1968 is Human Rights year and one of the basic rights of everyone is the right to life itself. A man can have no other human or civil rights unless he is alive. There were seventeen thousand and fifty-two Newfoundlanders who, last year, displayed their appreciation for this basic right by donating their blood, so that four thousand, nine hundred and ninety-one men, women and children might live.

Alistair Eaton, Volunteer Chairman of the Red Cross Blood Donor Committee said that although this service was made possible, mainly by blood donors, it is also a joint service, requiring the combined efforts of Volunteer workers, Volunteer donors and Volunteer dollars. All parts of this operation must remain in effect if this essential service is to continue.

Mr. Eaton also revealed that eight hundred and ninety units of fibrinogen, serum albumin, gamma globulin, fresh frozen plasma and cryoprecipitate, which are by-products of blood, were also collected, processed, and distributed free of charge to the patients requiring its use.

Mr. Eaton pointed out that although there has been an increase in the amount of blood collected each year, we should not become complacent, as the need for additional blood, due to the increased number of hospitals and the expanding availability of medical and surgical services, will require everyone's continued support.

On behalf of the four thousand, nine hundred and ninety-one patients who received blood during the past year, Mr. Eaton expressed grateful appreciation to the donors and the dollars that made this service possible.

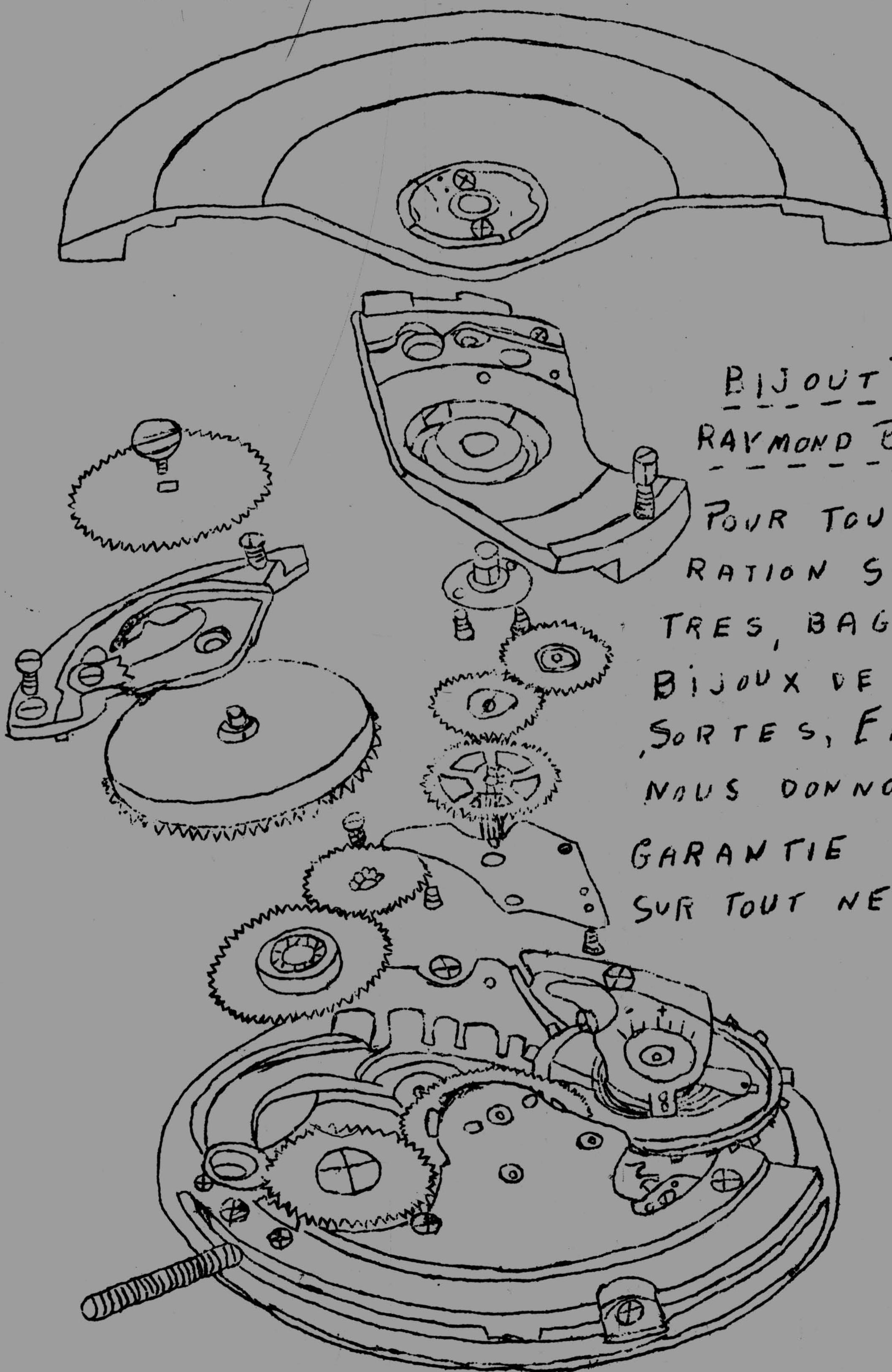

- SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP -

INGREDIENTS

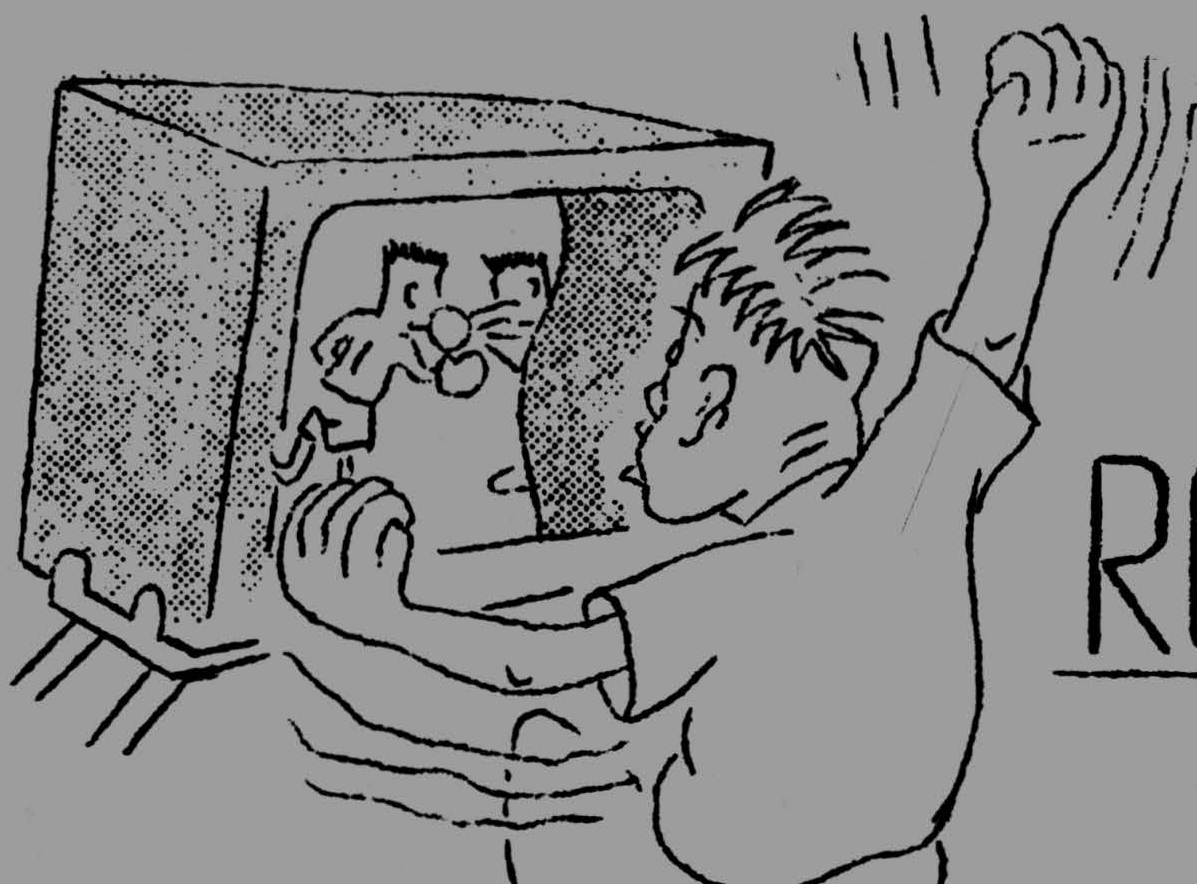
6 oz puff (or flaky) pastry  
Whipped cream or  
confectioner's custard  
vanilla essence  
Raspberry or strawberry jam  
White glacé icing

VANILLA SLICES

Roll the pastry  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch thick and form into a strip 4 inches wide. Cut into oblong pieces about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  wide and bake in a very hot oven (475° F.) for 10 minutes. Allow to become quite cold, then sandwich two or three of them together with jam and cream, which should be flavoured with vanilla. Top the slices with a little white glacé icing. Serve these pastries as a cold dessert, or for tea. If preferred, fresh strawberries or raspberries can be used for the filling instead of the jam.
