NEWFOUNDLAND LAWN TENNIS ASSOCIATION:

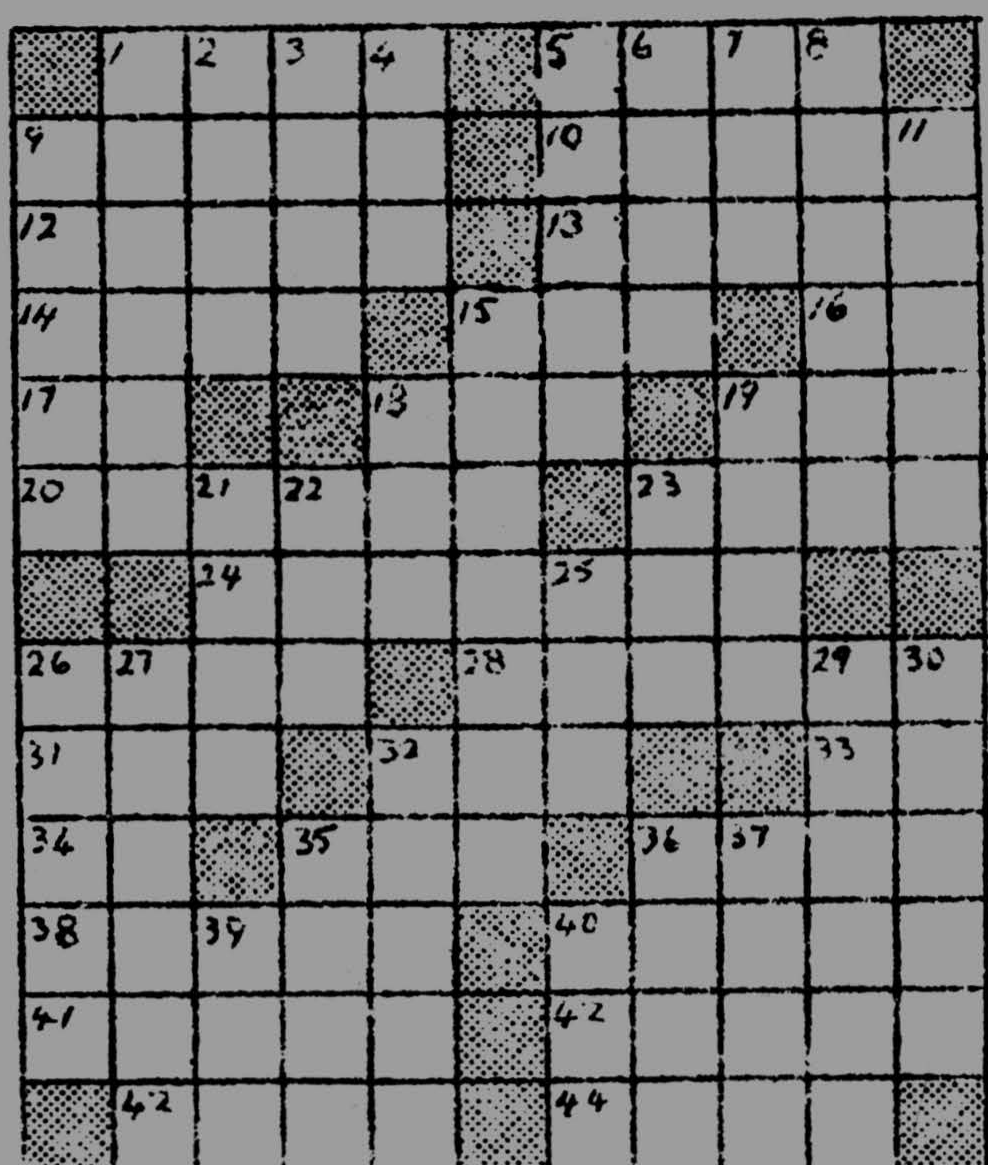

In the C.L.T.A. ratings, which were recently released, Miss June Saunders was ranked 6th in the under 16 girls age division. Miss Saunders is currently in training for the 1968 season and has one more year left in the under 16 age division. She has an excellent chance this year for either a National Championship or a higher ranking in her category.

John Crowley was listed as Number 8 in the under 12 boys age division. John will be entering the under 14 age classification this year and should make his mark in this division as well.

The N.L.T.A. will be holding an eight week tennis course at the Torbay Recreation Centre beginning April 6 and ending May 25. - SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP -

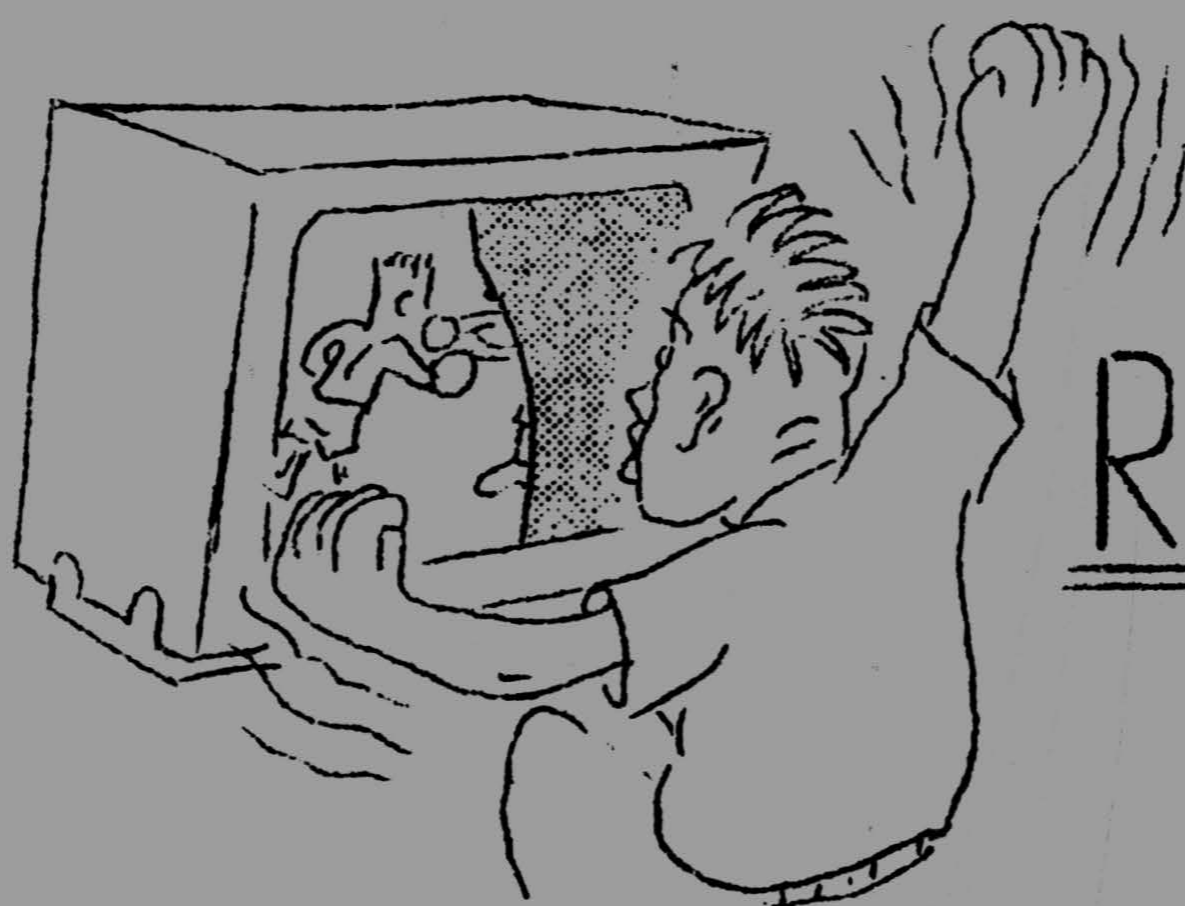
INGREDIENTS:

8 oz. flour
8 oz. butter or margarine
Iced water
Apple pulp
Cream
Glacé icing
Chopped almonds
Glacé cherries and
angelica.

SWEDISH THOUSAND LEAVES TORTE

METHOD:

Sieve the flour and cut in the fat, using a knife.
Use iced water to mix, and work the mixture with
a wooden spoon until it is smooth; cover and
chill. Divide into 6 - 7 portions, roll very
thinly on waxed paper, cut into rounds and prick
all over. Put on to a baking tin, brush over
with iced water and bake in a hot oven (450°F.,)
for 6 - 8 minutes. Keep on the waxed paper until
cold. Spread alternate pastry rounds with apple
pulp and cream, building them up like a layer
cake. Top with icing and decorate with a ring
of browned almonds, and with glacé cherries and
angelica.

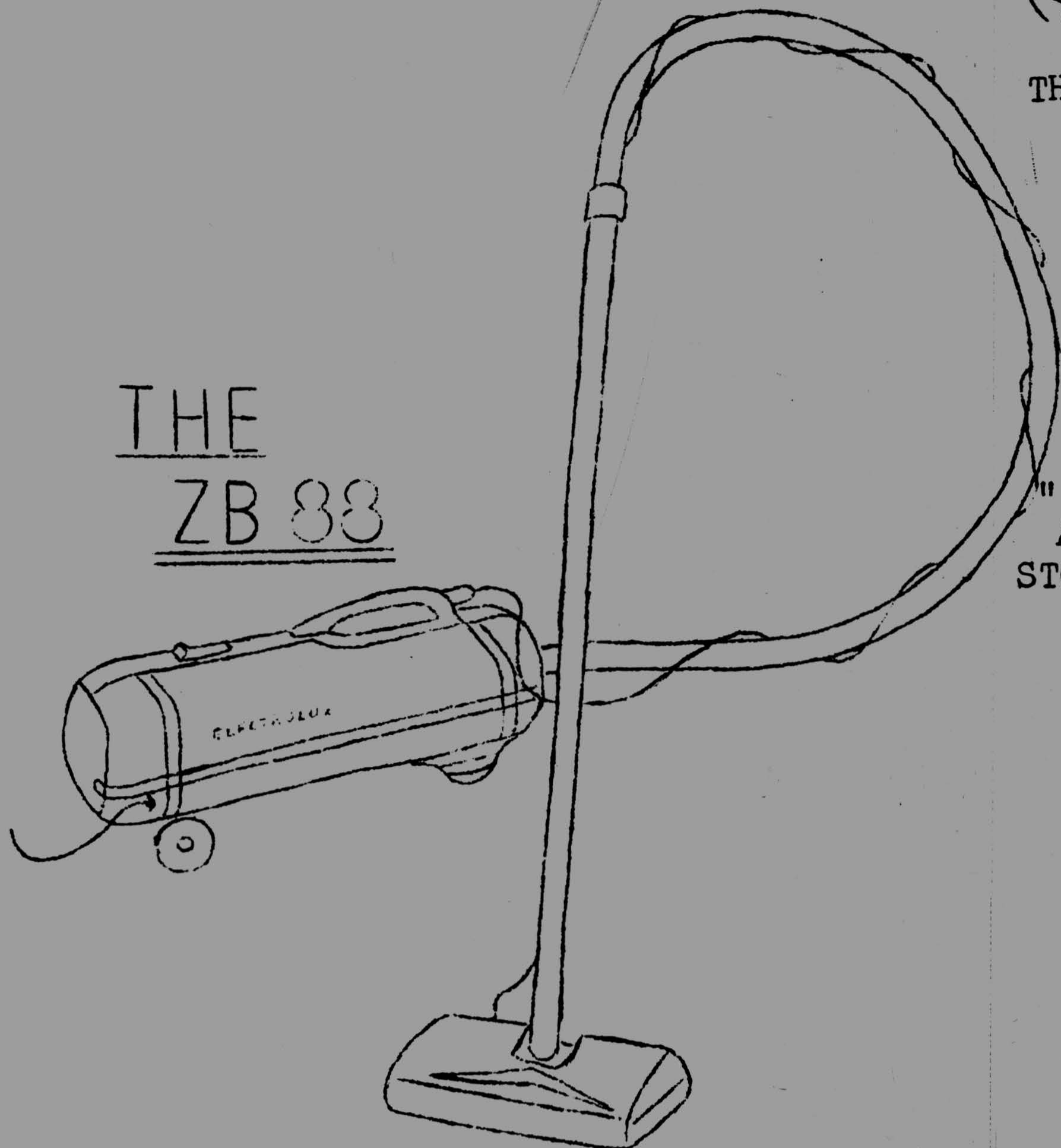

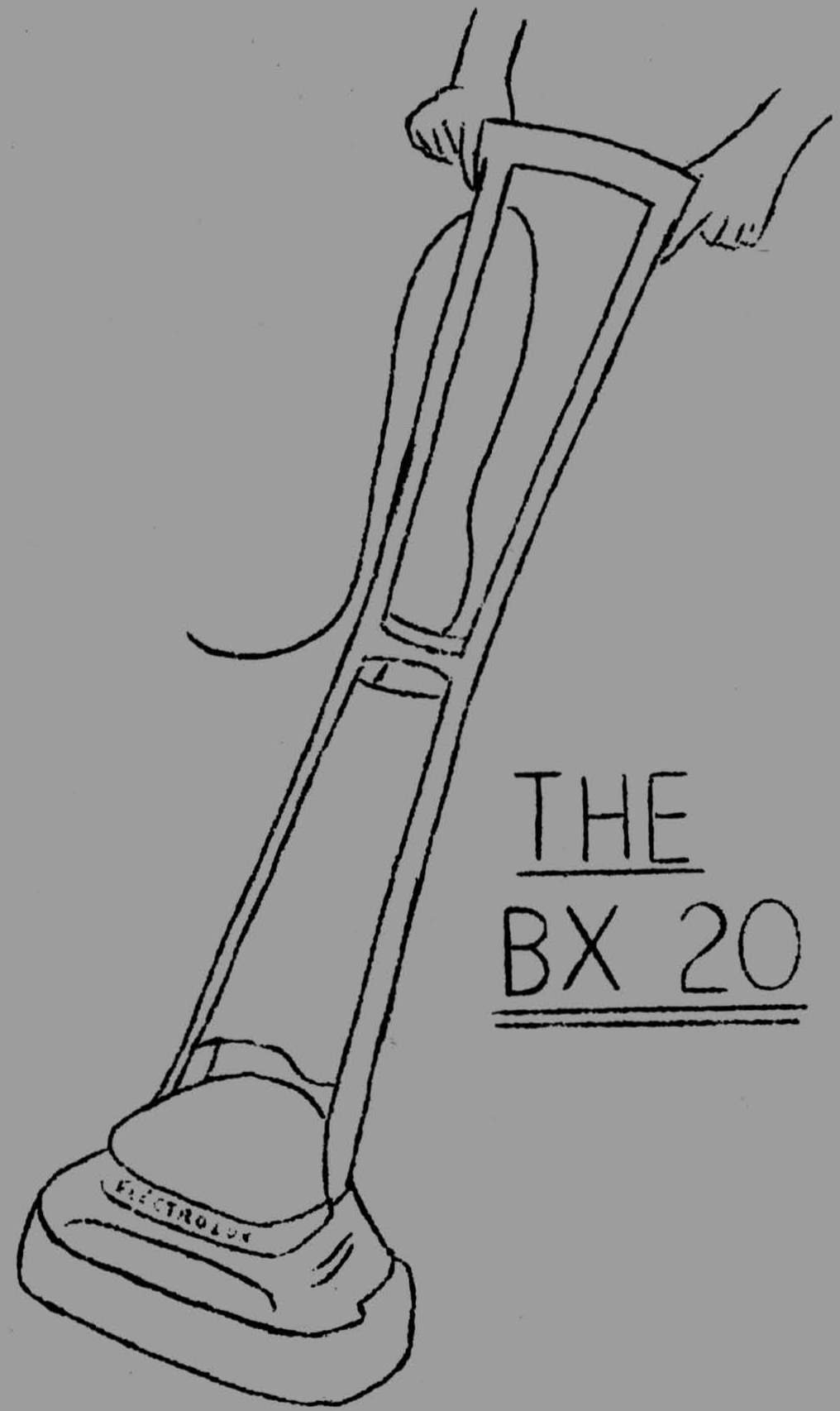

- NEWS RELEASE FROM THE CANADIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY -

The Premier, the Honorable J.R.Smallwood, who is also the Honorary President of the Nfld:Division of the Canadian Red Cross Society,has endorsed the work of the Society with these words.

" I have been asked to say a few words, endorsing the work of the Canadian Red Cross Society.

In both capacities, I have become very familiar with the great humanitarian work of Red Cross in Newfoundland and throughout the World and I make no apologies for asking you to assist this world-wide organization, particularly at this time in the history of the World, when there is so much suffering and bloodshed. I would ask you to remember then when you contribute to Red Cross, you are not only helping to alleviate the suffering of the victims of war in Viet Nam - both north and south - and, also victims of disasters in other countries, but you are also helping to alleviate the sufferings of many of your fellow Newfoundlanders.

To illustrate this, I would point out that in 1967 over 17,000 Newfoundlanders cared enough to give their blood, so that 4,991 of their fellow countrymen might live. 2,750 patients were accommodated at the Red Cross Hostel - a home away from home.

There are 30,000 of our youth participating in the Red Cross Youth programmes in Newfoundland schools, developing them to be healthier community-minded citizens.

Over 12,000 men,women and children received instructions in Water Safety.

1,055 of our fellow Newfoundlanders were assisted by Red Cross Disaster Committees throughout the Provinces and which cost the Society \$21,540.00.

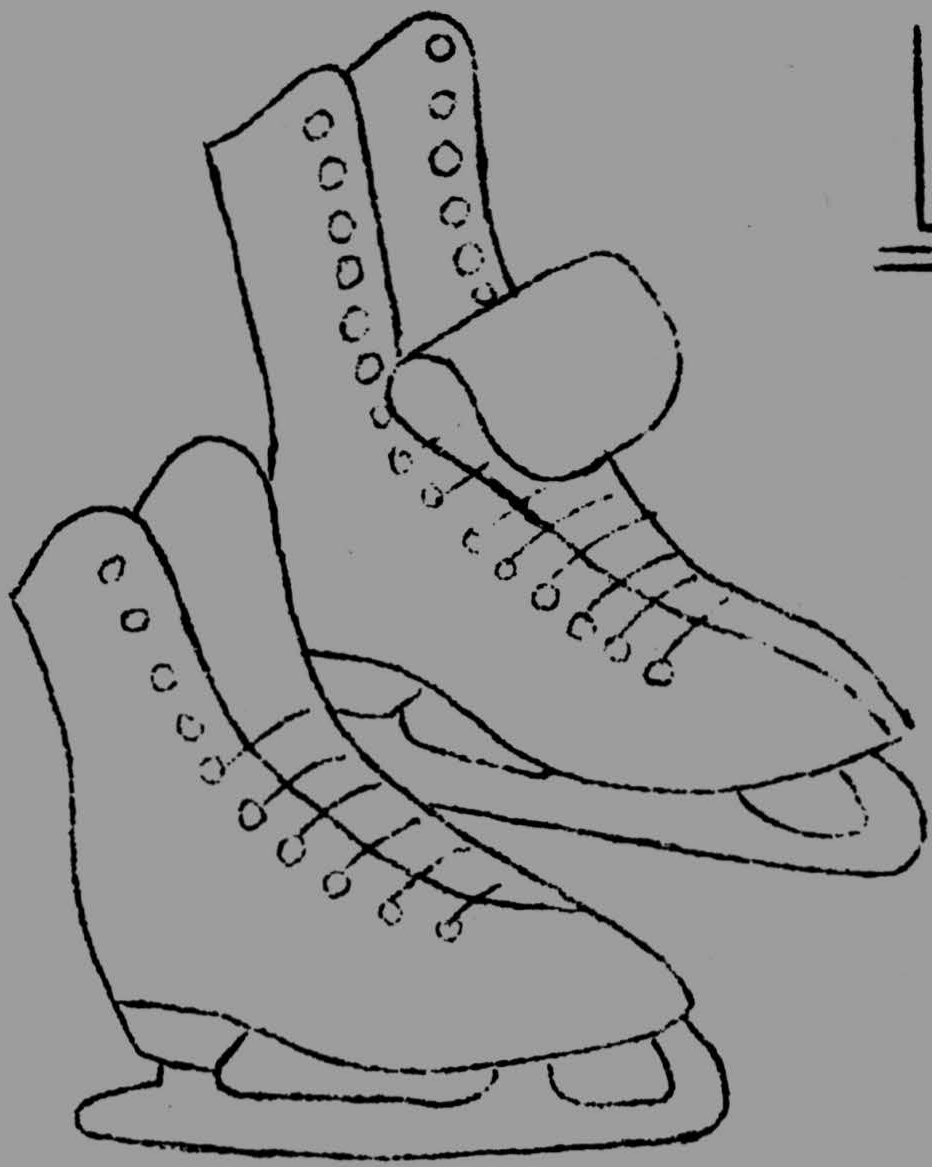

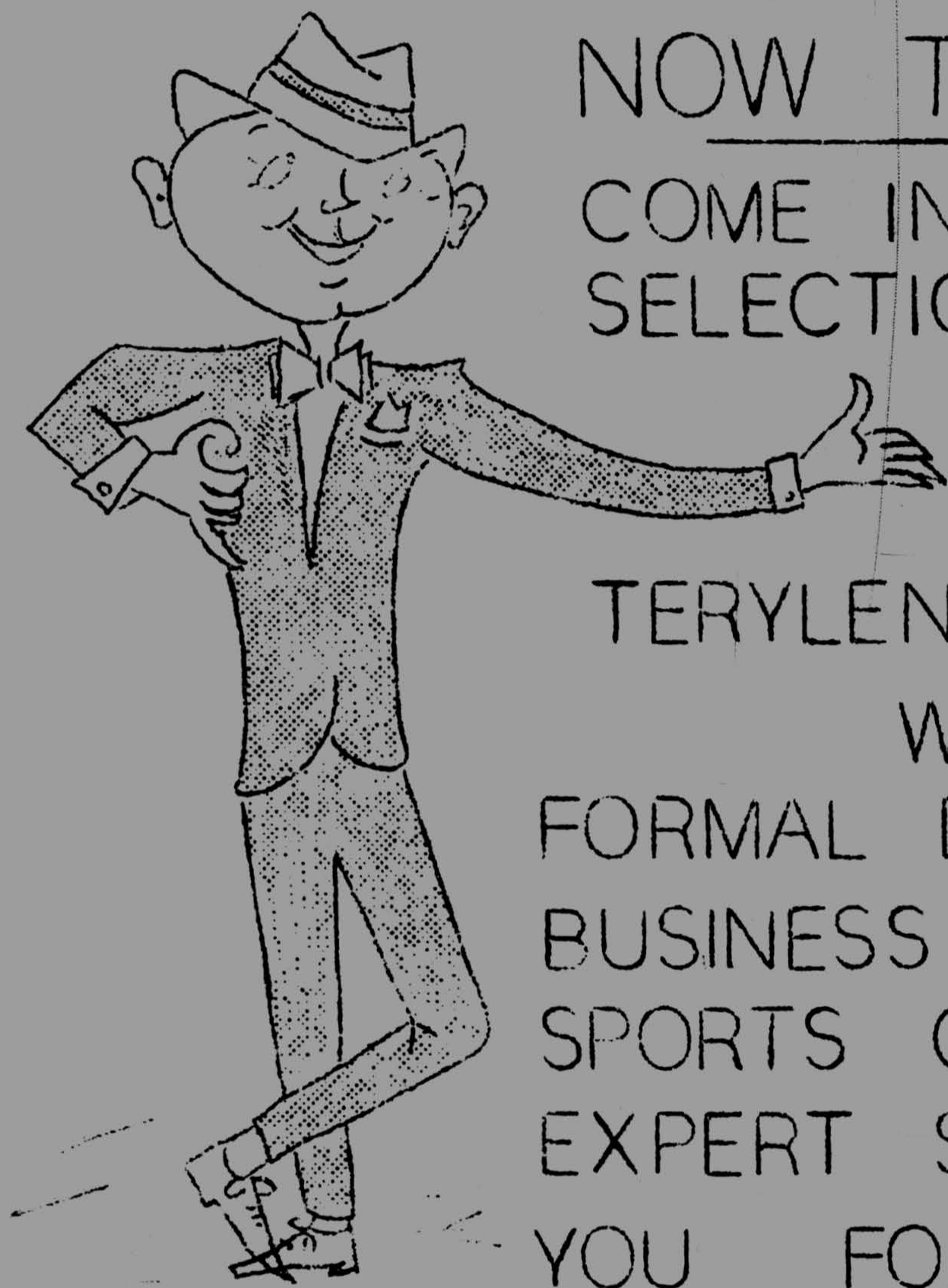

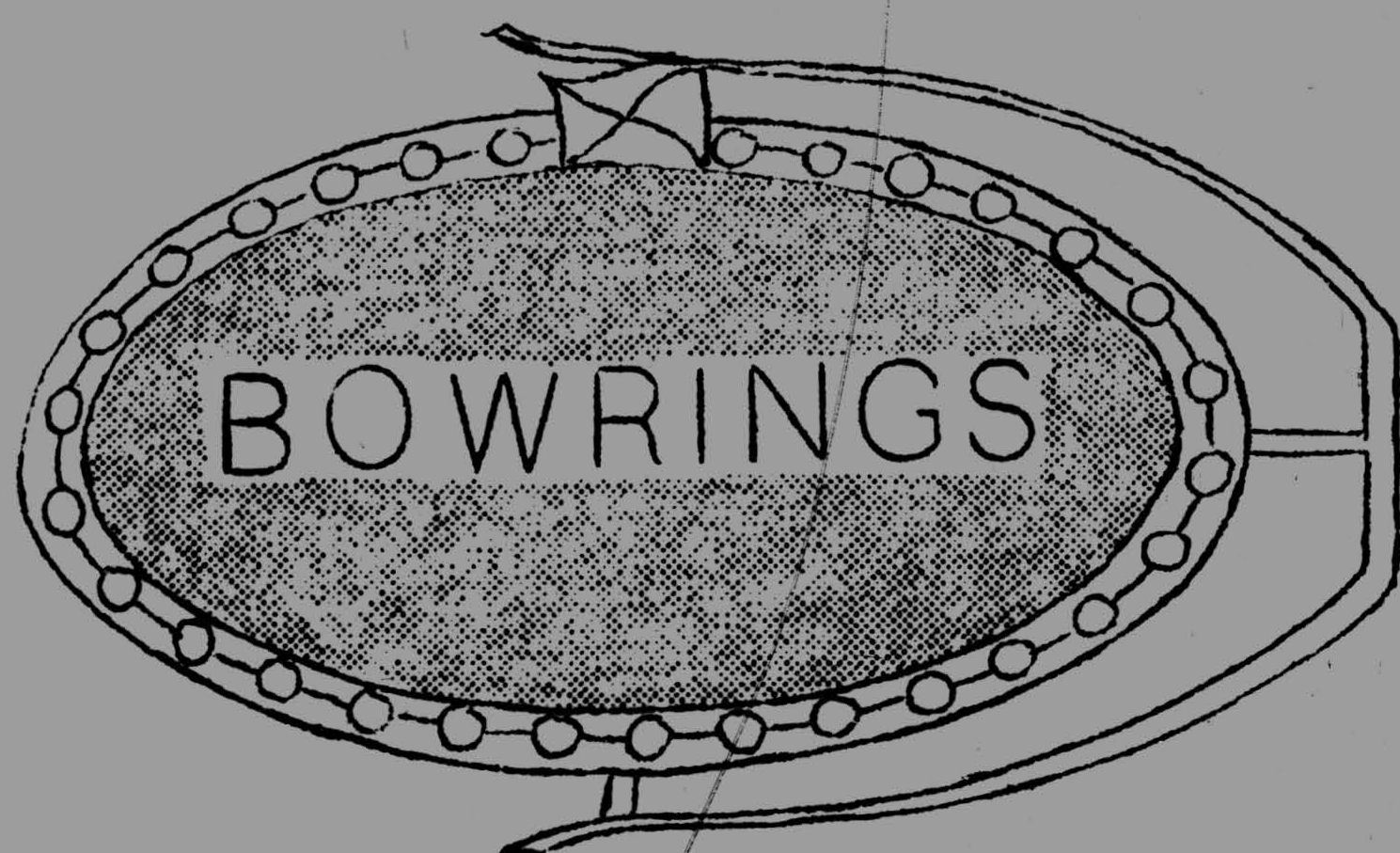
