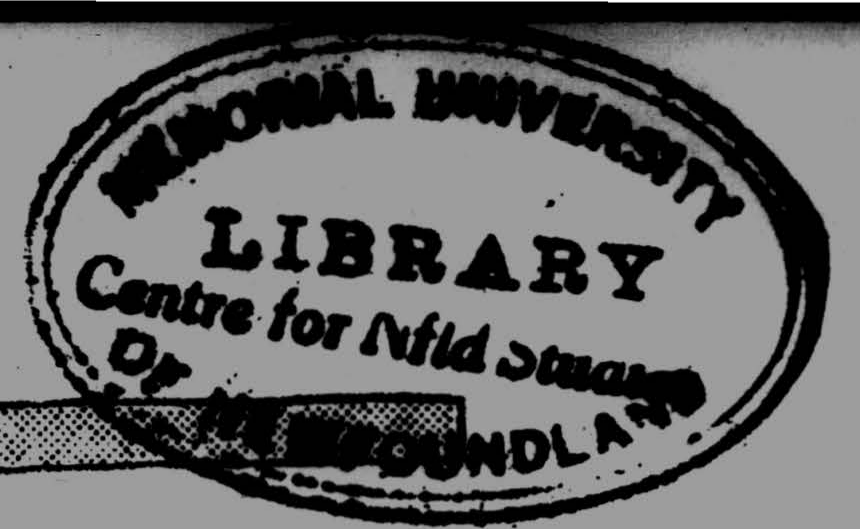

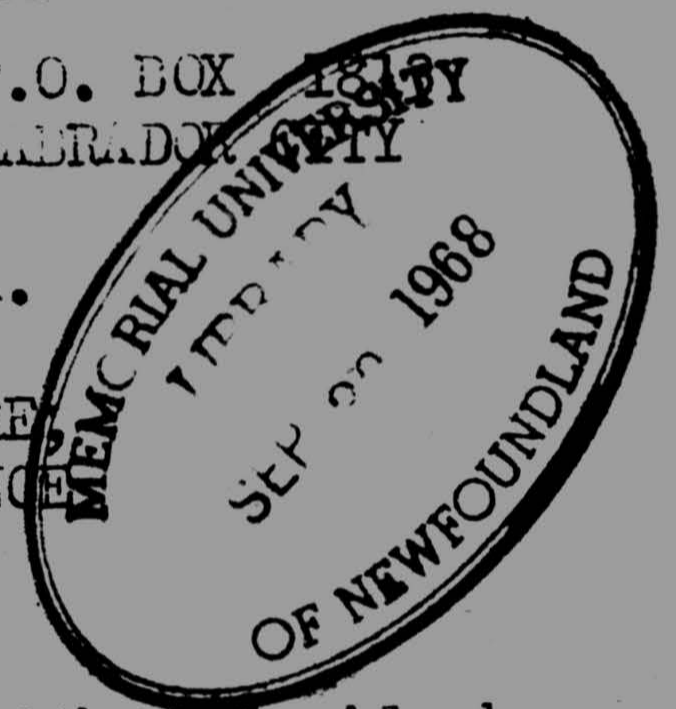

MRS JEAN FARR, HONORARY AGENT FOR THE S.P.C.A. SUBMITTED TO THE CAROL NEWS THIS STORY WHICH TOOK PLACE IN 1953 IN THE COUNTY OF DERBYSHIRE ENGLAND. A TRUE TALE OF FAITHFULNESS, ENDURANCE AND COURAGE.



Our heroine is a sheep dog, or collie, a handsome animal with silky black coat and bright intelligent eyes. Her name - Tip - she is seven years old. Her beloved master Joe Tag was eighty years old, a retired shepherd who still loved to roam the moors and hills with his faithful old friend and constant companion, Tip.

One cold day in December, 1953 Joe set off for his walk with Tip, assuring his niece, Miss Thorpe that they would return before dark. However, night came and Joe and Tip didn't return. Next day, a search party including police, boy scouts, neighbours and even holiday makers set out to find them. Alas the search was in vain, no sign of Tip or Joe was found.

Days passed into weeks and the search was abandoned, all hope gone of ever finding the old man was given up. Then one day, fifteen weeks since the pair vanished, on March 27th, 1954, two men came upon a haggard, skeleton-thin old looking dog, lying across what appeared to be a bundle of old clothes. It was Tip, still protecting the remains of her beloved master. How she had survived no one knows, she gave a feeble snarl, but allowed the men to lift her gently and take her home to Miss Thorpe.

After careful nursing, Tip once again became well, although it was obvious to all who knew her that her heart was longing for her old master. She became very famous, the most photographed dog in all Britain. People came from all over to see her. Her bravery was rewarded when she received the highest award a dog can possibly win - the Bronze Medal of the National Canine League of England.

On February 6th, 1955, Tip died in her sleep, just like old Joe, and people all over England came to do homage to a brave, faithful dog. Subscriptions were sent from all over the world to erect a monument in her memory. Hundreds attended when the beautiful granite stone was unveiled and they thanked God in their hearts for such a fine faithful dog as Tip had been. The stone lies near the spot where Tip the faithful collie kept her long, lonely vigil, awaiting her beloved masters next command - which never came.

Here is the inscription on the stone:

IN COMMEMORATION OF THE DEVOTION OF  
T I P  
THE SHEEP DOG WHICH STAYED BY THE  
BODY OF HER DEAD MASTER  
MR. JOSEPH TAGG  
ON HOWDEN MOORS  
FOR FIFTEEN WEEKS  
FROM 12th, DECEMBER 1953 to 27th MARCH, 1954

Could one ever hope to find such love and faithfulness among ones

MINISTRY OF PUBLIC WELFARE: NEWS RELEASE

The following statement was made recently by the Hon. Edward Roberts, Minister of Public Welfare:

" It is a known fact that all but a few of the people in Newfoundland and Labrador receiving assistance from the Department of Public Welfare are entitled to it as a matter of need. They do not try to get more than they are entitled to.

But there are the few who do. They generally wind up in court to receive the punishment that goes with the attempt to defraud the Department.

In the fiscal year ending March 31, 1968 there were 20 convictions. In the first five months of the new fiscal year, from the first of April to the end of August, there have been 37 convictions.

About two-thirds of the cases, 24 of 37 dealt with people who gained welfare benefits by falsely reporting earnings and income.

Part of their penalty is to pay back the money that they received under false pretenses. There were 11 cases in which a father tried to shirk the responsibility of providing the necessities of life for his family. The other conviction was for forgery."

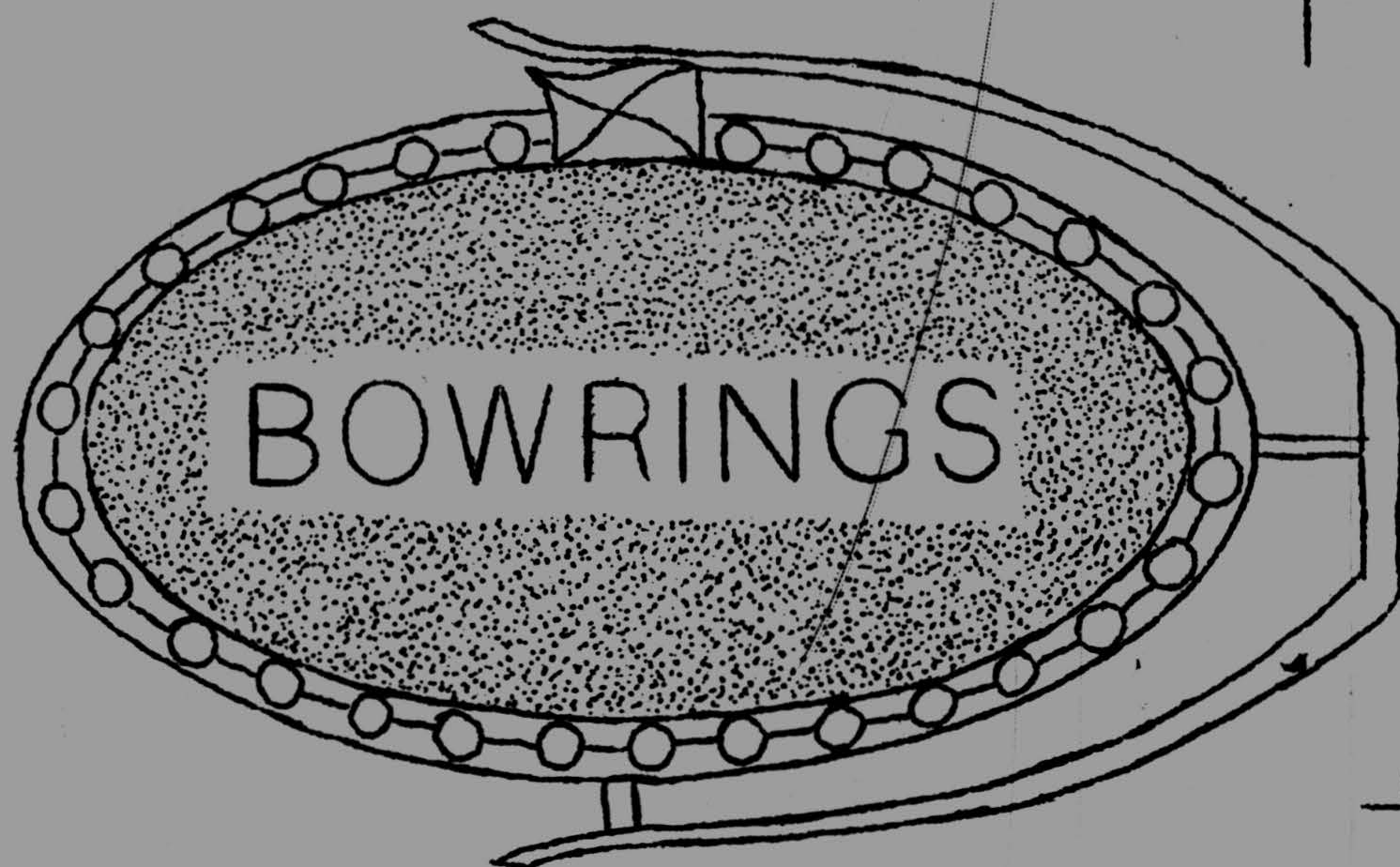
