In the summer we have wonderful "resort" country around us. Lakes by the score, dotted with cottages and lodges, fishing and boating are almost second nature to the folk up here. Good highways lead to big cities in the southern half of the province and to the west of Canada and the U.S.A.

This then is the picture of the new home of your former Carol News Editor, and family. We are happy to be back in our home province of Ontario, but at the same time look back with many fond memories of our other Province which was home to us for nearly four years. More so we are happy about some of the friends we made in Newfoundland, and will always save a spot in our hearts for them. 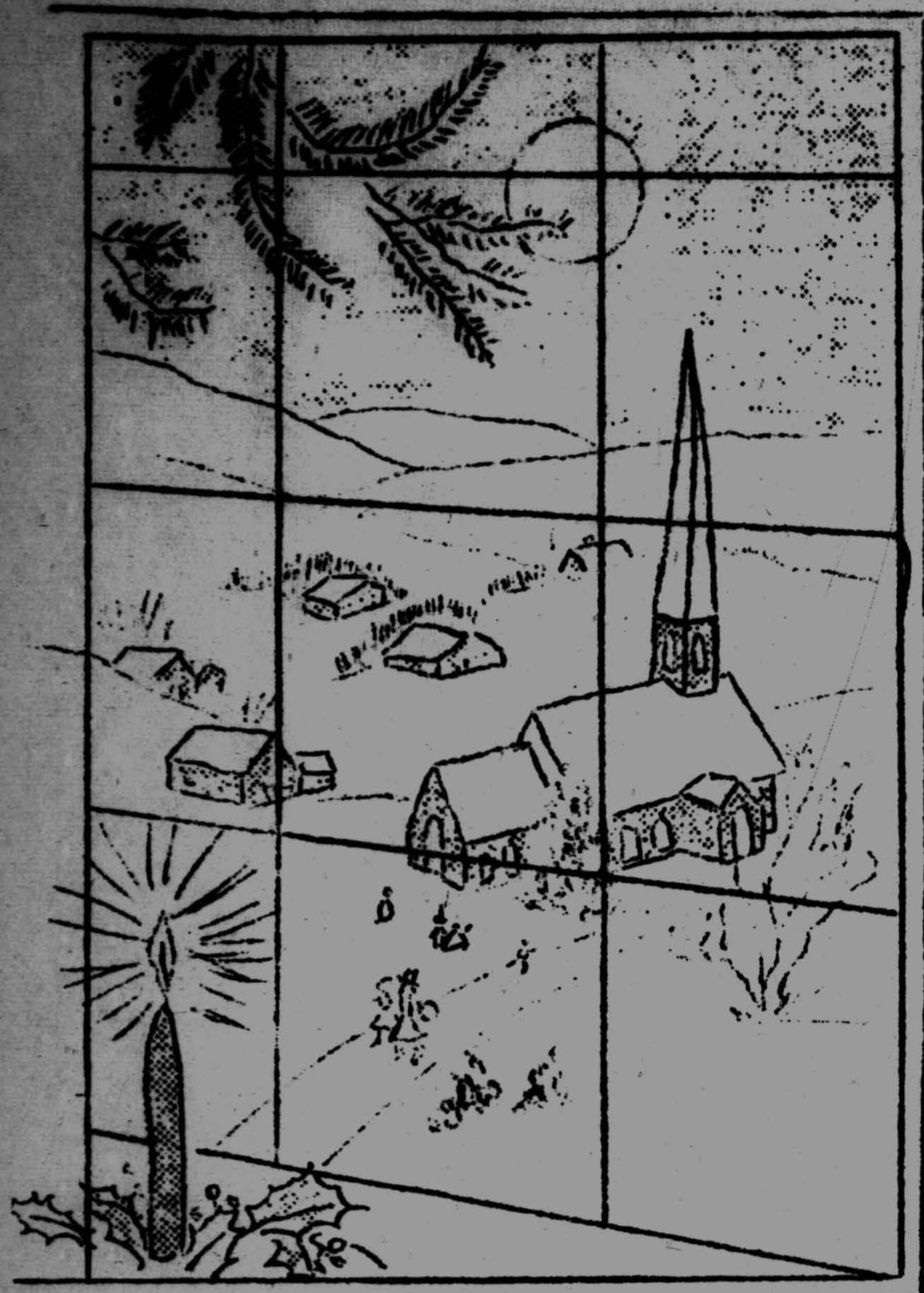

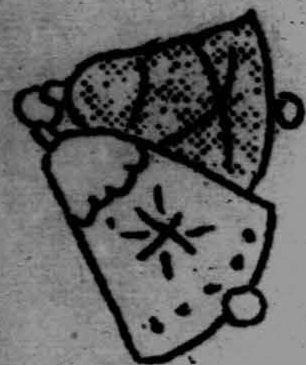

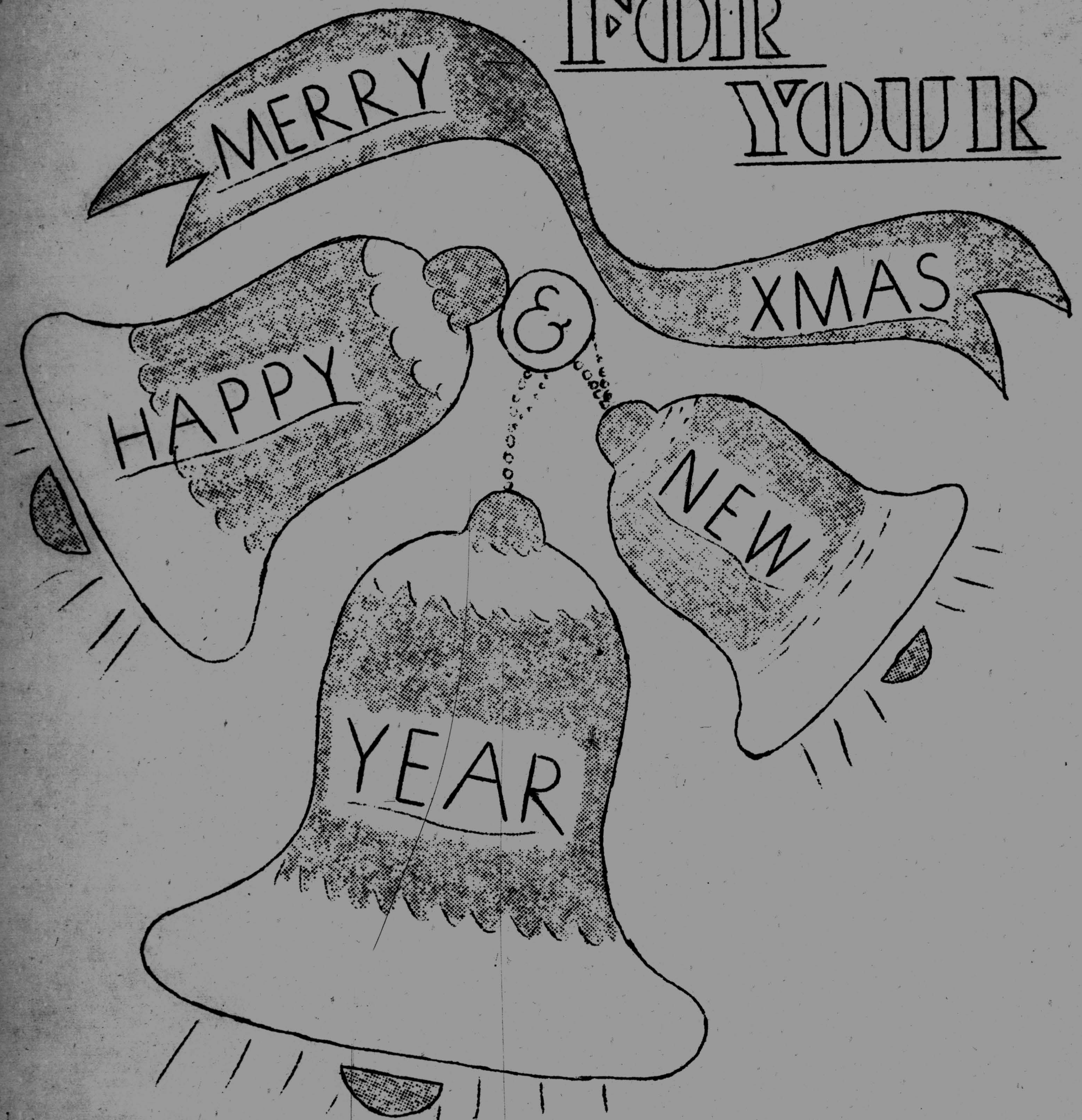

- Juice of 1 lemon
- 2 lb. currants

 Mix up all the fruit together with the cinnamon, cloves, mace, suet and sugar, the rind, the lemon juice, port and brandy, and put into jars. Tie down tightly and use as required.

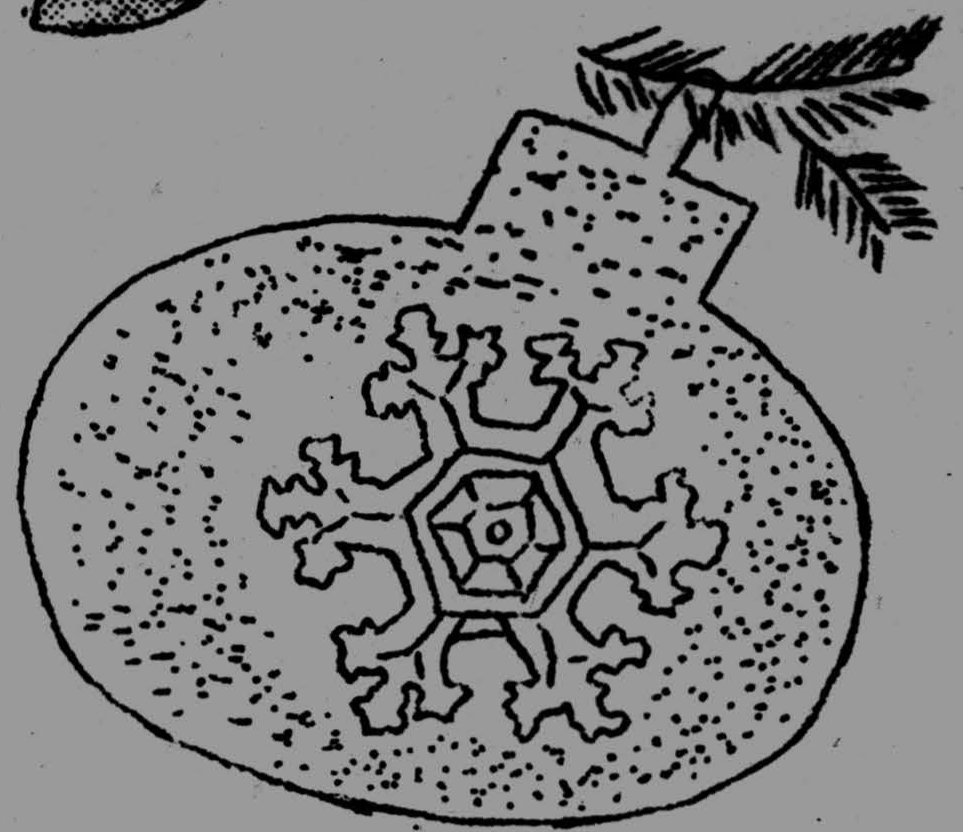

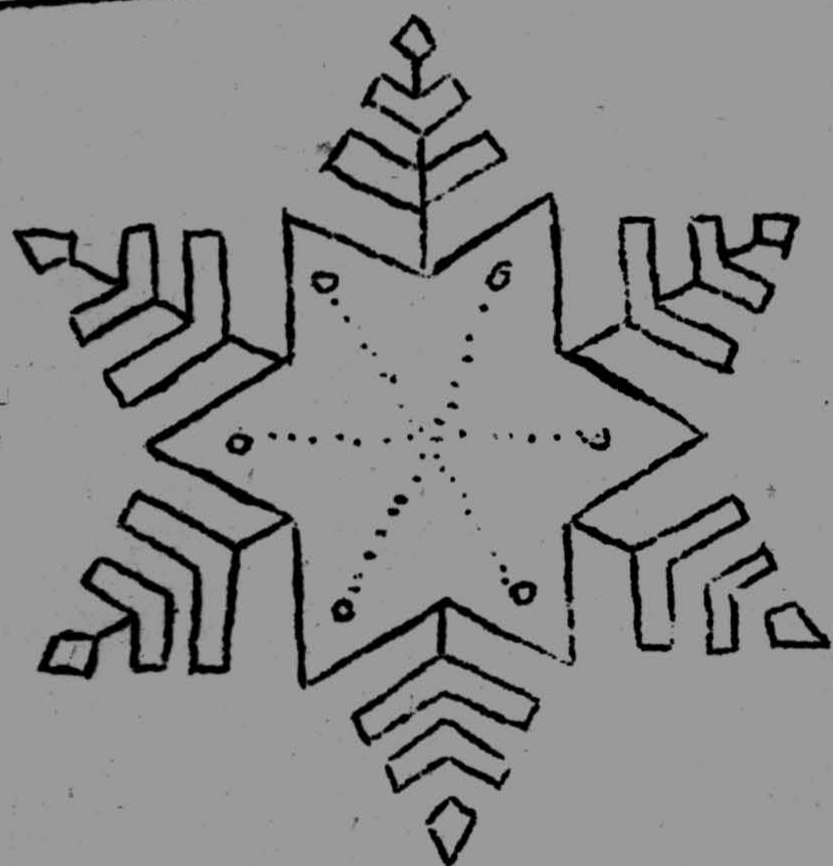
