STATEMENT BY HONOURABLE DR. F. W. ROWE
MINISTER OF LABRADOR AFFAIRS

From time to time the Premier has expressed the desire of the Government to make it possible for the residents in the Labrador part of our Province and those on the Island of Newfoundland to have closer contacts not only economically, but culturally and socially as well. To this end the Government have taken a number of steps during the past several years, including assistance for the expansion of E.P.A., a ferry on the Strait of Belle Isle, reduction in the cost of air travel to and from Labrador and so on.

I am now in a position to announce another step forward in this direction. The Government have decided that assistance will be given to cultural, athletic, recreational and social groups, belonging to the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, to enable such groups from Labrador to visit the Island of Newfoundland, and those belonging to the Island of Newfoundland to visit Labrador.

As things are at present the travelling and other costs for a St. John's Drama Troupe to visit Labrador City would be prohibitive. By the same token the cost for one of the excellent school choirs in Labrador to participate in a music festival in St. John's would impose a heavy financial strain on the school or parents concerned. There are many other examples in the field of athletics that could be mentioned. Under this new programme a team, choir or group wishing to go to or from the Island of Newfoundland to Labrador or vice versa could make application for assistance towards the cost.

A committee has been set up consisting of the Deputy Minister of Labrador Affairs, Mr. David L. Dutler, as convenor, the Deputy Minister of Provincial Affairs, Mr. J. G. Channing, the Deputy Minister of Education, Mr. P. J. Hanley and the Deputy Minister of Finance, Mr. Denis Groom to receive and evaluate such applications and to make such recommendations thereon to the Minister of Labrador Affairs as they may deem appropriate.

The Government have deliberately refrained from setting up any rigid formula since the needs of groups will vary according to the circumstances. One group might require only a little assistance whereas another might qualify for a greater amount; in fact the amount and type of assistance might very well vary from time to time and place to place. In other words, the committee will judge all applications entirely on their merits and will make recommendations accordingly. An athletic team going from St. Anthony to Goose Bay would normally require less assistance than one going from Happy Valley, say, to participate in a football series on the Durin Peninsula.

So that there may be no misunderstanding at all on this matter I would emphasize two facts: first, that this new programme is not meant to take the place of any existing programme of assistance in other Departments of Government; second, this assistance will be given only for groups going from the Island of Newfoundland to Labrador or from Labrador to the Island of Newfoundland. No assistance will be given for group movement within the Island of Newfoundland itself or in Labrador itself. The programme is designed as I said at the beginning to foster more intimate cultural and social relations between those of our citizens who live in Labrador and those who live on the Island of Newfoundland.

Any groups wishing to obtain assistance under this programme should make application directly to the Department of Labrador Affairs. Such applications will be referred immediately to the Committee who will recommend assistance only when they feel that the activity planned could not be carried out without some help.

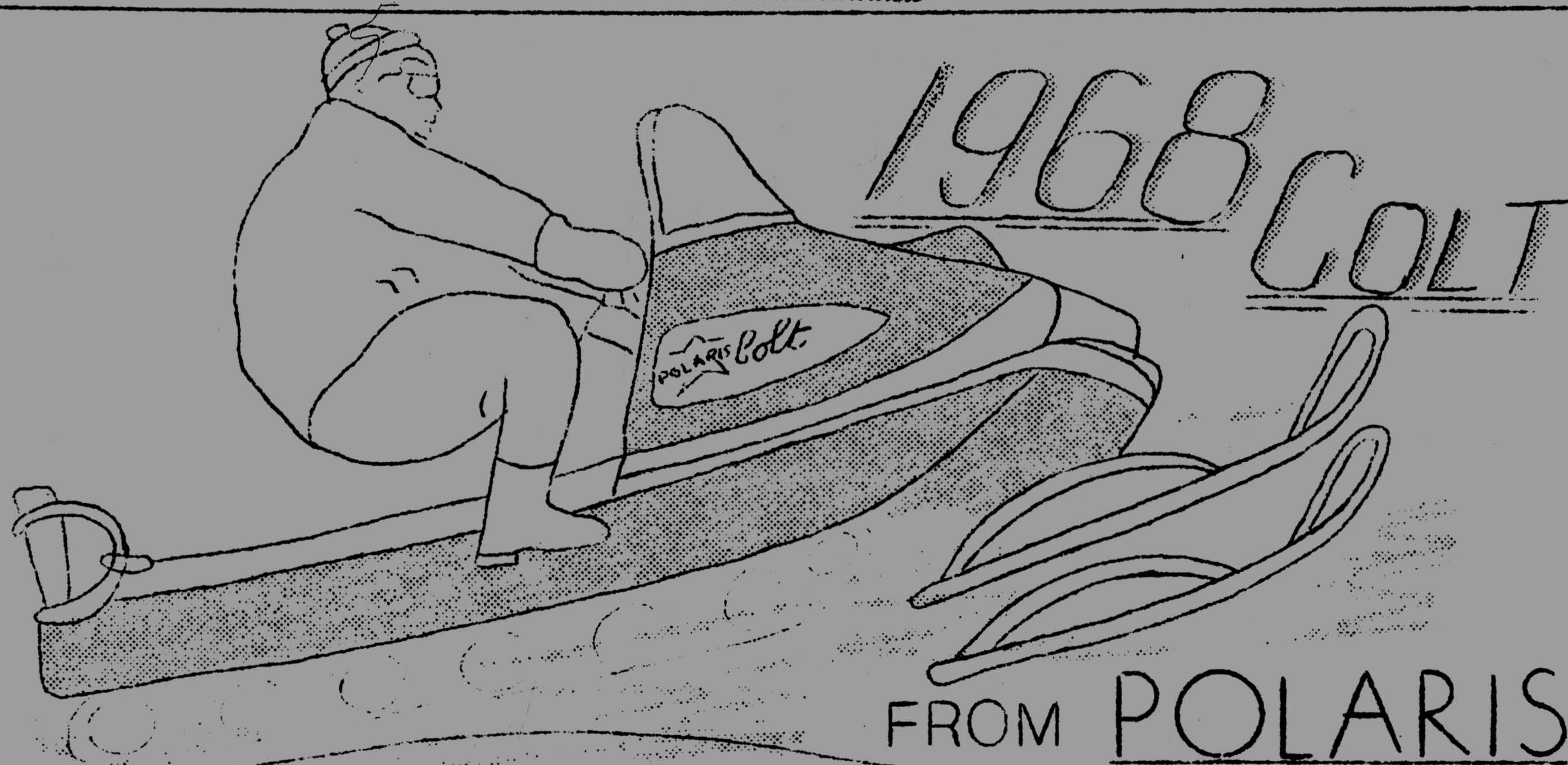

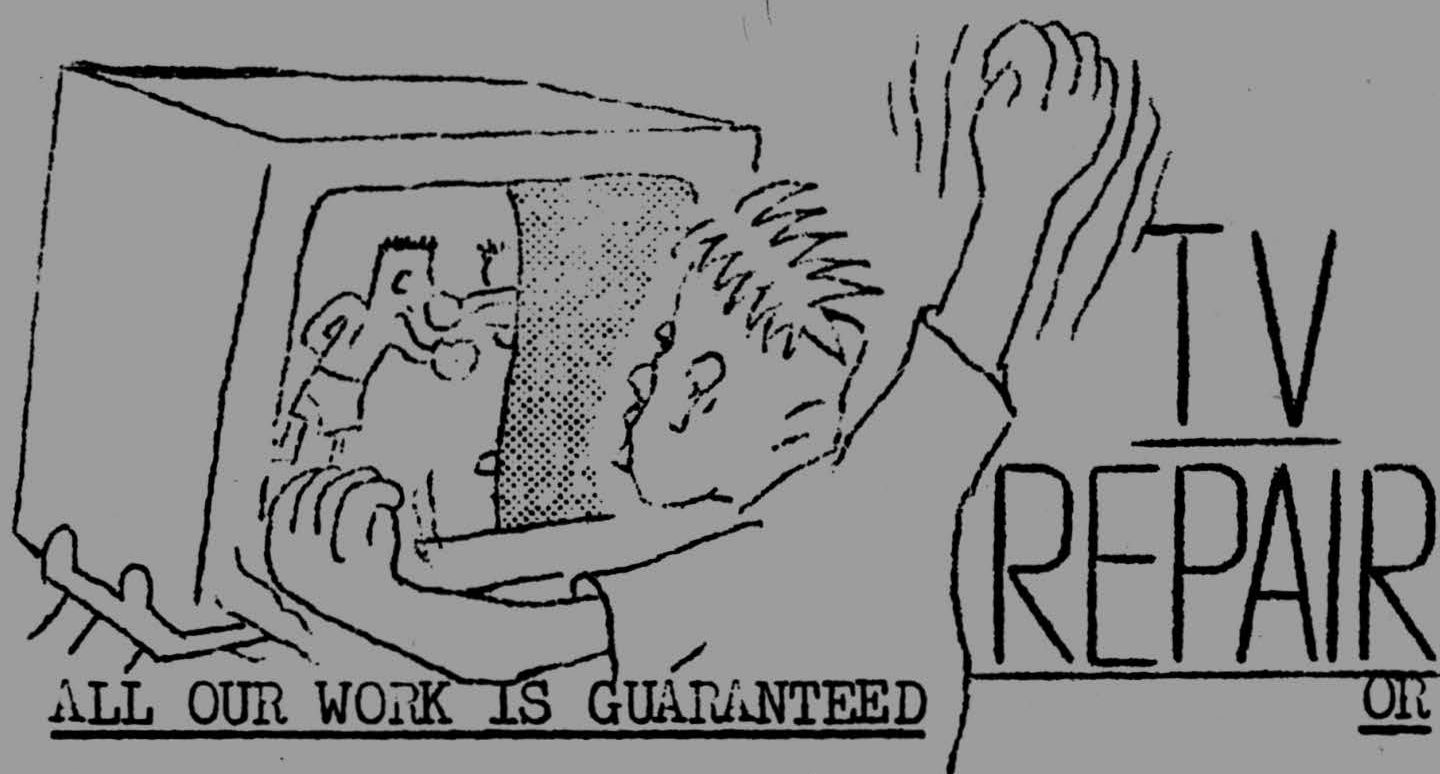
INGREDIENTS

 with the malt mixture, stirring all the
 time..Dissolve the bicarbonate of soda
 in a little water and add it to the mixtur
 then pour this into a 1.lb.bread tin.

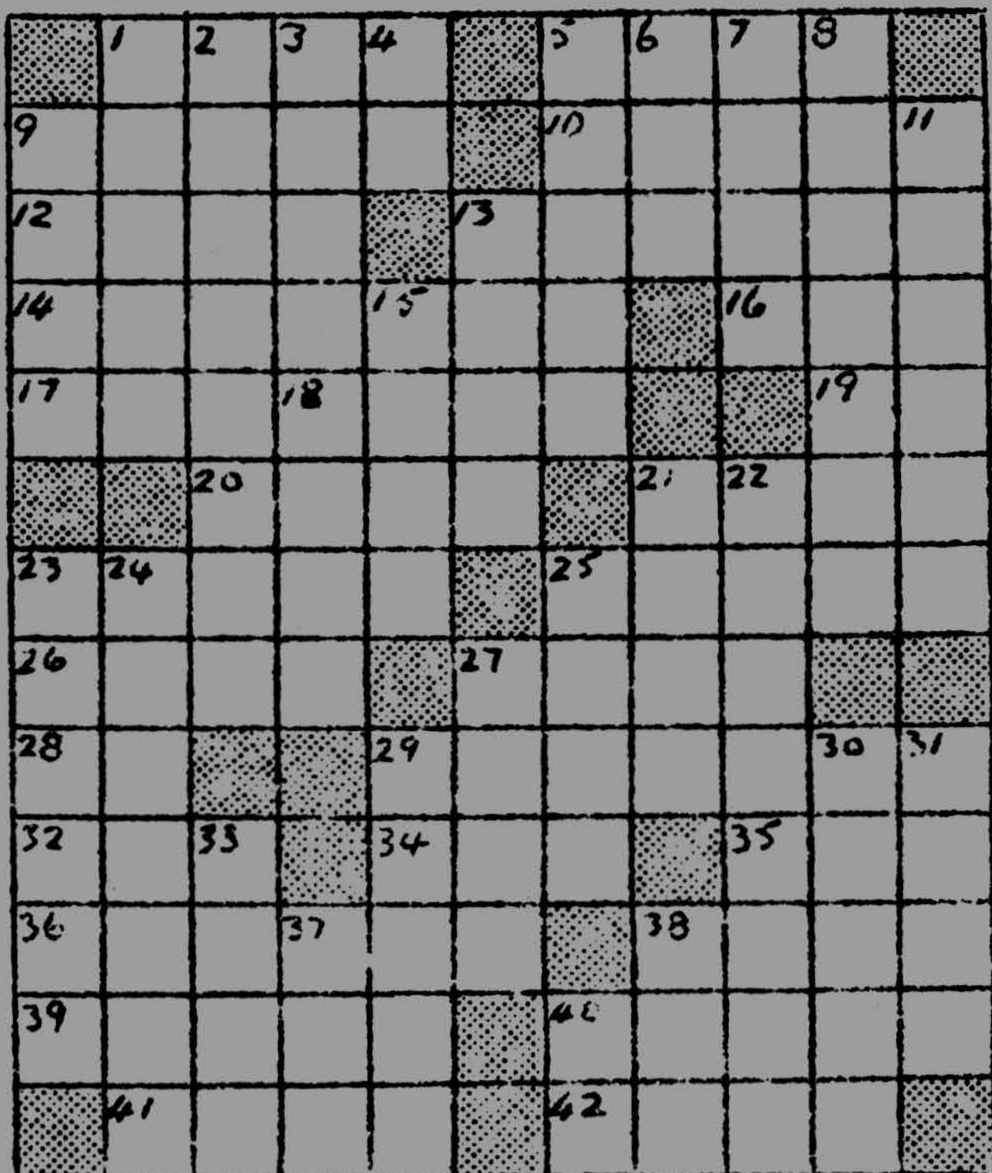
