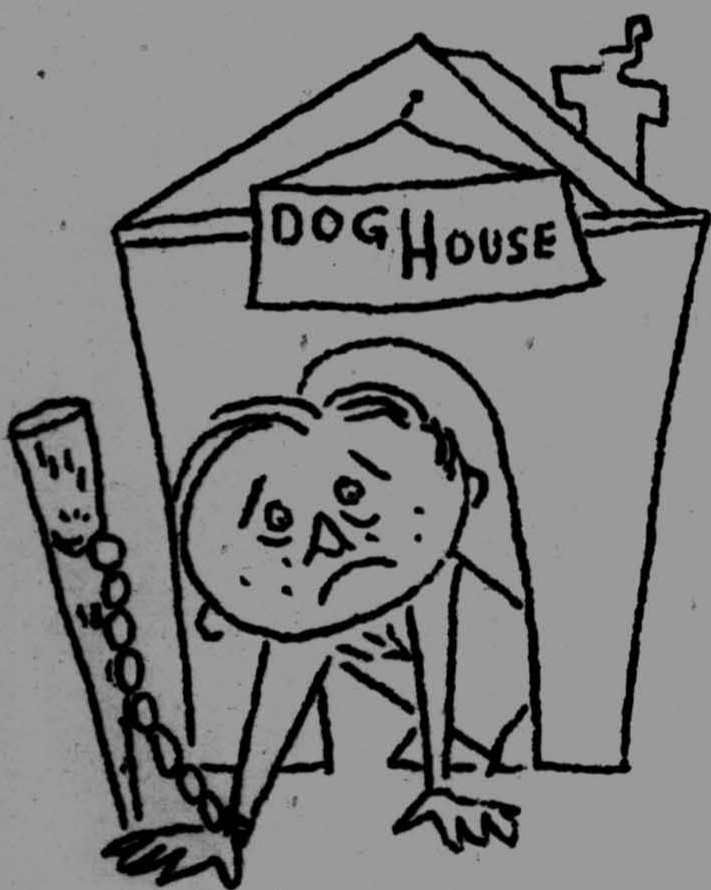

**COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES AT LABRADOR CITY COLLEGIATE - STUDENTS RECEIVED  
\$12,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES**

The Labrador City Collegiate Annual Prize Giving was held on November 20, 1967.

Mr. W.J. Snelgrove, Principal of the Labrador City Collegiate, presented his annual report for the school year 1966-67. In the English Section of the high school, internal exams were written by 195 pupils. The percentage promoted was 75%. In the French Section of the high school, 15 students wrote internal exams in grades IX and X. The percentage of promotions was 67%.

Of the 671 pupils who wrote final examinations from Kindergarten to Grade XI, both inclusive, 90.01% were promoted in the regular academic programme.

Twenty-nine students in the English Section wrote the Junior Matriculation and Grade XI certificate exams of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador. Five received honours and a total of 19 matriculated. Eight students received pass certificates. The percentage of passes was 90%. Eight students wrote Business Education exams, seven passed, one with honours.

In the French Section the Grade XI students wrote the exams of the Department of Education of the Province of Quebec. All candidates were successful.

The guest speaker for the programme was the Rt. Hon. the Lord Taylor, B.Sc., M.D., F.R.C.P., President and Vice-Chancellor Memorial University. We were also privileged to have with us His Excellency, Most Reverend Henri Légaré, O.M.I., Bishop of Labrador and Schefferville. The certificates and awards were presented by Lady Taylor. Mr. B.M. Mcnaghan, Mine Manager of the Iron Ore Company of Canada closed the official section of the program with words of appreciation to our distinguished and honourable guests. Following this programme musical entertainment was provided by the boys and girls of the Collegiate under the direction of Miss Margaret Hennessey. 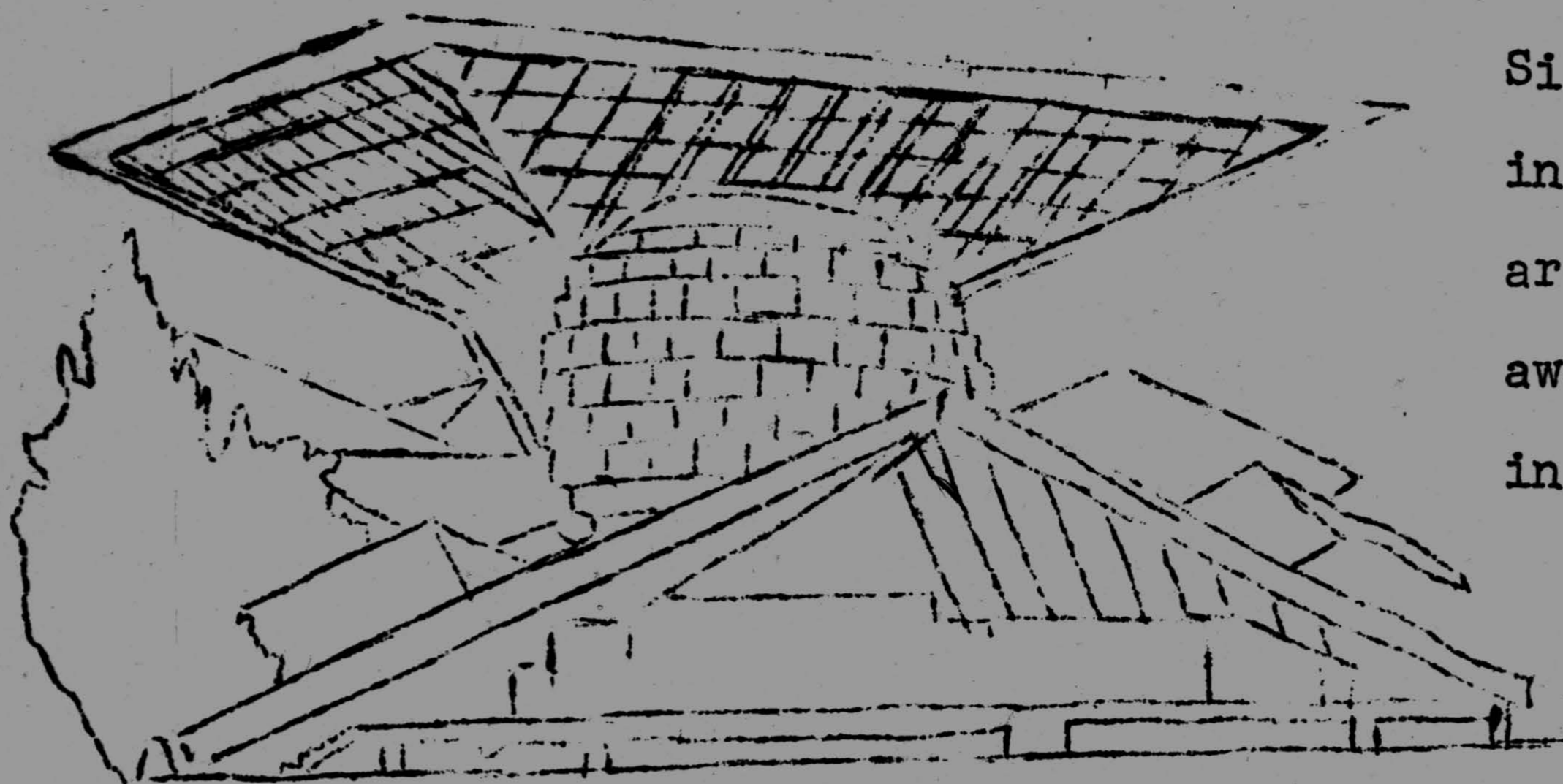

In recent months we have been working steadily to achieve our goal of a completed Youth Centre - and we are very close to that goal.

A report on last month's activities, accomplishments and setbacks was made public some weeks ago. This was the report for October, with bingos, the bake-sale and the door-to-door canvas being the main activities for that month.

This month, although rather slow in the area of public activities, has helped to bring us closer to our goal.
