## OFFICIAL OPENING AND DEDICATION OF THE SALVATION ARMY, LABRADOR CITY CORPS CITADEL

The Salvation Army's new and modern citadel on Bartlett Drive was officially opened and dedicated on Saturday and Sunday past. The Salvation Army's Territorial Commanders for Canada and Bermuda, Commissioner and Mrs. C.D. Wiseman officiated at the opening services. They were supported by the Provincial Commanders for Newfoundland and Labrador, Colonel and Mrs. Wm. Ross. Colonel H. Janes also participated in the weekend services.

The official opening ceremony took place on Saturday afternoon. Following the presentation to Commissioner Wiseman of the key by Mr. Eric Chaulk, the new citadel was declared open, and a short service was held inside. Mr. D.M. Monaghan brought greetings on behalf of the Iron Ore Company of Canada, and Mr. T. Burgess, representing the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, also spoke.

On Sunday afternoon the solemn service of dedication took place, with various members of the clergy in attendance. Reverend L. Whitten brought words of greeting from the local ministerial association. Magistrate Brace, representing civic authorities, addressed the gathering and spoke of his past associations with the Salvation Army. He expressed his hopes of continuing his close associations with the Salvation Army in an endeavor to meet the needs of people in times of trouble.

Mr. E.P. Murphy, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Labrador City addressed the meeting and spoke of his delight at seeing the Army progress from its early beginnings in Labrador City to its present stage of development.

Other services on Sunday included the eleven a.m. holiness meeting and a great evangelistic meeting at night during which the presence of the Holy Spirit was very much in evidence as many sought and found Jesus Christ in personal commitments.

Commissioner and Mrs. C.D. Wiseman departed for Toronto on Monday afternoon following a luncheon at the Sir Wilfred Grenfell Hotel, at which they met members of the Board of Management of the Captain William Jackman Memorial Hospital.

The weekend of special services came to a close on Monday night with Colonel and Mrs. Wm. Ross conducting a public meeting in the newly opened citadel.

Captain and Mrs. J. Carew, Corps Officers wish to thank all who in any way made possible the building of their new citadel.

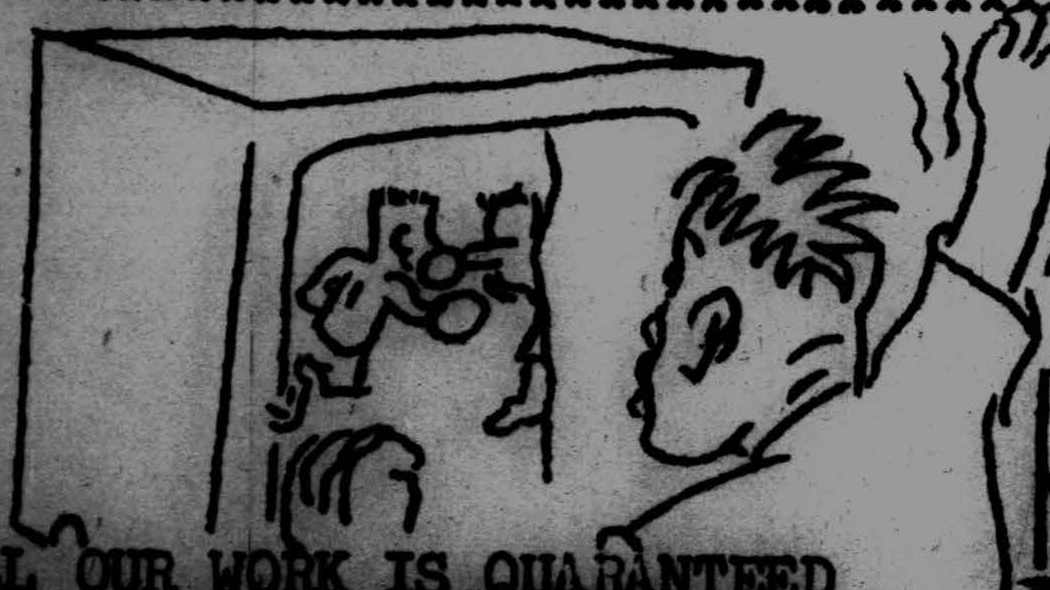

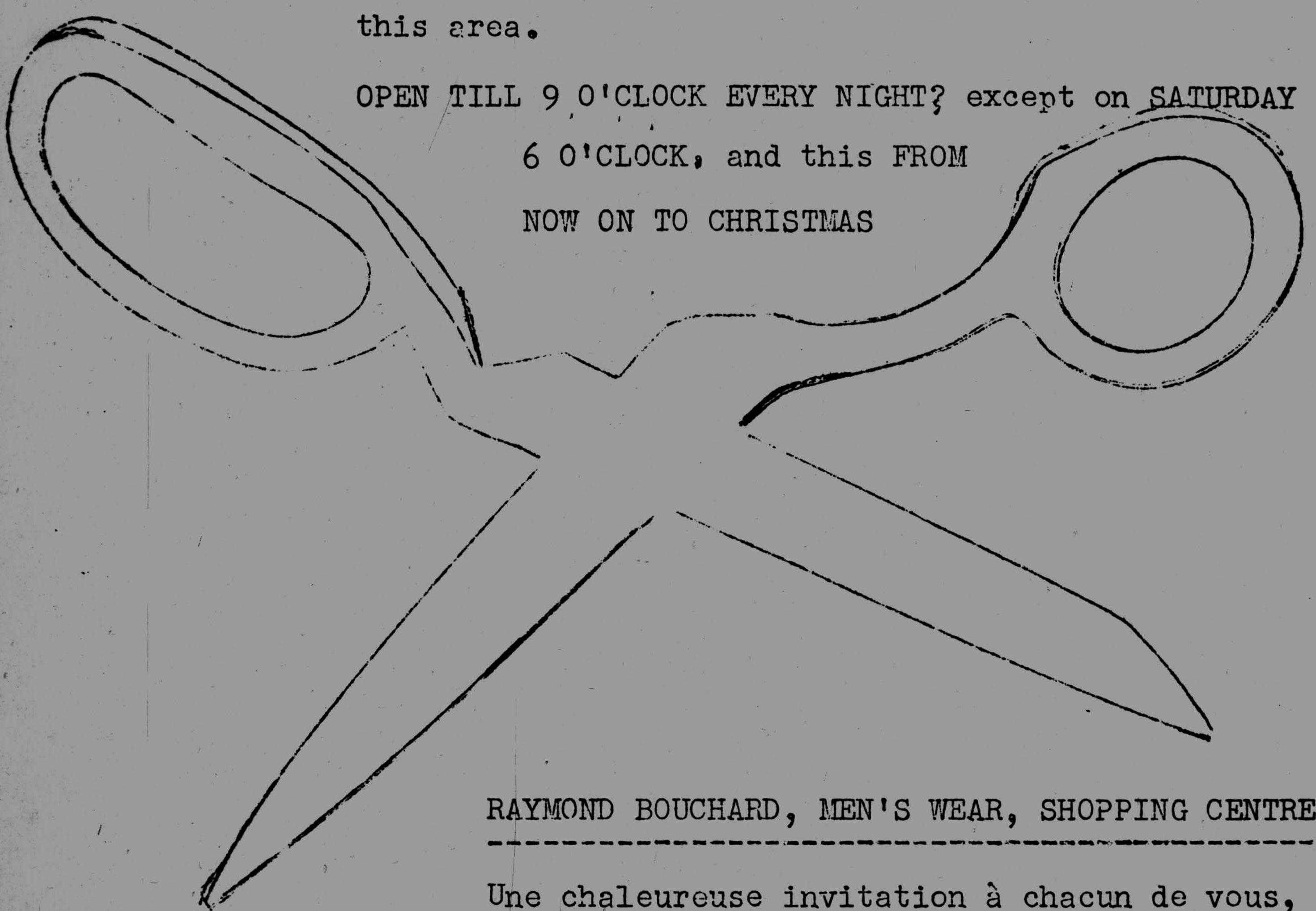

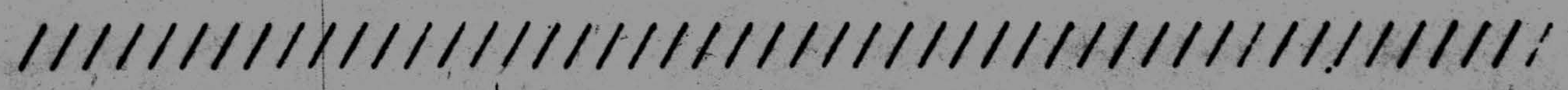

### COURT NEWS

A Labrador City man appeared in Magistrate's Court on a charge of assault. He was convicted and fined \$100.00 and ordered to pay \$175.00 compensation.

Ten residents of Labrador City and Wabush were fined \$10.00 for failing to stop at a stop sign; 18 were fined for parking violations; 3 for driving left of center; and five persons were convicted of speeding. Another man appeared on two charges of speeding and was fined \$25.00 for the first offence and \$50.00 for the second.

One Labrador City resident was found guilty of obtaining goods under false pretences and sentenced to six months in jail.

Three Labrador City men appeared in court on charges of stealing tools from the Iron Ore Company. They were found guilty, and one was sentenced to 12 months in jail, another to 6 months, while the other was given a 2-year suspended sentence.

Two Labrador City men were convicted on charges of impaired driving and fined \$100. each. One of the men was also convicted of taking a motor vehicle without the consent of the owner and fined \$200.00.

Four residents of Labrador City and Wabush were fined for failing to keep their dogs penned or tethered at all times.

One Labrador City man was fined for causing a disturbance and was ordered by the court to pay compensation. One resident was fined for being drunk in a public place.

A Wabush resident was sentenced to 12 months in jail for forging cheques, and he also received a 6-month sentence for failing, while on bail, to appear in Court when required.

Two men were fined for operating a motor vehicle without a driver's licence.

A Labrador City man appeared in Court for imprudent driving, driving without a licence, and taking a vehicle without the consent of the owner. He was fined \$135. and ordered to pay compensation of \$175.00.

A Churchill Falls man was convicted for having obscene films in his possession for the purpose of circulation. He was fined \$150.00 and his film was confiscated.

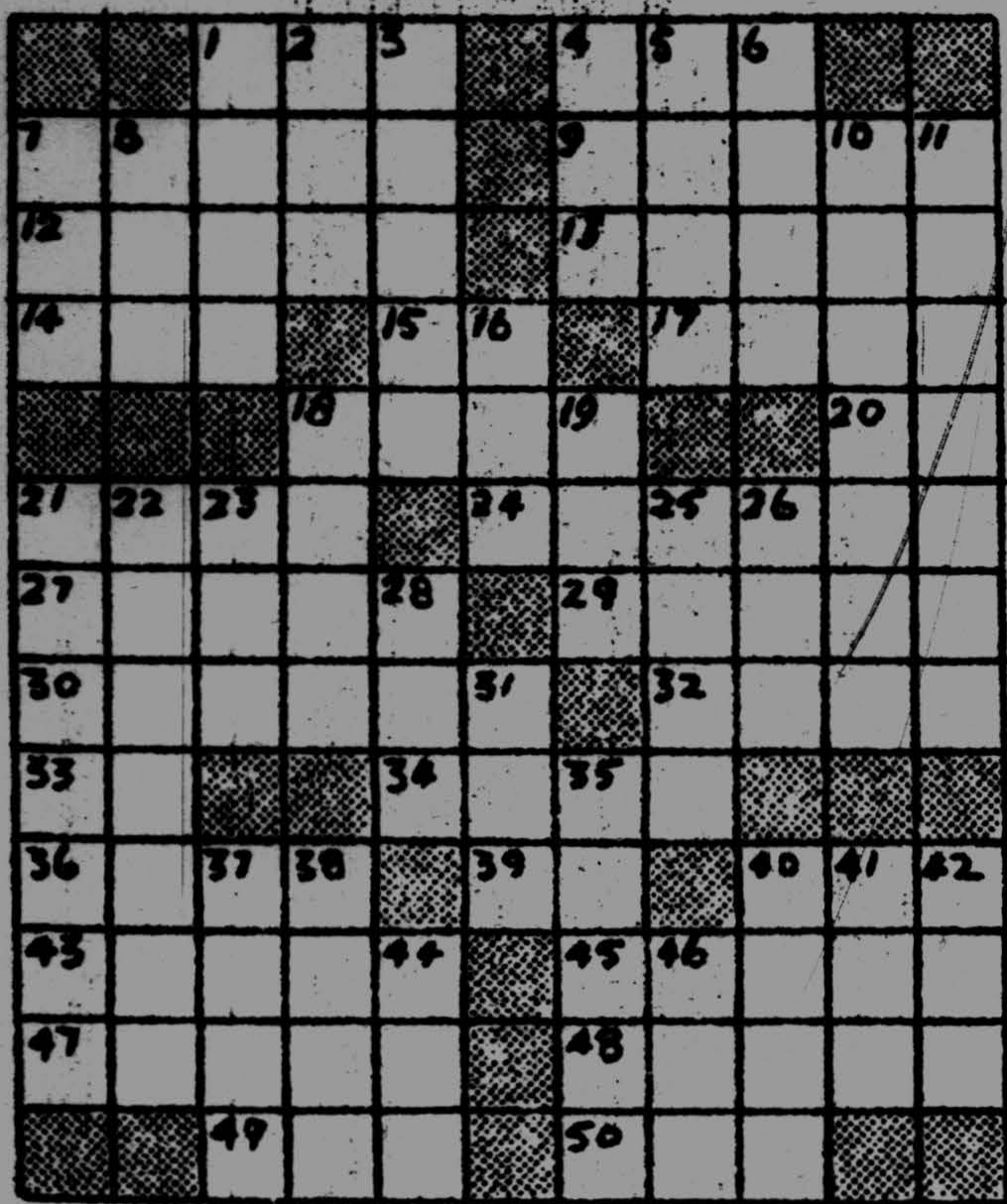

The following letter was sent in to the Carol News by Mr. Bill Craig who will, I am sorry to say, be leaving us soon for St. John N.B. All our best wishes go with you and your family.

.....

I have spent the last two and one half years in Labrador City and must say that it was very pleasant in every way. How very fortunate you people are who have permanent jobs and are staying here.

I cannot help being amazed at the many changes that have taken place during my short stay. A skating rink, curling club, hospital, Woolworths - to mention only one of the new stores in the shopping centre. One large apartment building now occupied and a smaller one almost ready for tenants.

Hundreds of new self-contained houses, a well equipped play ground for the younger generation, new golf course, laundry and renovated bakery to mention only a few indications of a growing town. The shopping centre parking area has been paved as well as the road to Wabush, also the runway of the Airport along with a new terminal building.

My job here is finished and it is with a feeling of regret that I leave for I have met some wonderful people whom it is my privilege to call my friends.

## MINOR HOCKEY TIPS # 7. - PLAYING DEFENCE

There are four distinct phases of defence play which more or less cover the complete range of play up the ice and back - these are :-

- (1) Covering in your own end
- (2) Clearing the puck from your own end
- (3) Attacking up the ice.
- (4) Covering breakouts from the other teams end.

When the puck is in your own end, you and your partner must team up, one to cover the front of the net, the other the puck. When the puck is in the right corner, for instance the right defenceman checks the puck carrier while the left defenceman is in front of the net.

The moment you get possession, look for a forward breaking out for a pass, being careful of interception. As soon as you get the puck-swing behind the net to gain time to look up. Regardless of how you do it, your first thought should be to get the puck over the Blueline without icing it.

When your forwards carry the puck up the ice, follow to get position on the points at the opposing Blueline. If the puck is in the left corner, the left defenceman should be at the left boards - just inside the line. His partner should be at the centre of the Blueline - just inside. As the play swings across the ice, the defencemen follow.

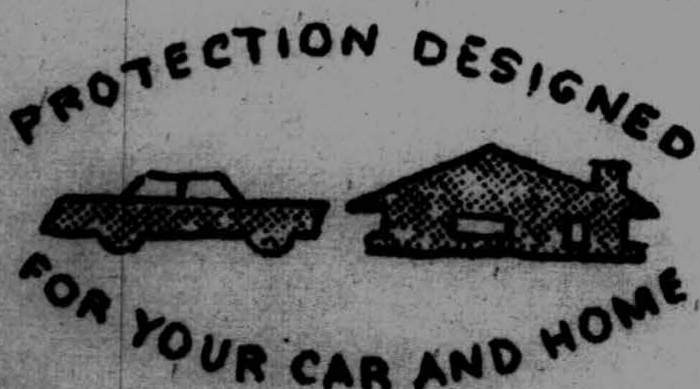
When the other team gain clear possession, breaking down the boards out of their own end, the centre point defenceman starts back at once. His partner on the boards may wait a few seconds for a possible check, before starting back.

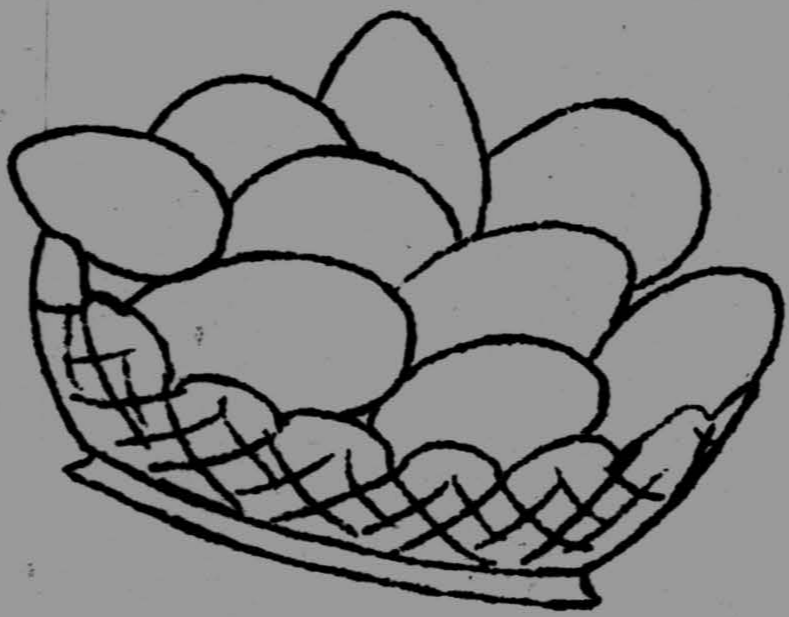

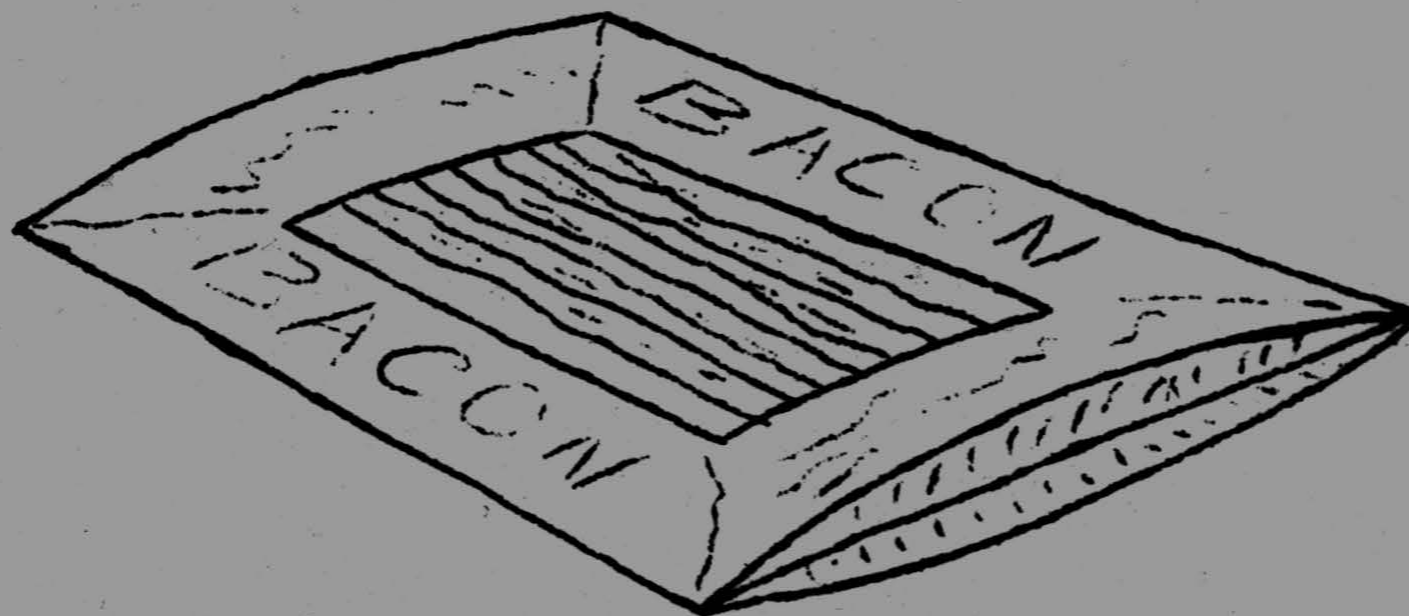

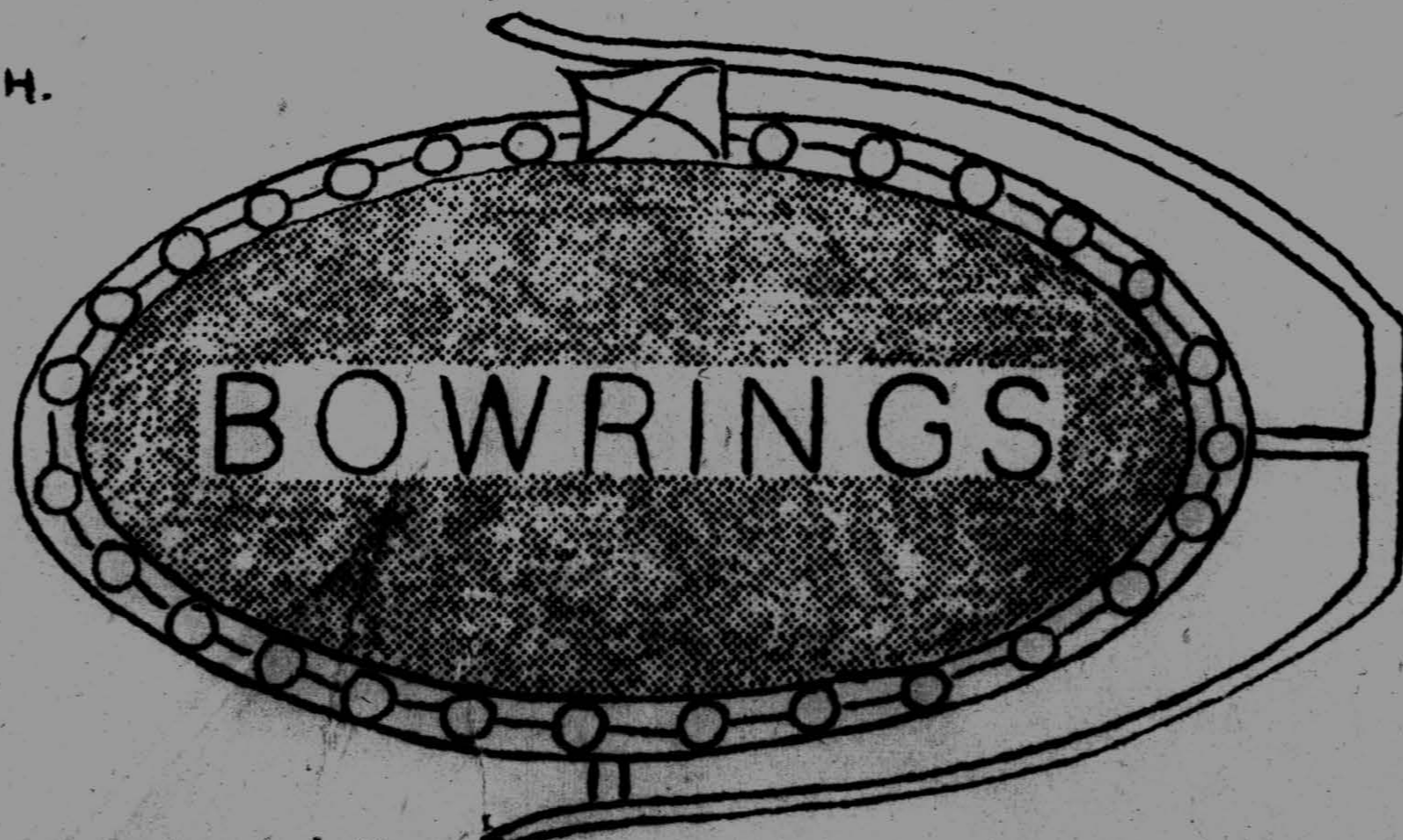
