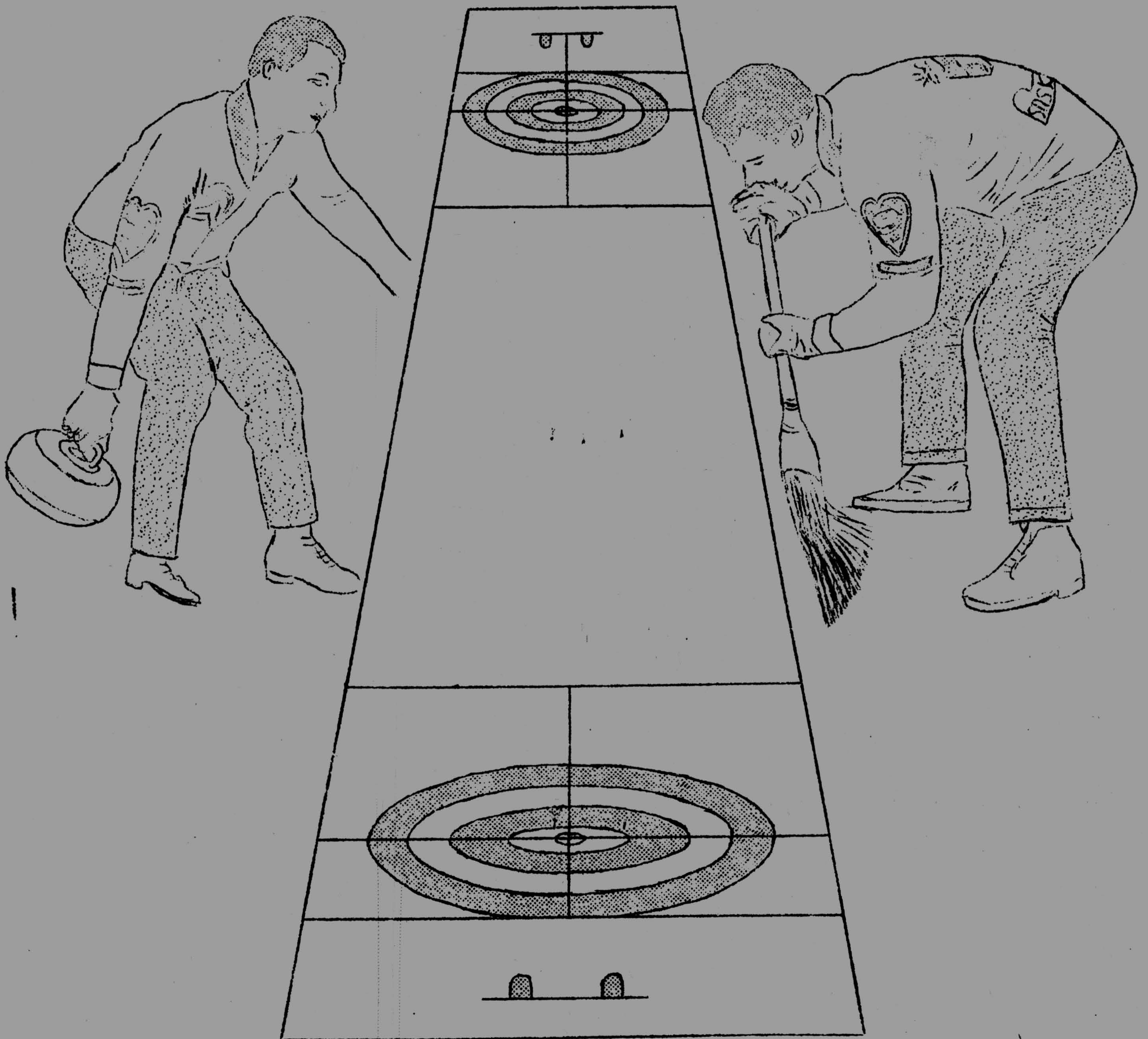

# SPORTS BEAM <sup>by</sup> DON

WHOEVER DREAMED A FEW YEARS AGO THAT THIS FROZEN NORTHLAND THAT GOD GAVE TO GAIN WOULD BE HOSTING A CURLING BONSPIEL THAT HAS THE MAGNITUDE AND PRESTIGE OF THE ONE TAKING PLACE RIGHT AT THIS MOMENT. TO VISUALIZE 44 VISITING CURLING RINKS COMPETING IN LABRADOR CITY WAS BEYOND OUR WILDEST DREAMS - AND NOW THIS DREAM HAS BECOME A REALITY.

IT SEEMS LIKE ONLY YESTERDAY WE HOSTED THE FIRST PROVINCIAL TEEN-AGE BOWLING TOURNAMENT, AND THIS, AT THE TIME WAS QUITE AN ACCOMPLISHMENT, WITH 7 TEAMS COMING FROM ALL OVER THE ISLAND. NOW HERE WE ARE FOUR YEARS LATER WITH A 44 RINK CURLING BONSPIEL WITH TEAMS COMING FROM ALL OVER THE FOUR ATLANTIC PROVINCES AND QUEBEC. THE MANAGER, PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE OF THE CAROL CURLING CLUB HAVE JUST REASON TO BE PROUD OF THE SPECTACLE UNFOLDING TODAY. SOME OF THE PAST PRESIDENTS AND EXECUTIVES OF THE CLUB, WHO ARE STILL RESIDENTS OF THIS COMMUNITY WILL FEEL A TWINGE OF PRIDE; AS WE HAVE REALLY COME A LONG WAY FROM THE RINK IN THE OLD PILOT PLANT.

LAST EVENING MARKED THE OPENING OF THE FOURTH ANNUAL EASTERN PROVINCIAL AIRWAYS, MEN'S OPEN BONSPIEL, THE FIRST TIME THE SPIEL HAS BEEN HELD OUTSIDE THE AIRPORT TOWN OF GANDER, NFLD:

MR. TOM BURGESS, MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY FOR LABRADOR WEST, THREW THE FIRST STONE TO OFFICIALLY OPEN THE SPECTACULAR EVENT. THE LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, TOWN OF LABRADOR CITY HELD A COCKTAIL PARTY IN HONOUR OF VISITING CURLERS, OFFICIALS AND DIGNITARIES.

OFFICIALS FROM EASTERN PROVINCIAL AIRWAYS IN ATTENDANCE INCLUDED MR A.J. LEWINGTON, PRESIDENT OF THE COMPANY, MR Wm. HARRIS, CHIEF OF SALES AND MR. CYRIL PENTON WHO NEEDS NO INTRODUCTION TO RESIDENTS OF THIS AREA. BONSPIEL ORGANIZERS REPRESENTING E.P.A. INCLUDED MR. FARRELL GAUDET AND MR. REX PRIMMER.

THE FIRST GAMES COMMENCED AT 8:00 am. THIS MORNING AND COMPETITION WILL CONTINUE UNTIL 6:00 pm SUNDAY WITH SOME OF THE BEST CURLERS IN CANADA PARTICIPATING. CURLERS WILL BE COMPETING FOR OVER \$1,000 IN PRIZES. THERE WILL BE FOUR EVENTS WITH THE LOSER OF A GAME DROPPING TO A LOWER SECTION, THUS EACH RINK IS ASSURED OF AT LEAST FOUR GAMES. THE FINALS IN THE FOUR EVENTS WILL BE CURLED AT 3:00 pm SUNDAY. GAMES WILL CONSIST OF 8 ENDS WITH THE SEMI-FINALS BEING 10 ENDS AND THE FINALS 12 ENDS.

REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE CANADIAN PRESS WILL COVER THE ENTIRE BONSPIEL ALONG WITH REPORTERS FROM THE VARIOUS PROVINCES.

ENTERTAINERS IN TOWN FOR THE EVENT INCLUDE MR LARRY DAY, COMEDIAN-EMCEE AND THE EXOTIC LADY DANCER "MISS AZIZA", BOTH FROM MONTREAL. THE GUEST SPEAKER AT THE BANQUET WILL BE THE ORIGINATOR OF THE CLOSING STATEMENT I USE IN MY COLUMN EACH WEEK, NONE OTHER THAT NFLD'S MOST HUMOROUS AFTER-DINNER SPEAKER, MR AUBREY MCDONALD. DANCES WILL BE HELD AT THE CURLING CLUB ON FRIDAY AND SATURDAY NIGHTS WITH MUSIC BEING SUPPLIED BY THE LEGIONAIRES BAND.

AS CAN BE SEEN THIS PROMISES TO BE A GALA AFFAIR AND EVERYONE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ORGANIZING AND PLANNING OF THIS EVENT DESERVE A PAT ON THE BACK FOR WHAT I AM SURE WILL BE A JOB WELL DONE.

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP

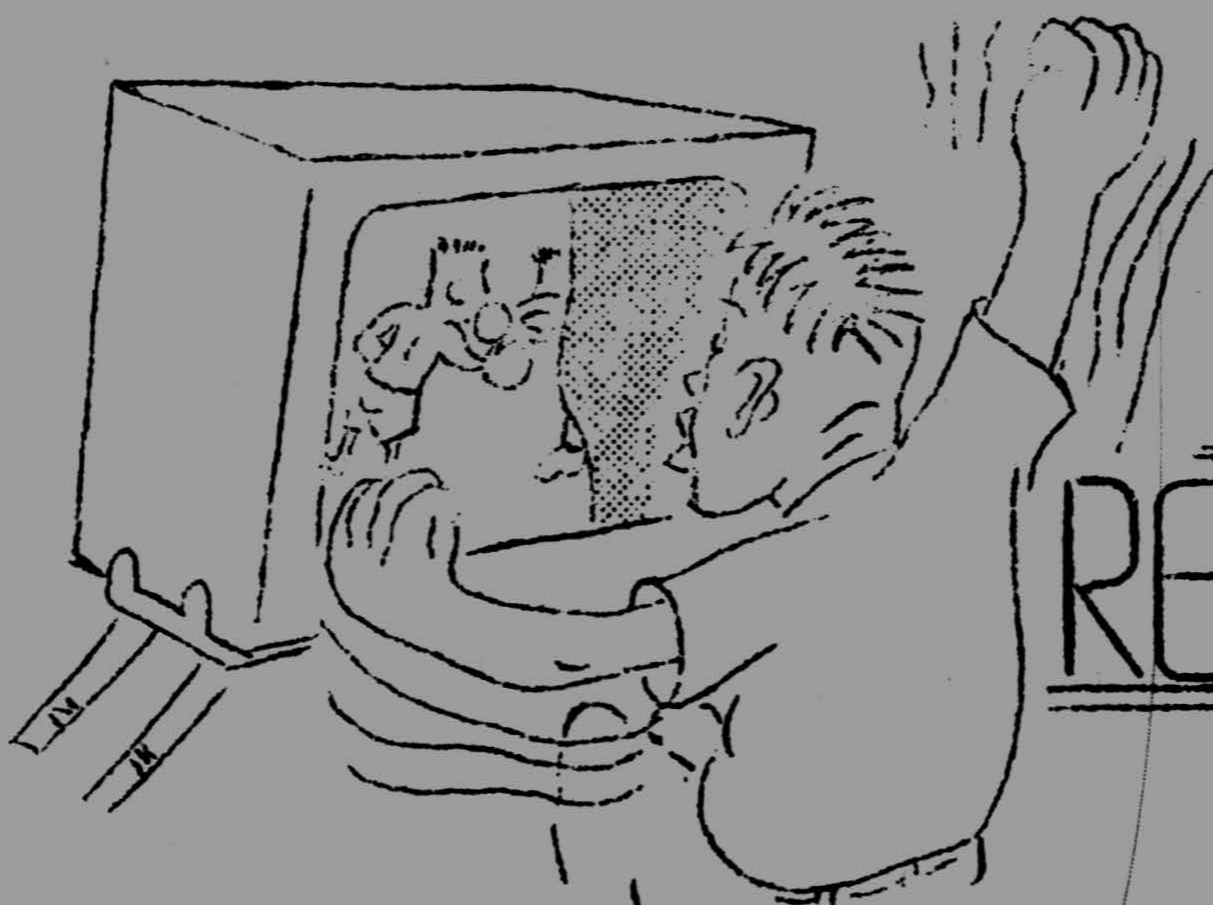
- LANCASHIRE PARKIN -

METHOD

4 oz self-raising flour  
 or 4 oz plain flour and 1 level teasp. baking powder  
 ½ level teasp. salt  
 4 oz. fine or medium oatmeal  
 2 level teasp. cinnamon  
 1 egg  
 4 tablesp. milk  
 4 oz. golden syrup  
 4 oz shortening, marg. or butter.  
 4 oz. Demerara sugar.

Grease a shallow square 7½ inch tin and line the bottom with greased paper. Sift together the flour, baking powder (if used) salt, oatmeal, ginger and cinnamon into a bowl. Beat the egg with the milk. Melt syrup, fat and sugar together in a pan, and when slightly colled make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients and pour the liquid into it. Mix all together thoroughly. Turn into the prepared tin and bake in a moderately slow oven. Cool on a wire rack and store for several days before cutting.

BAKE FOR 1-1½ HOURS AT 325° F.

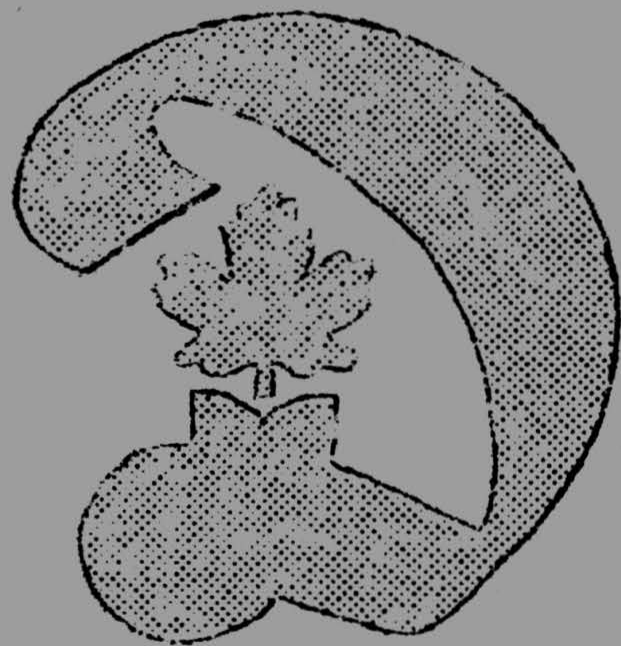

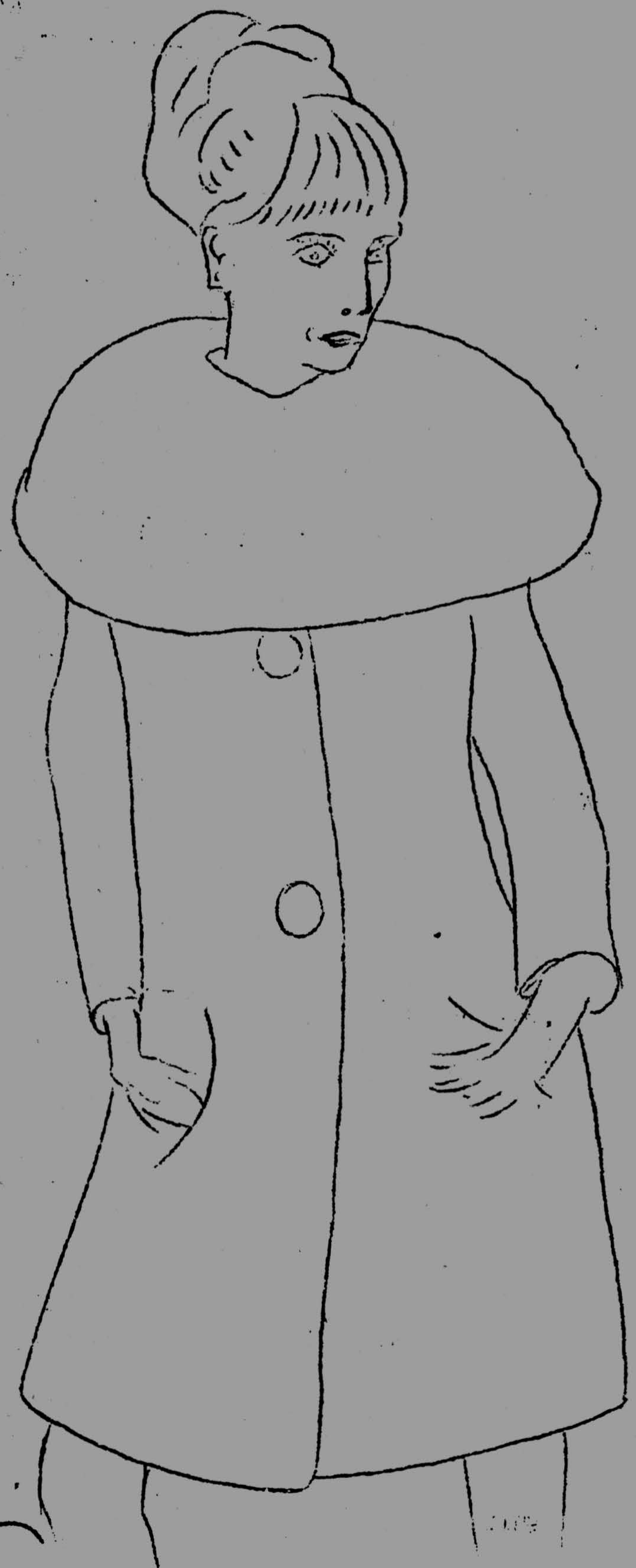
