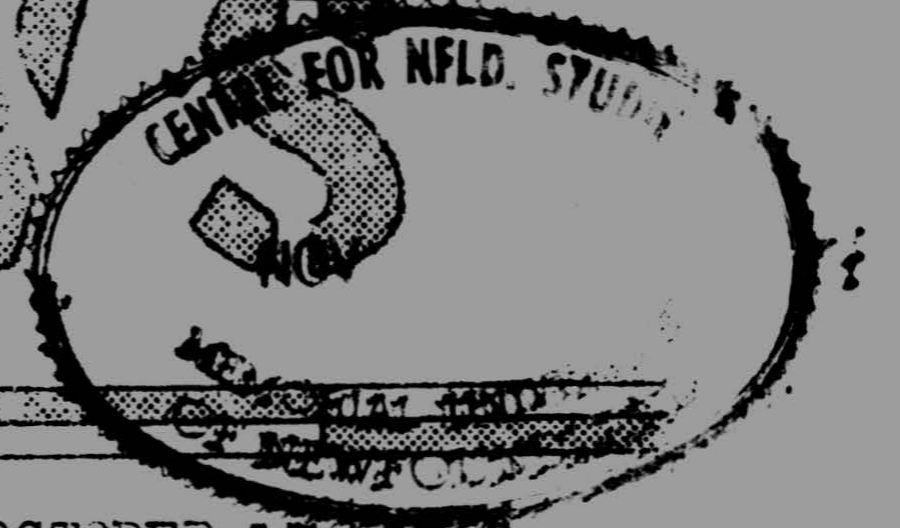

Although the brilliant young French pianist, JEAN CASADESUS, is the son of internationally celebrated musical parents, Robert and Gaby Casadesus, he has won staggering global acclaim in his own right as a musician of uncommon gifts. The handsome pianist, who continues to add impressive laurels to the family crown, will appear in this city on OCTOBER 18 at 8:30 pm under the auspices of the LABRADOR COMMUNITY CONCERTS ASSOCIATION in one of his characteristically fine programs that promises to capture the enthusiasm of local music lovers, as has been the case during his previous extensive tours of the United States.

Born in Paris in 1927 he began his pianistic studies with his great aunt, Rose Casadesus. In 1940 he moved to the United States with his family and his professional career was launched when he made his debut as soloist under Eugene Ormandy a few years later as winner of the Philadelphia Orchestra Youth Auditions.

The interim years were spent diligently perfecting his already enviable technique and building his fabulous repertoire. In the Spring of 1954 he made his first appearances in Latin America and, in 1961, a tour of Israel won him mountainous plaudits from the Israeli press and public alike. For example, Haboker declared: "The young Casadesus is not an artist of the future; he has already reached a standard which labels him among the foremost pianists," while Haaretz profoundly stated that "his success was great and truly deserved."

His Berlin debut with the RIAS Orchestra under Bernard Haitink was a smashing success. "CASADESUS WAS THE BEST" headlined Berlin's Der Abend. The Berliner Morgenpost's headlines blared: "A YOUNG MUSICIAN ON THE LADDER OF SUCCESS". In musically-discriminating Vienna, Jean Casadesus was hailed as "by no means a mere crown prince. He is a highly individual and a great artistic personality." (Das Klein Volksblatt) An appearance in Chicago, the Windy City, drew a solid rave from Claudia Cassidy of the Chicago Tribune: "Casadesus stepped out as a virtuoso. He had for the glittering, bouffant music the brilliance, the definition, the bite, and that indefinable charm of urbanity so much a part of the aristocratic world of French music. I double-checked him on my list in the category called: When possible, don't miss!" After a performance with the symphony there, the Santa Barbara News-Press critic wrote: "Jean Casadesus, son of the famous concert pianist, Robert Casadesus, proved to be a personable, vital, marvelously fluent master of the keyboard, with style and expressive grace worthy of his sire, and a reserve of power and theatric verve typical of the younger generation virtuoso."

In Halifax, Nova Scotia, Jean Casadesus' exciting performance there was comparable to a central heating system, according to the Halifax Mail Star headline: "GIFTED PIANIST WARMS AUDIENCE IN COLD HALL." Critic Peter Hawkins went on to observe that "Monsieur Casadesus was at his best. Here was the technical mastery, the élan, the refined brilliance that makes his performance of exquisite richness." In addition to appearing as featured soloist with the symphony orchestras of New York, Philadelphia, Chicago and Denver, Jean Casadesus has appeared on CBC T.V. in Montreal with marked success.

A very recent recording by the Casadesus family of works by Bach and Mozart for Columbia Records (MS 6495 and ML 5895) is destined to become a classic. HI-FI STEREO labeled it "Spirited....Enjoyable....Exceptionally well done." Rachel Morton headlined her review: "FRENCH PIANIST MAGNIFICENT PERFORMER" She made a point of saying "He played with polish and delicate refinement. In the first movement his tone was lucid and he made clear and clean the ascending and descending scales. There was a sparkling clarity in the trills...played with poetic insight." This latter observation is the consummate poetic approach to everything Casadesus

plays that sets him quite apart from other gifted young pianists. His technical equipment has long since been his forte and a combination of the two enviable qualities speaks well for his continued success in the great world on music.

Bien que le brillant jeune pianiste Français Jean Casadesus est le fils de parents musiciens internationalement reconnus, Robert et Gaby Casadesus, il a gagné de lui-même une acclamation globale extraordinaire étant reconnu comme un musicien fort doué. Ce brillant pianiste, qui continu à ajouter des lauriers impressionnant à la couronne familiale, se présentera dans cette ville le 18 OCTOBRE, 1968 à 8:30 heures du soir sous l'invitation de la SOCIÉTÉ DES CONCERTS DU LABRADOR avec un programme qui promet de capturer l'enthousiasme du public local.

Né à Paris en 1927, ce débonnaire et charmant français commença ses études de piano avec sa grande tante, Mlle Rose Casadesus. En 1940, il se rendit aux États Unis avec sa famille et sa carrière fut lancée quand il débuta comme soloiste sous Eugene Ormandy et quelques années plus tard remporta les honneurs pour les Auditions de la Jeunesse de l'Orchestre de Philadelphie.

Les années intermédiaires furent passées à perfectionner avec diligence sa technique déjà enviable et à bâtir son prodigieux répertoire. Au printemps de 1954 il fit sa première apparition en Amérique Latine et en 1961, un tour d'Israël lui avait gagné une montagne d'applaudissements de la presse et du public Israélien. Pour exemple Haboker déclara: "Le jeune Casadesus n'est pas un artiste de l'avenir; il a de ce fait atteint un calibre qui le classe parmi un des meilleurs pianistes contemporains", pendant que Haaretz déclare que son succès était grandiose et sincèrement mérité."

Son début à Berlin avec l'orchestre R.I.A.S. sous Bernard Haitink eut un succès éclaboussant. "Casadesus fut le meilleur" Der Abend de Berlin écrit dans sa manchette. "La manchette du Morgenpost de Berlin écrivit: "Un jeune musicien sur l'échelle du succès". A Vienne, lieu misical de discrimination Jean Casadesus fut salué comme "par aucun critère comme un simple prince couronné. Il est un très individualiste et un grand personnage artistique." (Das Kleine Volksblatt)... Une apparition à Chicago donna le délire à Claudia Cassidy de la Tribune de Chicago. Casadesus apparut comme un virtuose. Il eut pour la musique scintillante et bouffant la brillance, la définition, la touche et ce charme indéfinissable d'urbanité faisant tellement parler le monde aristocratique de la musique Française. Je l'ai souligné à deux reprises sur ma liste à catégorie qui recommande: "Quand possible, ne manquez pas!" Après une performance avec la symphonie de la-bas le critique du journal "News Press", de Santa Barbara a rédigé: Jean Casadesus, fils du pianiste du concert célèbre, Robert Casadesus, s'est avéré être un maître du clavier, un personnage, vital et merveilleusement fluide, avec le style et la grâce expressive de son père et une réserve de puissance et une verve théâtrale caractéristique du virtuose d'une génération cadette.

À Halifax, Nouvelle Ecosse, la performance excitante de Jean Casadesus était comparable à un système de chaleur centrale, selon la manchette du journal "Mail Star" de Halifax. Pianiste doué chauffe l'audience dans une salle froide." Le critique Pierre Hawkins, a continué en faisant la remarque que "Monsieur Casadesus était à son meilleur ici était la une maîtrise technique parfaite, l'élan, la brillance raffinée qui fait sa performance de la musique Française, irresistible richesse exquise." Par surcroît d'apparaître comme vedettes soloiste avec les orchestres symphoniques de New York, Philadelphie, Chicago et Denver, Jean Casadesus a apparut à la télévision Montréalaise avec un succès foudroyant.

Un disque a très récemment été enregistré par la famille Casadesus sur les travaux de Bach et Mozart pour les Disques Columbia (MS 6495 et ML 5895) est destiné à devenir un classique, Hi-Fi Stereo l'ont classé "Ahimé de bon goût...exceptionnellement bien fait". Rachel Morton a écrit la manchette de sa revue: "PLANISTE FRANÇAIS MAGNIFIQUE ARTISTE". Elle s'est fait un point de dire: il a joué avec éclat une finesse délicate. Pendant le premier mouvement son accent était lucide et il dénote claires et limpides les échelles ascendantes et descendantes. Il y avait dans les trilles une brillante clarté...joué avec une perspicacité poétique. Cette dernière observation est en effet une vérité, car c'est l'approche poétique et ce que tout Jean Casadesus joue que le place à l'écart des autres jeunes pianistes doués. Son équipement technique a depuis longtemps été à force et une combinaison des deux enviables qualités parle bien parer son succès continu dans le grand monde de la musique.

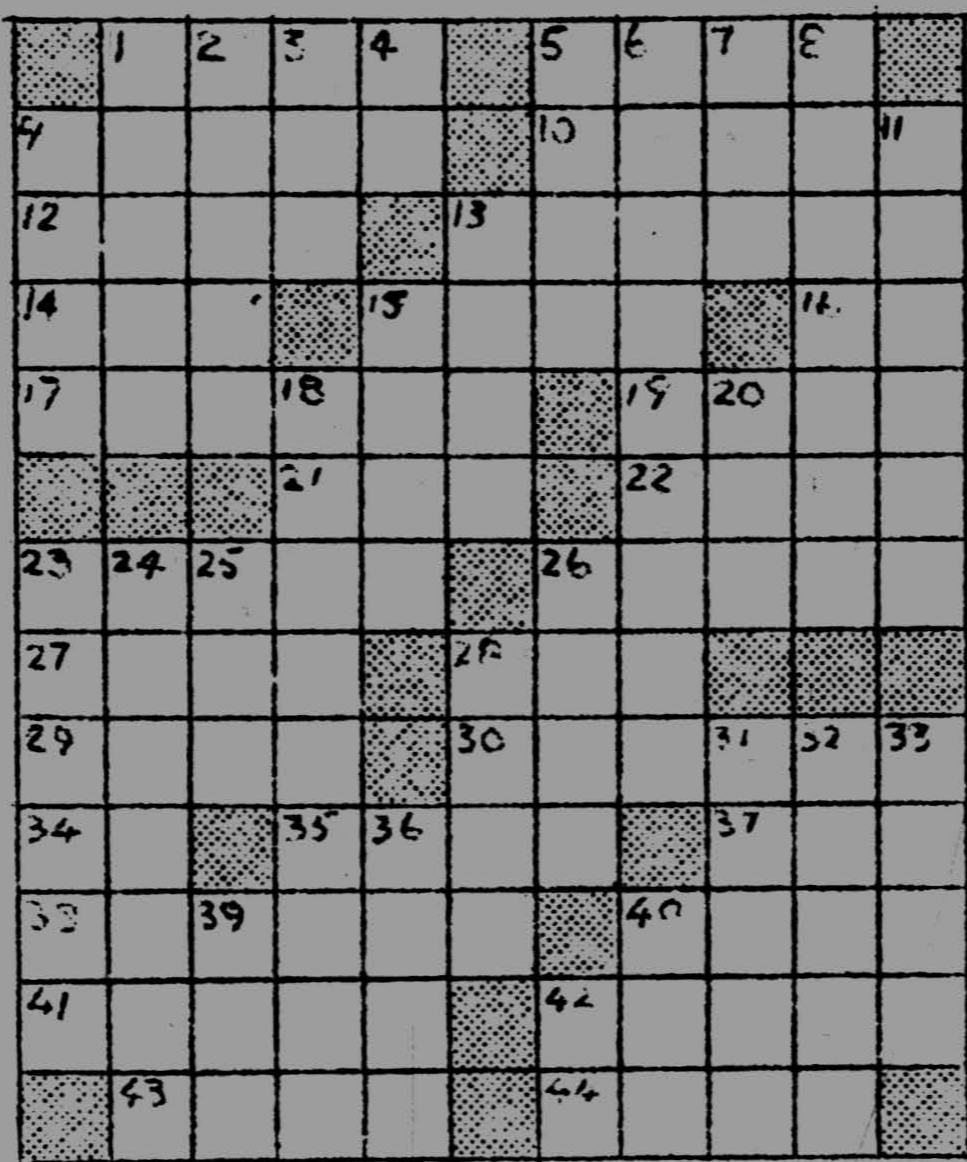

YOUTH ASSOCIATION REPORT

The Labrador City Youth Association Youth Centre has been delayed due to temporary financial setbacks. An initial cost was given by a major company in town and sufficient funds were raised to cover the preliminary work. However, after a survey of the plans for the building was made, a re-estimate of \$16,719.00 was given. Unfortunately the Youth Association does not have this amount of money and cannot raise the necessary balance before the winter set in.

At the present time the L.C.Y.A. has approximately \$5,500.00 which is less than 1/3 of the required amount needed for the basement which must now be re-designed in order to lower the cost of construction to a more reasonable amount. The building is still on Salvation Army land and must be moved as soon as possible before the winter sets in - this being one of the agreements of the sale. Either we move the building or tear it down. Tearing it down would ruin much of the building material therefore the alternative would be more reasonable, to move the building to the opposite side of the excavation and place it there temporarily without a basement. It could still be used with great success and when the money becomes available the basement will be constructed.

In the meantime a lot of teenagers have given up the idea of ever seeing a Youth Centre. The executive of the L.C.Y.A. are doing their best to get it rolling but this takes time and patience. If everyone will continue to support the Youth Centre, we will soon have a place to hold our dances and other activities.

The Labrador City Youth Association would like to thank the people of Labrador City and Wabush for their support in the recent fund raising bake sale and ticket raffle which were both very successful. Your support was greatly appreciated. Thanks go to DOWRINGS for the use of their store for the bake sale held recently. To WOGLWORTHS for allowing us to sell tickets at the store. LABRADOR CITY ARENA where we held our skating parties and last but not least our sincere thanks to the CURLING CLUB and the ASHUNUPI CLUB for allowing us to hold our dances there.

When Mrs. Hugh John Flemming of New Brunswick, sponsored a high-school essay contest on "What Is Being Done for the Protection of Animals, and What More Can be Done?" she got more than she bargained for.

Children wrote letters asking: "Why didn't we know these things before? Why didn't someone tell us? Is there a Club we can join to help put a stop to these terrible things that happen to animals?"

In answer to that question, Mrs. Flemming in December 1959 started the Kindness Club, and soon afterwards she invited the late Dr. Albert Schweitzer, whose writings had inspired her, to become honorary president. He consented, and served in that capacity until his death.

Letters from all over the world began pouring into Kindness Club headquarters, asking about the Club, which was freely advertised by newspapers columnists, radio and TV personalities and other humane-minded folk.

Volunteer helpers came forward, including Mrs. Richard Lambert, well-known Toronto author, who wrote the book HOW TO BE KIND expressly for the Kindness Club. It is a handbook for leaders. Mrs. J. Alvah Green of Port Credit, Ontario, started a Kindness Club quarterly, "Fur and Feathers," to which leading writers and photographers in both Canada and the U.S. contribute free of charge. The magazine also features stories, poems and sketches by children.

Symbol of the Club is that lovable rascal the racoon. Leaders call themselves Racoon Captains. Boys and girls choose an animal name for their Club. If a child can find no one locally interested, he may become a Lone Racoon, with full status. Each member takes the pledge:

"I promise to be kind to animals, as well as people, and to speak and act in defense of all living creatures."

Recently the Humane Society of the United States, Washington, D.C., has sponsored a pilot Kindness Club programme in five states (Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, Virginia and West Virginia).

Says Mrs. Flemming: "I started the Kindness

Club because I felt so deeply the need of it in our schools and churches, and my experience with children has taught me that it should be the basis for development of good citizens and happy people --- a proven deterrent to juvenile delinquency."

Children want the Kindness Club. As one child wrote: "It's not the sight of suffering animals which makes us unhappy, but doing nothing about it." Each Club is responsible for local projects to help animals and needy children.

Two years ago, the Club received a boost when Charlotte Baker, a well-known children's writer, created a lively book based on the Kindness Club idea (THE BEST OF FRIENDS, David McKay, New York). A Note to the Reader gives the address of the real Kindness Club. This book has resulted in over 2,000 letters from boys and girls eager to join the Club.

Swamped with the growing success of her Club, Mrs. Flemming gladly responds to every chance to further the cause of kindness. "We must seize every opportunity," she says, "and pray the help comes along with the demand."

KINDNESS AROUND THE WORLD

JAPAN: A group of schoolchildren in the northern part of the country found several swallows pitifully freezing in snow. The birds were stranded and unable to continue their migration southward. The children at once notified the Bird Protection Association, and members of the association went into action immediately, taking the birds by plane to Tokyo, and from there to the warm shores of Lake Hamano.

SWITZERLAND: Factory workers in Appenzell found a novel way to help the World Wildlife Fund. They worked a voluntary Saturday shift and gave their wages to the Fund. Encouraged by this imaginative gesture, the management donated an equal sum.

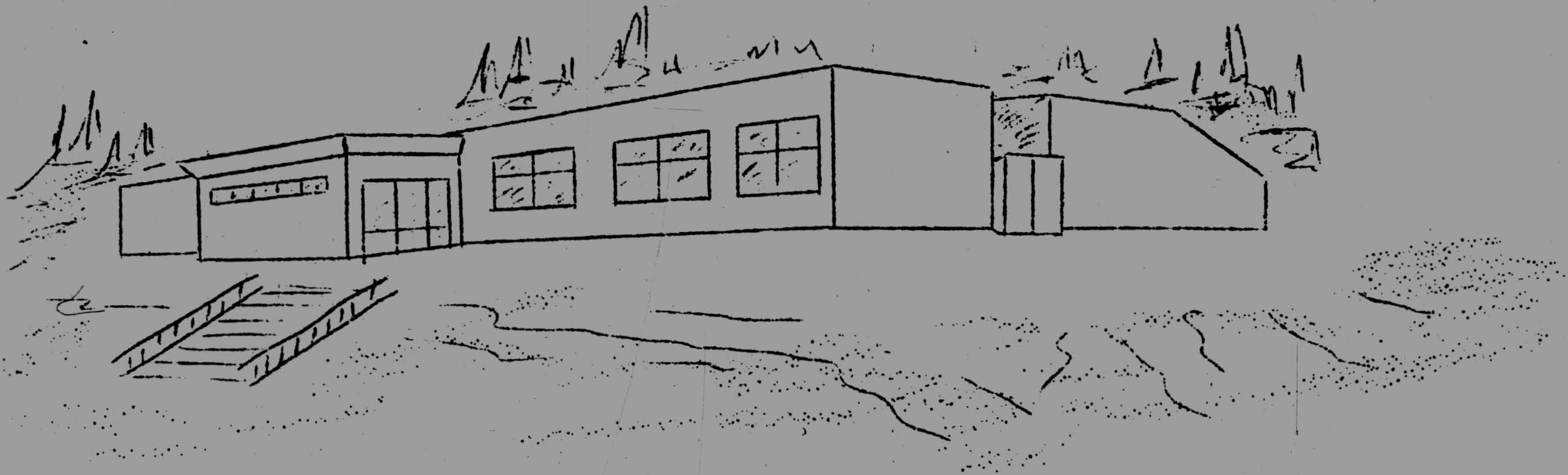

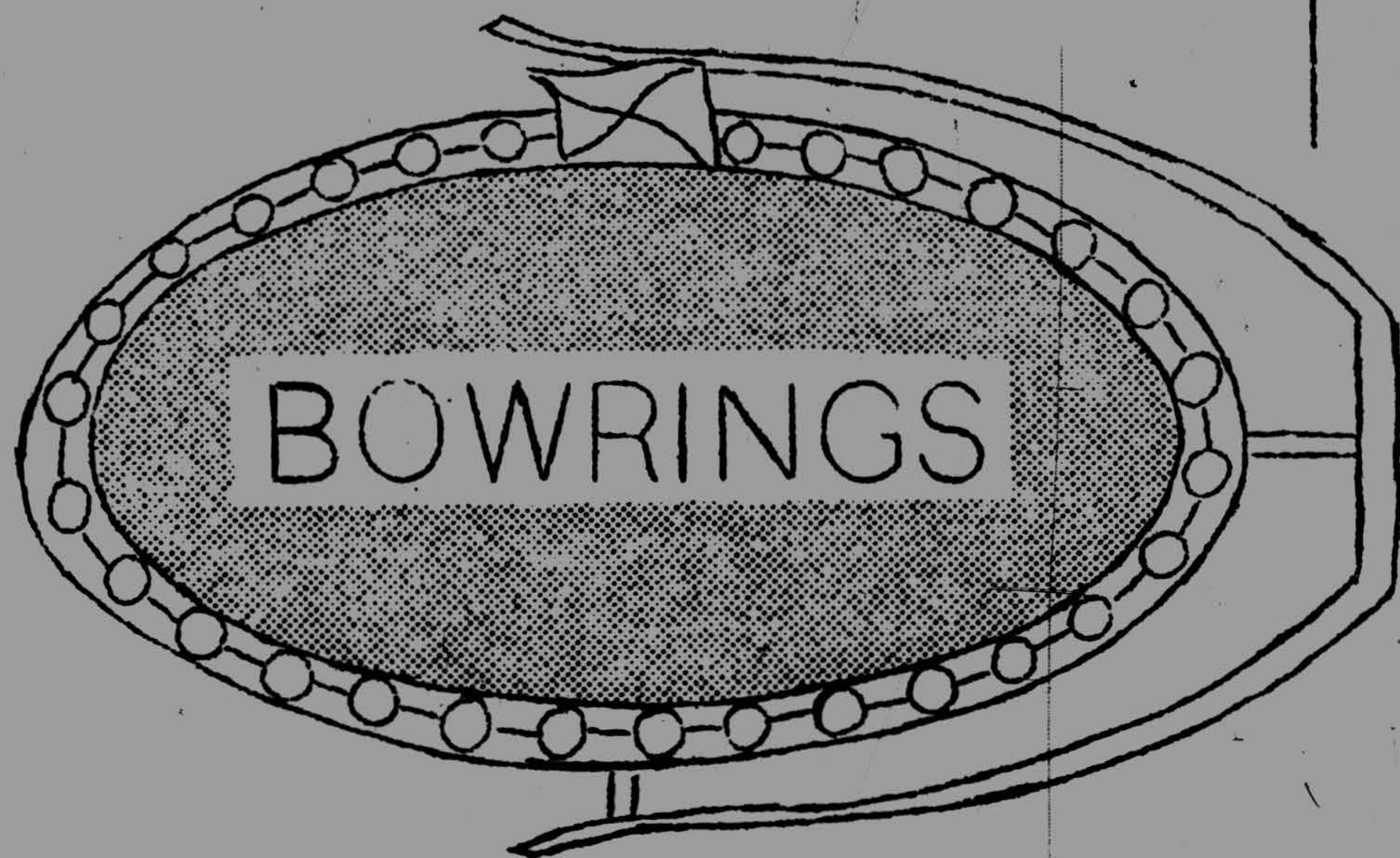

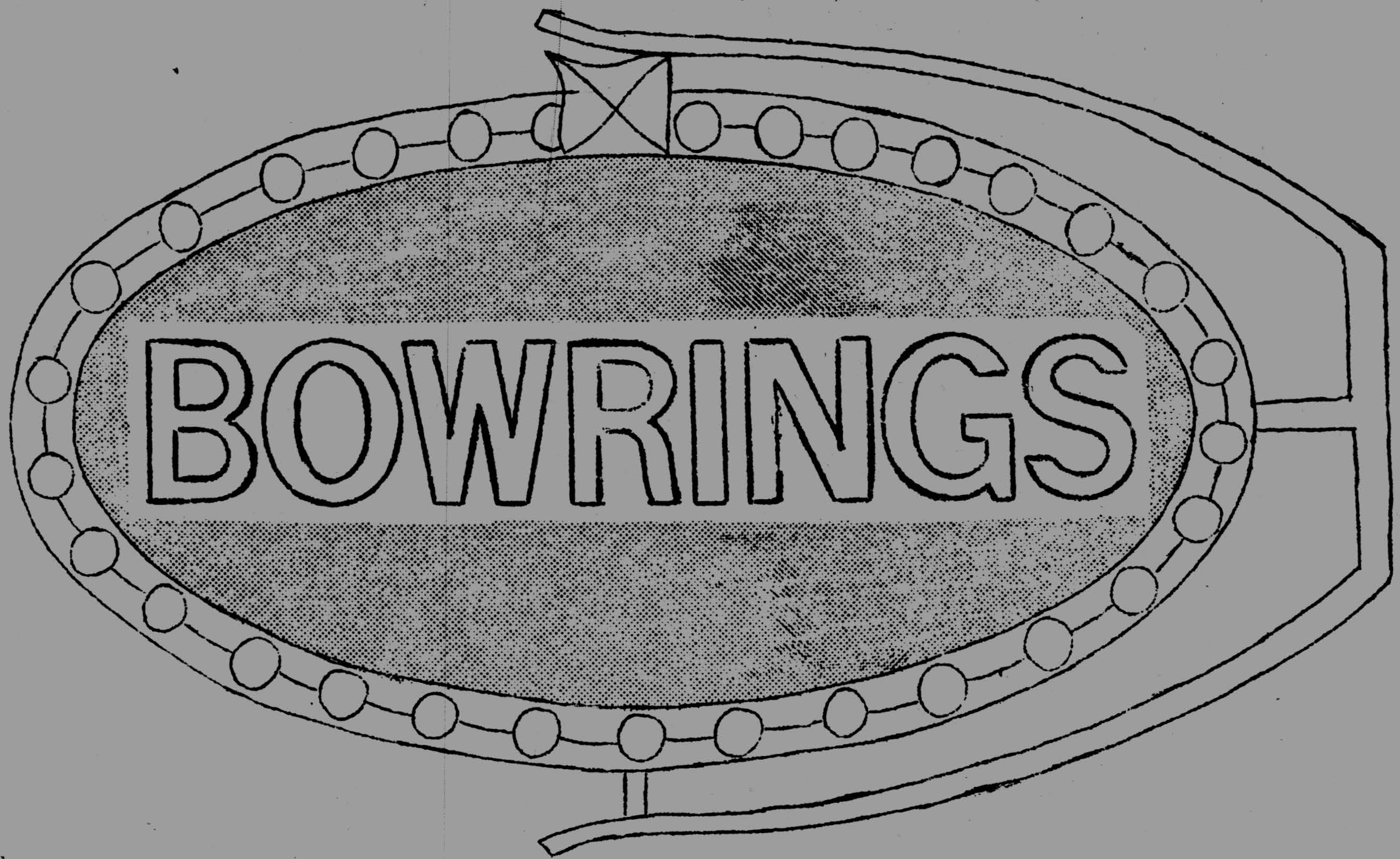
