PRESS RELEASE BY THE HONOURABLE DR.F.W. ROWE, MINISTER OF LABRADOR AFFAIRS

Because of the success of the Labrador Travel and Exchange Programme introduced by the Government early this year to assist cultural, athletic, social and recreational groups travelling back and forth between the Island and Labrador, it has been decided to institute an additional programme along somewhat similar lines.

It is now proposed to select students in the Grade X and XI categories in groups of seven at a time, to visit the Island and Labrador using the Government's Twin Otter aircraft. These groups will be accompanied by a Departmental supervisor.

The idea is that School Boards will undertake to select and recommend the students for these visits, and the parents, relatives or friends of the students will undertake to accommodate on a reciprocal basis these students from the Island or from Labrador during their visit which, subject to weather, would normally be of two days duration.

It is hoped that over a period all school districts will be able to share in this programme of having students from the Island of Newfoundland visit Labrador and students from Labrador visit Newfoundland. The Government's share in this proposal will be a major one providing as it will, free transportation back and forth between Labrador and the Island. It will, of course, include meals or lunches en route as circumstances may dictate.

School Boards are, therefore, invited to select and recommend to the Department of Labrador Affairs, as early as possible, groups of seven students in the Grade X and XI categories who wish to take advantage of this programme. Selection in every instance must be the responsibility of the School Board or Boards concerned.

When the Department of Labrador Affairs has received recommendations from a School Board it will decide on the date and assembly point where the aircraft will arrive with the supervisor to pick up the students for the flight. With the recommendation from the School Board there must also be a list of those who will accommodate students from Labrador or from the Island on reciprocal visits, so that the students will have no costs other than ordinary pocket money.

It is expected that the response to this new Travel and Exchange Programme will be immediate and enthusiastic. The Department of Labrador Affairs will extend every possible assistance and facility in making arrangements as soon as requests and recommendations from the different School Boards have been received.

It is hoped that this Programme will be able to start around the first week of July so that the students will be able to get maximum benefit from the summer weather. While details have yet to be worked out, and in any case will be as flexible as possible, it is hoped to have students from the Island visit the Goose area and Labrador City and Wabush, and include flights over the great Churchill Falls, while Labrador students will include a visit to St. John's in their itinerary.

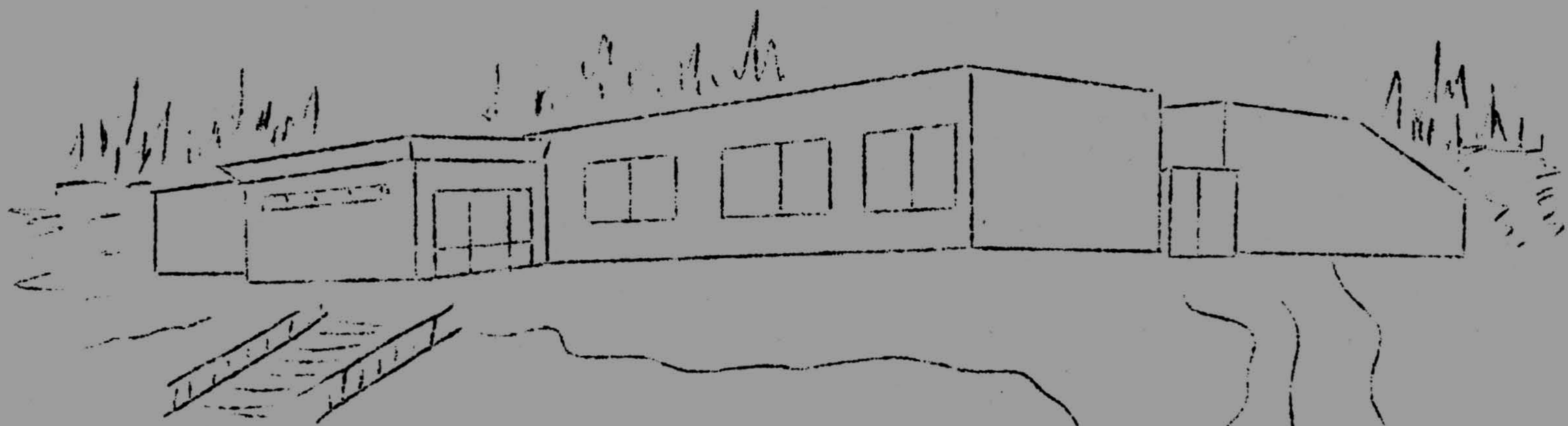

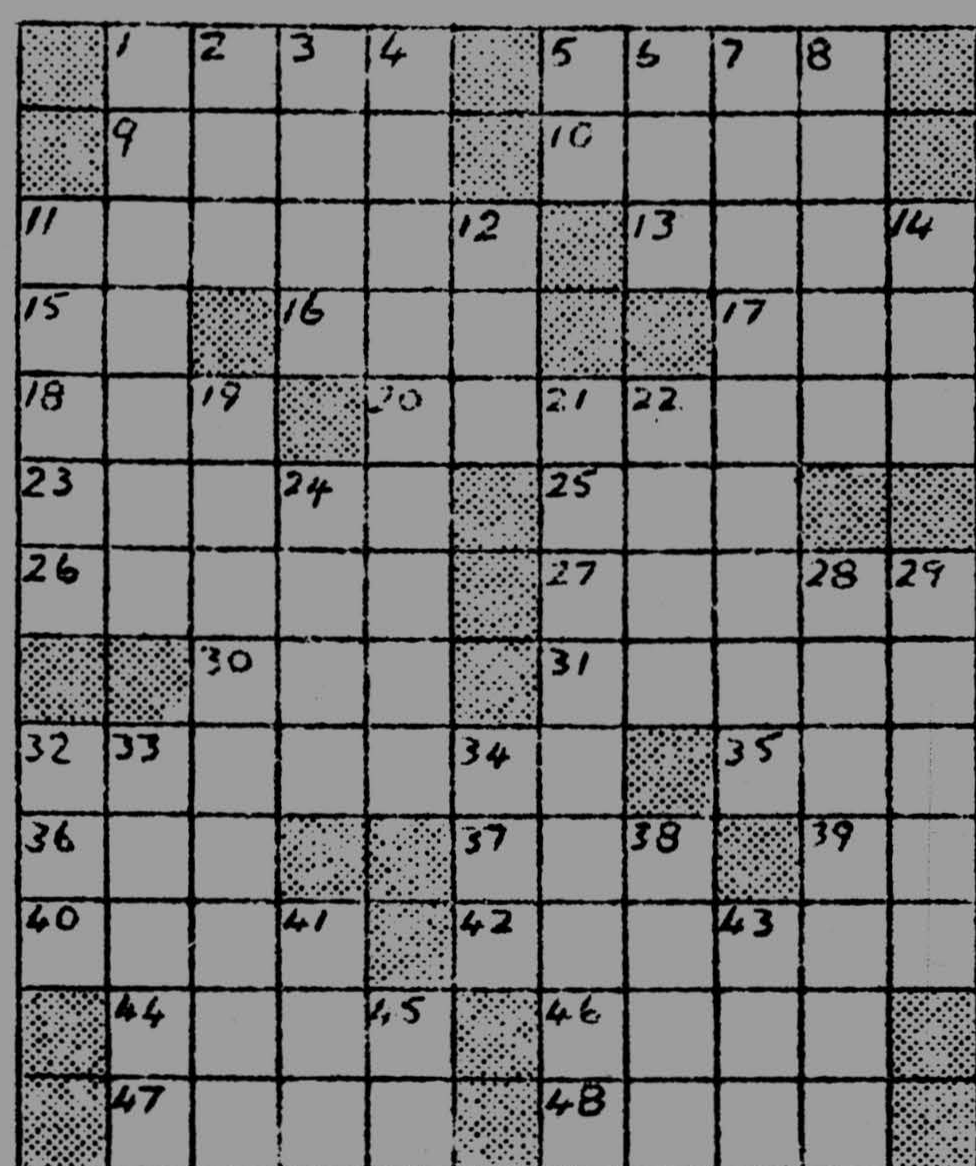

The Canadian National Institute for the Blind, Newfoundland-Labrador Division, is setting up an Advisory Board to represent Labrador.

The function of the board will be to promote help for the blind in Labrador with programmes aimed at the prevention of blindness.

It was decided at a meeting held in the Notre Dame Academy on the 13th day of June 1968 to appoint a Steering Committee to investigate the formation of an Advisory Board for Labrador. The board would have as its nucleus, residents of Labrador City and Wabush, with representatives from other areas such as Happy Valley, Cartwright etc. Correspondence with interested parties in other areas is under way and the Steering Committee feels that the Advisory Board will be formed in October of this year.
