## O GIVE THANKS

The Pilgrim Fathers who had come to America to make a home in the wilderness where they might have religious freedom to worship God according to the dictates of their Conscience, had the first harvest in 1621. So at Plymouth, Mass; the little handful of devoted people, hewing homes out of the wilderness amid many perils, set apart a day of thanksgiving to God. And on that day they feasted and gave thanks. President Lincoln appointed the last Thursday of November, 1864, as Thanksgiving Day. Now the Thanksgiving Day tradition is firmly established in America and Canada. Each country upon its appointed day in October, give thanks as their forefathers did.

As we count our many material blessings, let us give "thanks unto God, for All Things" A story I read in The Upper Room, moved my heart, Maurice E Persons, a missionary in Africa, tells of a service he attended at a leprosy hospital in Mozambique. How could she have possibly been thankful that she was a leper ? She came from a village where there was no Church and she reasoned, "Had I not been a leper, I would never have come to the leprosarium: I would never have heard the good news of Jesus Christ, my Saviour and Lord".

In all things, GIVE THANKS. Do it with true thankful hearts, not only during Thanksgiving, but DAILY.

I would like to pass on to you the pattern for one of the prettiest scarves imaginable and probably the easiest you have ever attempted. This was quite a fad when I was a teenager and I still like to make them for Xmas presents.

It doesn't matter what kind of wool or what size of needles you use but for a child's scarf I take an 8 needle with double knitting wool.

Cast on 41 stitches and knit plain for about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the length desired ; (it stretches quite a lot when finished) Before casting off let every other stitch fall to the bottom of your work. Cast off loosely and finish with bobs or tassles.

This makes the softest scarf for baby or make a wide one for yourself in lurex and you have a beautiful stole.

of the Grade X Confederation Scholarships.

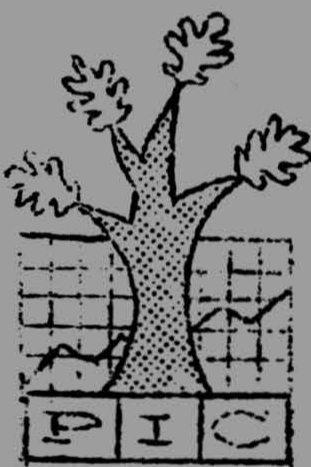
There are 250 scholarships valued at \$100 each and these are awarded each

In the event the results of this investigation deem it necessary, action will be taken to implement this safety service on a province wide basis.

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP

INGREDIENTS

APPLE AND NUT FAMILY CAKE

METHOD.

12 oz flour	12 oz chopped dates and nuts
6 oz butter or marg.	½ pint apple purée
6 oz sugar	1½ level tsp. bicarbonate of soda
1 tsp ground cinnamon	2-3 tbsps. milk
<u>CAKE TOPPING</u>	
1 tbsps. chopped dates	
2 dessertsp. sugar	
1 tsp. ground cinnamon.	

Put flour into a bowl, rub in fat until mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Add sugar, cinnamon, dates & nuts. Make well in centre, add apple purée. Dissolve bicarb. in milk and add to mix. Mix well and put in prepared tin 8x5" Mix ingredients for topping, sprinkle over the surface, and bake in a moderate oven (350° F.,) for 1½ hours.

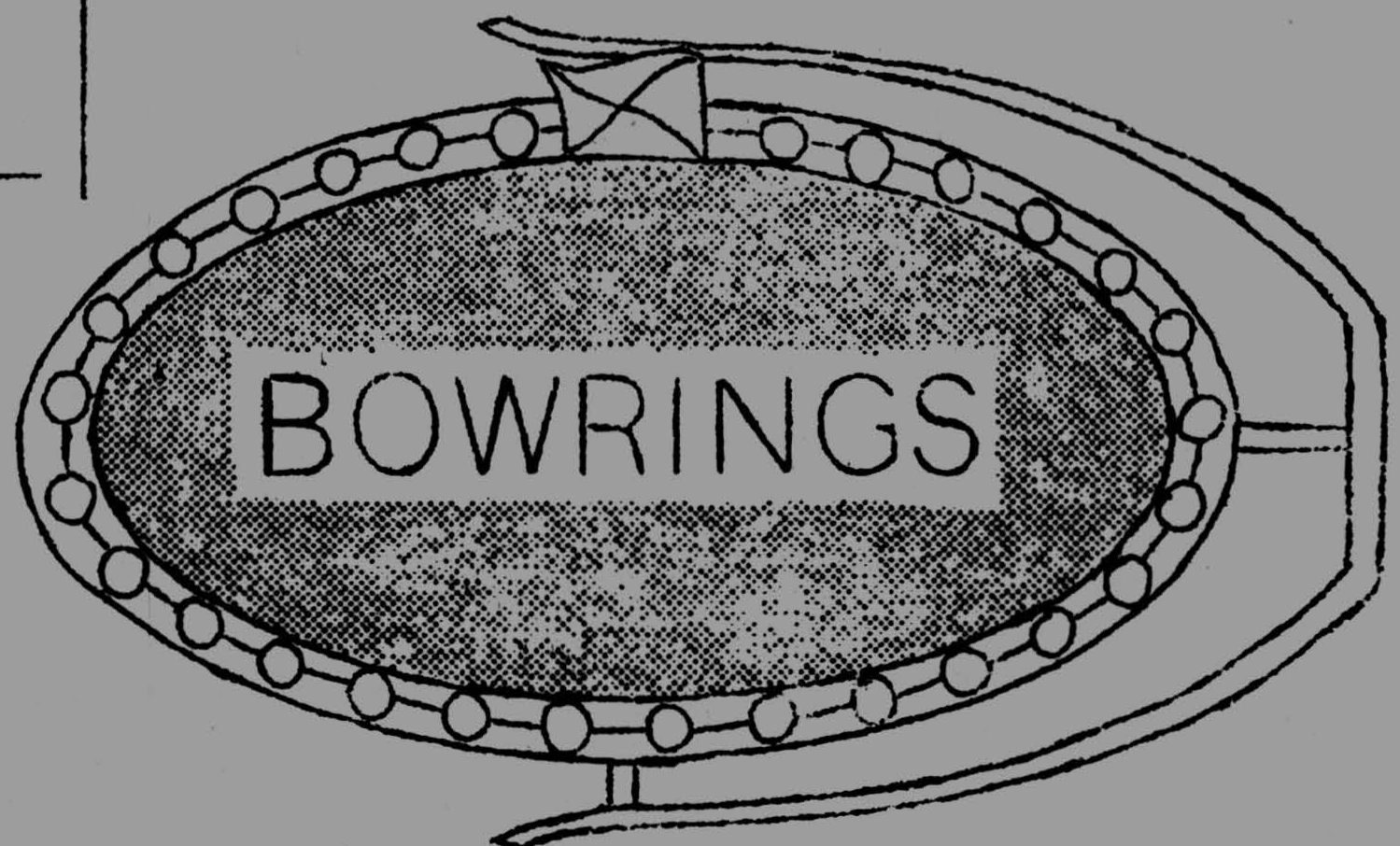

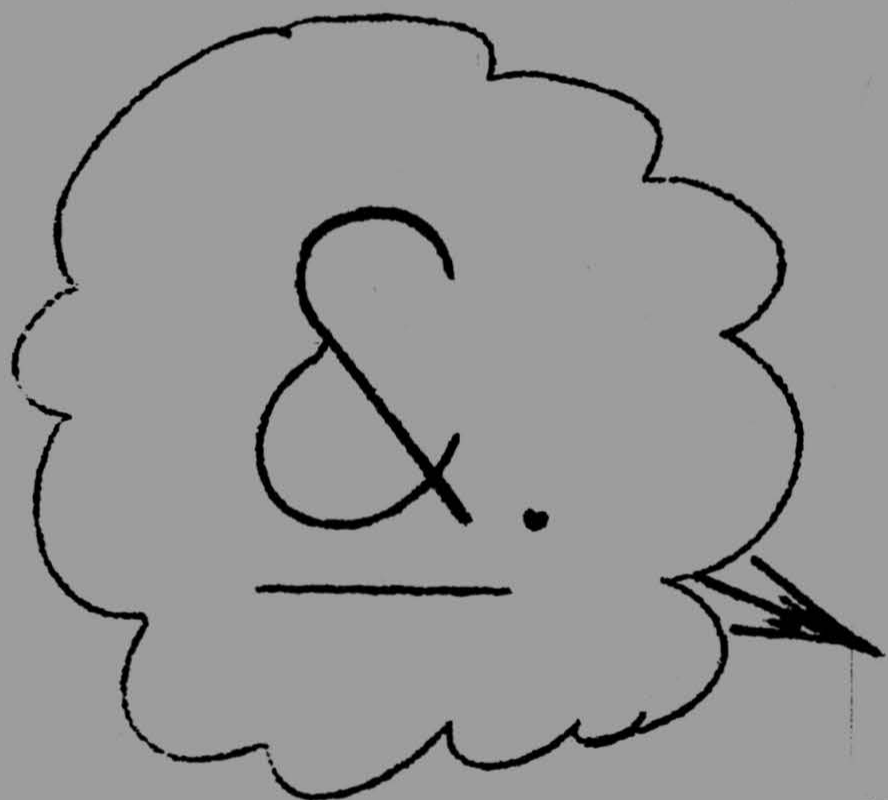
