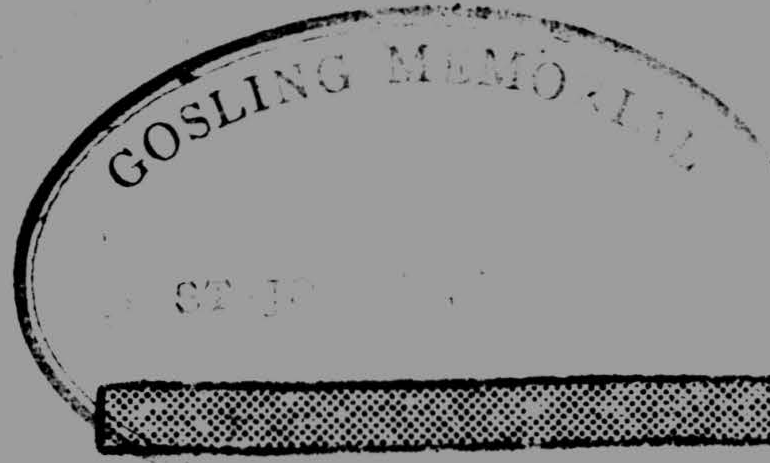

CANADIAN MATHEMATICAL CONGRESS  
- RESULTS OF 1968 MATHEMATICS CONGRESS ANNOUNCED -

Newfoundland winners of the Annual High School Congress in Mathematics were named on June 6th by Professor W.J. Blundon, Head of the Department of Mathematics at Memorial University, Newfoundland.

Professor Blundon was the 1968 convenor of the Newfoundland Congress in conjunction with the Provincial Department of Education and the University.

Winner of the First Prize of \$100 is ROGER BARTER. Roger won out over a total of 178 contestants representing 34 schools in the province.

Second Prize of \$50 was awarded to GLEN SKANES of St. John's.

3/4 pint fish stock or water

6 fillets of fish  
Lemon and parsley  
Boiled rice.

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT, CUT AND KEEP  
CURRIED PLAICE OR HADDOCK

Melt the fat and fry the onion. Peel and chop the apple and cook for several minutes. Add curry powder and paste and cook for a further 5 minutes, then add flour and cook for several minutes more. Pour the liquid in gradually, and then add seasoning, a little sugar and chutney. Roll the fish fillets and put them into a casserole, pour on the curry sauce and cook in the oven for 1/2 hour. Serve garnished with lemon slices and parsley, and accompanied by the boiled rice.

GOVERNMENT RELEASE - JUNE 7, 1968

The Honourable Dr. F.W. Rowe, Minister of Education, announced today that beginning with the June 1969 Examinations scholarships for Grade X will not be awarded on the results of public examinations. Instead a special scholarship examination will be prepared and administered to those students who apply to the Department to write this examination. It is expected that the Grade XI scholarships will not be awarded on the results of the public examinations to be held in June 1970, but that a special scholarship examination will be provided at that time for that grade.

This new policy of having scholarships divorced from public examinations is being introduced to enable schools to be more flexible in the various programmes which they can offer their students and to make it more convenient for them to introduce subject promotion.

PERMITS TO BURN

Under the provisions of Section 5 (6) of the Forest Fires Act 1952, Chapter 179 of the Revised Statutes of Newfoundland, 1952, notice is hereby given that effective midnight, May 31, 1968 all permits to burn issued under the above mentioned Act are cancelled until further notice.

The general public is warned that with the approach of summer fire hazard conditions, extreme caution should be taken by all people visiting and travelling through forest lands.

A resident of Labrador City appeared in Magistrate's Court on a charge of imprudent driving. Upon conviction, he was fined \$50.00 and his driver's licence was suspended for three months.

A Labrador City man was convicted of purchasing alcohol when under age. He was fined \$20.00.

Four residents of Labrador City and Wabush were fined for overtaking and passing a vehicle when it was unsafe to do so. Twenty residents were fined for failing to stop at a stop sign. Seven were convicted of parking offences, and twenty-eight were fined for exceeding the speed limit.

Two other residents were fined for being intoxicated in a public place.

A Wabush resident was fined for failing to give notification after a collision with an unattended vehicle.

A resident of Labrador City was convicted of driving his motor vehicle in a manner that was dangerous to the public. He was fined \$100.00 and his driver's licence was suspended for one year.

A Wabush resident was fined for operating a motor vehicle without a driver's licence.

Two men, one from Wabush and one from Labrador City, were charged with carrying firearms in a place known to be frequented by game during the closed season. They were convicted and fined \$25.00 each, and their firearms were confiscated.

Three other residents were convicted of hunting migratory birds during the closed season and were fined \$50.00 each, and their firearms were confiscated.

Four residents of Wabush were fined for failing to keep their dogs penned up or chained at all times.

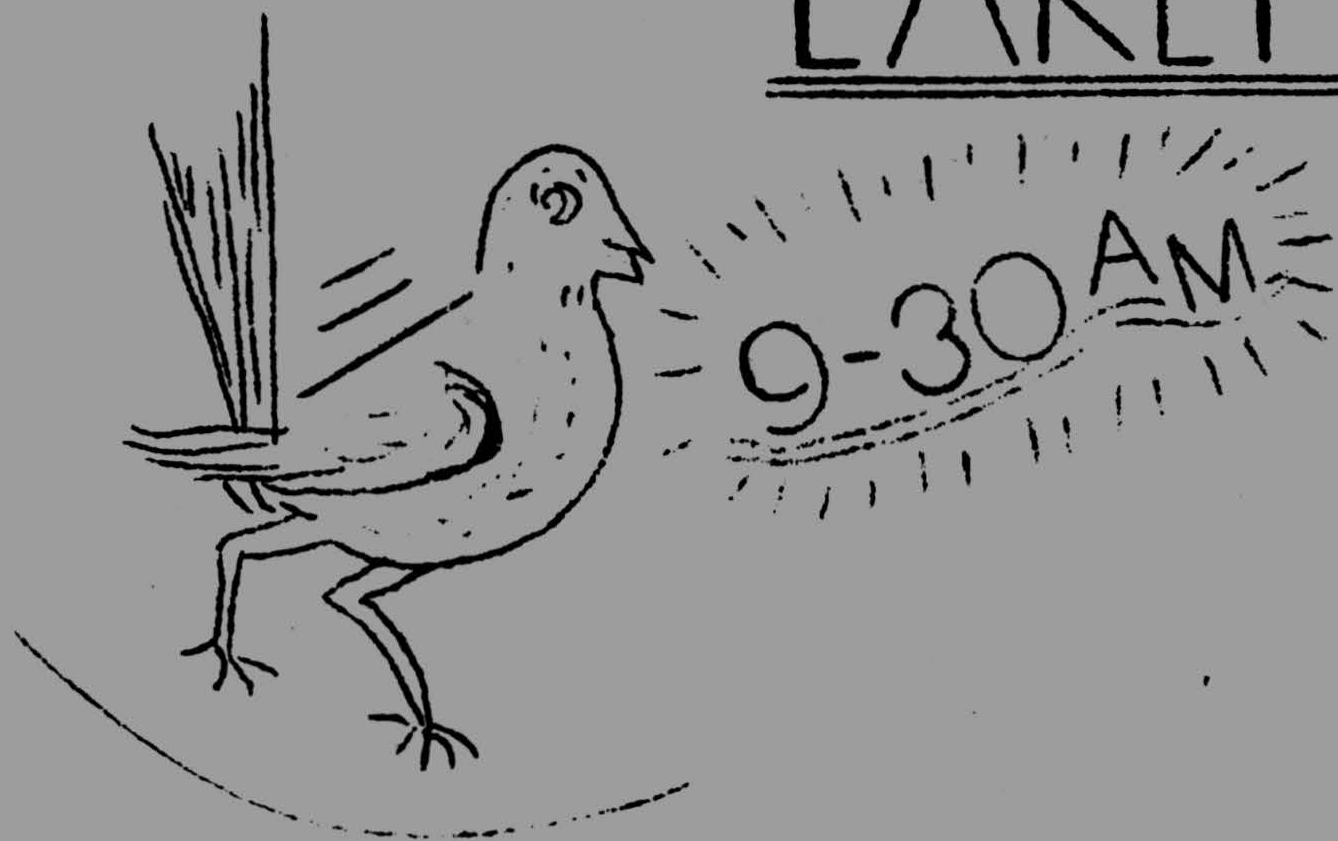
