## MANY THANKS TO MISS SANDRA JOURNEAUX FOR HER SUMMARY OF THE RECENT STUDENT TRIP TO EUROPE

On September 9th our group boarded Air Canada at London bound for Canada. There were mixed feelings. Some would have preferred to stay longer in Europe - others were tired of living from a suitcase and still others were quite happy to be soon seeing their families and friends. I felt the summer had been a tremendous experience for us personally and for the children. Everyone had a lot of fun. There were ups and downs but really none that we couldn't overcome with time and patience.

On August 23rd we sadly left Lausanne where we had been for 6 weeks. Lausanne is a lovely city on Lac Lemman with almost 20,000 people. The language spoken is French which the children had studied at L'Ecole Supérieure de Commerce - and the only time I heard complaints was when their turn rolled around for making a speech. Shopping and socializing with the local people had to be done in French.

Our accommodation for the girls was a convent run by the sisters of the Protection of the Young Girl and it was tremendous. The boys were living in a villa and also enjoyed complete comfort. Each weekend we travelled into various areas of Switzerland. The country is really beautiful - sometimes we were accommodated in rather primitive hostels - but none that we couldn't live through for it was shelter at least - and for 50¢ a day we couldn't utter a complaint. One that will always bring a smile is Hospice Simplon - an old asylum run by an order of Brothers. Really it was a creepy place - and none too warm - and we could touch snow by running a short distance up the mountain peak in back of the hostel!

Lausanne was our home in Europe and we grew very fond of the city and the people we met. We were all so wonderfully received by the relatives of Mr and Mrs Henri Dind, local residents of Labrador City. The children all enjoyed visits to their home. We also visited a cherry farm and a wine cellar. Our bus driver Mr Weber knew his country very well, making our itinerary even better.

On August 23rd we arrived in Frankfurt, Germany. The zoo there is something that should never be missed. The Palmengarten is one park the girls will never forget! After Frankfurt we went to Heidelberg - an interesting city with so much fun to be had. The trip from Mainz to Koblenz on the Rhine steamer was something to remember. In Koblenz our hostel was an old castle - our transportation provided by a German bus company Jasper, was excellent. We were supposed to fly from Cologne to Hamburg but we all enjoyed the bus so much we remained to keep Herr Henkel, our driver company enabling us to see the beautiful countryside between Cologne and Hamburg.

Hamburg is a beautiful city in northern Germany and was our home for just a few days. We found a place to go dancing making Hamburg a favourite right away.

Our trip to Scandinavia was the last part of our holiday. In Copenhagen we visited the Palace, Rosenberg castle, The Little Mermaid and many other places of interest. In the evening the Tivoli Gardens was on the agenda and everyone had a marvelous time. Next stop was Stockholm - the city on the water, very beautiful with many museums and interesting buildings. Our hostel this time was the S/S AF Chapman - a naval ship with all modern conveniences including hot showers. Then on to Oslo were the Nordic museum, the Ski museum and the Kon Tiki were among the many places of interest we were fortunate to visit.

We were now on our way back to Copenhagen and home. We changed our itinerary as everyone wanted one more night in Hamburg before we said good-bye to Europe - we did have a ball - and we were sorry to say good-bye to Herr Henkel and Germany.

Our accomodation in London (compliments of Air Canada) was just too much and most of the group stayed up all night. This was the beginning of the end and really noone wanted the end to come. Imagine having a beautiful room in the Skyways - hot and cold showers, private bath and everything, and most of us not using them !

We are very happy after our summer of travel. The children have learned to find their way from a map - learned to exchange ideas with children from other countries, and most of all learned how to be independent in life.

All in all I was thrilled to be in charge of such a group and I would like to express my appreciation to everyone who made the trip a reality. I am indebted to the children for making the summer so much fun.

the Labrador City / Wabush branch of the M.U.N. Alumni Association will be

Each course will take place one night a week for a period of 2 hours and the  
duration of each course is 20 weeks. For each of the courses the registration  
fee is \$20 payable upon registration.

It is planned to offer the Grade 11 Matriculation Programme for the  
province of Newfoundland and Labrador, and the Grade 11 programme in French in  
accordance with the regulations of the province of Quebec. The cost of each of  
these full courses is \$80 but if a person wishes to study only a part of the  
total programme the cost is \$25 per subject.

In addition to the two programmes mentioned above a Business Education  
Course will be offered at a total cost of \$120 or \$40 per subject. The class  
in typing will be offered at a cost of \$55. All fees for these courses must be  
payed in advance. The money will be refunded only if the person concerned dis-  
continues the course because of his leaving the district.

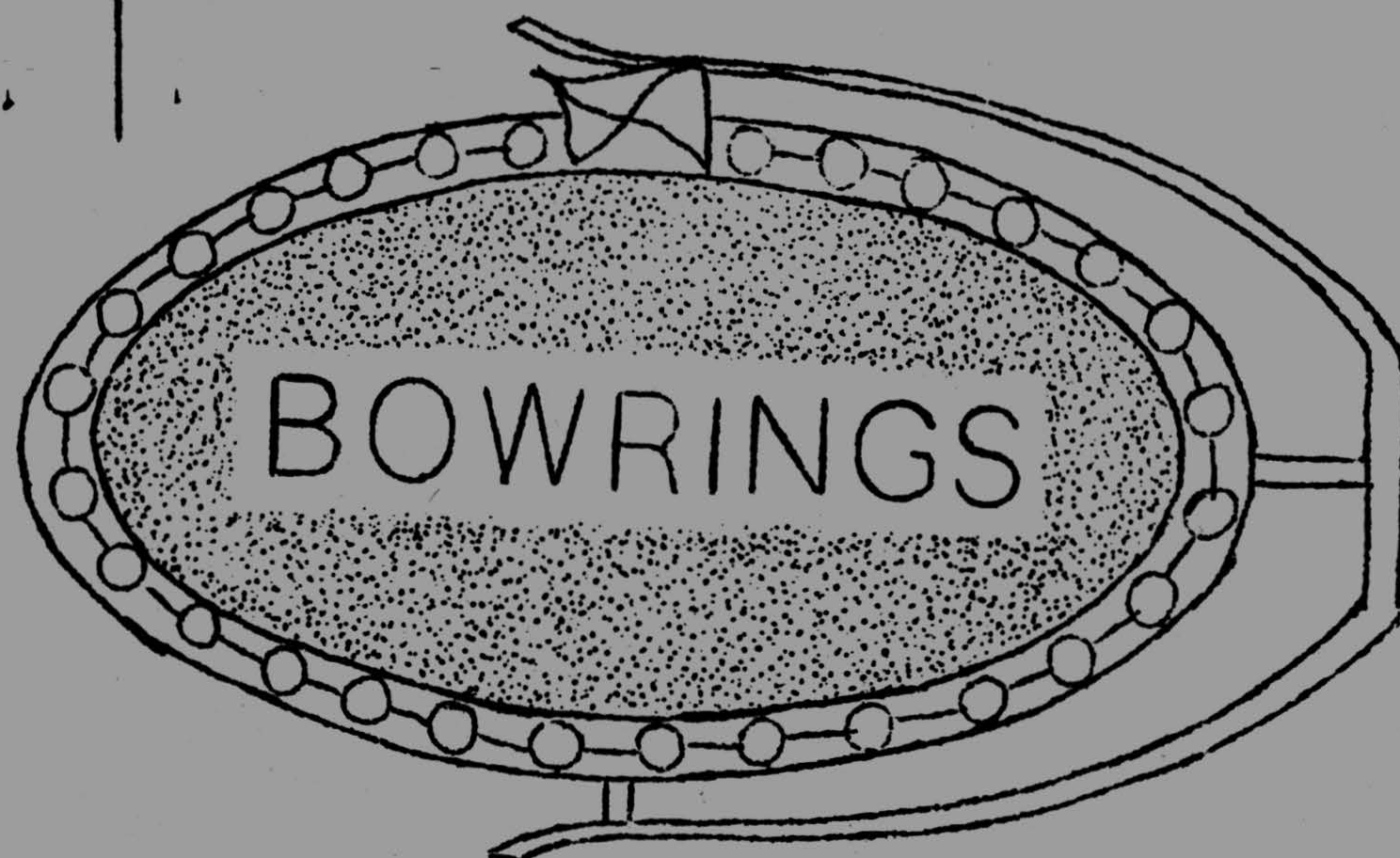

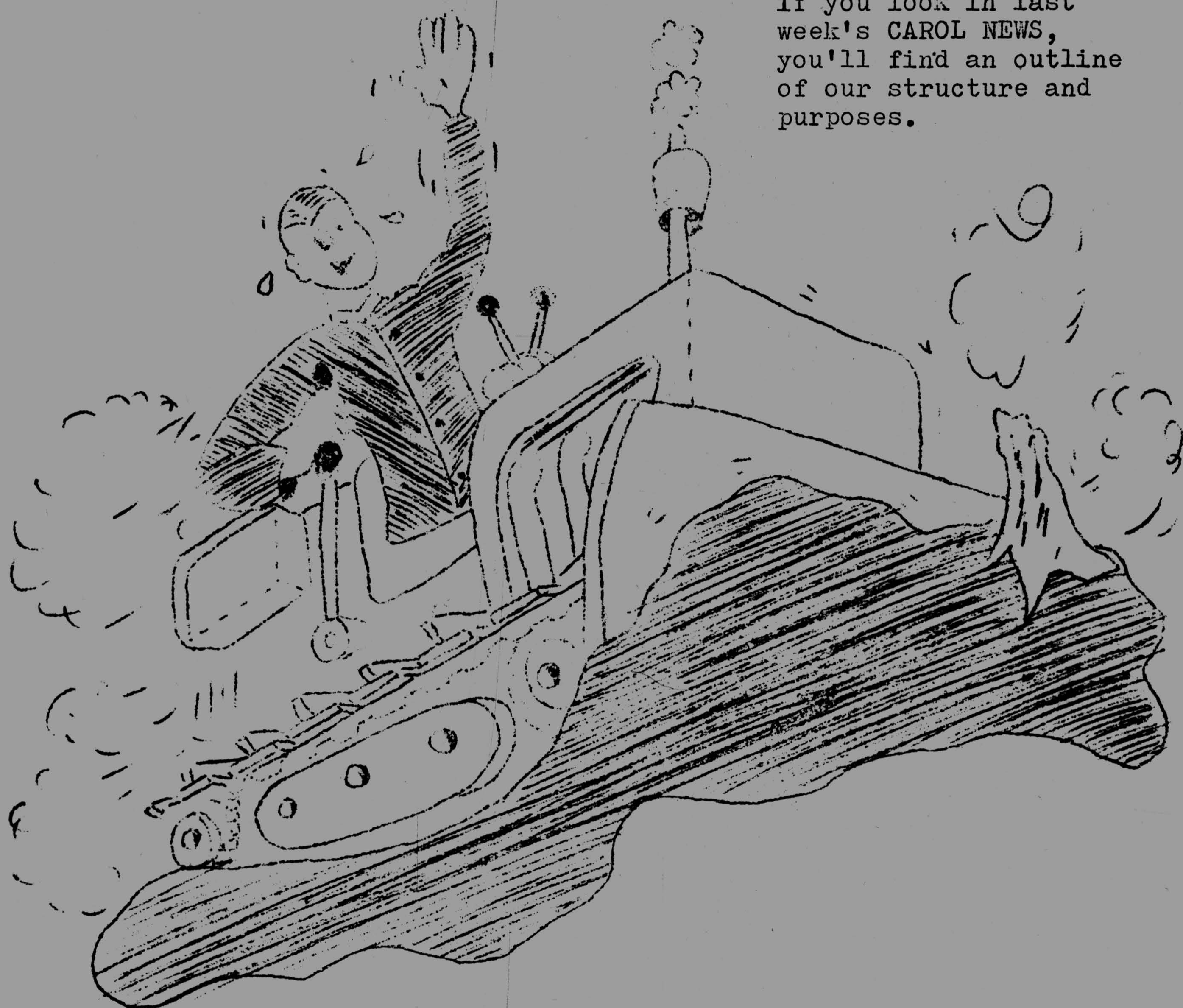
