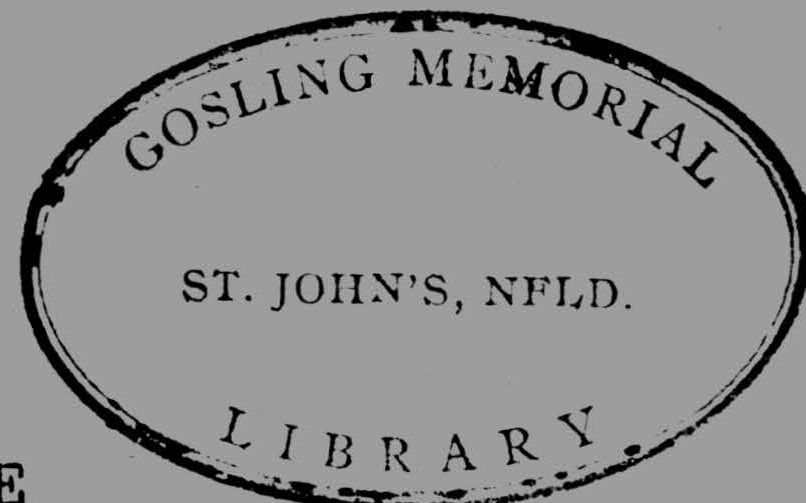

THE KINDNESS CLUB PLEDGE

"I promise to be kind to animals (as well as people) and to speak and act in the defence of all helpless creatures."

This is the kindness pledge taken by young people all over the world who have become members of the Kindness Club. The club was first started in December 1959 by Mrs. Hugh John Fleming, who is today club president.

Among the many members of the club was the eminent humanitarian, Dr. Albert Schweitzer, who devoted his life and vast knowledge to the good of humanity. On accepting Mrs Fleming's invitation to become Honorary President of the Kindness Club, Dr. Schweitzer wrote, "True goodness requires us to respect the lives of all creatures."

The object of the club is to teach children and young people to be kind to animals. If they are kind to animals they will be kind to people. This was Mrs Fleming's belief when she started the club. She believes that children are normally and naturally kind, but many are thoughtless about suffering, therefore the idea of kindness should be actively inculcated, not just left to chance.

The children form their own branch clubs, and run them themselves according to certain rules, and with the advisory help of an adult, known as the Raccoon Captain. Meetings are conducted according to the proper procedure, which is all carefully explained in the rules. Thus they enjoy the real responsibility of self-government and learn how meetings should be run - a useful experience for them and one for which they will be grateful in later life. They have projects, hobbies and the fun and enjoyment of many sorts of recreation.

We have a great need for such an organization in our town, many people are unaware of the many cruelties that are perpetrated against our pets. I know, as agent for the S.P.C.A. in town it has been my painful duty to go to the aid of cats and dogs which have been the victims of these terrible cruelties.

Granted not everyone loves cats and dogs, but no "normal" person takes pleasure in causing suffering to them. Such acts are punishable by law, and quite severely, and I promise that such action shall be taken by the S.P.C.A.

SUMMARY OF TEACHER SITUATION

The following statement was made today by the Honourable Dr. F.W. Rowe, Minister of Education on the teacher supply situation in Newfoundland.

I have received from the several Superintendents of Education a report on the teacher supply situation as it pertains to their respective schools.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Roman Catholic Superintendent reports that there will be 2,650 Roman Catholic teachers on the payroll in September and about 85% of these will have Grade 1 or higher. About 30 additional teachers are needed, chiefly for one or two room schools in small communities on the East Coast.

ANGLICAN CHURCH

The Anglican Superintendent reports that there are about six high school vacancies and ten other vacancies mostly in one room schools in Northern Newfoundland and Southern Labrador. The Superintendent believes that there are enough certificated and licensed teachers to fill these vacancies, but that they are not willing to teach in small schools in isolated communities. The Anglican Boards are finding the teacher supply problem much less severe than was the case last year at this time.

UNITED CHURCH

The United Church Superintendent reports that according to the information he has received there are only three vacancies in United Church Schools at this time.

SALVATION ARMY

The Salvation Army Superintendent reports that he does not expect there will be more than one vacancy in Salvation Army Schools in Newfoundland this Fall.

PENTECOSTAL CHURCH

Despite an 11% increase in the classroom needs, the Pentecostal Superintendent reports that 97% of their classrooms have so far been looked after, and that he has good hopes that the few vacancies remaining will also be filled.

AMALGAMATED SCHOOLS

The Director of Amalgamated Schools reports that the teacher supply situation in those schools is much improved over last year. This is particularly true of high schools. There are several vacancies in some small communities, but it is expected that these will be filled by the time school opens.

SUMMARY

In general, I am glad to be able to report that the teacher situation is a big improvement over what it has been in recent years. Not only are there more teachers available, there are fewer ungraded teachers than at any time in our history and far more of our teachers have done graduate training or specialized work of one form or another. In spite of the obvious progress that has been made I should point out that as long as there is one ungraded teacher in our schools the problem remains serious.

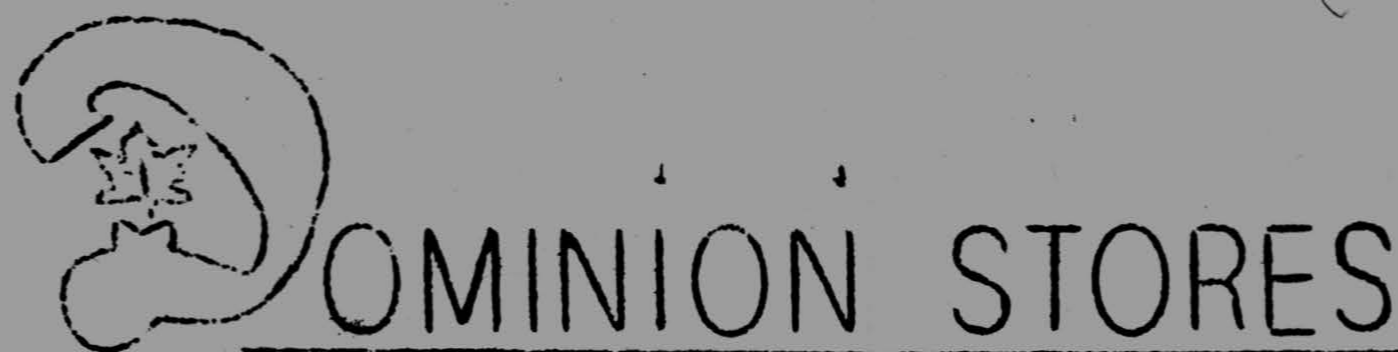

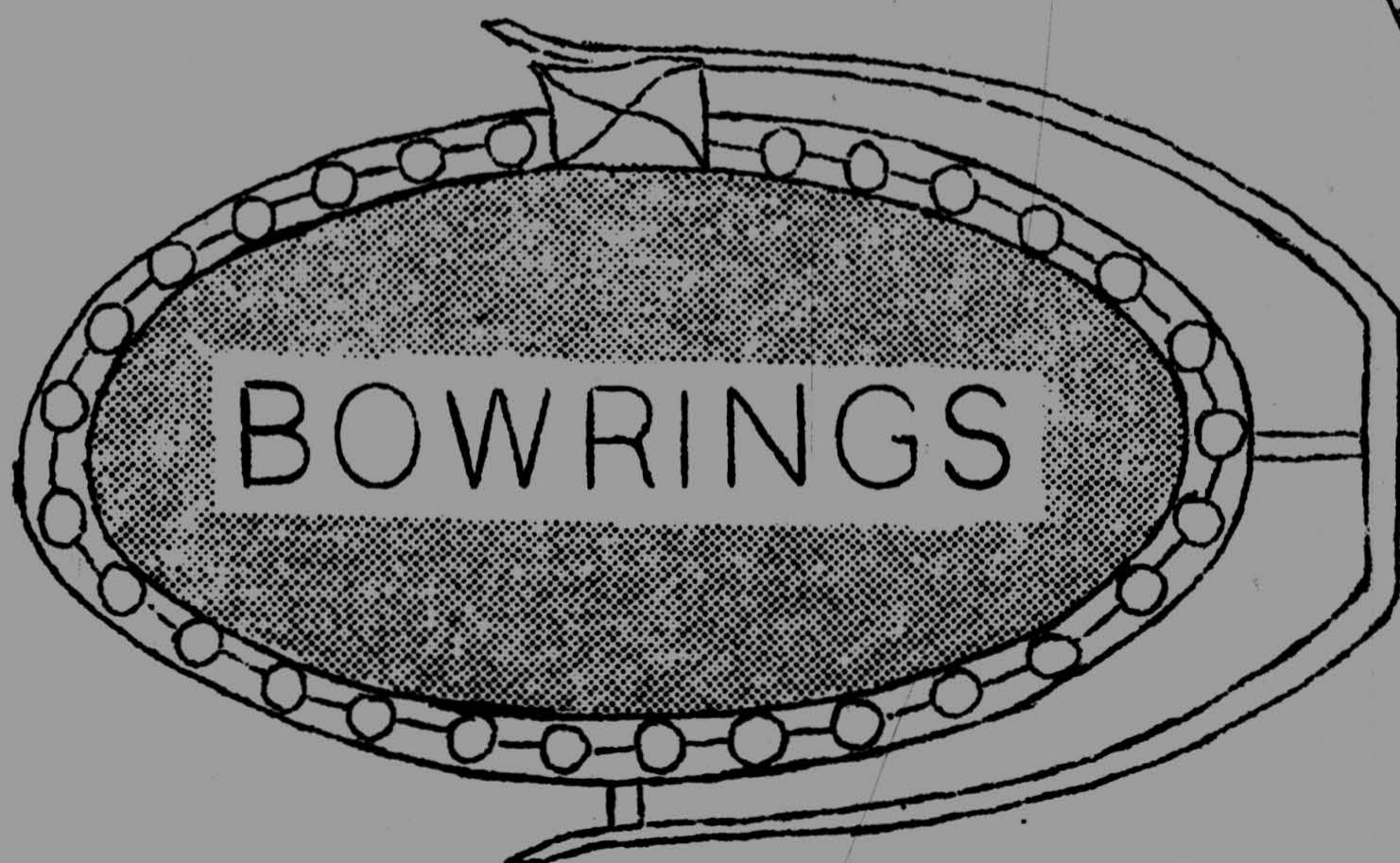

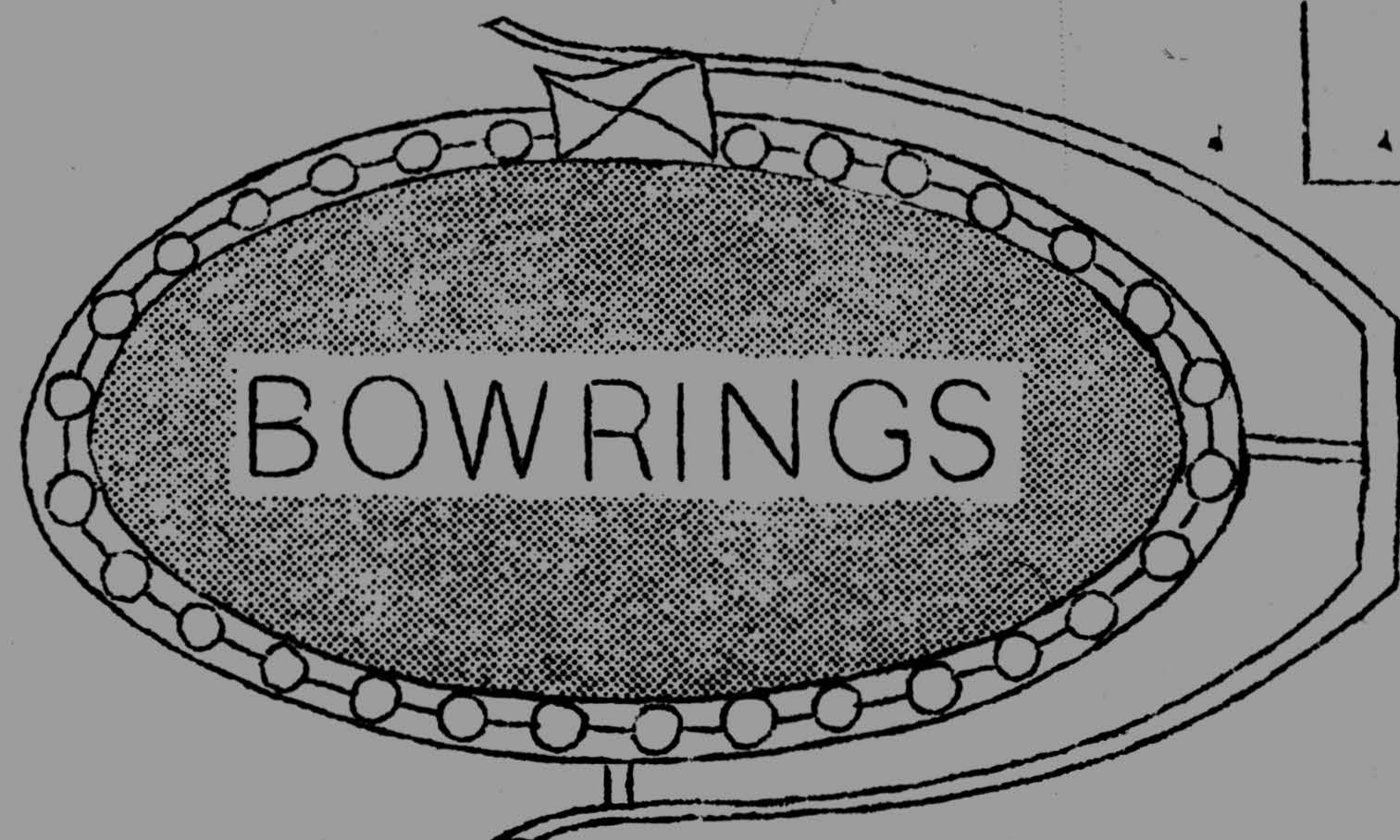
