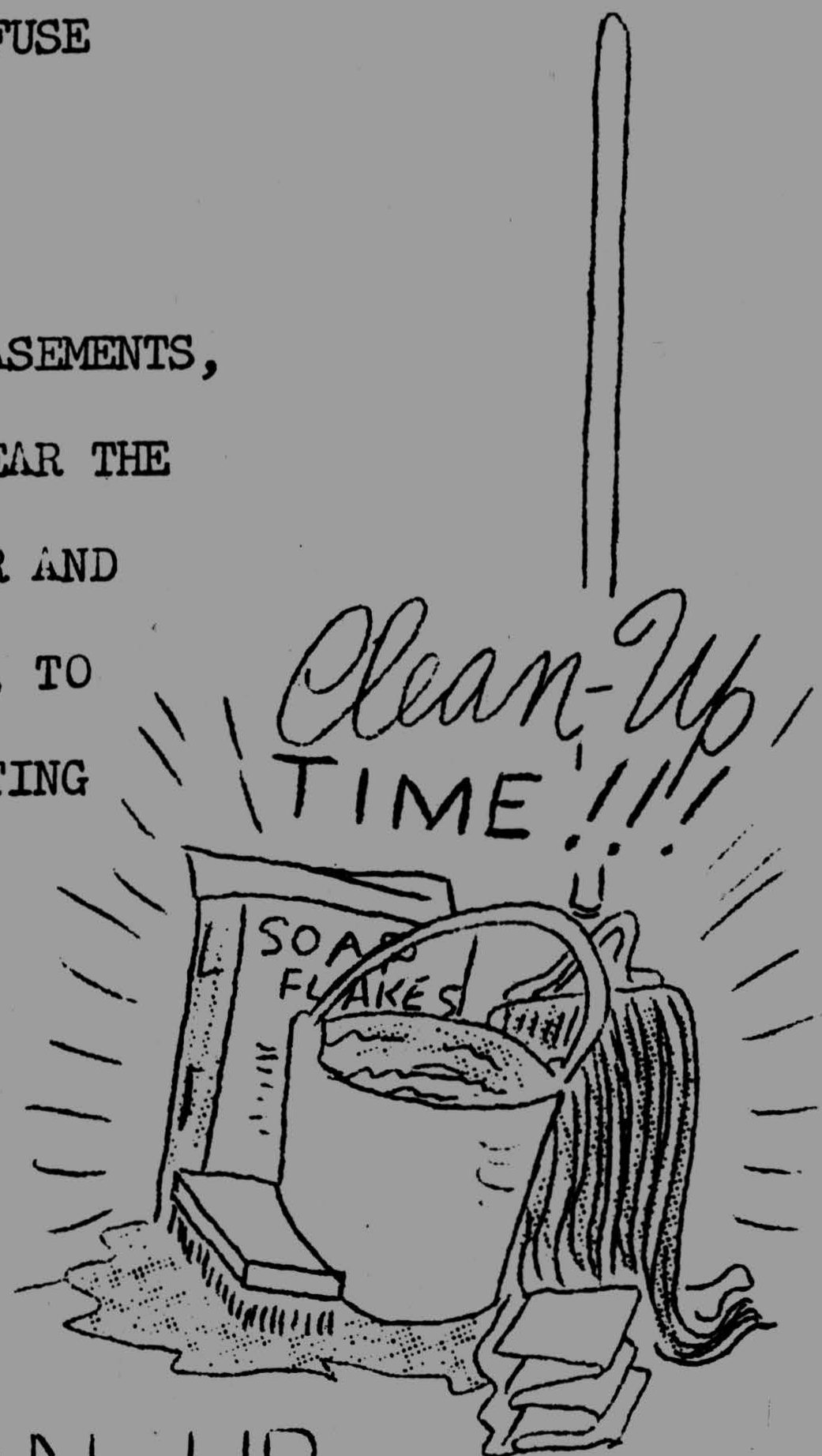

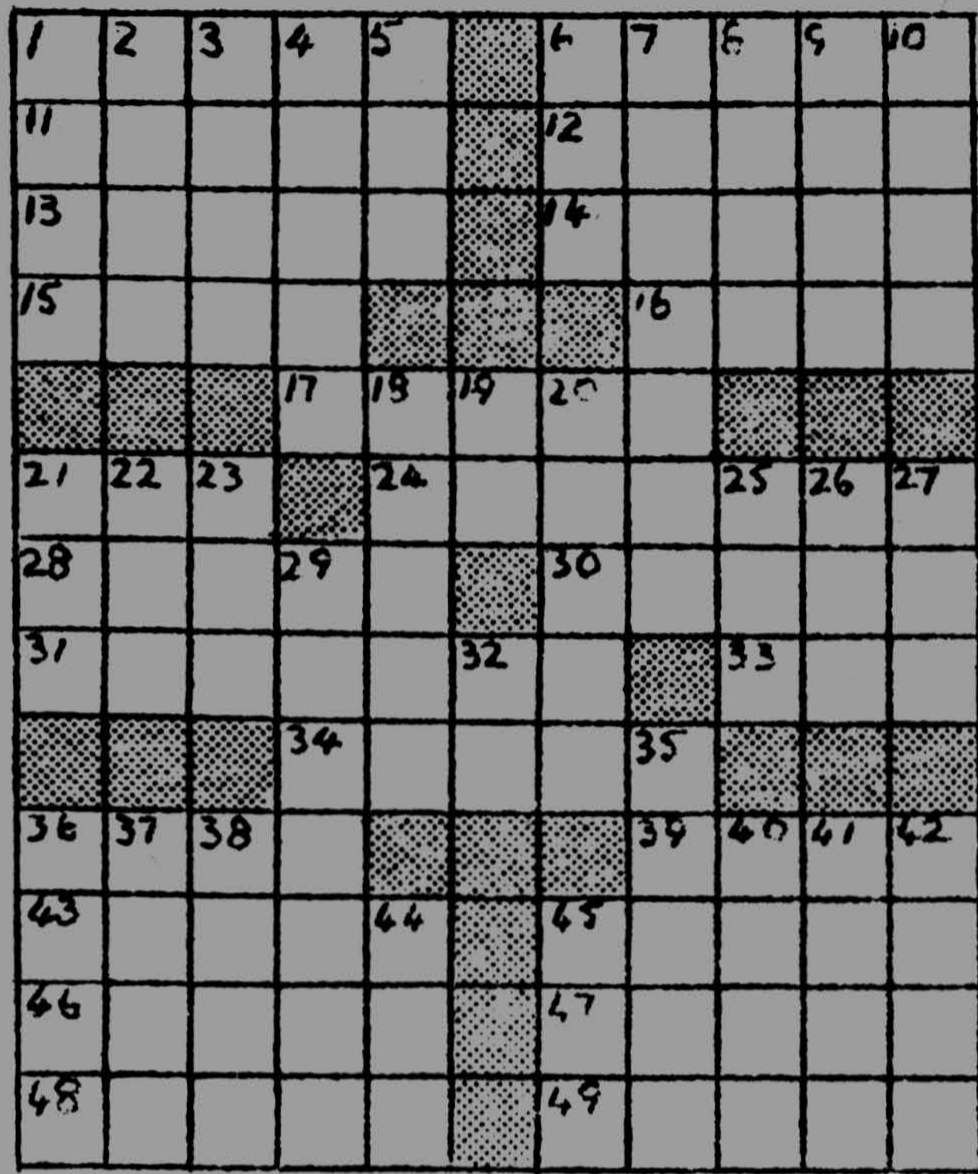
THE TOWN TRUCK WILL PICK UP ALL DEBRIS AND REFUSE

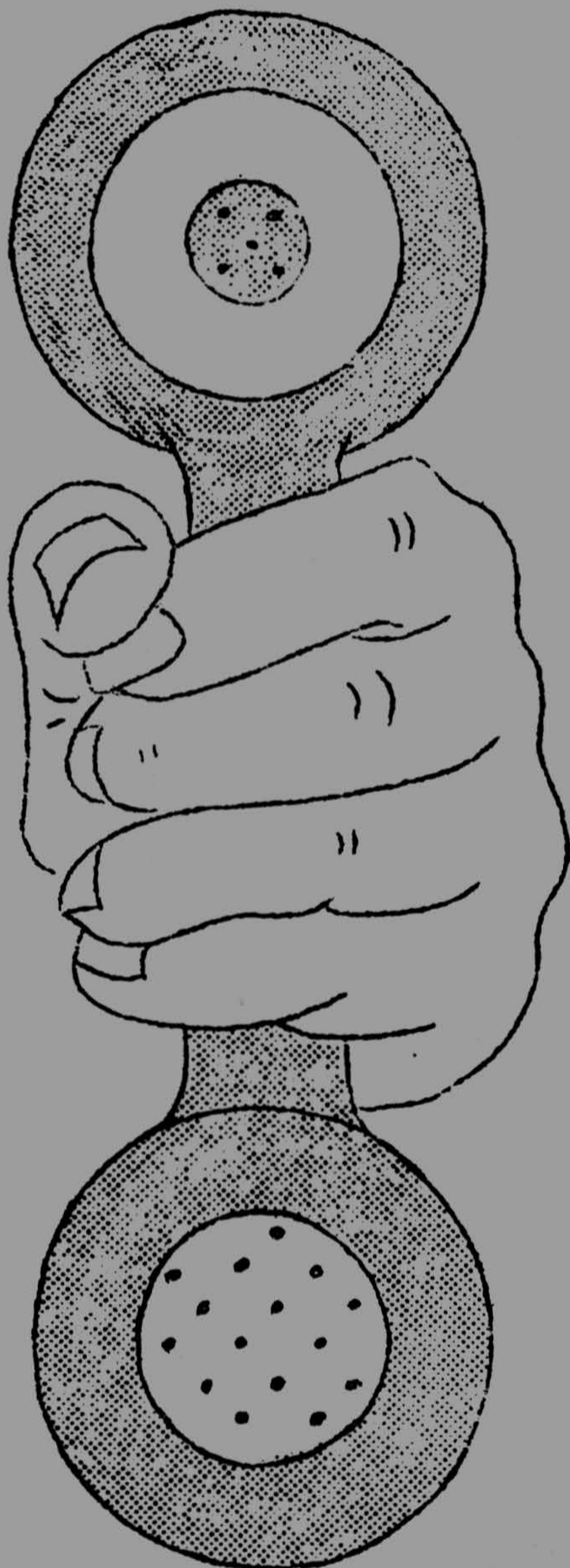

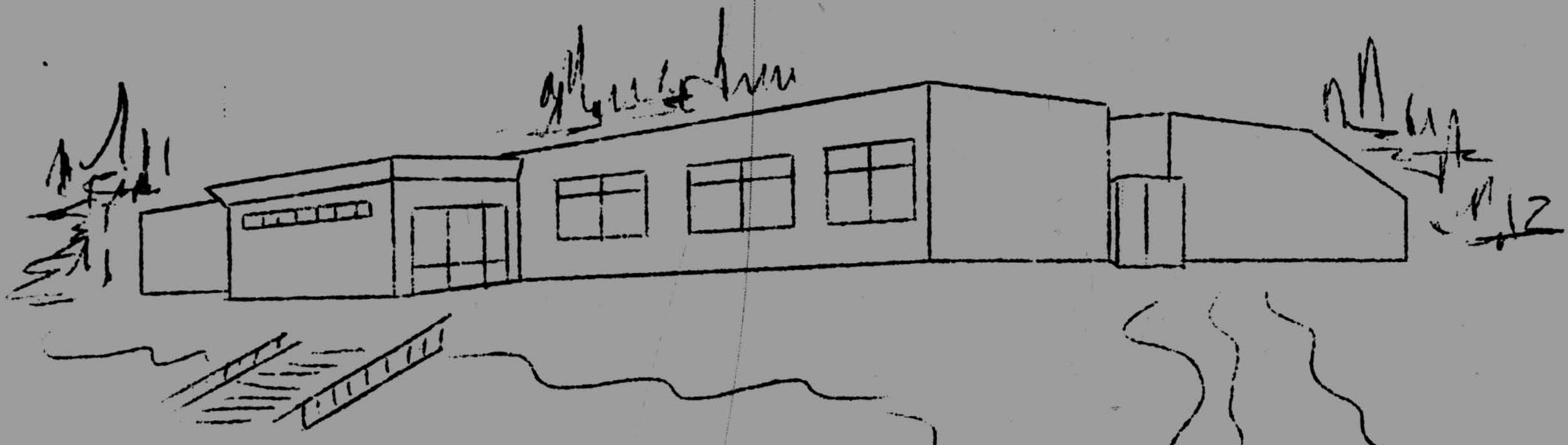

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP
- SPAGHETTI BOLOGNAISE -

INGREDIENTS

- 1 small onion
- 1 clove of garlic
- 2 tbsps. olive oil
- 1 oz. butter
- 4 - 6 oz raw minced beef
- 2 oz mushrooms
- 1 lb peeled tomatoes
- 2 tbsps. tomato paste
- 1 bay leaf
- Salt and pepper
- 12 oz spaghetti
- Grated cheese.

METHOD

Chop the onion and clove of garlic, and fry in the hot oil and butter. Add the meat, fry until it loses its redness, and then add the chopped mushrooms, sliced tomatoes, tomato paste and bay leaf; season with salt and pepper, cover, and cook gently until the meat is tender. Cook the spaghetti in boiling salted water for 15 - 20 minutes, drain, and put into a hot serving dish. Pour the sauce over and mix well, sprinkle cheese over the top, and serve more grated cheese separately.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. sugar
- 3 oz butter
- 2 level tbsps. glucose
- 1/4 pint water
- 8 oz. shelled walnuts or almonds.

METHOD

Put the sugar, butter, glucose and water into pan and bring to the boil, stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Heat to 300°F., then pour the toffee into small, well-greased tins, or pour in small portions on a greased slab or tin. Quickly put a halved nut on top of each and cover with a little more toffee. When set remove from tin and wrap in waxed paper.

WHAT IS ADOPTION ?

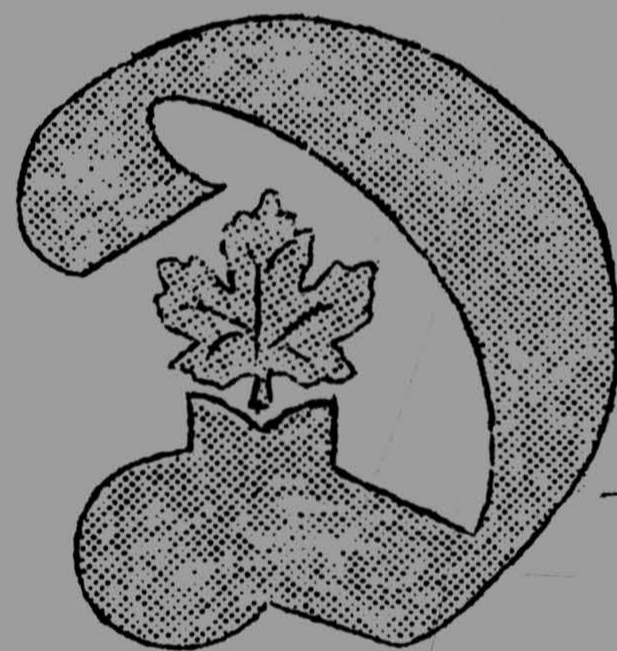
