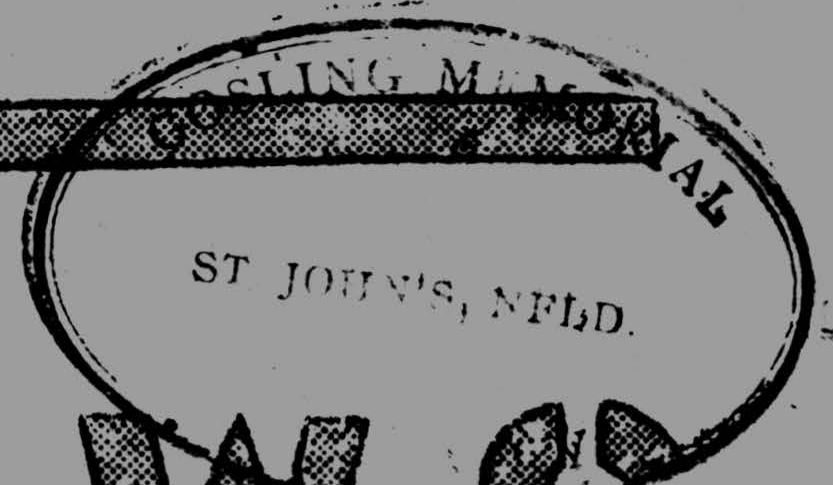

The following excerpt is from the Labrador City "CURFEW" Regulations:

\*\*\*\*\*

" NO PARENT OR GUARDIAN SHALL ALLOW A CHILD, ( "CHILD" MEANS AN UNMARRIED PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF SIXTEEN YEARS ) UNLESS THE CHILD IS IN THE COMPANY OF THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OR OTHER ADULT PERSON, TO BE ON ANY ROAD, STREET OR OTHER PUBLIC WAY IN THE DISTRICT OR TO FREQUENT PLACES OF AMUSEMENT OR OTHER PLACES OF PUBLIC ASSEMBLY AFTER THE HOURS OF

(a) 8:30 p.m. ON ANY DAY DURING THE MONTHS OF SEPTEMBER, OCTOBER, NOVEMBER, DECEMBER, JANUARY, FEBRUARY, MARCH, APRIL, MAY AND JUNE.

(b) 9:00 p.m. ON ANY DAY DURING THE MONTHS OF JULY AND AUGUST.

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT & KEEP

<u>INGREDIENTS</u>	<u>CURRIED SHRIMPS</u>	<u>METHOD</u>
1 finely chopped shallot or spring onion	Fry the shallot or spring onion in butter until golden-brown; add the curry powder and cook for 3 minutes. Pour in the stock and bring to the boil, then simmer gently for 15 minutes. Add the shrimps (reserving a few), cream, lemon juice and seasoning and heat through. Serve with boiled rice and garnish with shrimps, lemon and parsley. Shrimps curried like this may be also served as an hors d'oeuvre. (tinned or frozen shrimps may be used)	
1 oz. butter		
2 tsps. curry powder		
2 - 3 tbsps. stock		
1/4 pint picked shrimps.		
2 - 3 tbsps. cream		
1/2 tsp. lemon juice		
Salt		
boiled rice		
Shrimps, lemon and parsley to garnish.

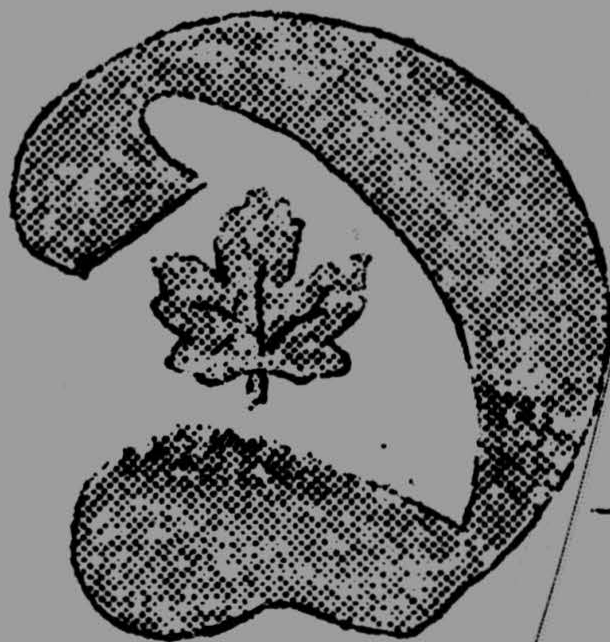

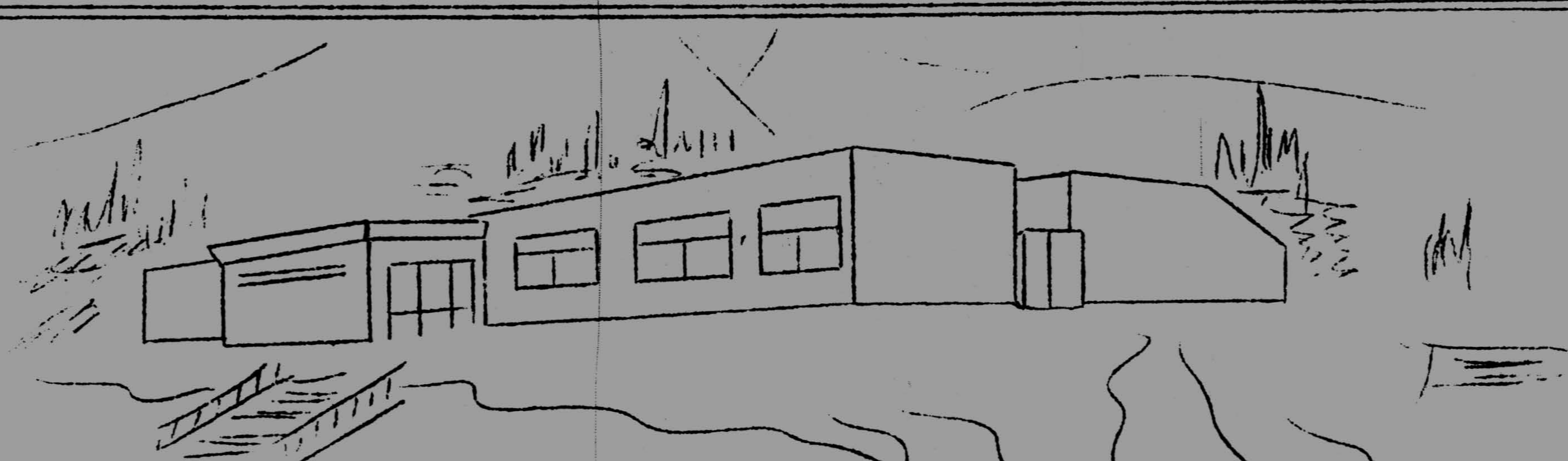

# WOOLWORTH'S

A number of inquiries have been received in the Department of Labour about the Employment of Children Act which was passed in the last session of the Legislature. The Honourable W.J.Keough wishes to bring to the attention of the public that this Act is not yet in force. It will not come into force until it has been so proclaimed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

In the meantime, preparatory work is being done in drafting Regulations which will be used in the administration of the Employment of Children Act.

The Honourable Mr.Keough today announced the appointment of an Advisory Committee, one of whose duties will be to prepare the Regulations which will be used in the administration of The Employment of Children Act.

Following are members of the Advisory Committee:

Chairman, Mr.T.A.Blanchard, Department of Labour

Vice-Chairman, Mr.M.J.Vincent, Director of Child Welfare, Department of Public Welfare

Mr.J.Acreman, United Church Superintendent of Education, Department of Education.

Mr.L.G.Vey, Senior Administrative Assistant, Department of Health.

When the draft Regulations are submitted to and approved by the Minister they will then be submitted for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

As and when the Executive Council decides upon the proclamation of the Act due notice will be given in advance of the proclamation date to enable all those whom it may affect to comply.

RESOURCES BRANCH NEWS RELEASE - JUNE 28th, 1968.

Two new Provincial Parks in the Central Region of the Island will be open for public use JULY 1st, the Minister of Mines, Agriculture and Resources, the Hon. C.M. Lane announced today.

The two new parks are Rushy Pond Provincial Park near Grand Falls and Flatwater Pond Provincial Park on the Baie Verte Road. Camping, picnicking and swimming facilities have been provided within both parks.

This brings to 33 the total number of parks now operated by the Provincial Parks Service.

Also open on JULY 1st will be 13 camping grounds in Dildo Run Provincial Park on New World Island. Dildo Run Park was opened for picnicking in 1967 but until now had no camping facilities.

The usual park fees apply to the new Provincial Parks. These are: the seasonal entrance fee of \$1 per vehicle, and a \$1 per night camping fee for both tents and trailers.
