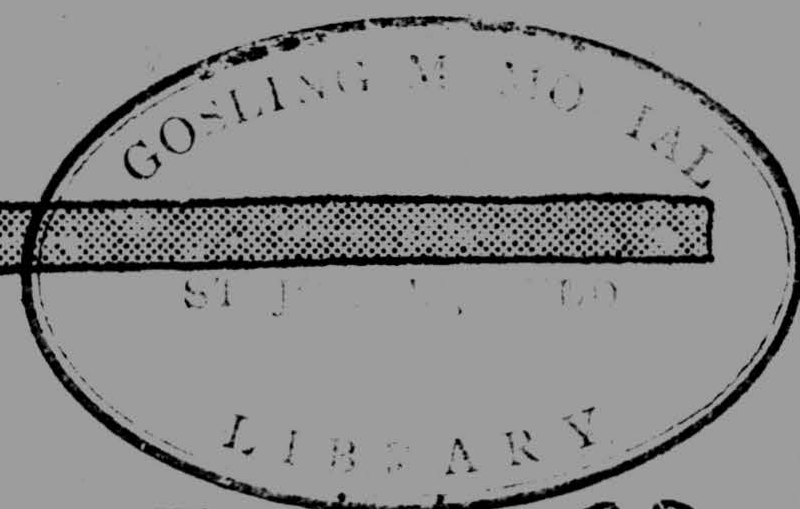

THE FOLLOWING EDITORIAL

"Two are better than one, because they have good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow; but woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up."

Some of my friends used to use those words as proof that a man should wear both a belt and suspenders. If one of them broke, the other was there to hold your pants up. And a fellow hates to get caught with his pants down. They were joking of course.

There is a serious meaning to it though. Two heads are better than one when people are trying to get a job done. Cooperation has its rewards. When people work apart they may get a good deal done - but not as much as when they work together. That is why there are such things as unions.

That is why I will be going to Japan to work with the Japanese church. East and west will be working together as a team. In the old days the missionary went to boss the project. Not any more. He is no longer the "mine manager". Now he goes as a partner in the business of Christianity -- an ideas-man to bring new thoughts to the situation.

You need not go to Japan to practice cooperation. You can do it here. For instance, the Anglican and United Churches are well along in plans to build together. It will be only a matter of a few weeks before we see the results of this cooperation right before our eyes.

There are other forms of cooperation in Labrador City. The library is one of them. People from the town have worked together, donating their time, so that we could have books to read. Next time you get a book, remember to thank them.

But in some cases the community spirit and cooperation has not been all that it should be. We have often been caught with our pants down in the past--and still are. Have you ever asked yourself what a stranger coming here would think of our cemetery? And if you have thought about it have you done anything about it?

Labrador City has plenty of room for those who want to do something useful. By next fall there should be enough boys for another Scout troop--and there are hardly enough leaders for the ones we have now.

What can you do? Rather, what will you do?

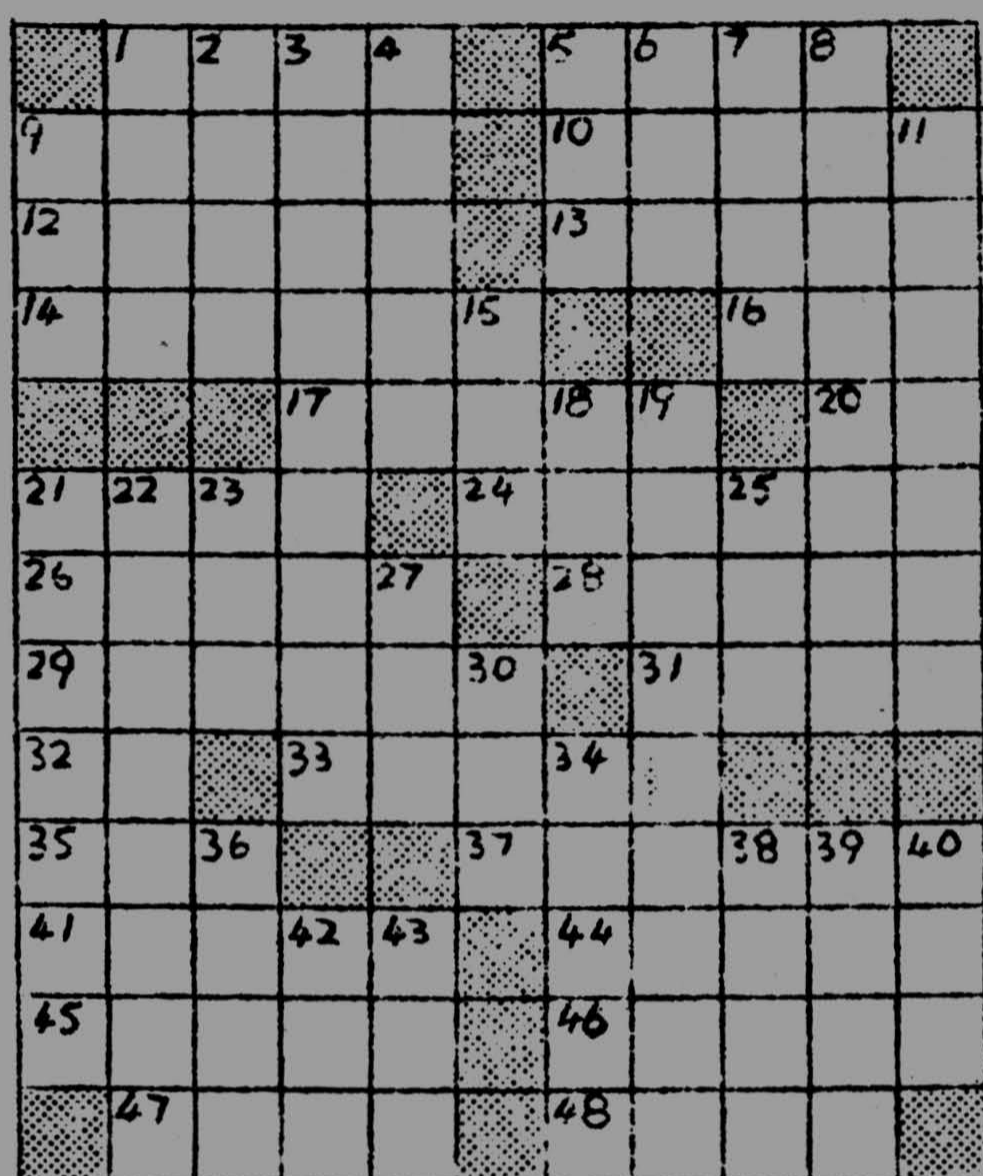

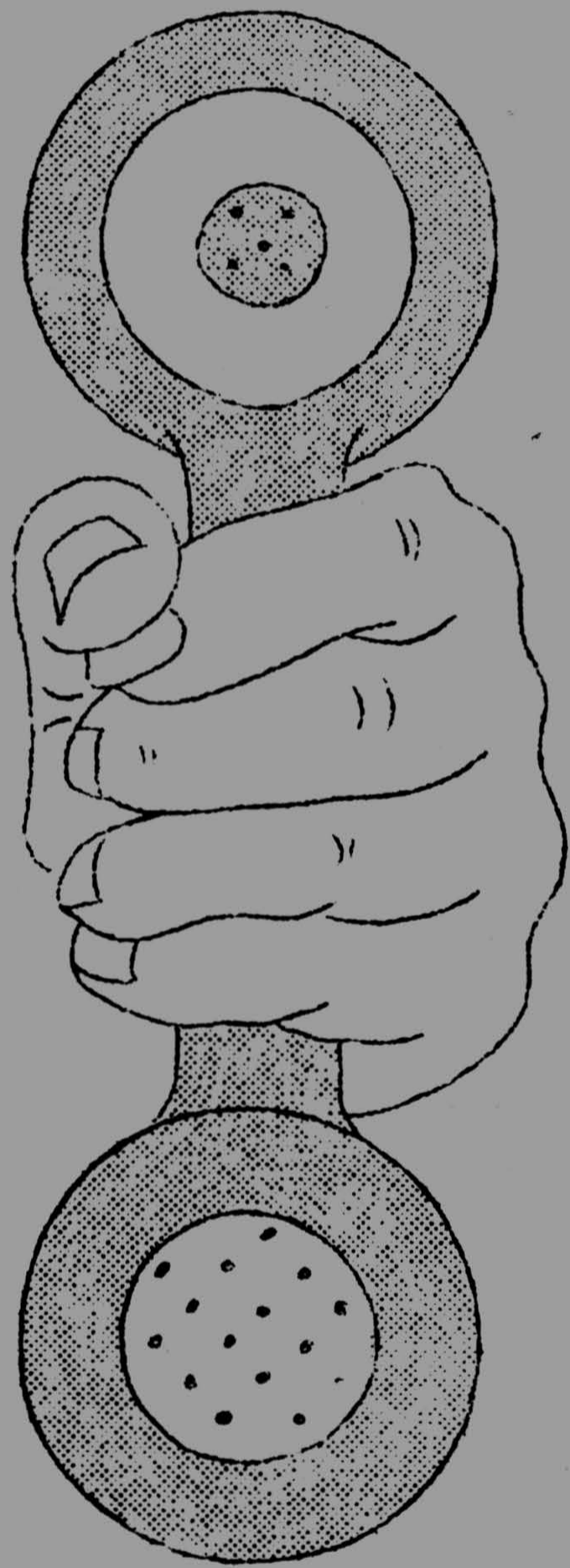
